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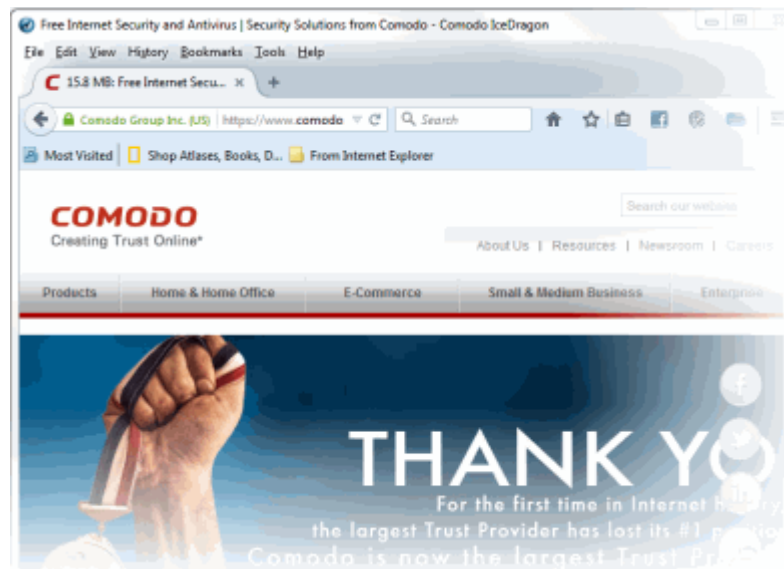
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1. Comodo IceDragon – Introduction

- Windows 8 / 8.1 / 7 / Vista / XP
- 128 MB RAM
- 40 MB Hard Disk Space

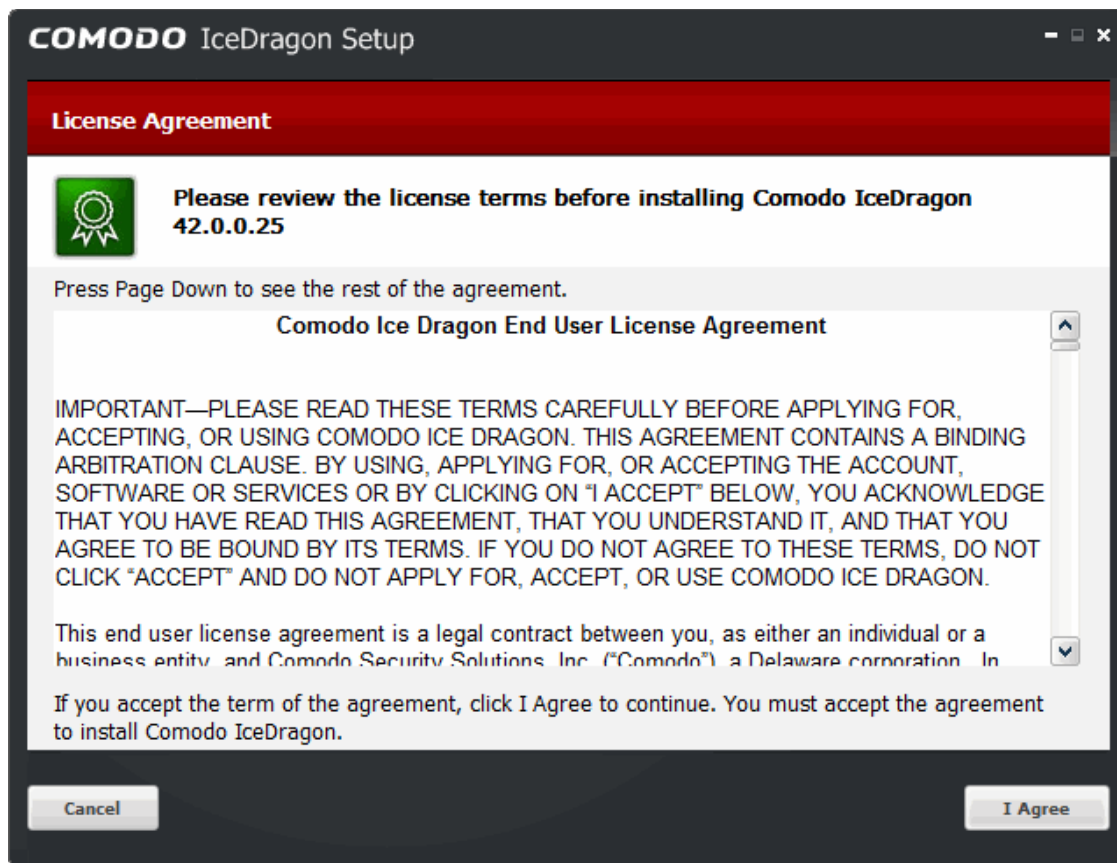

3. Downloading And Installing Comodo IceDragon

You can download the IceDragon setup file from the location: <http://icedragon.comodo.com/>

After downloading the setup file to your hard drive, double click icedragonsetup.exe  to start the installation wizard.

Step1 - End User License Agreement

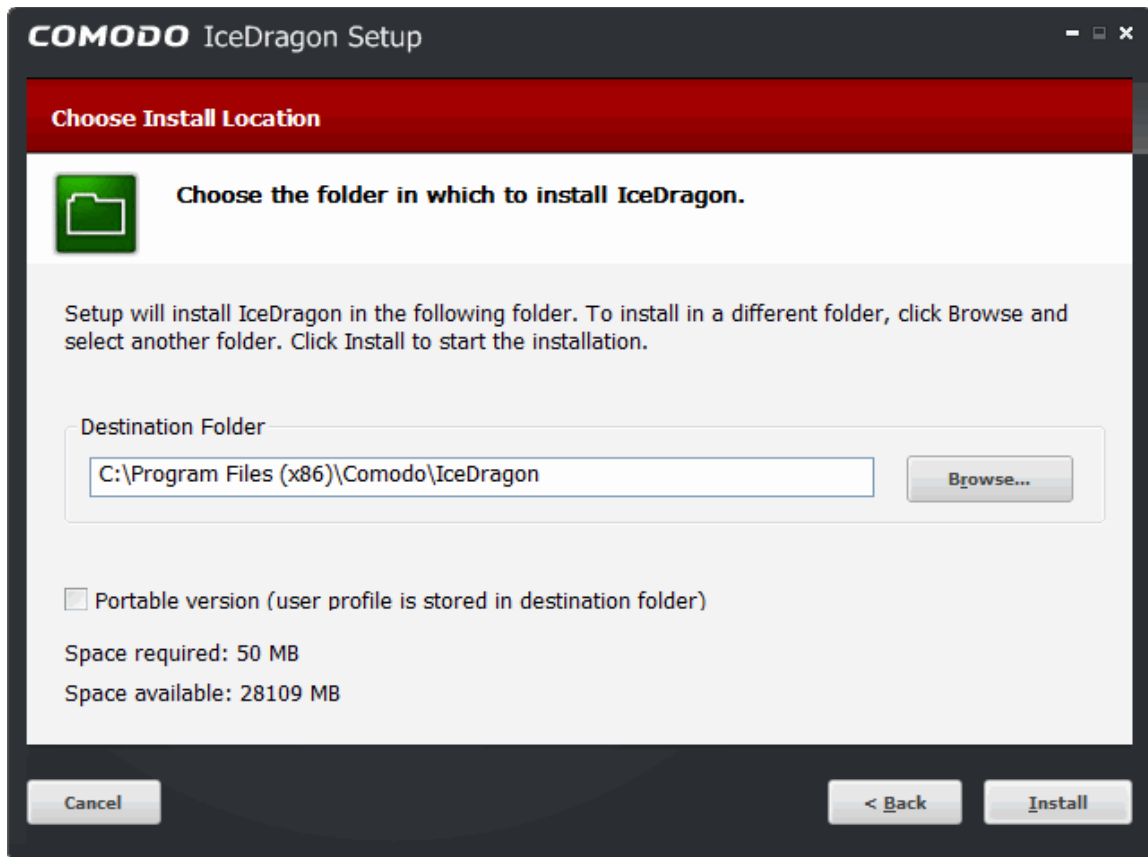


The EULA screen of the setup wizard is displayed. Complete the initialization phase by reading and accepting the End User License Agreement (EULA).

- Click 'I agree' button to continue the installation. Clicking 'Cancel' will abort the installation.

Step 2 - Select Installation Folder

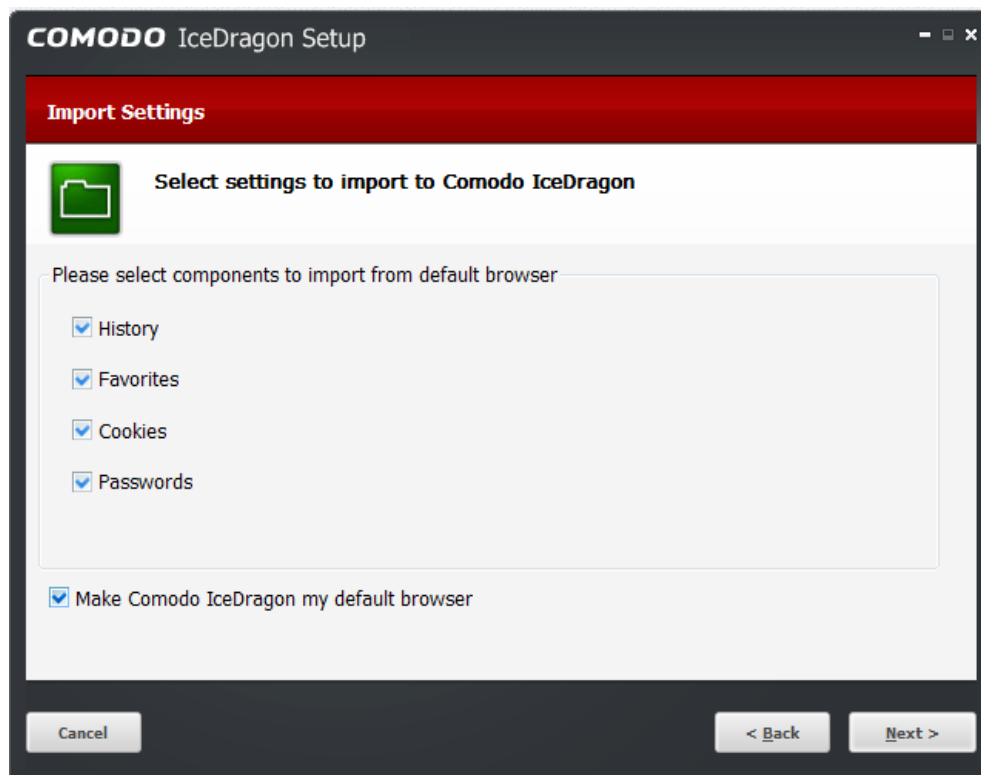
The next screen allows you to select the folder in your hard drive for installing Comodo IceDragon. The default installation paths are C:\ProgramFiles\Comodo\IceDragon (32 bit systems) and C:\Program Files(x86)\Comodo\IceDragon (64 bit systems).



If you want to install the application in a location other than the default location, click 'Browse' to choose a different location and click 'Next'.

Step 3 - Import Settings

The next screen allows you to select the components that you want to import from the current default browser in your computer to Comodo IceDragon.



Select the checkboxes beside the records that you wish to import from your default browser at this time.

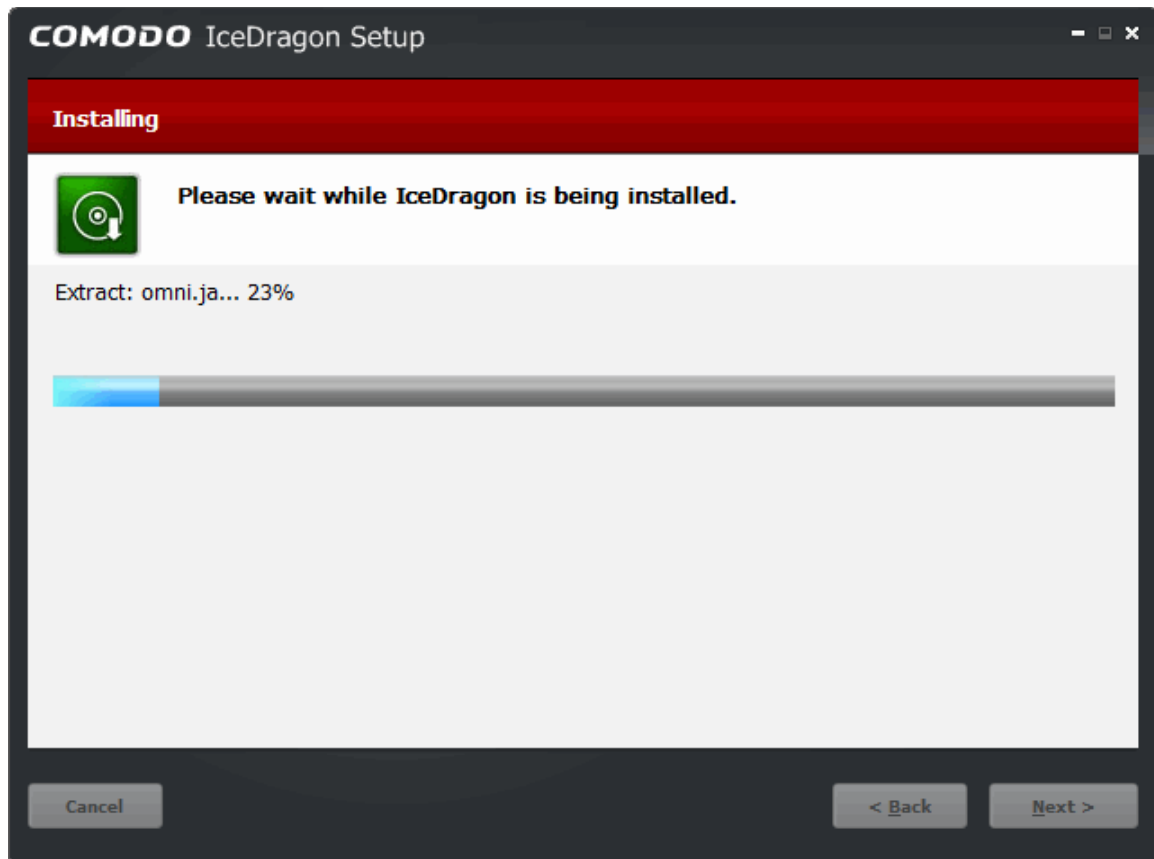
Tip: You can also import the records at later time if you have not selected any records at this time.

Leave the checkbox 'Make Comodo IceDragon my default browser' selected to make Comodo IceDragon your default browser. If you want to keep your current default browser intact, deselect the checkbox.

- Click 'Next' to continue.

Step 4 - Setup Progress

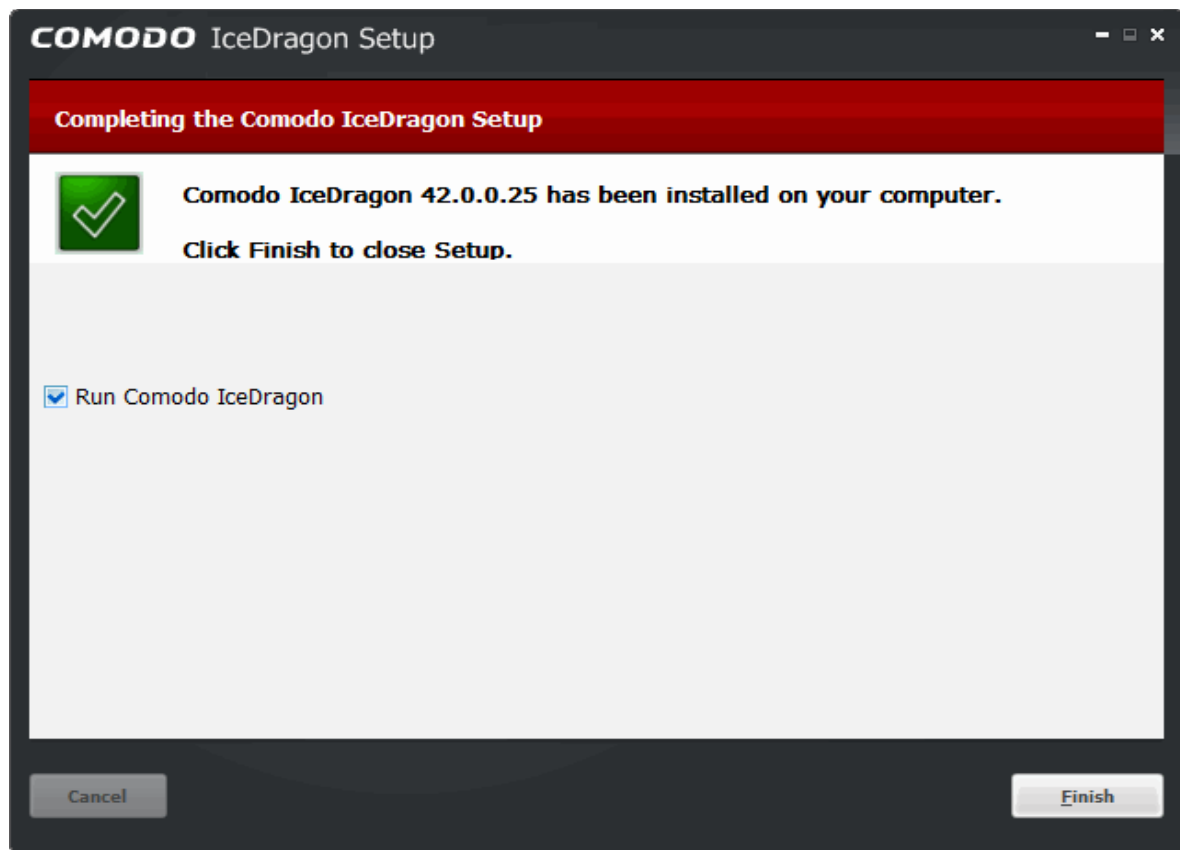
A setup status dialog box is displayed.



- Click 'Next' after the installation process is completed.

Step 5 - Installation Complete

The Installation Complete dialog is displayed indicating the successful completion of installation. Leave the checkbox 'Run Comodo IceDragon' selected to launch the browser else deselect it.

4.1. Starting Comodo IceDragon

There are two different ways to start Comodo IceDragon:

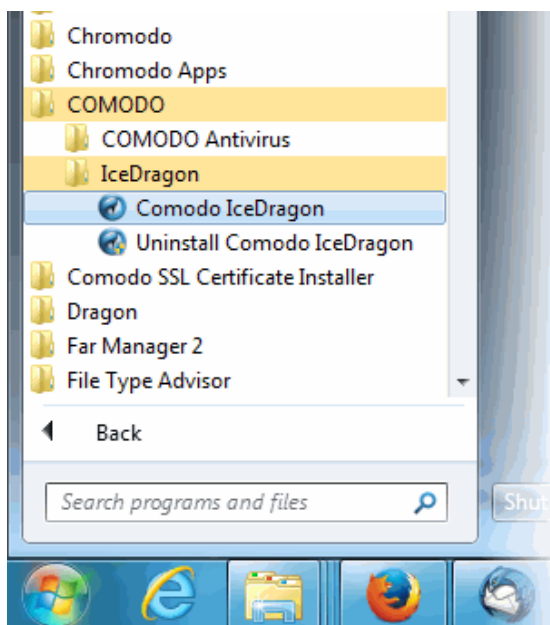
- [Start Menu](#)

- **Desktop**

Start Menu

You can launch Comodo IceDragon via the Start Menu.

- Click **Start** and select **All Programs > Comodo > IceDragon > Comodo IceDragon**



Desktop

- Just double-click the Comodo IceDragon icon on your desktop.

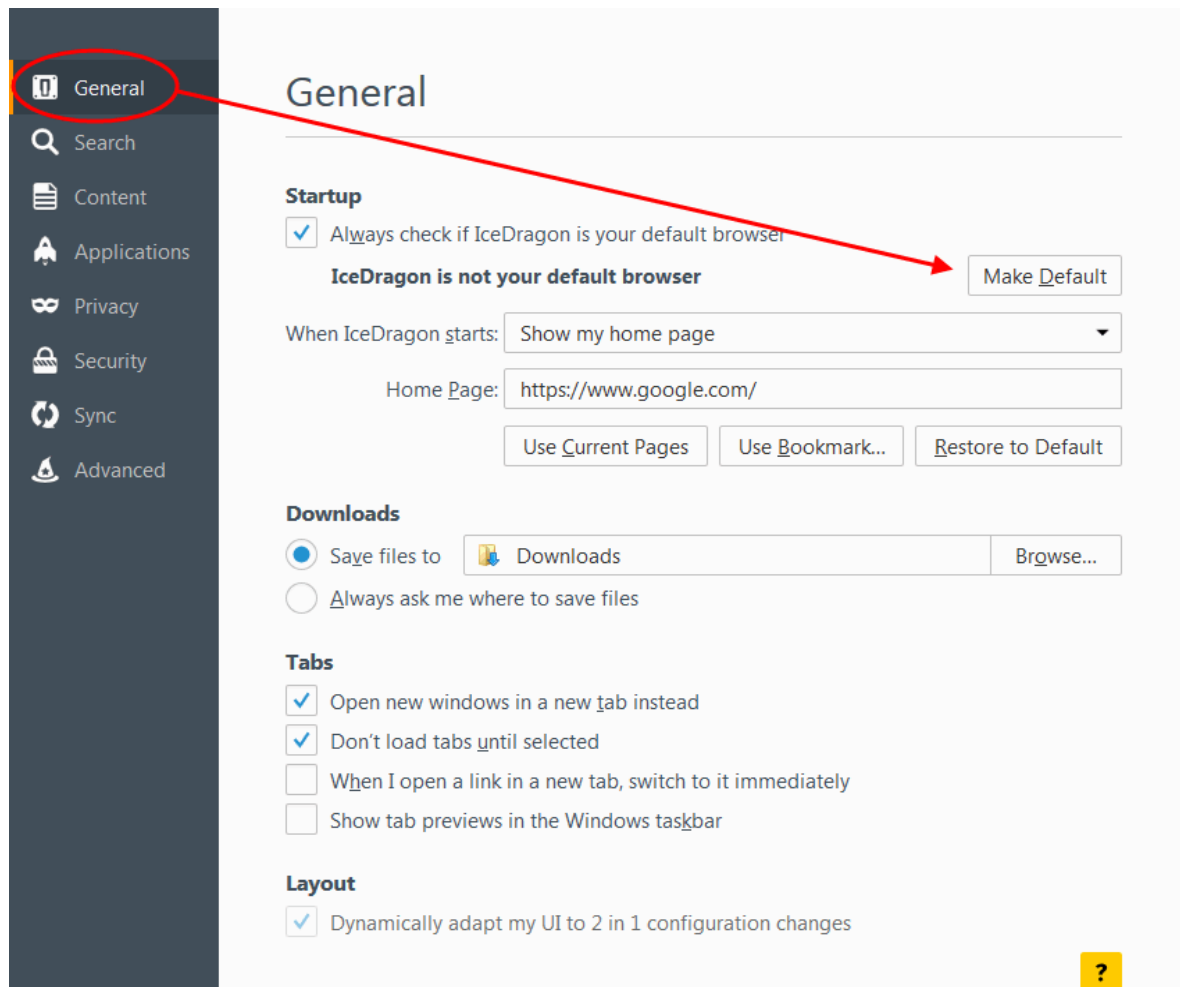

4.2. Setting IceDragon as your Default Browser

If you have more than one browser installed on your system, it's likely that you'll want to specify one of them as your default for everyday use. Setting IceDragon as your default browser means that it will automatically open and be used to display websites when you click a link in, say, an email or IM conversation.

To do this:

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser: 
- Select 'Options' > 'General' tab.
- Then click the 'Make Default' button



- Leaving the check 'Always check if IceDragon is the default browser' box enabled will instruct IceDragon to check whether or not it is the default browser every time you start the software.

4.3. Setting up Your Homepage

You can configure IceDragon to open by default at a specific web-page, to open multiple pages in different tabs, to open with a new blank page, or to open with whatever pages were open at the end of your last browsing session.

- Click the 'Options' > 'General'.
- Select what to be displayed when the browser starts from the 'When IceDragon starts' drop-down

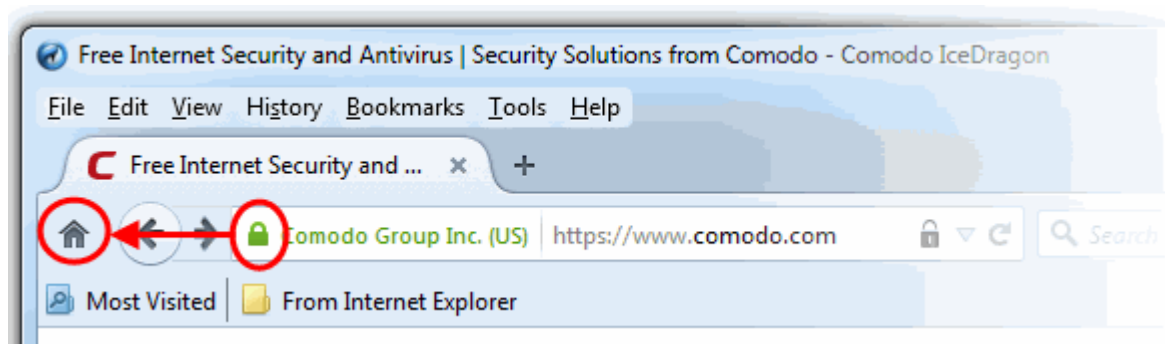

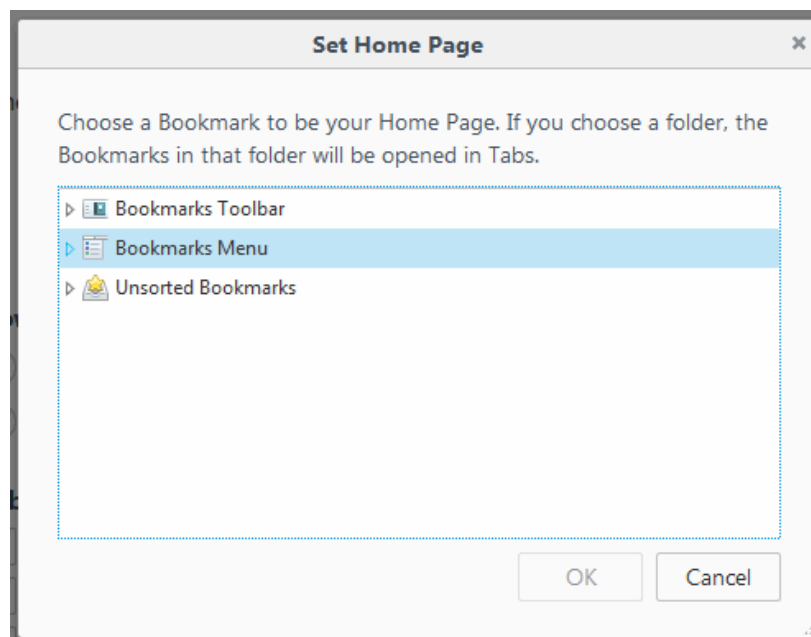

- Select your favorite page from the list and click 'OK'.

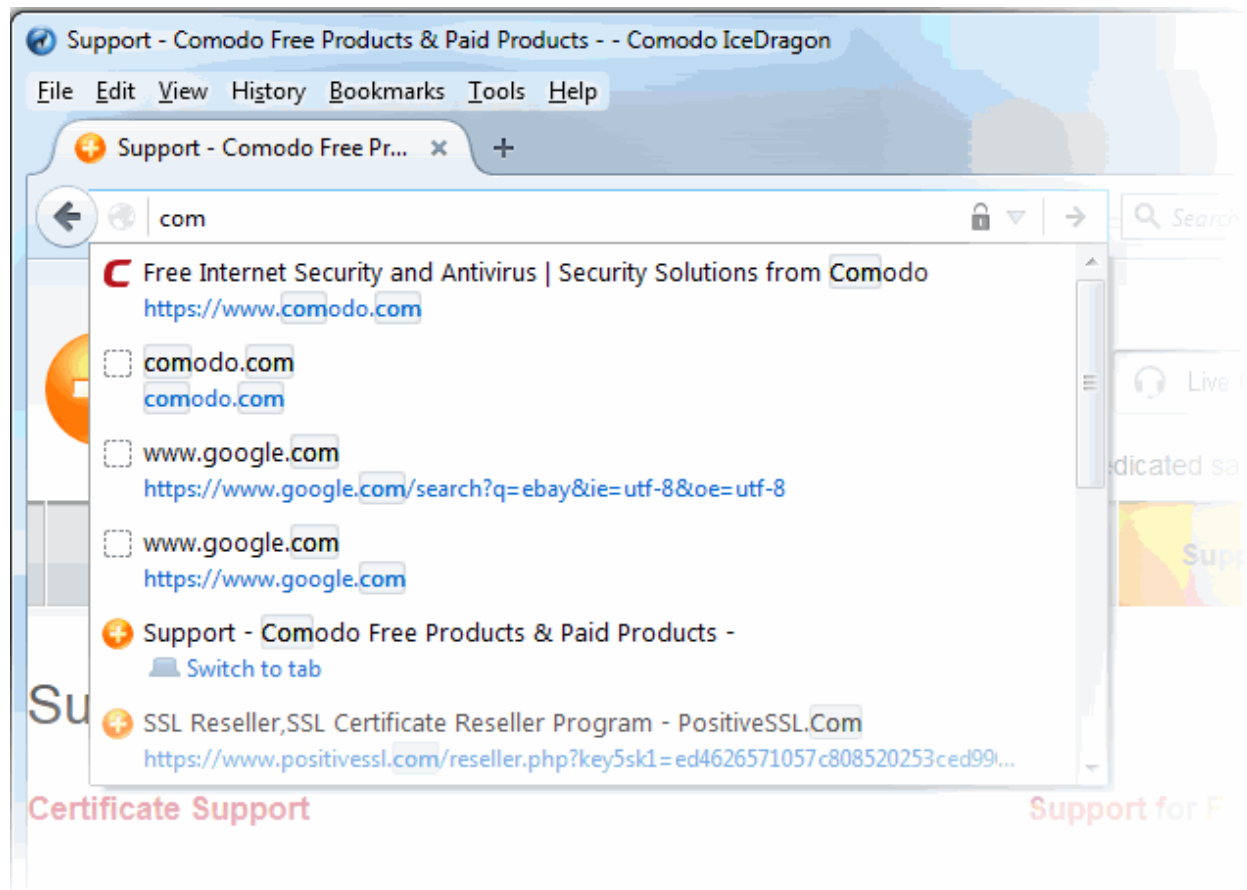

4.4. Searching the Internet

The Comodo IceDragon address bar also serves as a search box. By default, keywords typed into the address bar will use Yahoo as the search engine:

- Enter your keywords or phrases into the address bar.
- To search, click the arrow at the right side of the address bar or press 'Enter' on the keyboard.



- When you start typing a website address in the address bar, the browser automatically searches your browsing history and your bookmarks and, provides auto-complete suggestions from them. This allows you to easily find pages you have previously visited.
- You can change the default search engine as per your preference. Please see '**Changing Search Options**' for more details.

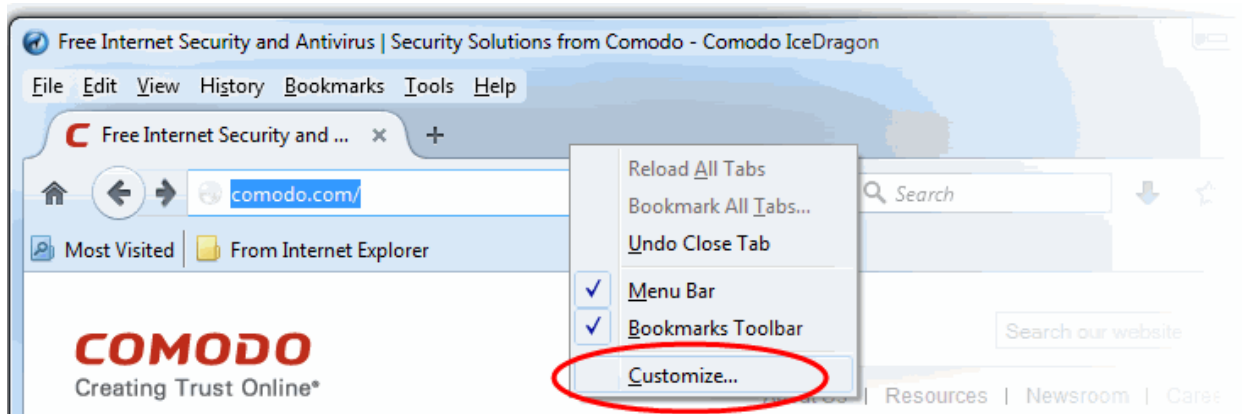

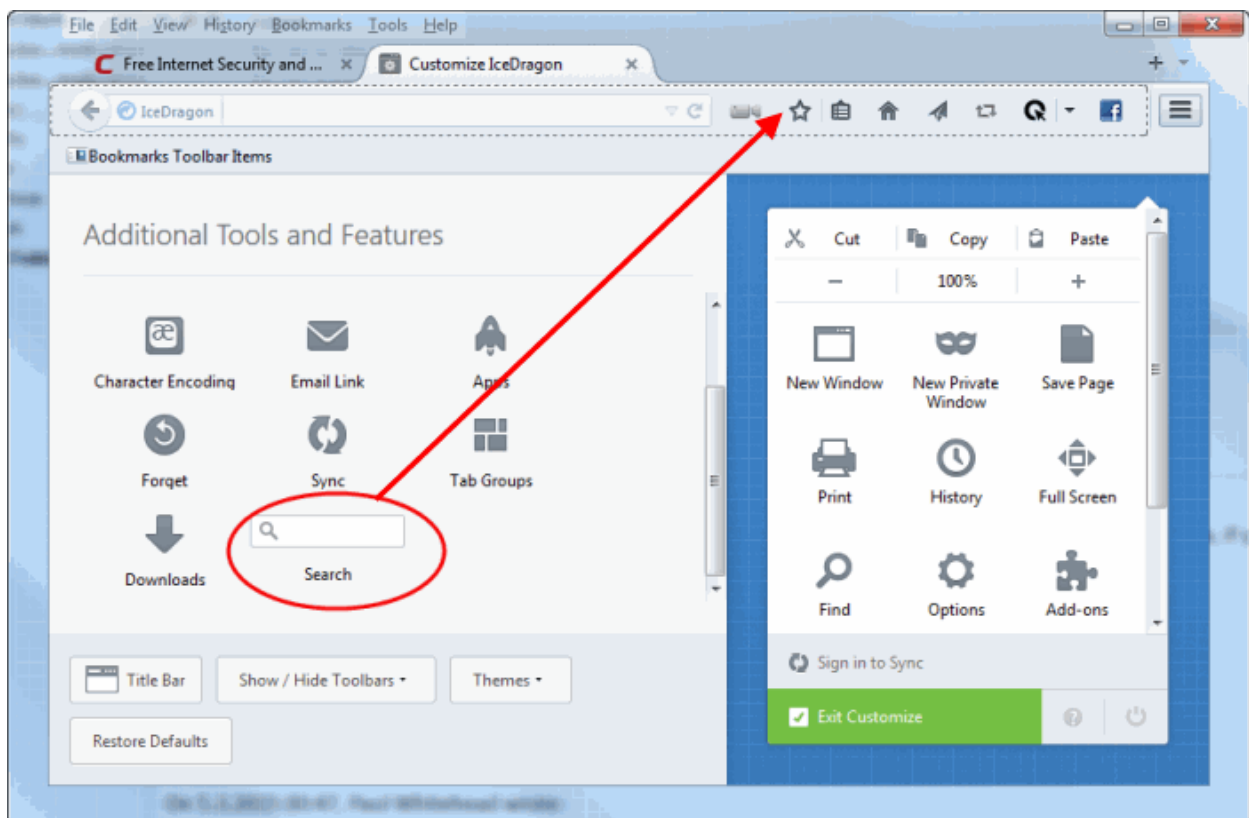
Searching using the Search Box in the tool bar

Comodo IceDragon can also display a dedicated search box to the right of the address bar. The search box is not displayed by default. To add it:

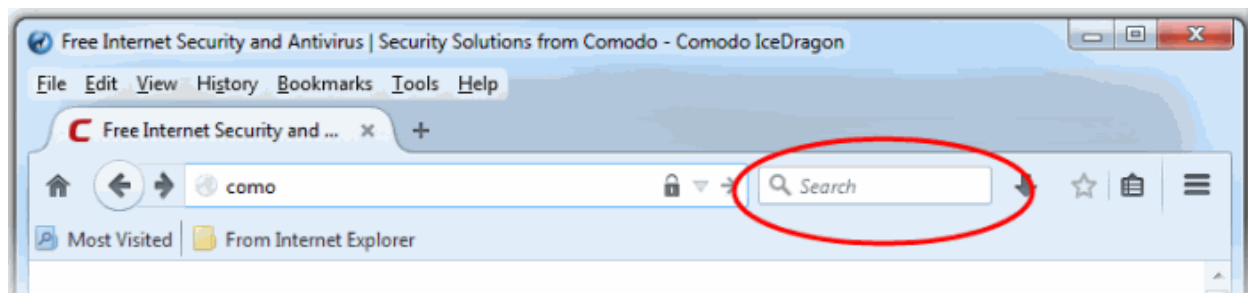
- Right-click anywhere on the file menu or navigation bar and select 'Customize'
OR
- Click the menu icon located at the right top of the interface and click the 'Customize' button



- This will open the 'Customize Toolbar' panel. This panel allows you to simply drag the items you want onto the navigation bar
- Drag the 'Search' box to the navigation tool bar.



- Click 'Exit Customize'. The search box will appear in the navigation tool bar.

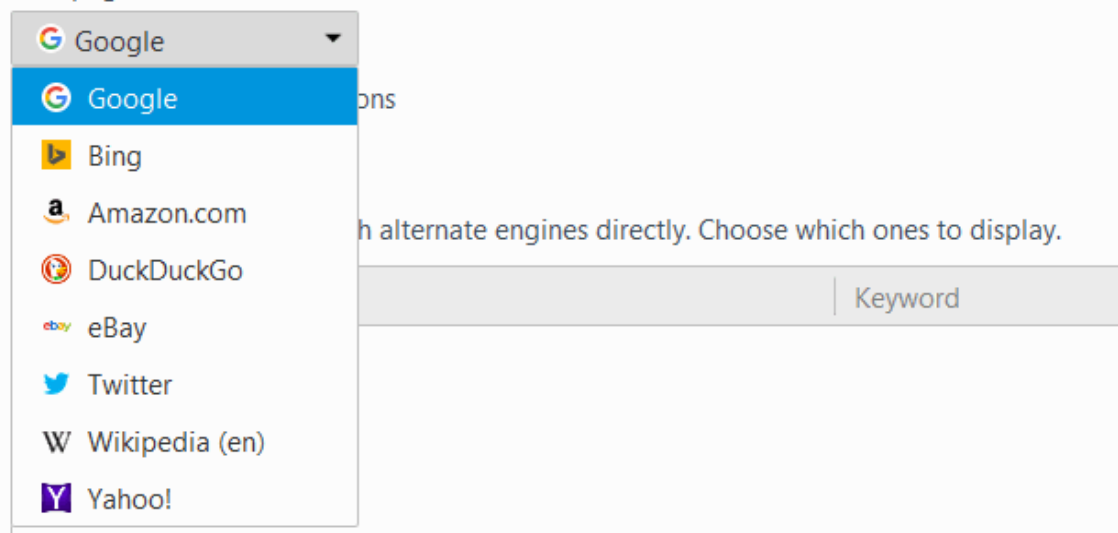


- By default, the search box uses Yahoo. To change this, click the magnifying glass in the search bar and click the 'Change Search Settings'. That will open the 'Default Search Engine' under the 'Search' tab in the 'Options' dialog with list of alternatives. Select your favorite search engine from the drop-down.

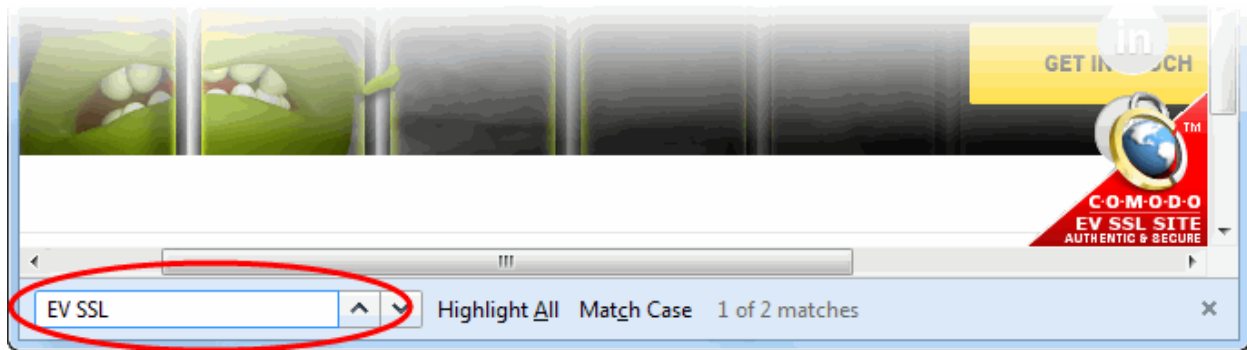

Searching within a webpage

To search for a specific keyword/phrase from within a webpage.

- Click the Ice Dragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser and click 'Find '
- or
- Press Ctrl + F on the keyboard.
- A 'Find' box will be displayed at the bottom right of the window:



- Enter your search key in the 'Find' box and click on the arrow or 'Match Case', The key term will be highlighted at its first occurrence in the web page.
- To find the successive occurrences, click 'Match Case'.
- If you want the browser to highlight the key term at all its occurrences, click 'Highlight All'.

Searching the Internet for a keyword from within a webpage

- Highlight the word/phrase using your mouse, right click and select Search <your default search engine > for "<selected keyword>".



- Highlight the word/phrase using your mouse, copy using right click options or pressing Ctrl + C and paste it in to the address bar or the search box.
- Highlight the word/phrase using your mouse and drag it and drop in the address bar or the search box.

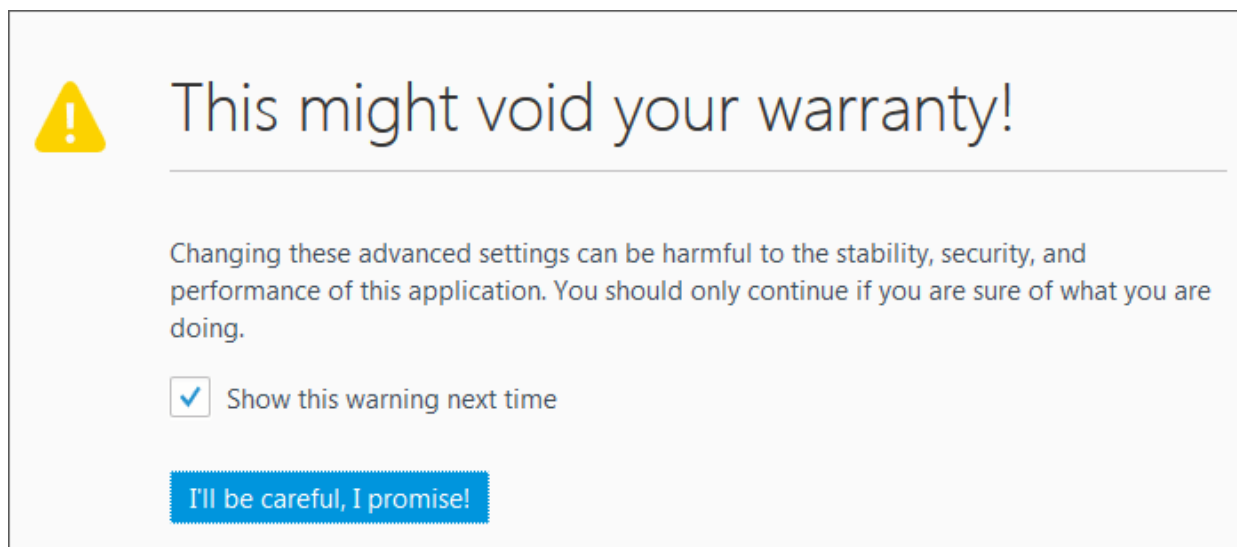

To change the search engine

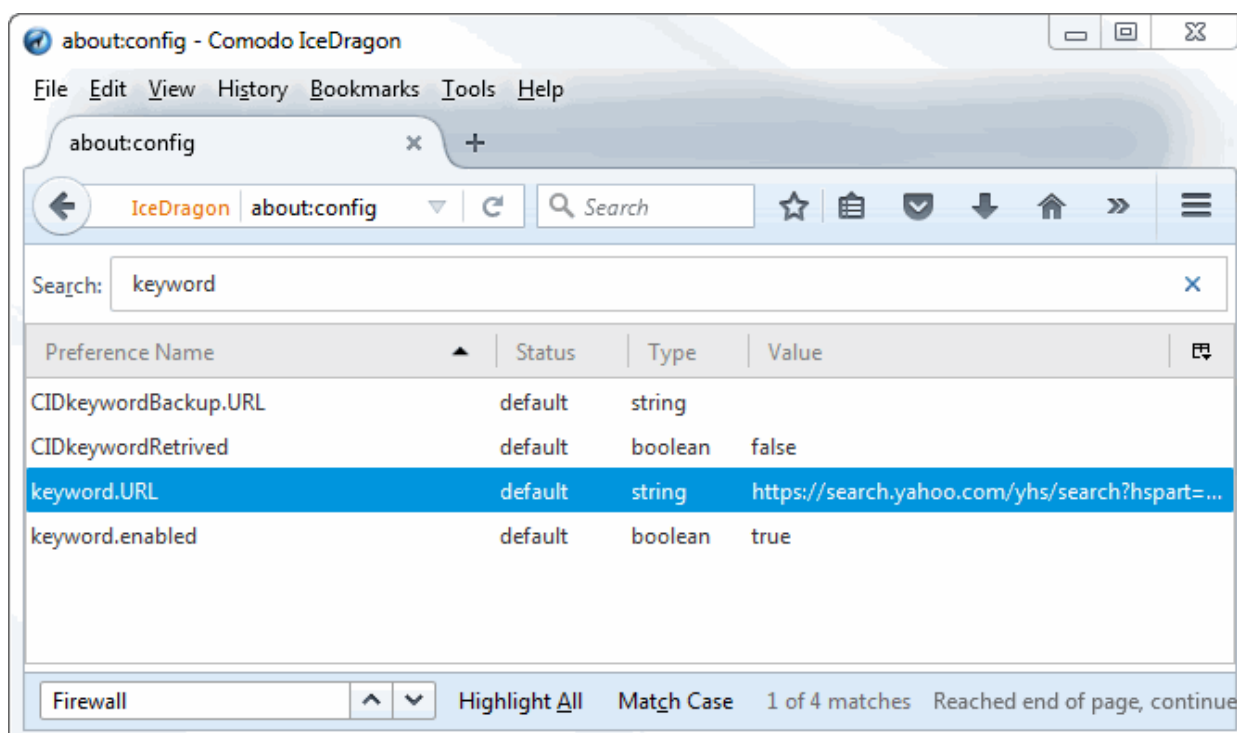
- Type 'about:config' in the address bar and press 'Enter' from the keyboard
- A warning will be displayed.



- Click 'I'll be careful, I promise!'

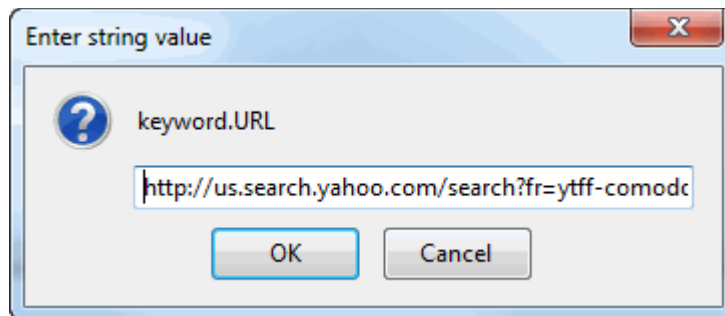
The configuration page will be displayed.

- Type 'keyword' in the search field then double click in the **Keyword.URL** entry.



The **Keyword.URL** dialog will be displayed.

- Type the URL for your desired search engine



- To use Yahoo! Search engine, type “http://search.yahoo.com/search?p=”
- To use Bing search engine, type “http://www.bing.com/search?q=”
- To search Wikipedia for the keyword, type “http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/”
- Click 'OK'
- To reset to Yahoo search engine, erase the content in the **keyword.URL** dialog and click 'OK'

To turn keyword search off


- Type 'about:config' in the address bar and press 'Enter' from the keyboard
- Click 'I'll be careful, I promise!' in the warning dialog to view the About Config page
- Type Keyword in the search bar to reach the item 'keyword.enabled'
- Double click on the item to change the value of the item to 'false'

The keyword search from the address bar will be stopped. To enable the feature again, follow the same procedure to change the value to 'true'.

Configuring URL Suggestions

Comodo IceDragon displays a list of suggestions as you start typing a URL in the address bar by searching matching strings from your browsing history and bookmarks. You can configure the items to be searched for providing suggestions.

To configure suggestions

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Privacy'
- 'Location Bar' - Leave all check boxes enabled to draw suggestions from History, Bookmarks and Open tabs when typing in the address bar.

When using the location bar, suggest:

- History
- Bookmarks
- Open tabs



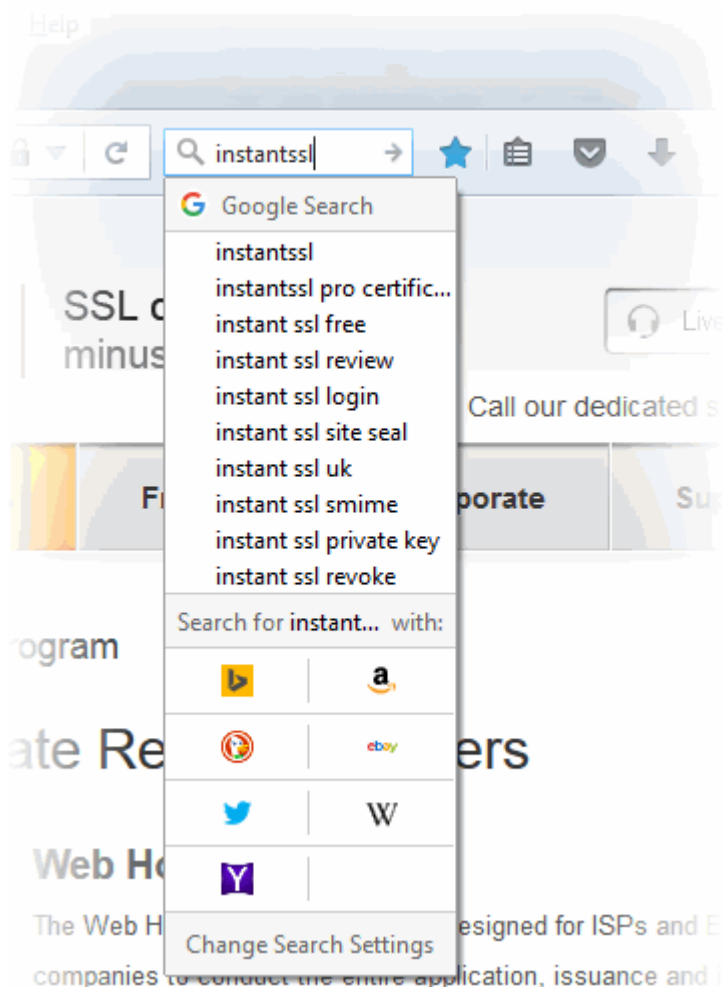
Enabling or disabling search suggestions

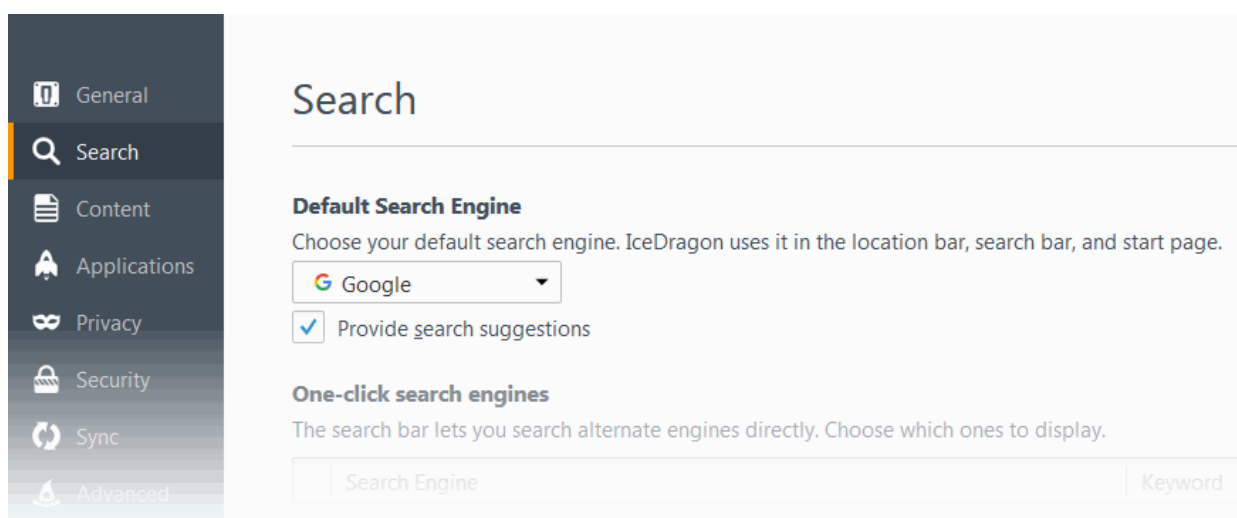
To enable or disable search suggestions through the Search Bar

- Right-click on the Search bar
- Deselect 'Show Suggestions'



To enable or disable search suggestions through the Search Engines Manager

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Search' tab
- Uncheckbox/ checkbox 'Provide search suggestions' to disable / enable search suggestions

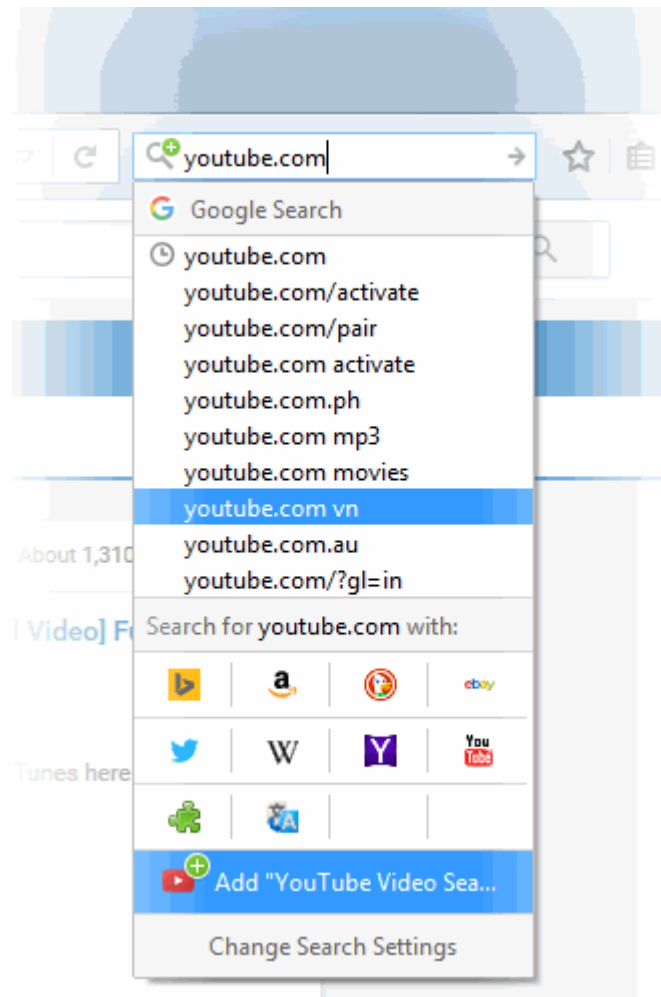


To add search engines using add-ons

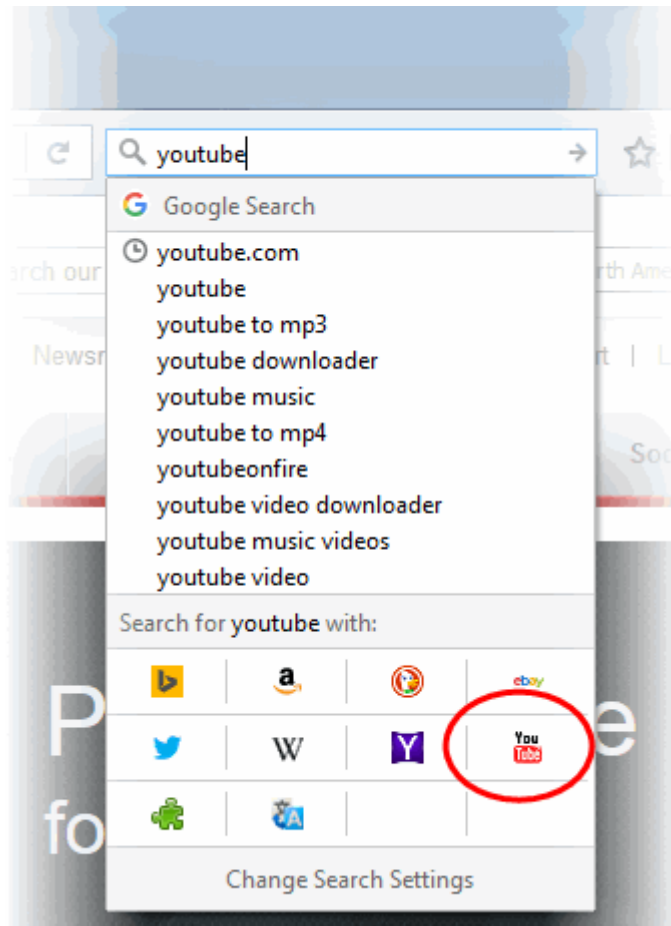
- Click on the magnifying glass in the Search bar
- The 'Options' will be opened
- Click the '[Add more search engines](#)' link
- You will be taken to the Firefox add-ons

To add a specific search engines

- Open the website
- Click on the magnifying glass  on the Search bar



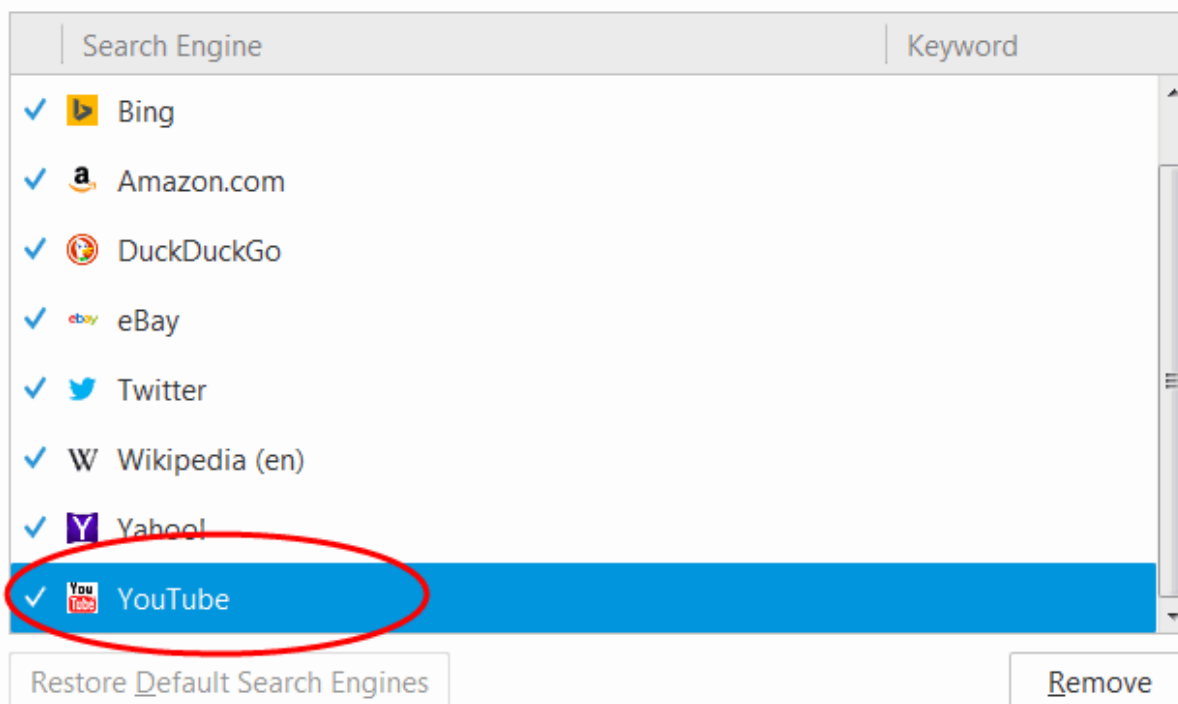
It will be appeared in your built-in search options

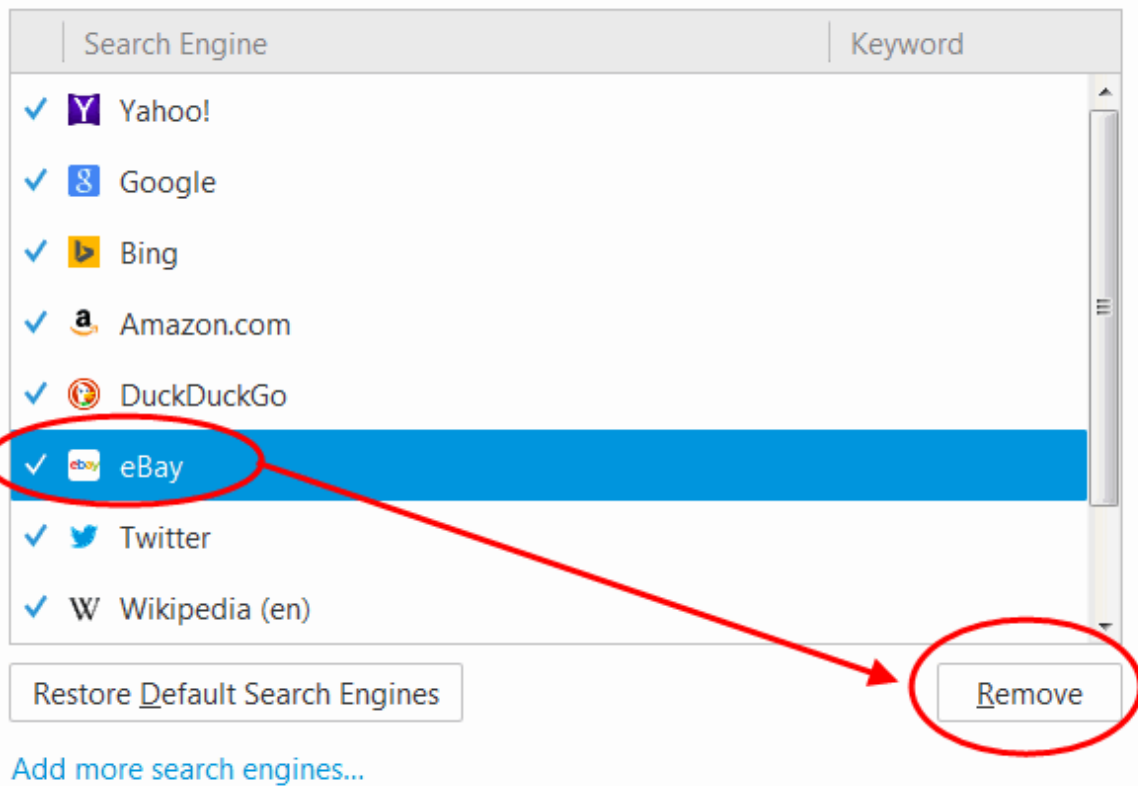

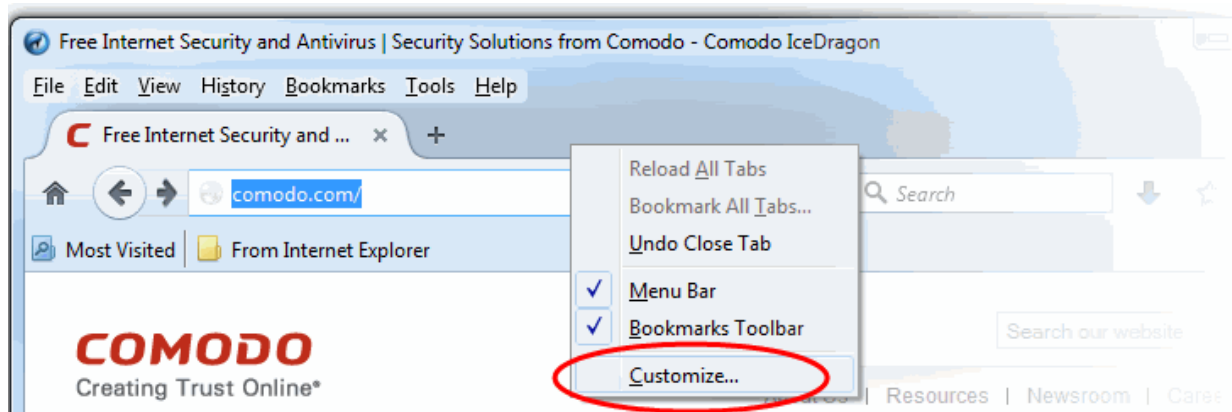

4.6. Customizing the Toolbar

The IceDragon toolbar contains shortcuts to items such as your homepage and bookmarks. The contents of the toolbar are fully customizable.

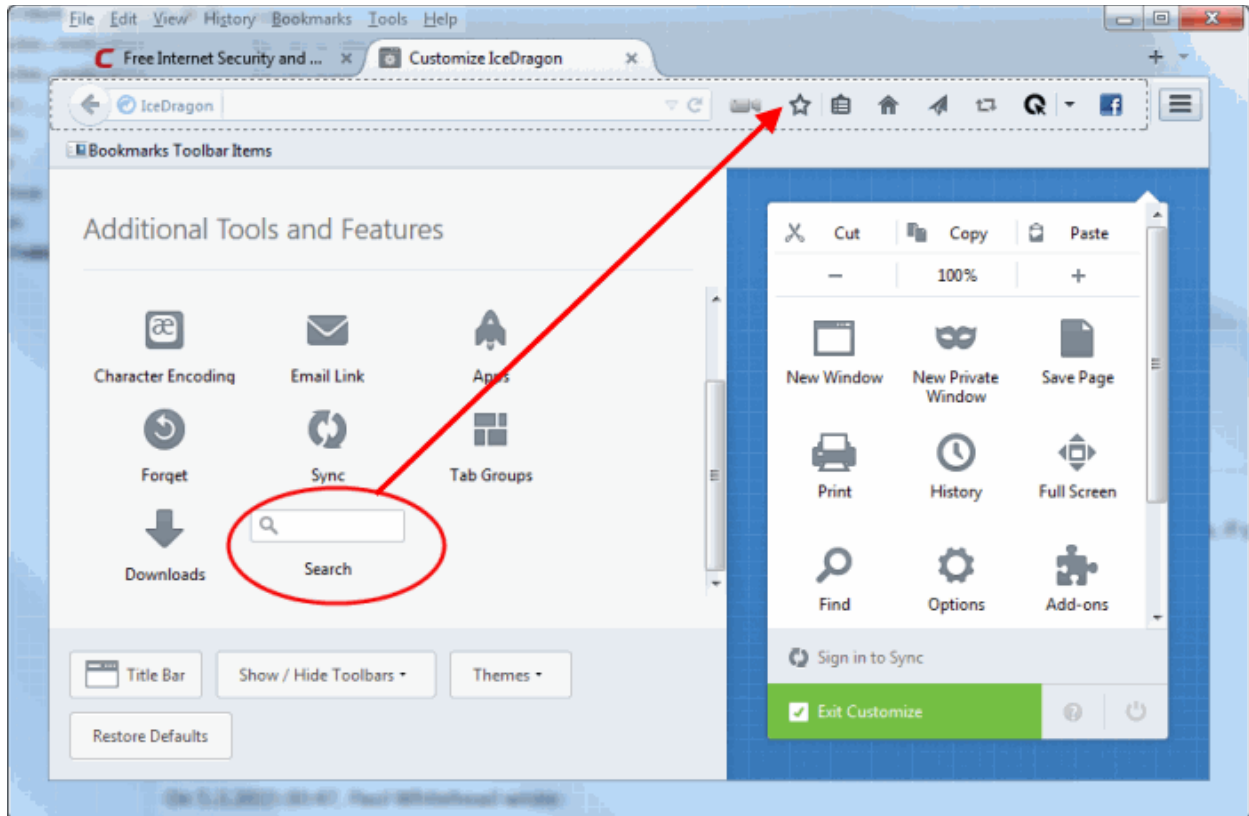
To add or remove items on the toolbar

- Right-click anywhere on the file menu or navigation bar and select 'Customize'

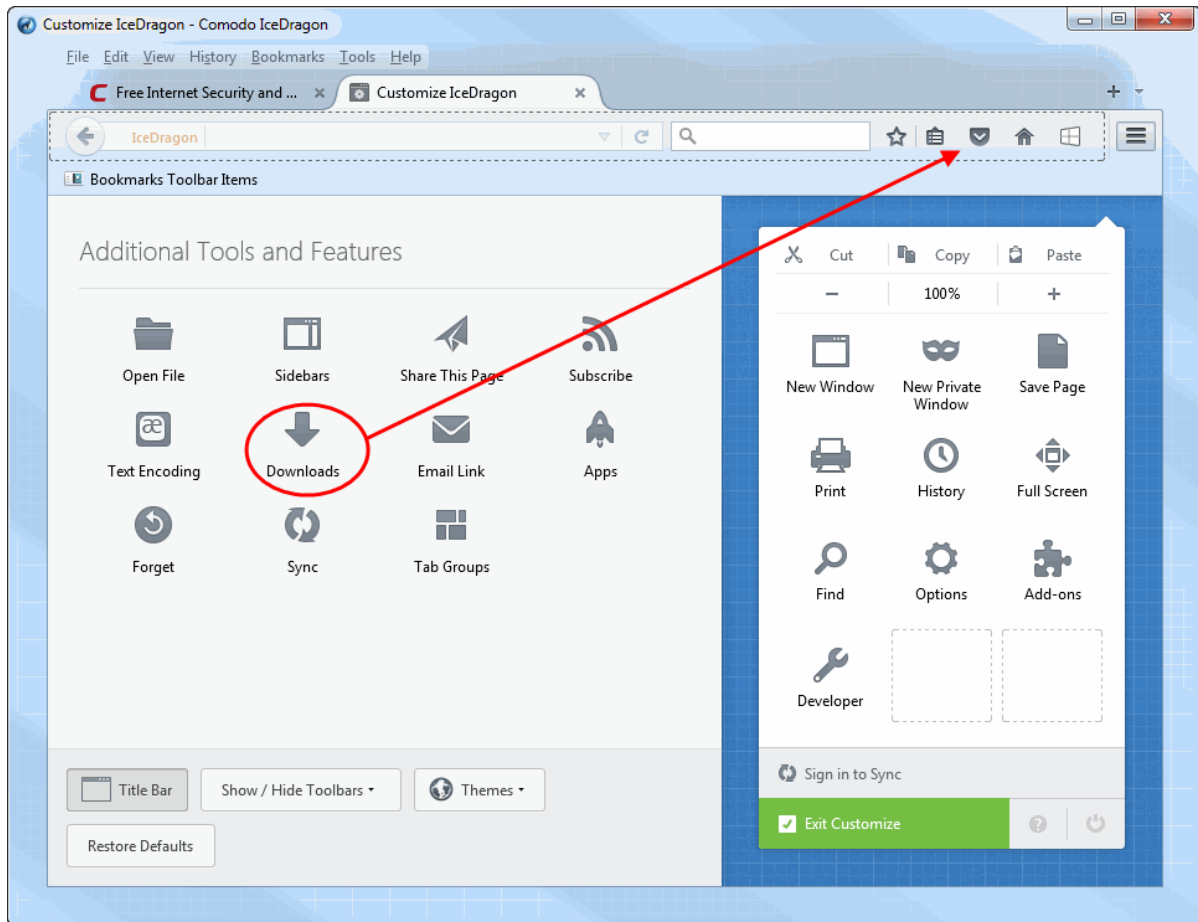


- This will open the 'Customize Toolbar' panel. This panel allows you to simply drag the items you want onto the navigation bar

- The example below shows how to drag the 'Search' box to the navigation tool bar.

























- To add a tool, drag it from the dialog and drop on the toolbar. Refer to the **table below** for descriptions of icons.
- To remove a tool, drag it from the toolbar and drop it into the 'Customize Toolbar' interface
- Click on the 'Title Bar' to display or hide the title bar
- Use the 'Show/Hide Toolbars:' drop down to check or uncheck the Menu bar or Bookmarks toolbar
- To set a theme, click the 'Theme' drop down to 'Manage' or 'Get more theme'. You will be taken to IceDragon *about:addons* or Firefox add-ons webpage
- Click 'Restore Default' to return IceDragon toolbars to their original state
- Click 'Sign in to sync' to share your data and preferences through your devices.







- Click 'Exit Customize' for your settings to take effect.

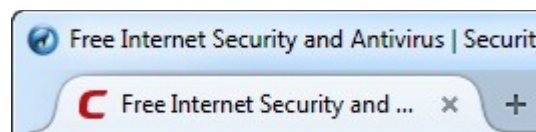
4.7.Re-opening Recently and Most Visited Websites

If you accidentally closed a page without bookmarking and decide you need to see it again, then you can use the 'Most visited' and 'Recently Closed Tabs' features.

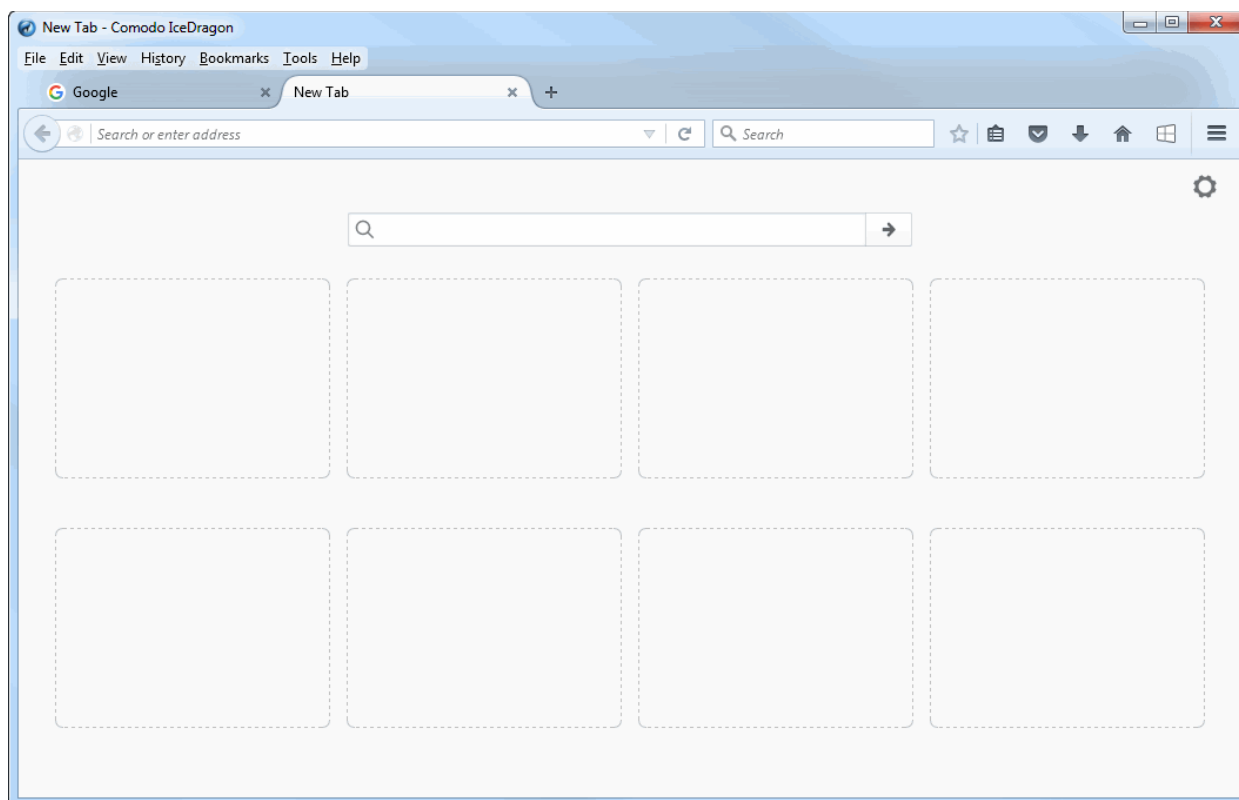
When you open a blank new tab in IceDragon, you will see thumbnails of your most visited sites so you can quickly re-open them.

To view recent and most visited websites:

- Click the  icon on the right of your open tabs:

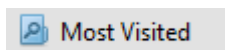


A tab will open containing thumbnails of your twelve most visited sites.



To set the browser displays 'Most Visited'

- In the address, type `about:config` and click 'Enter'.
- The `about:config` "This might void your warranty!" warning page will appear. Click 'I'll be careful, I promise!'
- Scroll down to `browser.places.smartBookmarksVersion`.
- Double-click on `browser.places.smartBookmarksVersion` and change the value to 0 (zero).
- At the top of the IceDragon window, click the File menu > Exit.



To disable the browser displays 'Most Visited'

- Type `about:config` into the address bar.
- The `about:config` "This might void your warranty!" warning page will appear. Click 'I'll be careful, I promise!'.
- Type "tab" in the 'Search' field at the top of the list.
- Scroll down to: `browser.newtab.url`.
- Double-click on `browser.newtab.url` to change the value to "`about:blank`".
- At the top of the IceDragon window, click the File menu > Exit.

To view recently closed tab

- You can access the 'Recently Closed Tabs' list under the 'History' menu.
- To open all recently closed tabs in a new tabbed window select 'Restore all Tabs'.

4.8. Viewing Browsing History

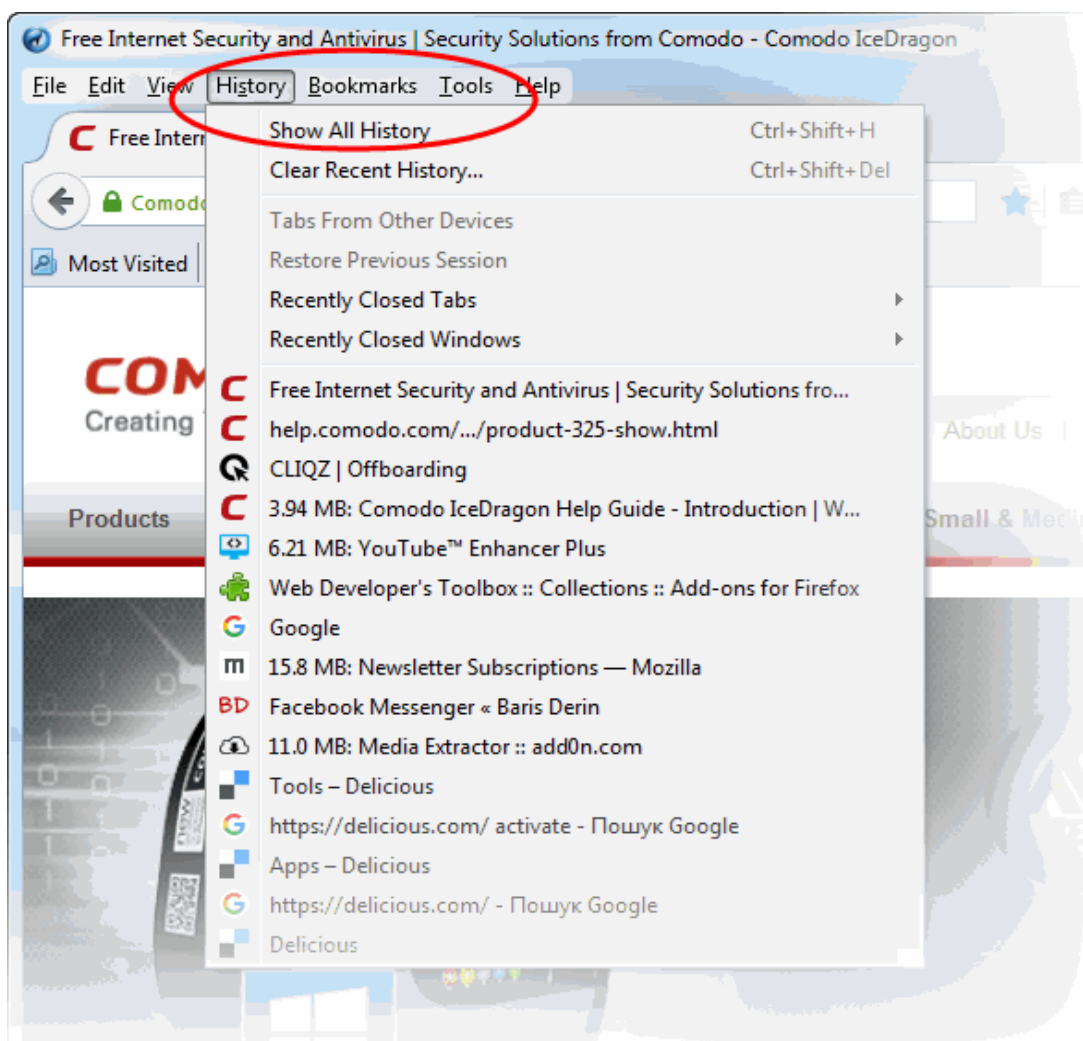
Comodo IceDragon will store a log of web pages that you have visited for the past 10 weeks. From time to time you may find it useful to look back through your history in order to revisit a particular site. Please note that Comodo IceDragon stores the history only when it is used in standard mode and not in Private Browsing mode. Also, it does not store the browsing history when browsing through secure websites. Comodo IceDragon also makes it easy for you to manually delete your browsing history and thus further safeguard your privacy. Refer to [Deleting your Browsing History](#) for more details.

To view a quick list of your browsing history

- Click on the 'History' from the menu bar. A list of webpages that you have browsed in the recent past will be displayed.



- Click on the page you want to re-visit.

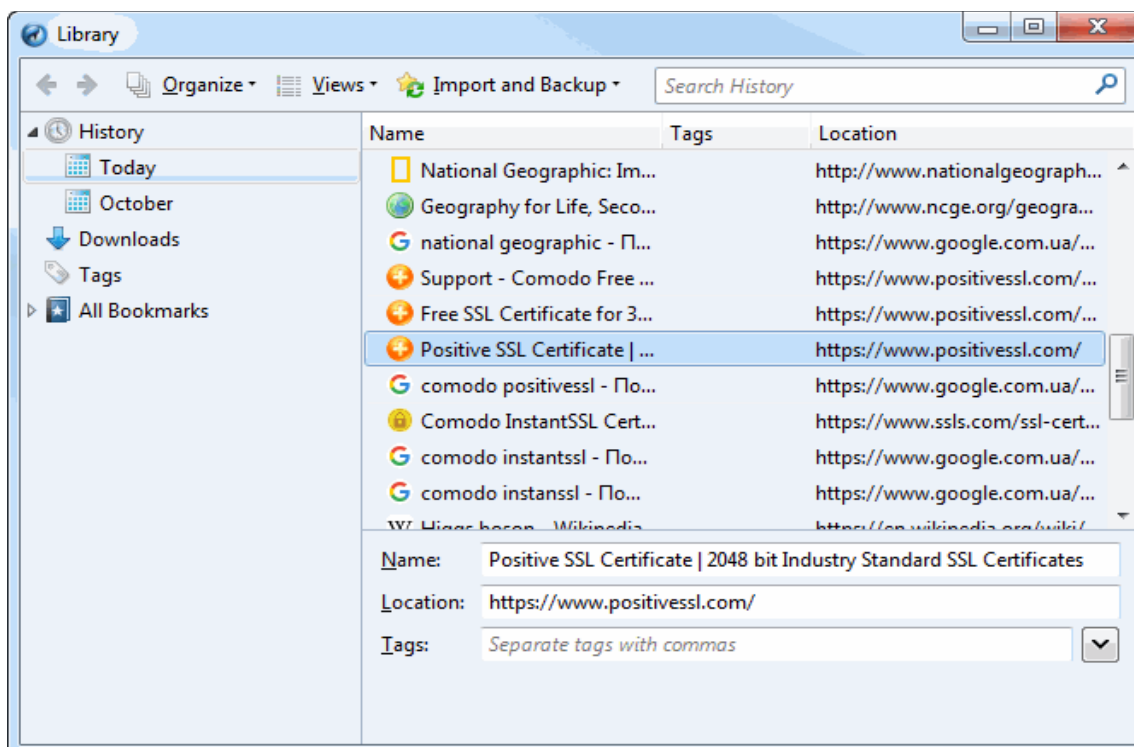
You can also see the pages that you have visited in your present browsing session by clicking and holding down the forward and backward arrows adjacent to the address bar. Hover over a result and release the mouse key to switch to that page.

Viewing full browsing history

- Click the 'History' from the menu bar and select 'Show All History'. A library window will be displayed.
- Select 'History' from the left hand side navigation pane.

- Alternatively, you can open the Library window by clicking 'Bookmarks' > 'Show All Bookmarks' and then select 'History' from the LHS pane.

Double click on the time period for which you want to see the browsing history from yesterday, past one week and previous months.



The list of visited pages for that time period will be displayed.

- Double click on the webpage you want to re-visit.

Comodo IceDragon enables you to change the way the webpages are shown on your screen as per your likes. You can configure the fonts, colors and the language in which the content in a webpage should be displayed on your browser so that it would be easier for you to read or be more appealing.

To configure fonts and colors

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click the 'Options' > 'Content'
- Click the 'Default fonts' drop-down under 'Fonts and Colors' and select the font and font size that you want the browser to display.

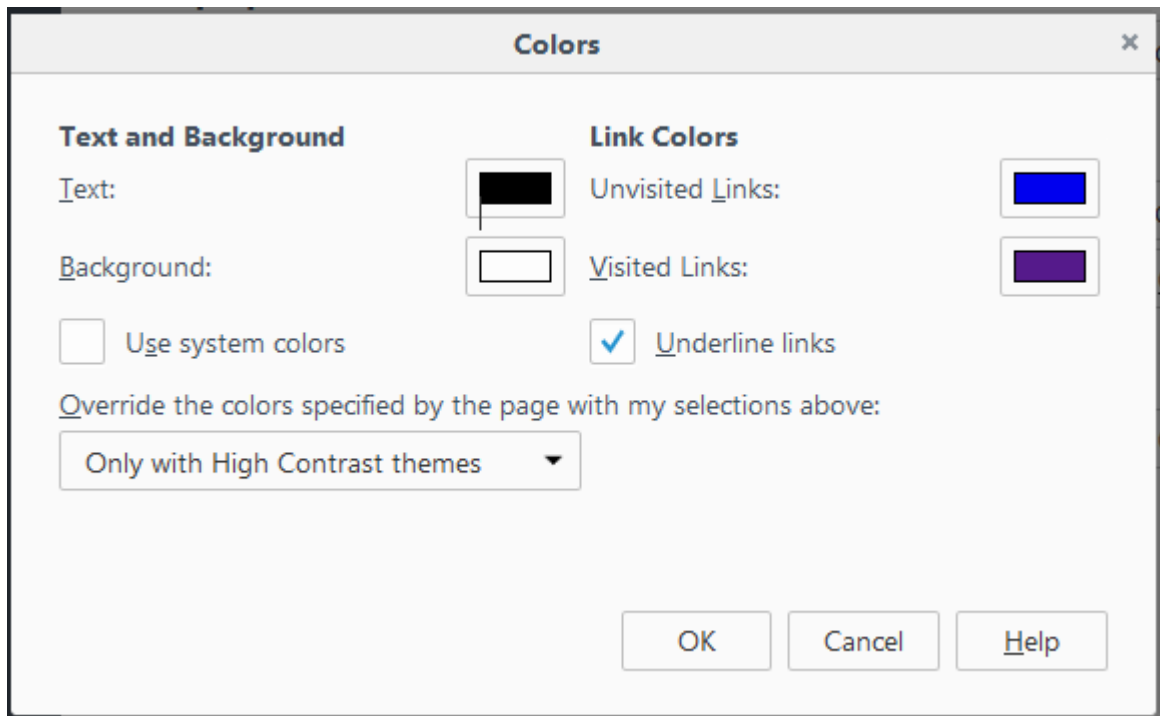

The fonts for various components of the text as per the chosen default font and the character encoding language indicated at the top field are displayed. If you want, you can change them, by selecting the desired character encoding language and respective fonts from the respective drop-down menus.

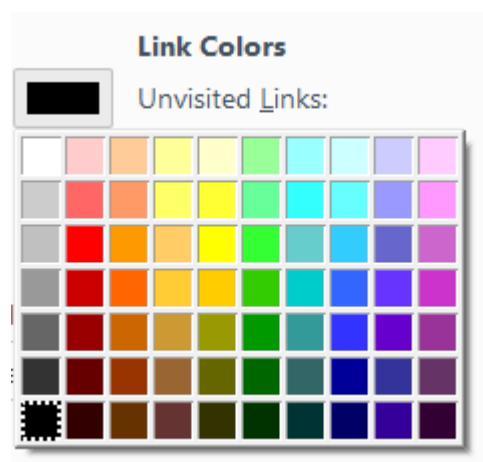
Deselect the check box 'Allow pages to choose their own fonts, instead of my selections above', to disable the browser from using the fonts and colors as set by the websites and to display the pages with your font/color choices.

You can also change the character encoding language from the default Character Encoding language from the 'Default Character Encoding' drop-down.

- Click 'Colors' beneath the Advanced button to open the colors interface box.




- Change the colors in which the text, background and links are displayed by clicking on the color patch and selecting the desired color from the palette.



- Deselect the check box 'Allow pages to choose their own colors, instead of my selections above' and click 'OK'.

To configure the language

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > click 'Choose' button under the 'Content' section. The 'Language' dialog will be displayed

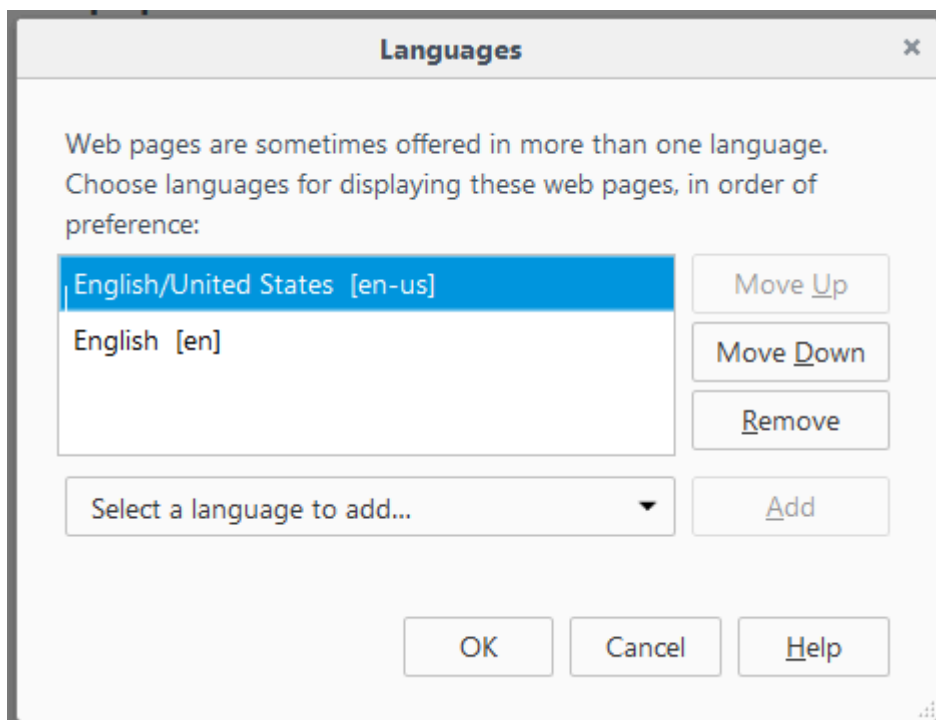

- The languages that are currently added to the browser are listed in the order of their usage preference.




- To add a new language to the browser, click the drop-down button beside 'Select a language to add...', select your desired language from the drop-down, click 'Add'.
- To change the order of preference of languages to be used by the browser, select the language and use 'Move Up' and 'Move Down' keys.
- To remove a language from the browser, select the language and click 'Remove'.
- Click 'OK' for your changes to take effect.

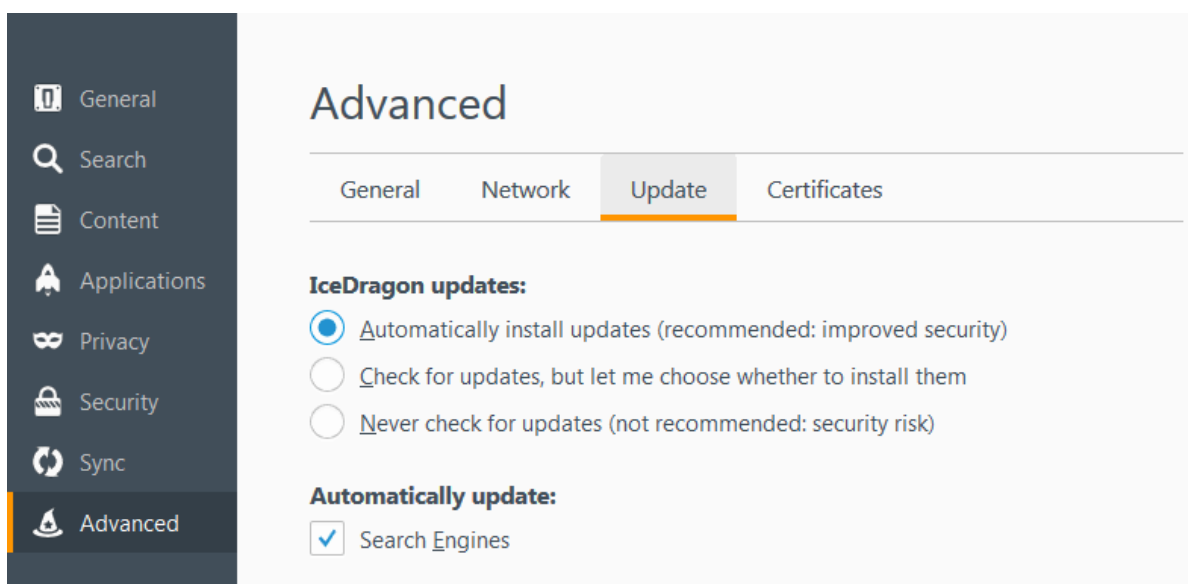
4.10. Configuring IceDragon Updates

To make sure that you are protected by the latest security one hand touch updates is a small amounts of new code, Comodo IceDragon automatically/manually updates whenever it detects that a new version of the browser is available.


- By default, the updates will be downloaded in the background and installed automatically when one is available or when you restart IceDragon.
- The notification to restart IceDragon and install the update will be displayed if the updates has been waiting to be installed for more than 24 hours.

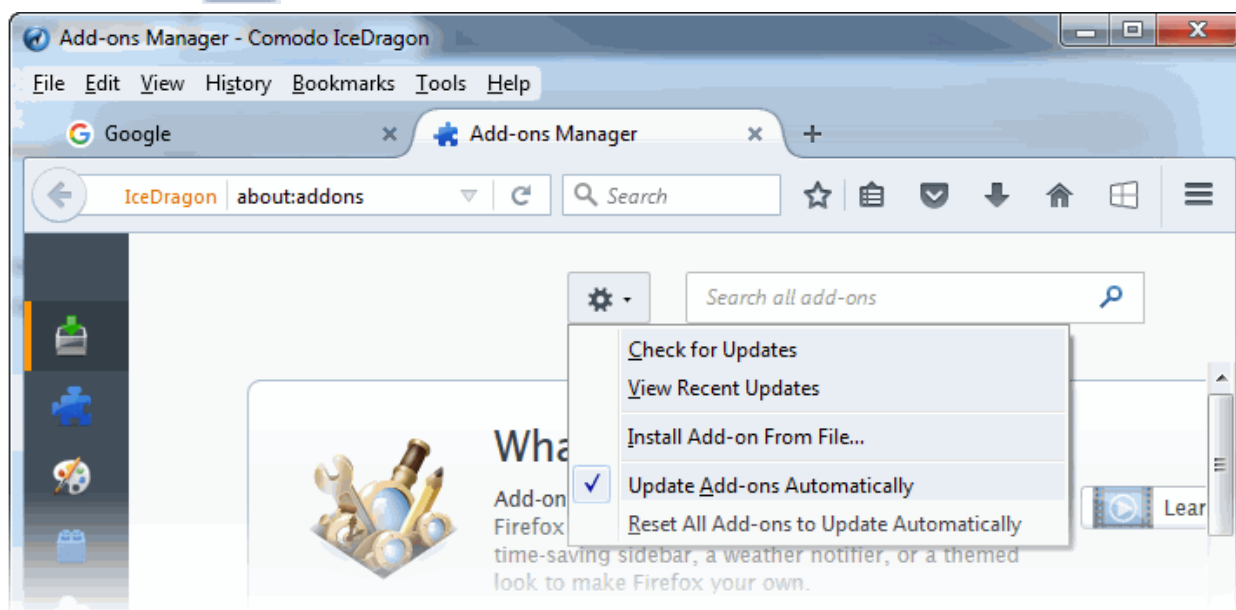
To configure updates automatically

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Advanced' panel.
- Under the 'Update' tab select check the 'Search Engines' box to receive automatic updates to your search engines.



If automatic updates are disabled then IceDragon will not silently install updates. Instead, you will be alerted when updates are available via the notification bar.

- Alternatively, you can check for updates or review whether the IceDragon updates are available by clicking the Add-ons.
- Press the  icon > select 'Check for Updates' or 'View Recent Updates'.



To configure updates manually

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu at the top left corner of the browser.
- Click 'Options' from the 'Options' menu.
- Click the 'Advanced' panel.
- Under the 'Update' tab select,
 - Check the '**Automatically install updates (recommended: improved security)**' box to automatically download and install updates.
 - **Check for updates, but let me choose whether to install them:** Allows you to choose a moment when to download and install updates. You can download them at a later time, if you do not choose to do that.
 - **Never check for updates (not recommended: security risk):** IceDragon won't check for updates. *Note:* Selecting this setting will disable you from receiving critical security updates that may keep you safe online unless

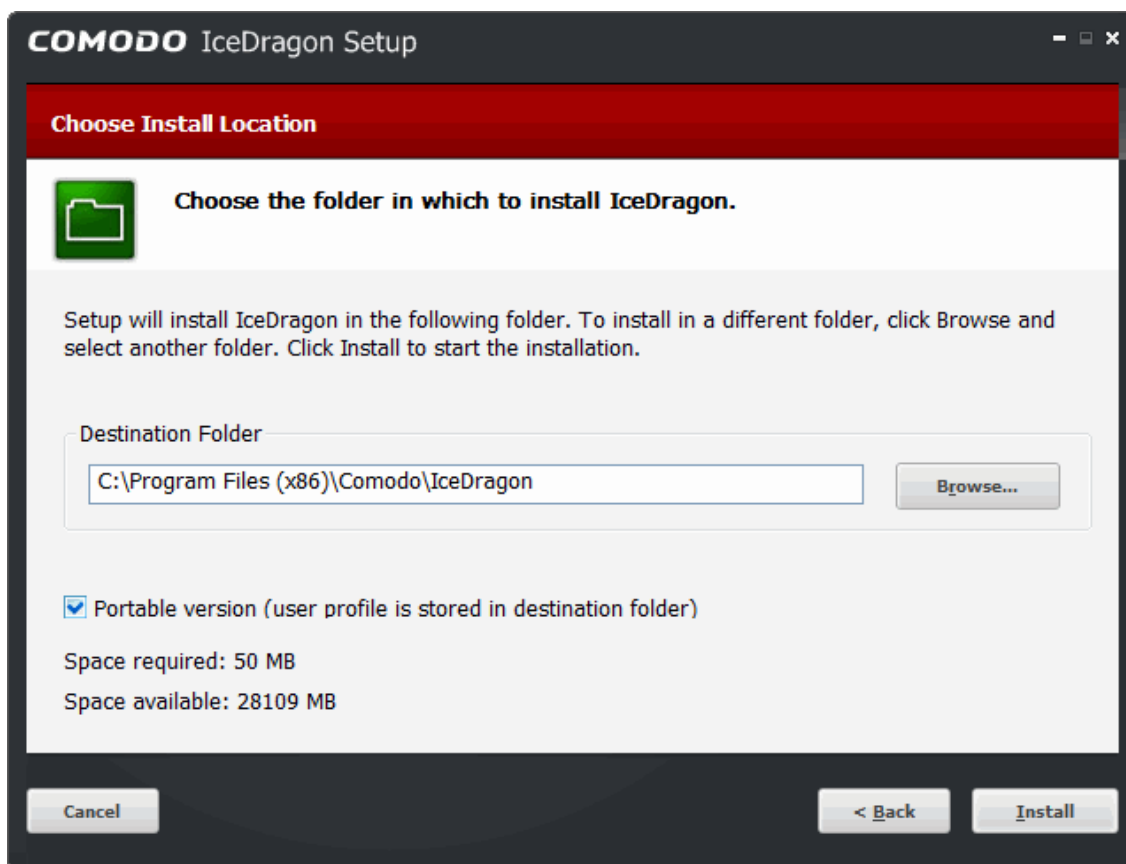
you frequently do a manual check for updates.

4.11. Portable Version

Comodo IceDragon can also be installed in portable mode. As the name suggests, portable mode allows users to quickly launch and use their pre-configured Comodo IceDragon on any computer without the need to install, import bookmarks or modify settings.

In portable mode, the user profile (configuration data) is written to the IceDragon installation folder instead of the Windows 'user' folder on the local machine. Therefore, by simply copying the installation folder to another drive (such as a USB fob or a drive on another computer), you will be able to launch and use your personalized Comodo IceDragon.

Portable mode must be selected during the installation process:



There are a few differences to setup if portable mode is selected:

- The 'Import Settings' and 'Secure DNS' dialog boxes will not be shown during the installation process
- The Installer does not write anything to the Windows registry
- Uninstaller is not created
- User profile is stored in the "User Data" folder inside the main Comodo IceDragon installation folder.

5.1. Using Tabs

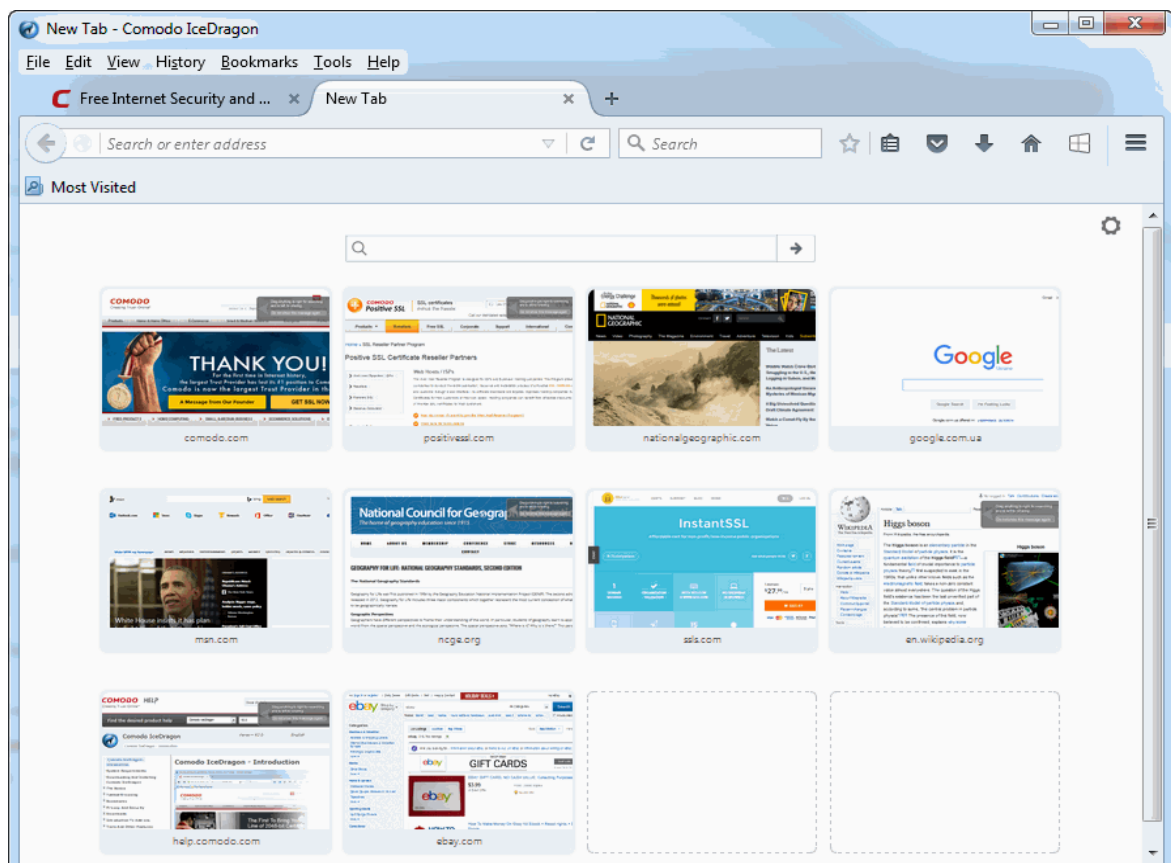
Each time you open a web-page in Comodo IceDragon, it will be displayed what is known as a 'tab'. If you have multiple web-pages open then each will open in its own tab.



- To open a new tab, click the new tab **+** icon, which is next to the last tab:



- Rearrange tabs by left clicking on a tab, holding down the mouse button then dragging the tab to its new position
- When you open a new, 'blank' tab, it will display a list of your fifteen most visited websites for your easy access:

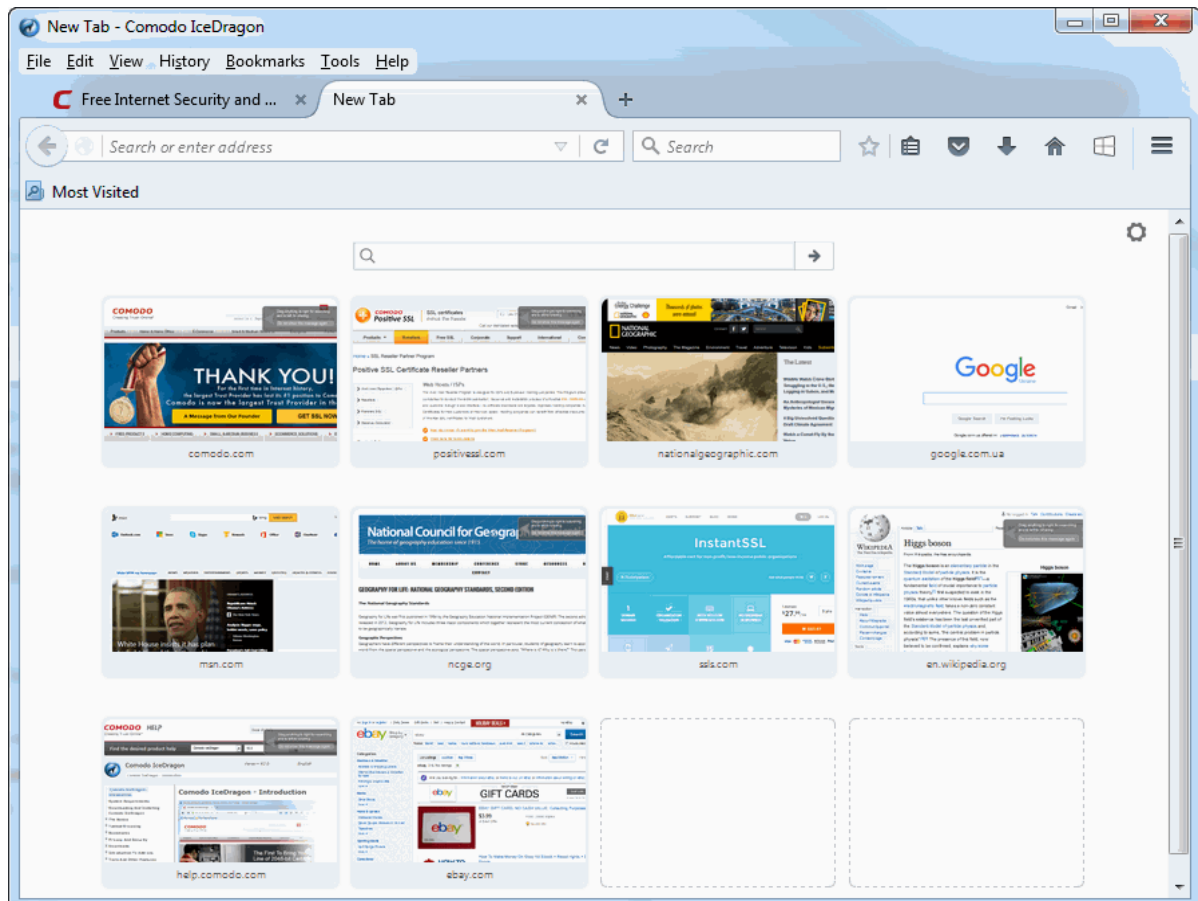

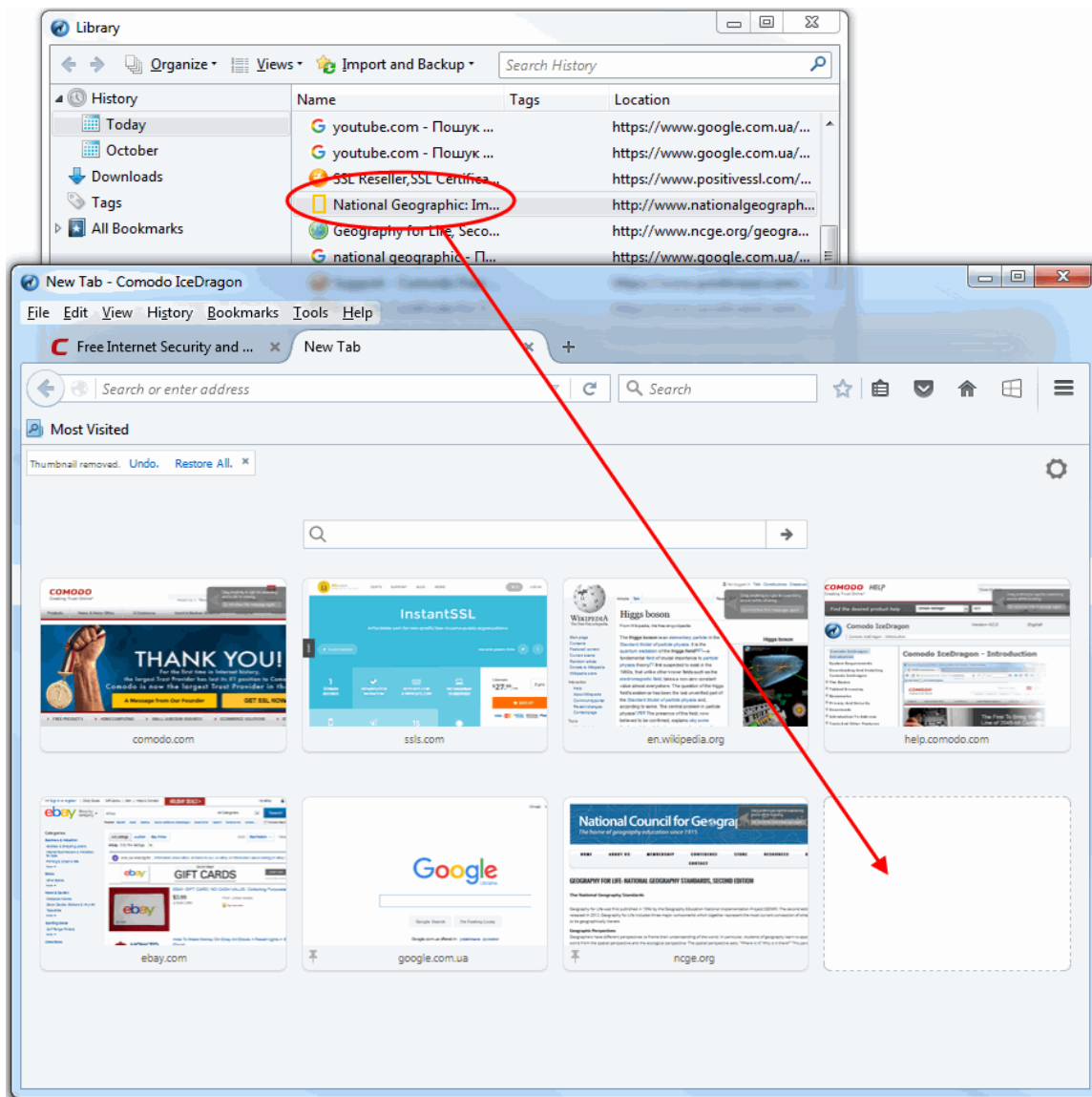
5.2. Customizing Your 'New Tab' Page

By default, when you open a new tab, it will display a list of your nine most *visited* websites. You can, however, make the 'New Tab' page display whatever websites you want (including your favorite websites). Each website will be displayed as a thumbnail. The thumbnails can be deleted and rearranged as you see fit.



To add a site to the new tab page:

- Open a new tab
- Click 'Bookmarks' > 'Show All Bookmarks' to open the 'Library' window.
- Alternatively, click the Bookmarks button on the Navigation Toolbar at the top right side of the interface
- Select a bookmark and drag it to the new tab page.



To pin a site

Hover the mouse cursor on the thumbnail in the top-left corner that you want to lock it in that position on the page.



To remove a site

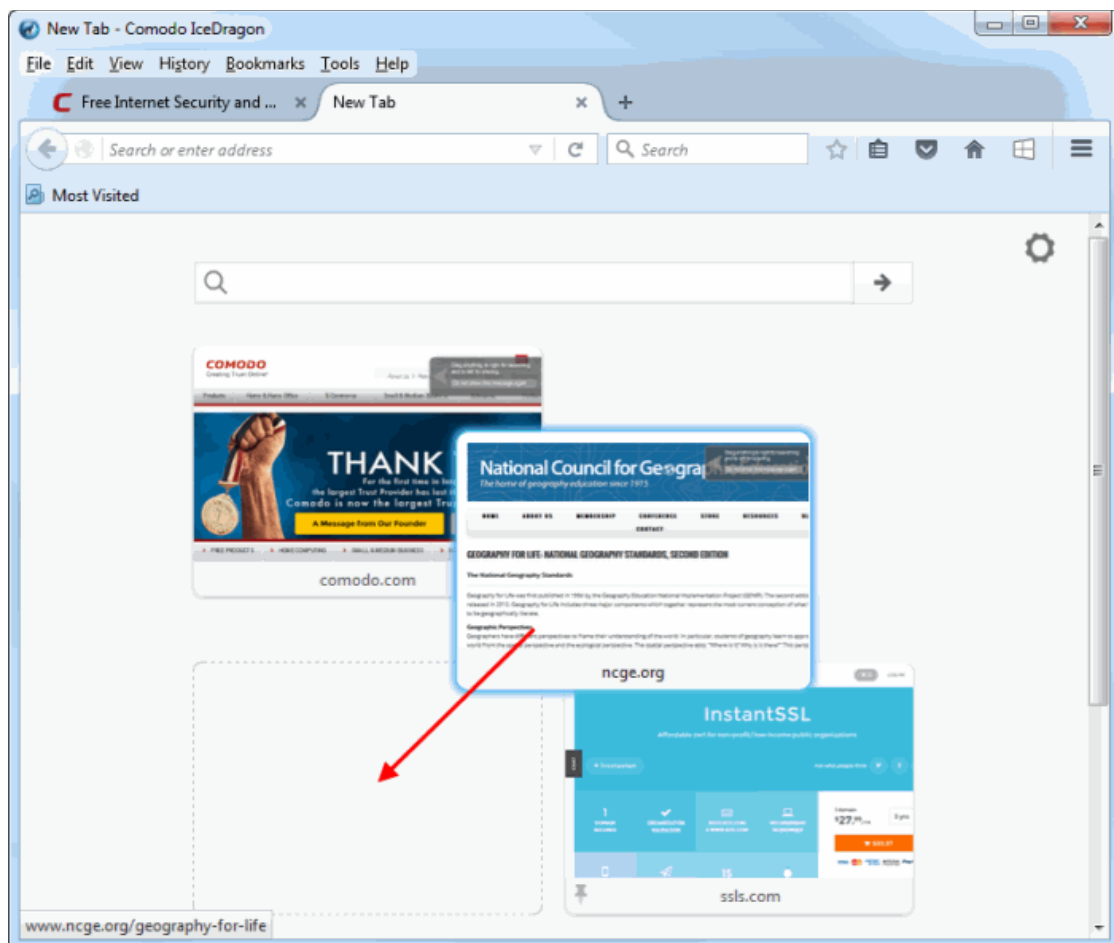
- Hover the mouse cursor on the thumbnail that you want to remove and click on the 'X' that appears on the top right corner.



- The thumbnail is now deleted from the page.

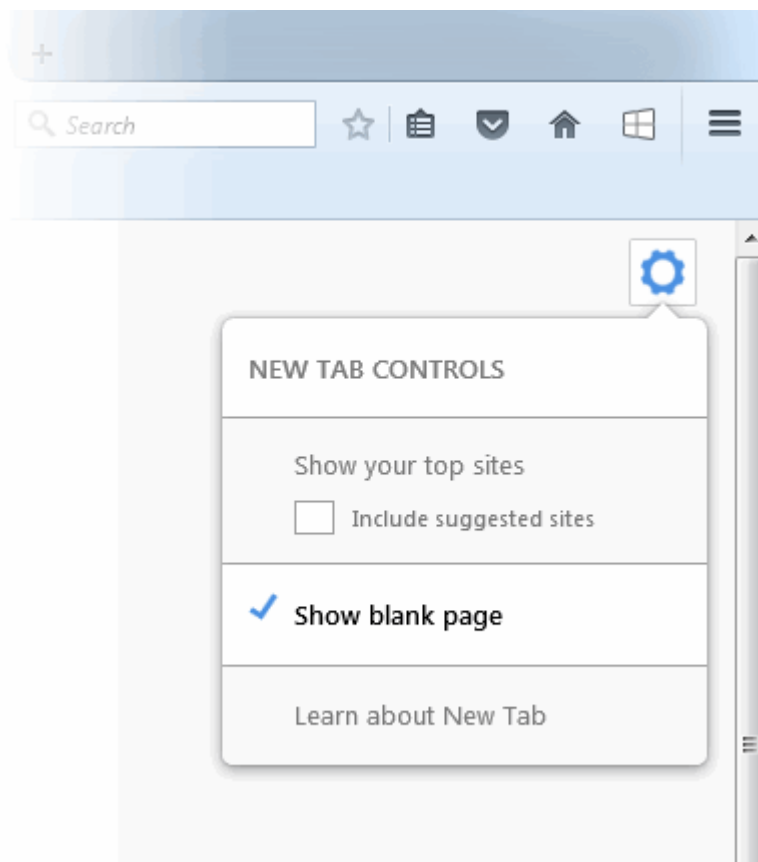
To rearrange thumbnails

- Simply click and drag the thumbnail into the position you prefer.



To hide the thumbnails

Click the gear icon in the upper-right and checkmark 'Show blank page' from the menu.



To turn this feature off completely

- "This might void your warranty!" warning page will be displayed. Click 'I'll be careful, I promise!', to continue the *about:config* page.
- In the address bar, type *about:config* and press Enter.
- Type *browser.newtab.url* in the Search box:
- Double-click the *browser.newtab.url* preference and change the URL from *about:newtab* to *about:blank*.
- Click 'OK'.

To reset the page to show blank thumbnails


You have to clear the browsing history first. To do this, click the 'History' > 'Clear Recent History' > 'Clear Now'.

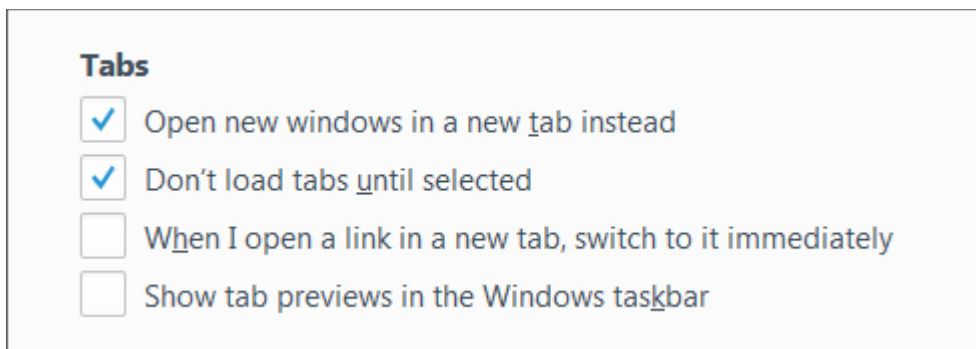

To configure tab settings

- Click the  menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'General' button:

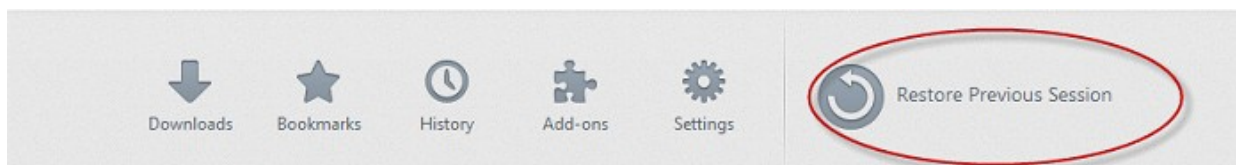


- **Open new windows in a new tab instead** - This option allows you to determine whether links from other applications or from web pages are opened in a new window or a new tab in the most recent window.
- **Don't load tabs until selected** - Check this option to load the active tab when it starts or restores your previous session
- **When I open a link in a new tab, switch to it immediately** - Check this option to load and display the page in a new foreground tab.
- **Show tab previews in the Windows taskbar** - Check this option to show a separate preview for each tab.

To restore a tab or a window from the default home page


- Click the  menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'General':
- In the Startup box, click 'Restore to Default'

You can recover a tab or windows that you have recently closed from by clicking the 'Restore Previous Session' icon on the default Comodo homepage.




All tabs and windows that were closed will be re-opened.

To restore the previous session from the history menu

- Click the  menu located at the top right corner of the browser

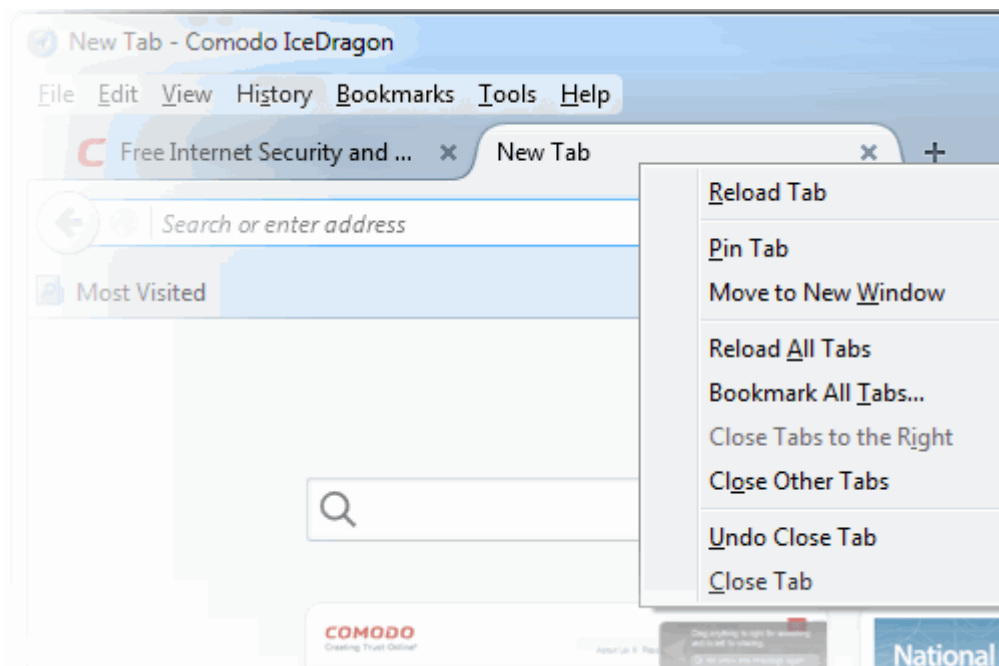

- **Undo Close Tabs** - Undoes closed tabs through a toolbar button or the right-click context menu.

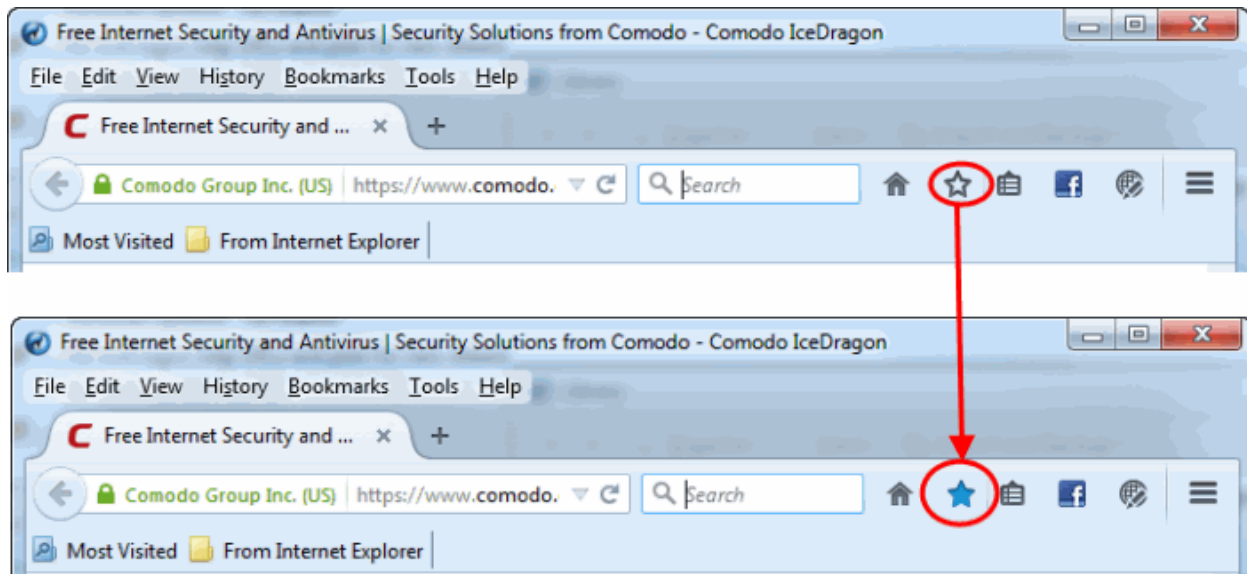

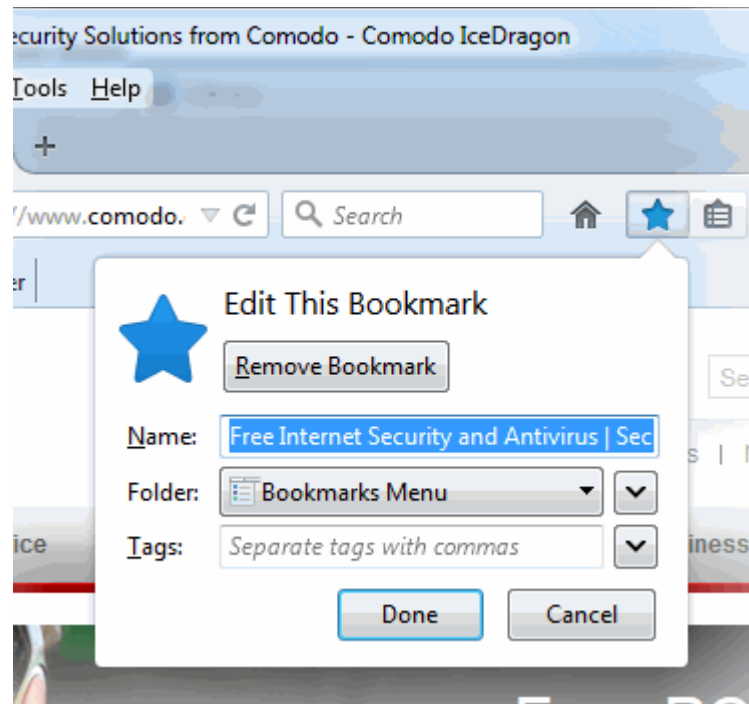
6.1. Creating Bookmarks

Comodo IceDragon allows you to create bookmarks to your favorite web pages in multiple ways.

Method 1

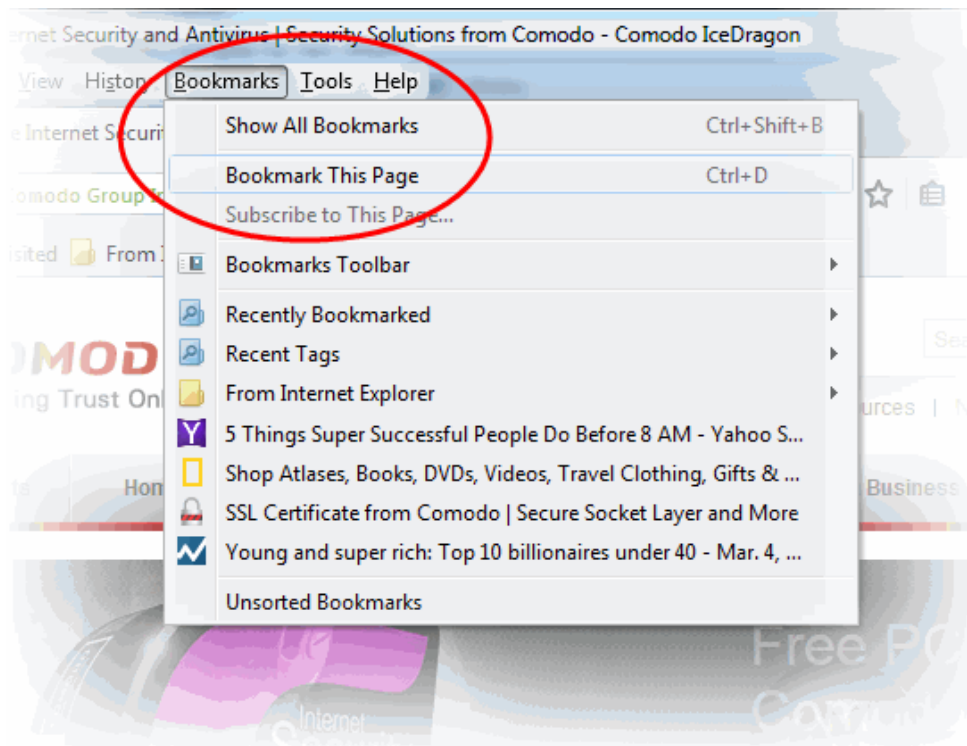
When on a webpage that you want to bookmark, simply click the star at the right of the address bar:





Method 2

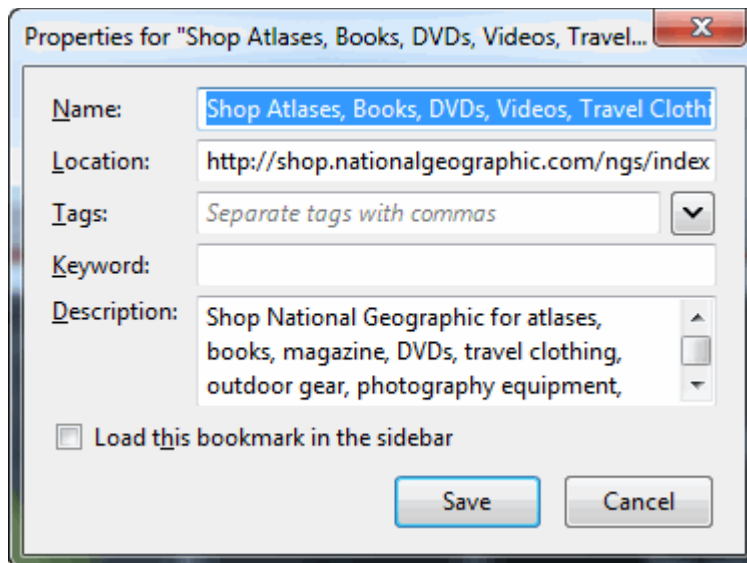
- Select 'Bookmark This Page' from the menu. By default, the bookmark will be created in the 'Unsorted Bookmarks' folder.
- Click the bookmarks button to the right side of the address bar.



By right-clicking on any bookmark then selecting 'Properties', you can modify bookmarks settings including:

- Name - The name displayed for the bookmark in menus.
- Tags - Set tags for the bookmark. Tags can be searched from the IceDragon address bar.
- Folder - Select what folder to store your bookmark in by picking one from the drop-down menu (the Bookmarks

Toolbar, Bookmarks Menu, Unsorted Bookmarks). Select Choose... to display a list of all bookmarks folders).



You can **import bookmarks** from other browsers.

Method 4

Drag and drop a link on a web-page onto the 'bookmarks' button on the right of the address bar.

Method 5

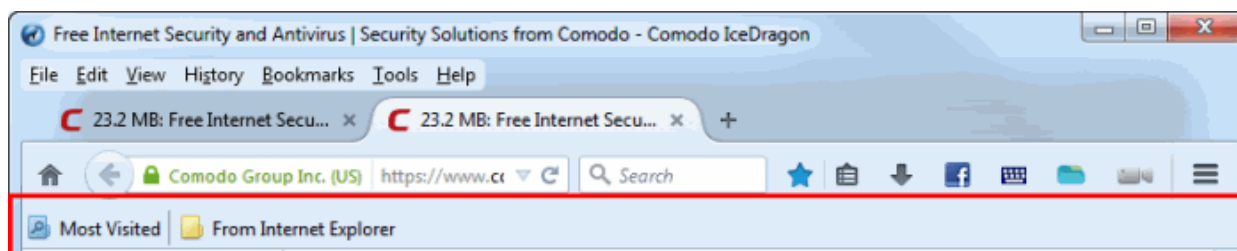
Use the keyboard short cut CTRL+D to create a bookmark of the web-page that you are currently viewing.

6.3. Managing Bookmarks

The managing bookmarks in Comodo IceDragon allows you to organize your bookmarks. Here you can edit, delete or rename bookmarks and folders. Right-click on any of the folder and open all the bookmarks in new tabs.

To open bookmark organizer

- Select 'Bookmarks' -> Show All Bookmark from the menu.
- The 'Library' interface will be displayed.



Here you can **view, search bookmarks, edit, rename, sort, or delete a one or multiple bookmarks, move a bookmark.**

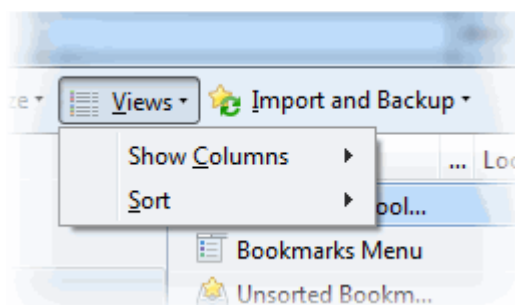

To delete a single bookmark or folder

- Select the bookmark or folder you want to delete.
- Click on the  icon in the Location bar.

- In the Edit This Bookmark box, click 'Remove Bookmark'.
- Alternatively, in the Library dialog click the 'Organize' menu > select the bookmark you want to delete > select 'Delete'.

You can also right-click on the item and select Delete from the menu.

To delete multiple bookmarks or folders

- Click the  button on the right side of the navigation toolbar
- Select Show All Bookmarks to open the Library window.
- In the left pane, click on the folder you want to view. Its content will appear in the right pane.

To move bookmarks

- **Browsing History:** A list of URLs that you have recently visited
- **Favorites:** (also known as 'Bookmarks'). Imports your bookmarks from the source browser
- **Saved Passwords** (Chrome only) – A list of passwords that you asked your browser to save
- **Preferences** (Safari only) – Imports preferences saved in your browser
- Click the 'Next' button then click 'Finish' at the confirmation dialog:



The bookmarks from the other browser will now be available in Comodo IceDragon in a folder named **From Internet Explorer**, **Safari** or **From Chrome**. To view and access your bookmarks, simply click the bookmarks button. All Bookmarks (included any imported) will be listed in the menu:



To import bookmarks from any browser as a HTML file

- Click the Bookmarks button then select 'Show All Bookmarks'
- The Library dialog will be opened.
- Click the 'Import and Backup' tab on the Library window.
- Click 'Import Import Bookmarks from HTML'.
- Navigate to the HTML file saved in your computer and click 'Open'.

To export bookmarks from IceDragon

Exported bookmarks can be imported into other browsers.

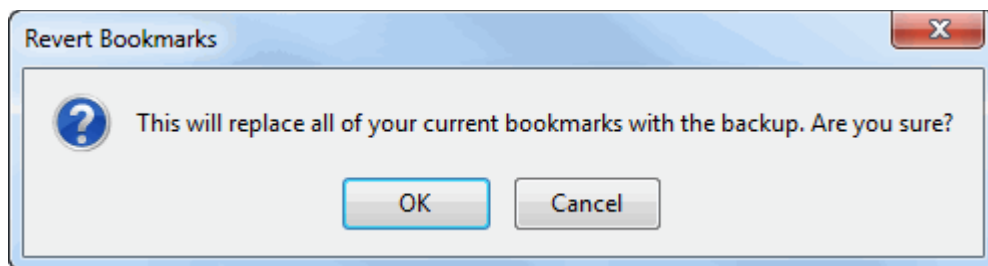
- Click the Bookmarks button then select 'Show All Bookmarks'
- Click the 'Import and Backup' tab on the Library window.
- Select 'Export Bookmarks to HTML' option.
- Choose a location where you want the bookmarks to be saved and click the 'Save' button.

To restore from backup

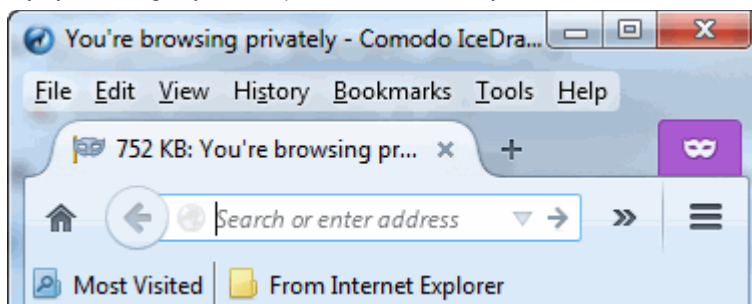

7.1. Private Browsing

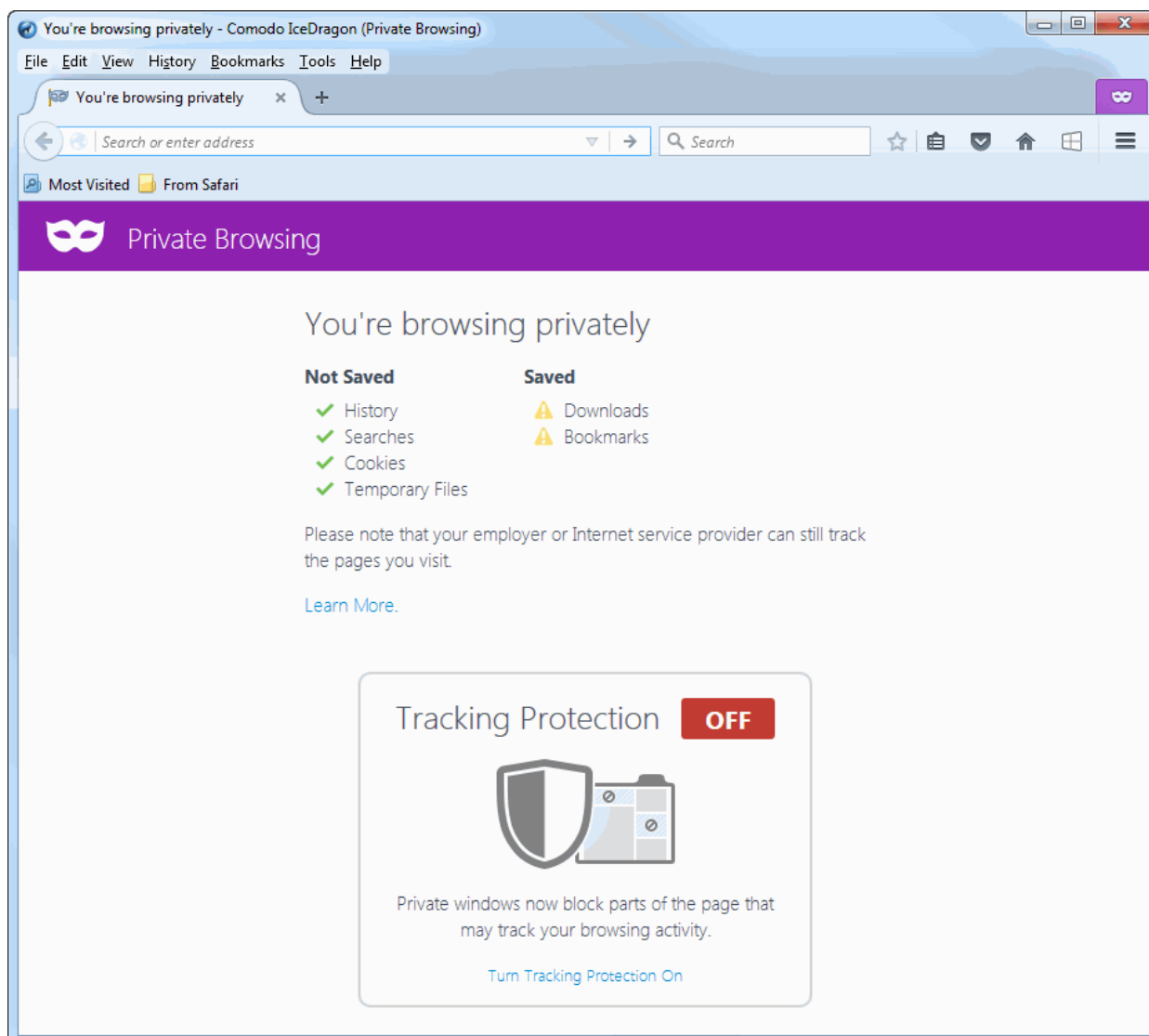
In a Private Browsing session, IceDragon will not keep any browser history, search history, download history, web form entries, cookies, passwords or temporary internet files. However, any files you download and bookmarks you make will be kept. This helps improve your overall security by removing any local copies of Internet activity.



To start a Private Browsing session

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Select 'New Private Window'
- Alternatively, if the title bar is enabled, click 'File' > 'New Private Window'

To help you easily identify whether the feature is switched on or not, the mask in magenta square appears while in 'Private Browsing' mode:




Tracking Protection – Turn tracking protection on to block website elements that could track your browsing activity. Refer to [Blocking Websites From Tracking Your Browsing Activities](#) for more detailed information.

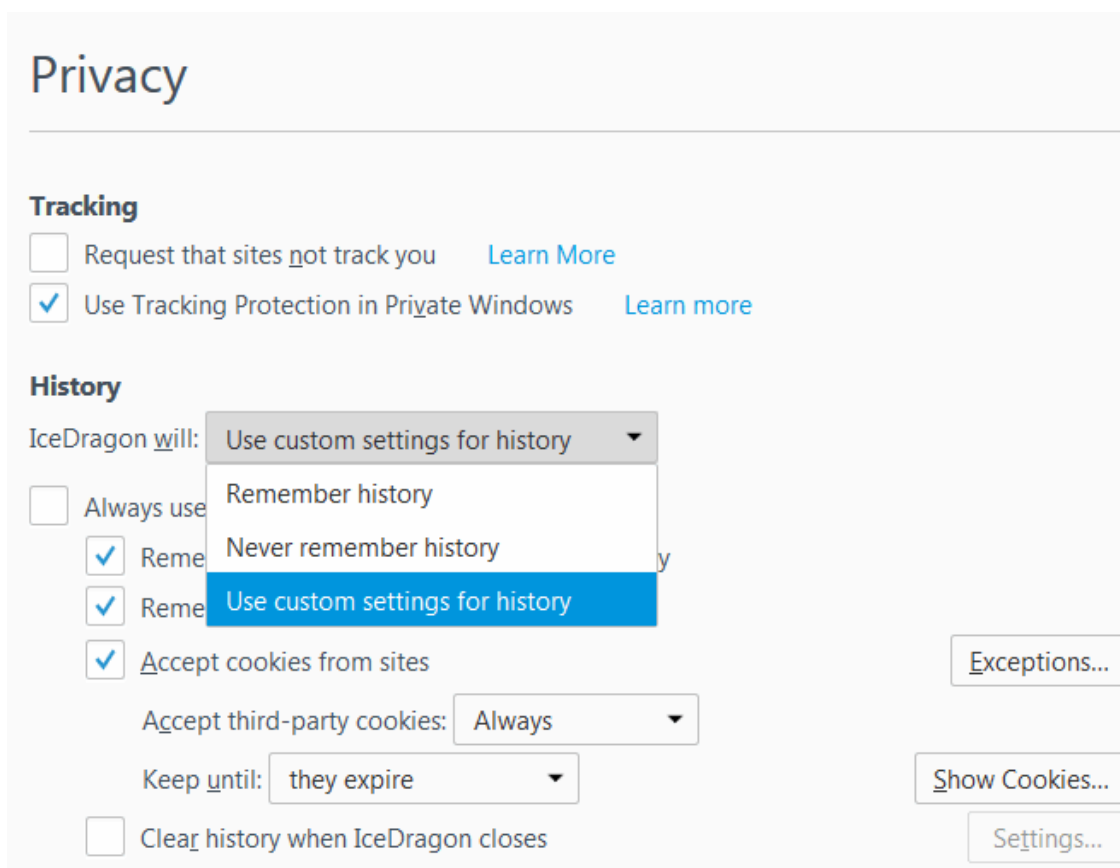
- Start your browsing session as you would any other - by entering a URL or search terms in the address bar or selecting a page from your bookmarks.
- At the end of your browsing session, click 'X' on the private window interface
OR
- Click 'Tools' > 'Options' > 'Privacy' and in the 'History' section, deselect in IceDragon will: 'Never remember history' and uncheck 'Always use private browsing mode' box.

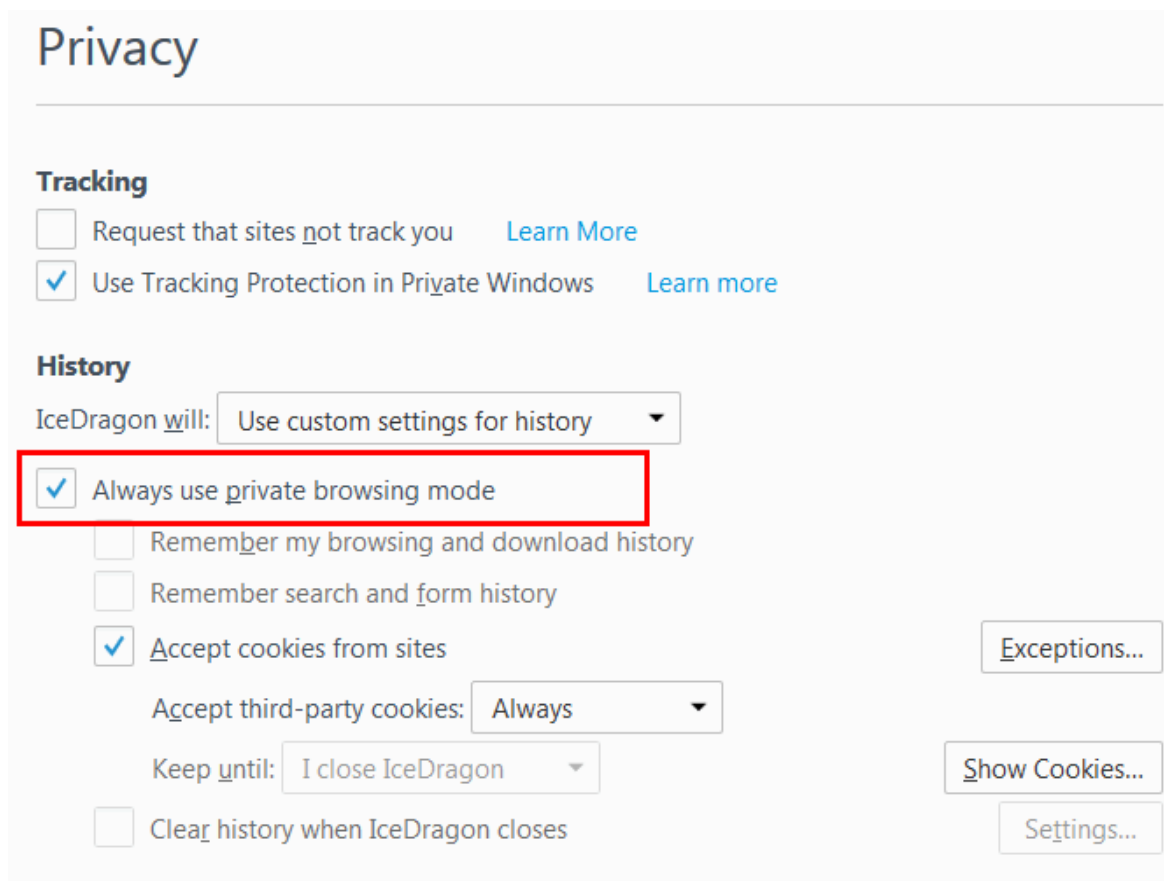
Your current tabs will be closed and all your browsing traces will be erased. The tabs and pages of your previous browsing session will be resumed.

Enabling Private Browsing Permanently

If you want all your browsing sessions to be kept private, you can enable private browsing permanently,

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > the 'Privacy' tab
- Under the 'History' section, in the 'IceDragon will' drop-down select 'Use custom settings for history'





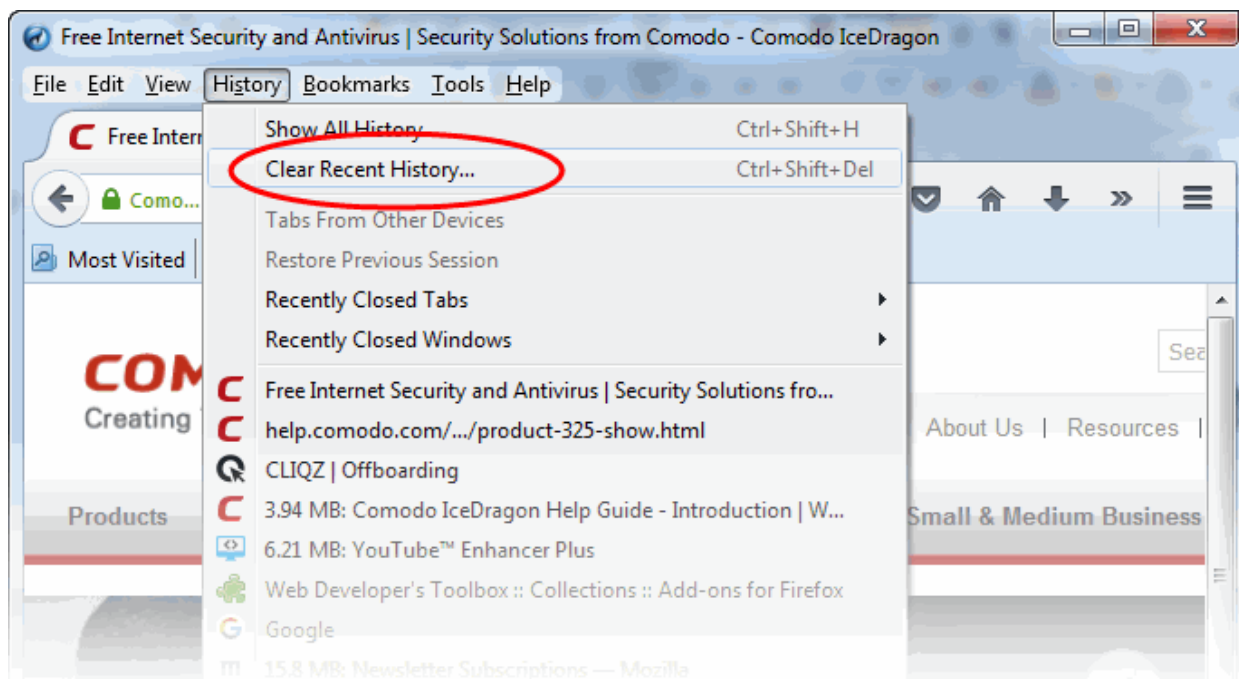
7.2. Deleting Browsing History and Configuring History Settings

By keeping a record of the websites you have visited, files you have downloaded, temporary Internet files and site preferences, Comodo IceDragon speeds up access to websites that you visit regularly. This page explains how to clear browsing history and how to configure history settings.

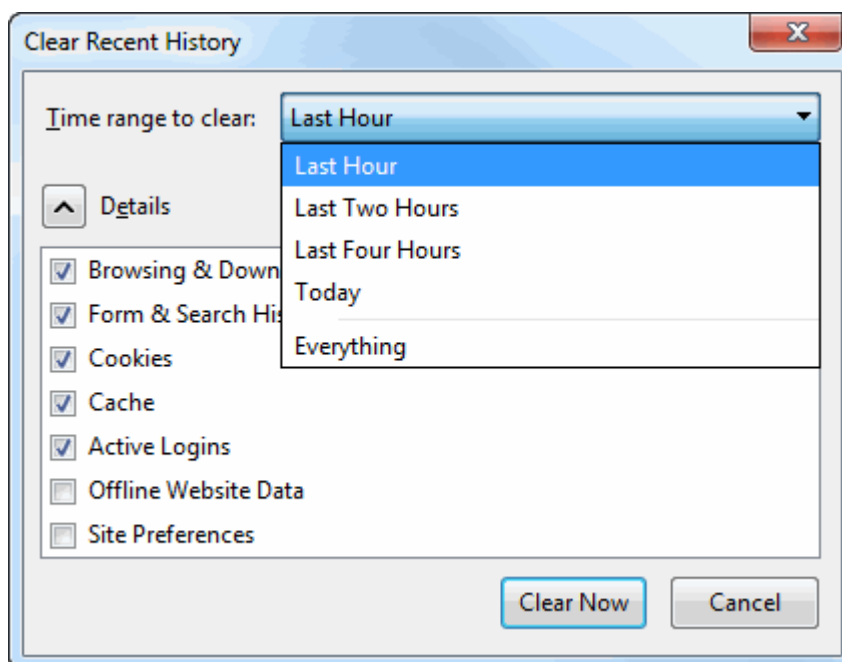

Deleting browsing history

- Select 'History > Clear Recent History'



- In the 'Clear Recent History' dialog, select the period that you want to clear history from the 'Time range to clear' drop-down box. Leaving this at the default of 'Everything' will clear all history information in your browser.
- Click 'Details' to display the items from which you can select for the history information to be removed.




- Select the items you wish to delete and click 'Clear Now'. The following items can be deleted:
 - **Browsing and Download History** – Browsing history is the list of websites that you've visited and the download history is the list of files that you've downloaded.
 - **Form and Search Bar History** – Form history are the list of terms that you've entered in web page forms and these terms will be listed in a drop-down menu in the Auto Form Fill as you start entering the first few letters in the form field.
 - **Cookies** - Cookies are small pieces of information sent by websites that you've visited which are stored by your web browser. Cookies are used by these websites to store your preferences about that website (for example, if you ask a website to 'Keep me logged in' or similar, it is the cookie that keeps a record of this preference).

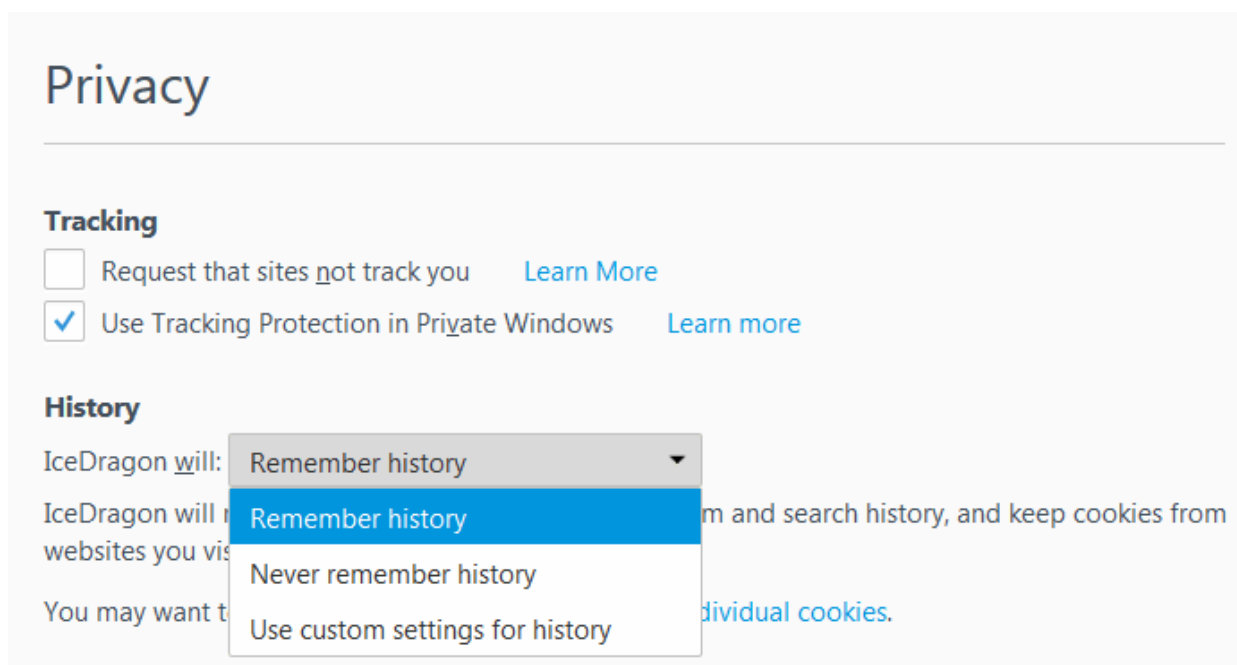
- **Cache** - The cache memory stores temporary files, such as of web pages that you've visited, which will help to load the pages much faster when you are visiting any of them once again.
- **Active Logins** - Authenticated sessions that are still active, that is, if you've logged into a website that requires authentication, are called active logins.
- **Offline Website Data** - If you've saved a webpage as 'Web Page, complete' in the save as option in the File menu, you can view the page even if you are not connected to the Internet.
- **Site Preferences** - Settings configured by you for certain websites such as zoom level and permissions.

Configuring History Settings

The 'Privacy' section of 'Options' allows you to specify default History settings for IceDragon.

To configure these settings:

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Select the 'Privacy' tab.
- In the 'History' section, you can specify default behavior in the 'IceDragon will:' drop-down



The options available are:

- **Remember history** – The browser will always remember history and you have to clear it manually as explained in the first half of this page.
- **Never remember history** – The browser will never store any history.
- **Use custom settings for history** – If you select this, you have the following options:
 - Always use private browsing mode – If you select this option, IceDragon will always open in private browsing mode. Refer the topic '**Private Browsing**' for more details.

- If you select 'Always use private browsing mode', you have the option to 'Accept cookies from sites'. This will allow the browser to accept first-party and third-party cookies from the websites that you visit.
- The 'Exceptions...' option allows you to configure which websites are allowed, blocked or for that session only to use cookies irrespective of whether you choose 'Accept cookies from sites' or not.

Exceptions - Cookies

You can specify which websites are always or never allowed to use cookies. Type the exact address of the site you want to manage and then click Block, Allow for Session, or Allow.

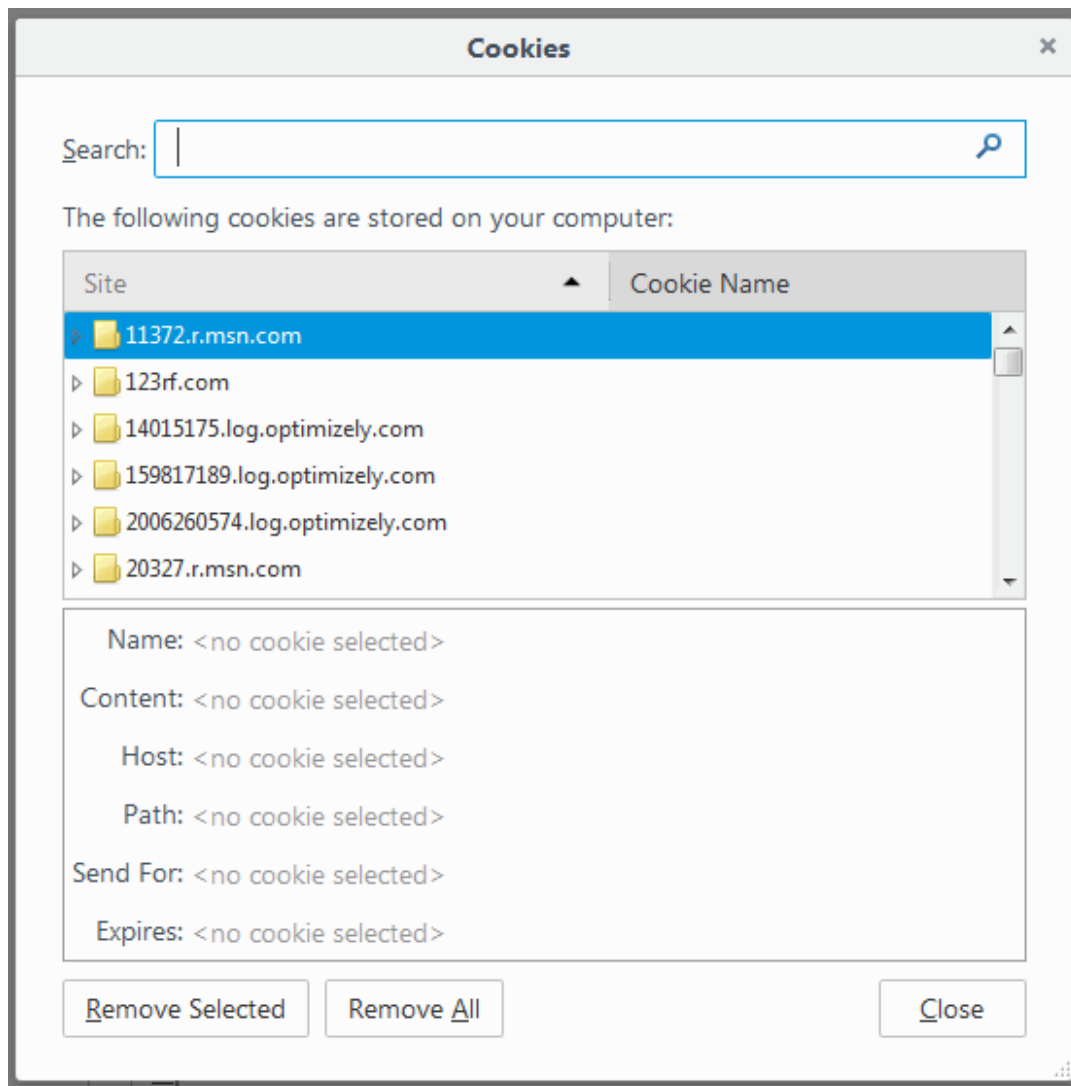

Enter the exact address of the website in the 'Address of website' field' and select any of the options:

- **Block** – The browser never allows any cookies from that website.
- **Allow for Session** – The browser allows cookies for that session only and not stored.
- **Allow** – The browser allows cookies and stores the cookies permanently until cleared manually.

If you want to remove a site from the list, select it and click the 'Remove Site' button. To remove all the sites, click the 'Remove All Sites' button from the exceptions list.

You can view the cookies that are stored in your browser by clicking the 'Show Cookies' button.



In the 'Cookies' screen, you can view the details of the cookies.

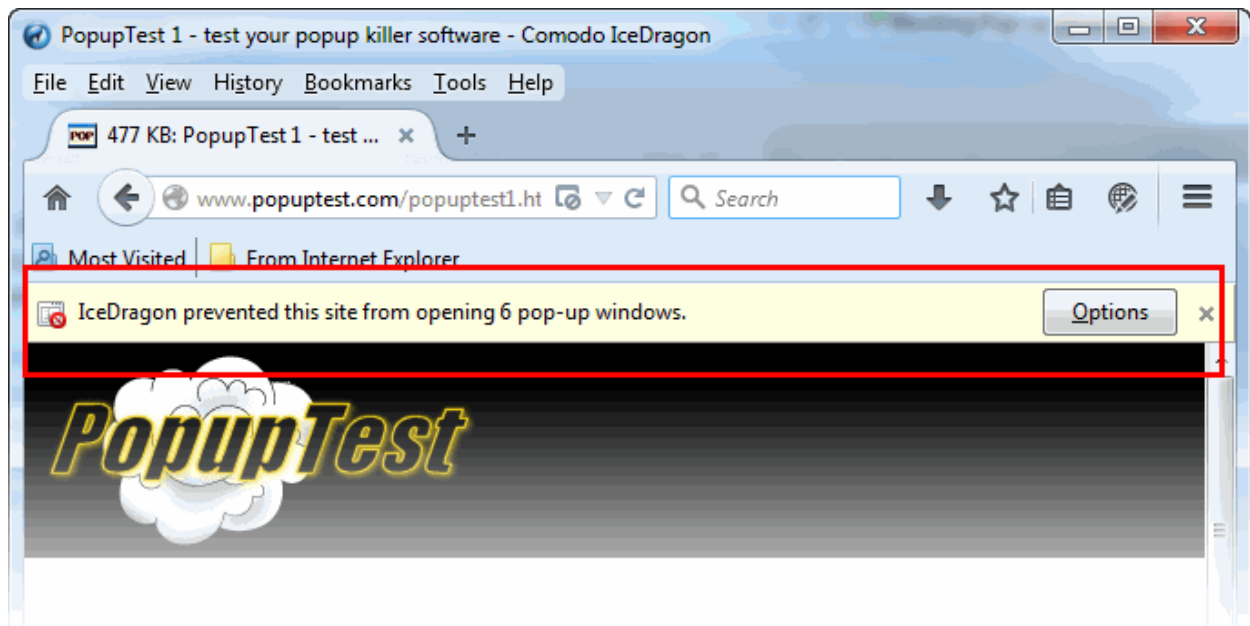
To delete cookies

- Select the site whose cookies you want to delete and click 'Remove Selected'
- Click 'Remove All' to delete all cookies.

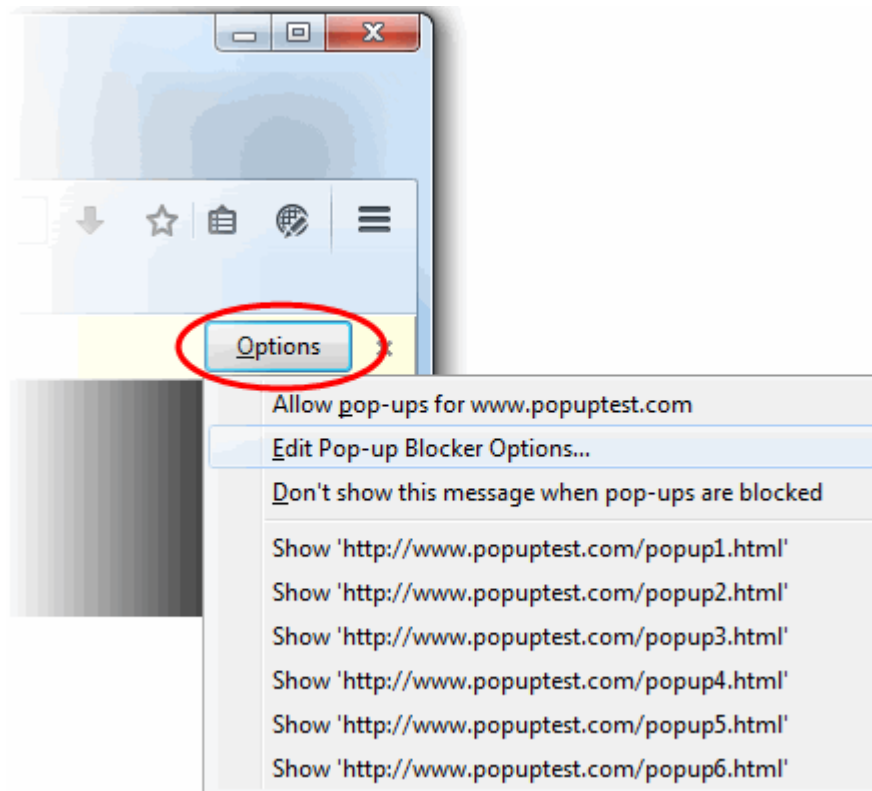
7.3. Allowing/Blocking Pop-up Windows

Many websites open pop-up windows to display advertisements and other features. While many of them are used for genuine purposes (for example, banking sites use pop-ups for login screens and providing warnings), some may be used for malicious purposes like injecting rootkits, keyloggers and other malware. Other pop-ups can just be plain annoying adverts. By default Comodo IceDragon blocks pop-up windows. You can configure IceDragon to allow or block pop-ups as you wish and can add exceptions so that pop-ups from selected websites are always allowed.


When a website tries to open a pop-up, IceDragon displays an information bar.

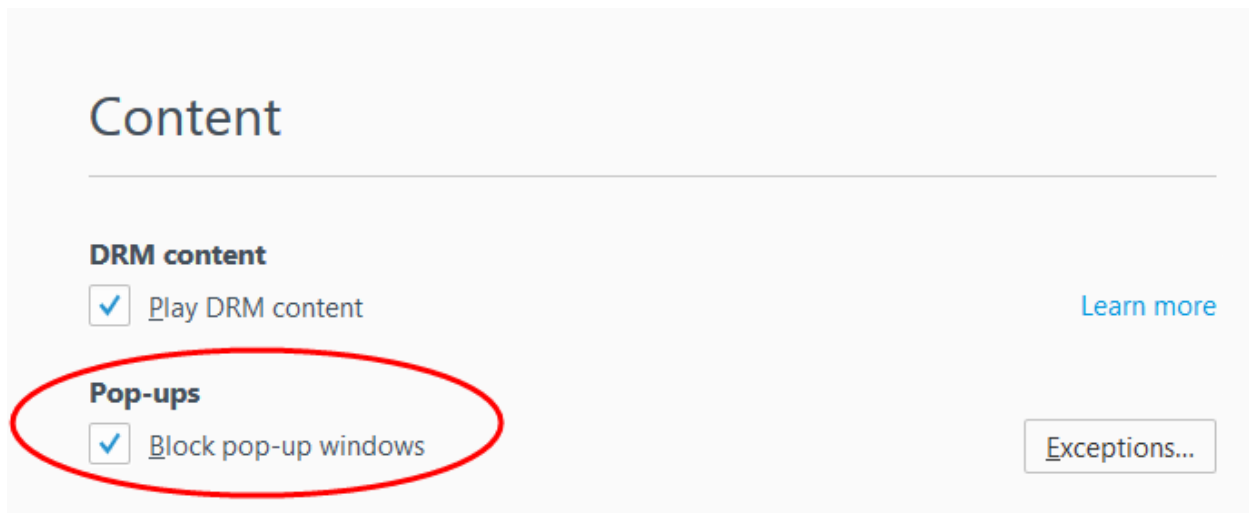


- You can temporarily allow or block pop-ups from that website in an ad-hoc manner by clicking Options > Allow pop-ups for <website>.

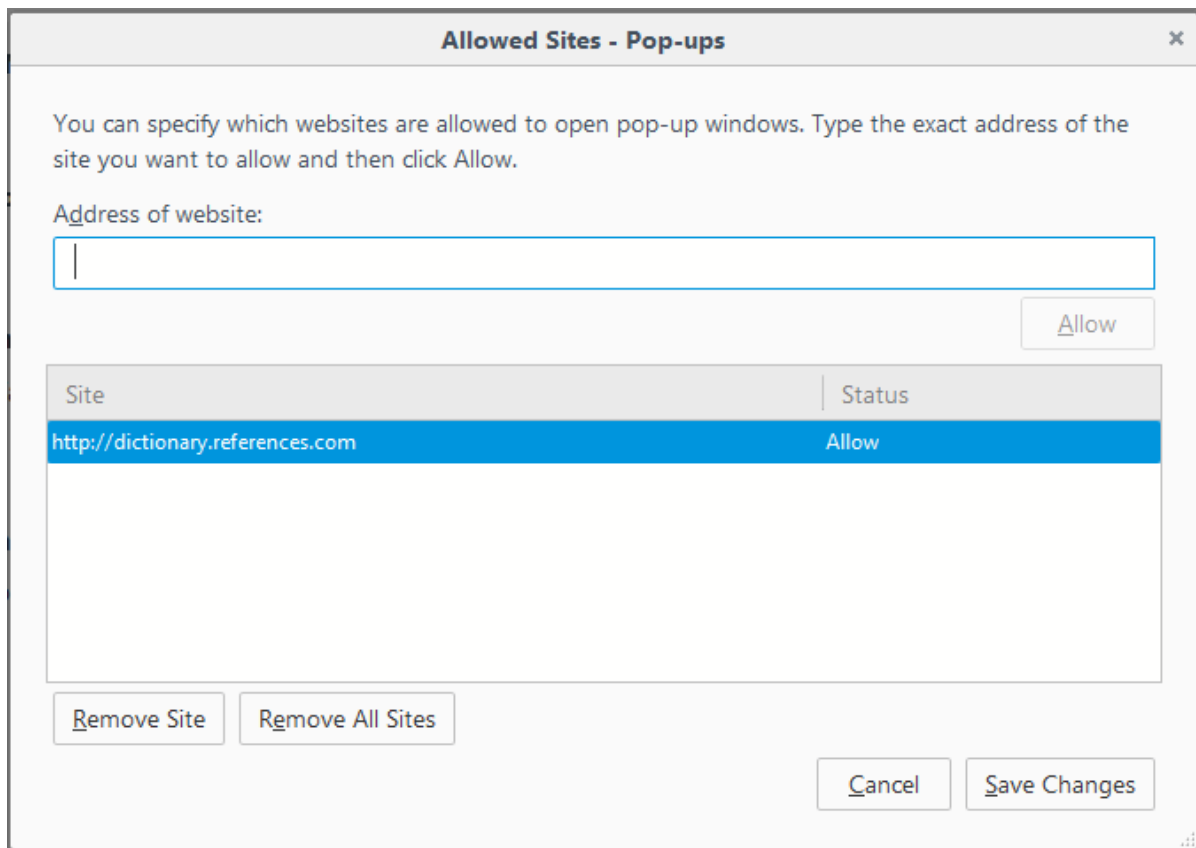


To configure pop-up windows

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Select 'Options'> click the 'Content'



- To block pop-up windows, make sure the 'Block pop-up windows' box is enabled
- To permanently allow pop-ups from all websites, deselect the check-box (not recommended)
- To add exceptions for pop-ups, click 'Exceptions'



- Enter the URL of the website for which you want to allow pop-ups permanently in the 'Address of website' field and click 'Allow'

The website will be added to the list of pop-up allowed websites. All the pop-up windows opened by this website will be allowed regardless of your setting in 'Block pop-up windows' check box.

- Click 'Save Changes'

7.4. Managing Cookies

Cookies are small files stored in your browser by websites that you've visited. These files contain information about your website preferences (for example, if you ask a website to 'Keep me logged in' or similar, it is the cookie that keeps a record of this preference), browsing history and can sometimes be used to authenticate you.

While many (if not most) cookies are stored for the well intentioned reason of service improvement, they can be used to track you and can often contain private authentication data. A search engine may store cookies to fetch your search history and will display targeted adverts to you on various webpages you visit. Some malicious sites may use cookies to log sensitive information about you. Hackers could, in theory, intercept a cookie sent from your browser to a website and extract sensitive data. To maintain your privacy and security, you need to clear cookies from your browser periodically and evaluate your overall policy regarding allowing or blocking cookies.

By default, Comodo IceDragon accepts cookies from the websites you visit. But it can be configured to allow or block cookies from websites and to add exceptions to permanently accept cookies from genuine sites and to permanently block cookies from sites that you do not trust.

Clearing Cookies

Cookies are automatically cleared when you clear browsing history or if you have configured IceDragon to clear browsing history on exit under Options > Privacy > History.

If you want to clear cookies at an instant manually,

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Privacy' tab
- Check the option for 'IceDragon will:' under the 'History'.

If 'Remember History' is chosen,

- To delete the browsing history along with the cookies click the link '[clear your recent history](#)'
- To delete cookies individually click the link 'remove individual cookies'. The Cookies dialog will open. The Cookies dialog allows you to remove cookies individually. Refer to '[Viewing and removing stored cookies individually](#)' for more details.

Never remember history

If 'Never remember history' is chosen,

- To delete your browsing history along with the cookies click the link 'clear all current history'

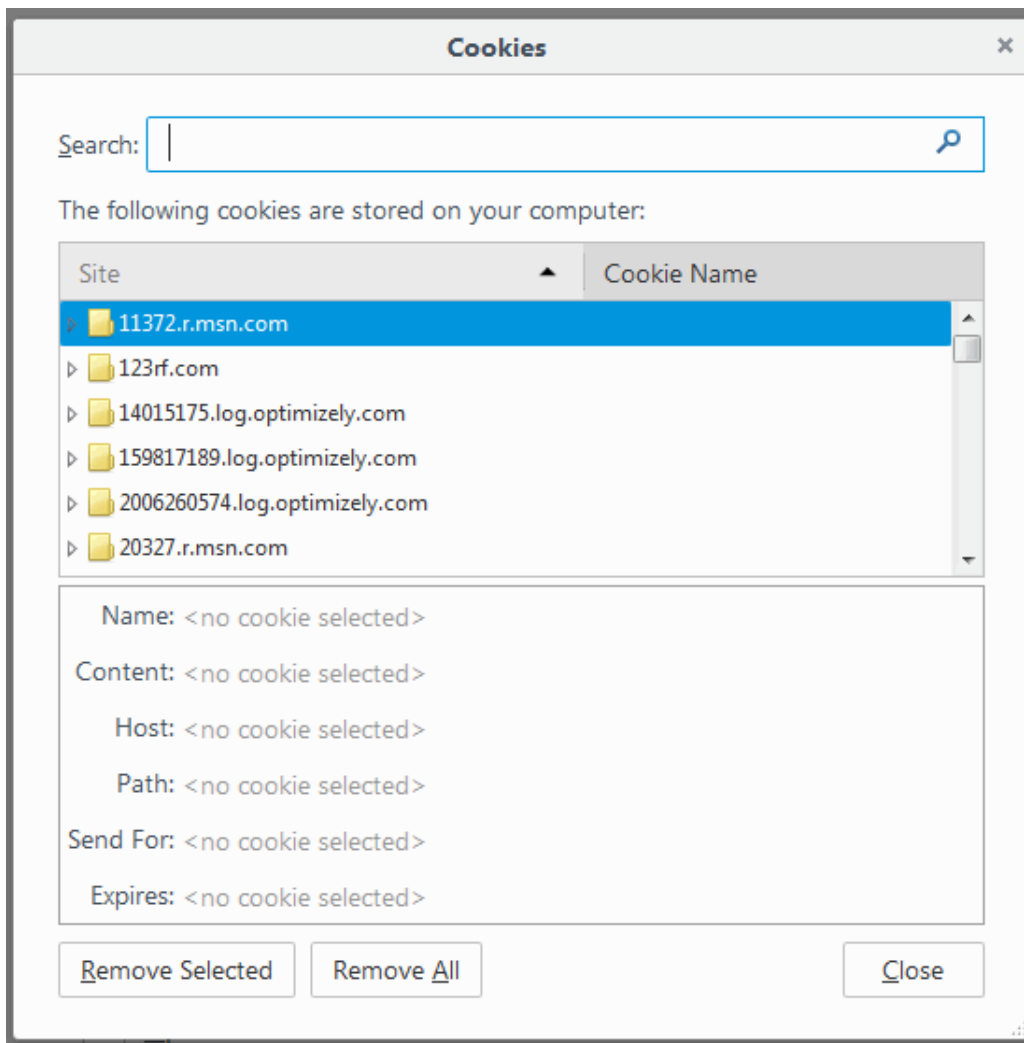

The dialog displays the list of stored cookies stored by different websites you have visited. To view individual cookies, click 'arrow' beside the website.

- To view the details of an individual cookie, select the cookie. The details are displayed at the lower pane
- To remove an individual cookie, select it and click 'Remove Selected'
- To remove all the cookies stored by an individual website, select the website (the folder icon) and click 'Remove Selected'
- To remove all the cookies at once click 'Remove All'
- Click 'Close'.

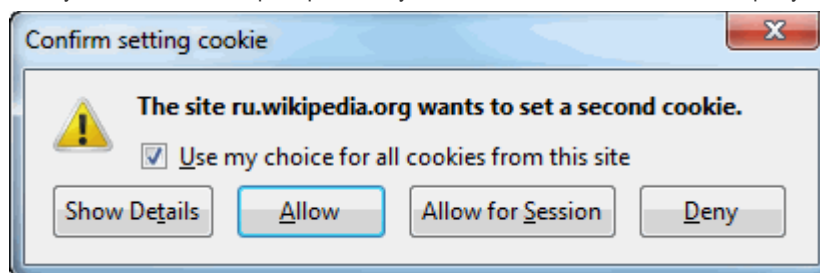

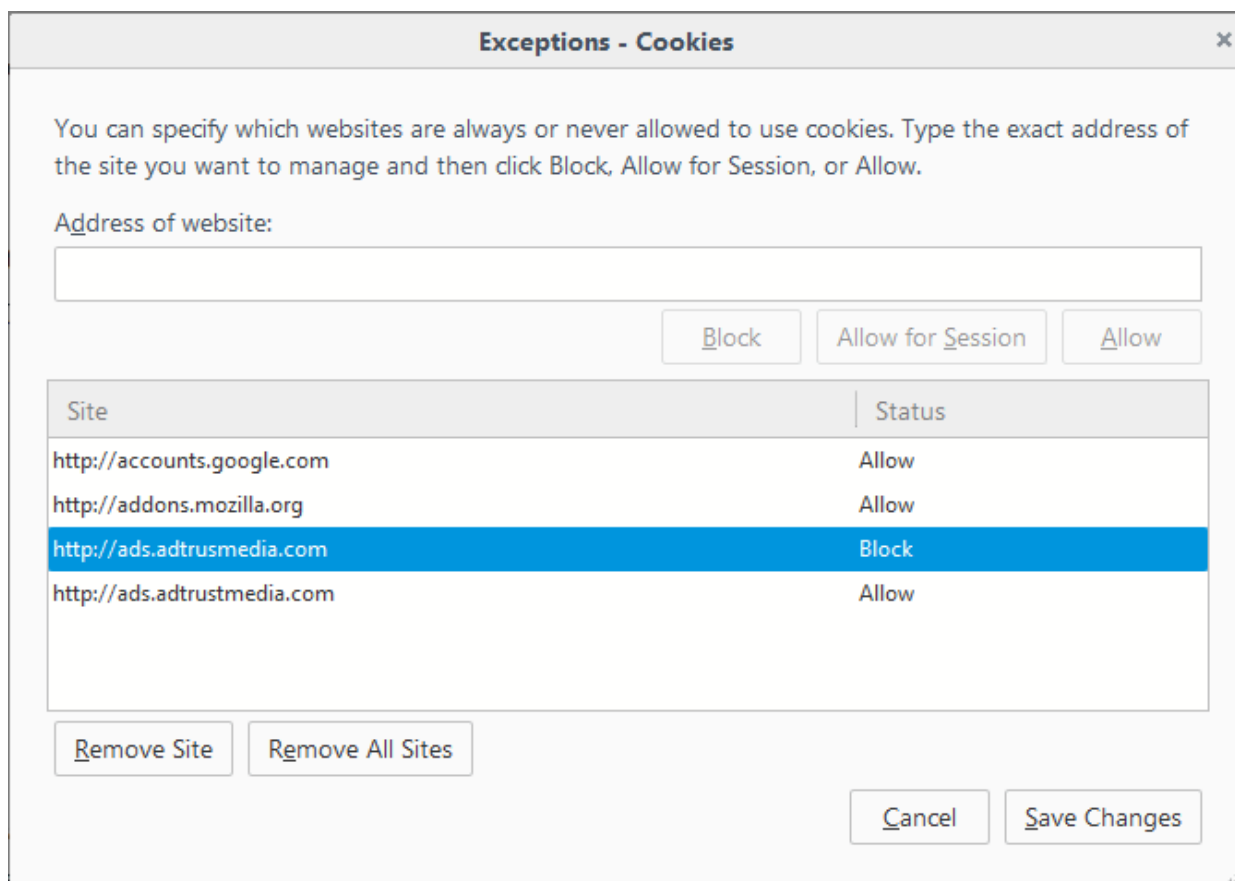

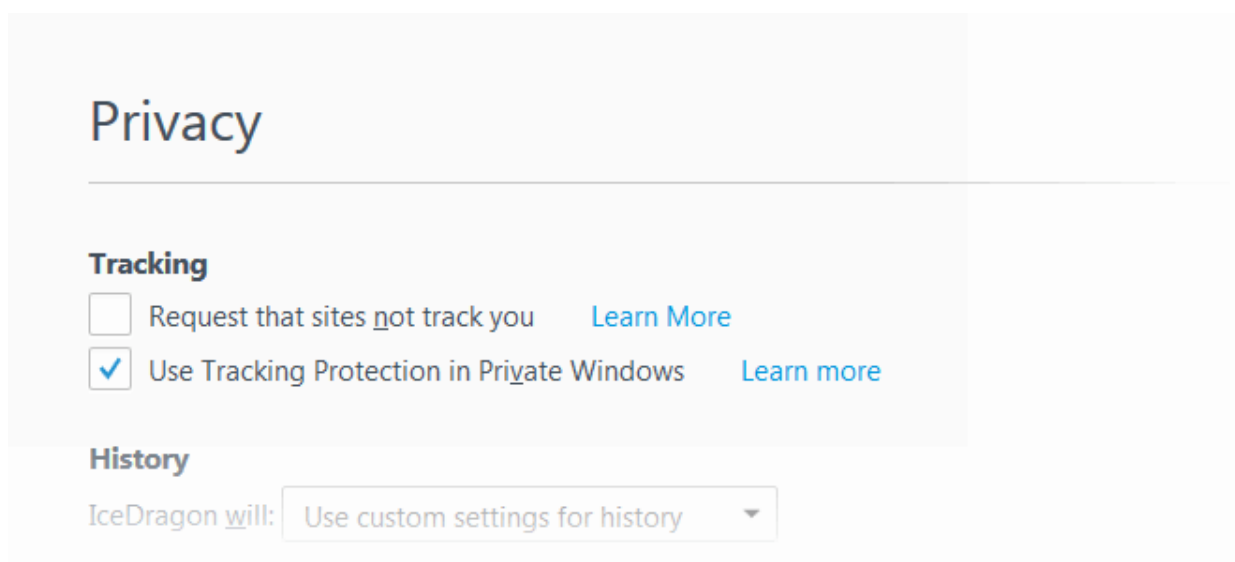

7.5. Blocking Websites from Tracking your Browsing Activities

Some websites track the browsing activities of their visitors. For example, a web site may track your activity to find your interests and display advertisements accordingly.

You can configure Ice Dragon to block activity tracking by websites:

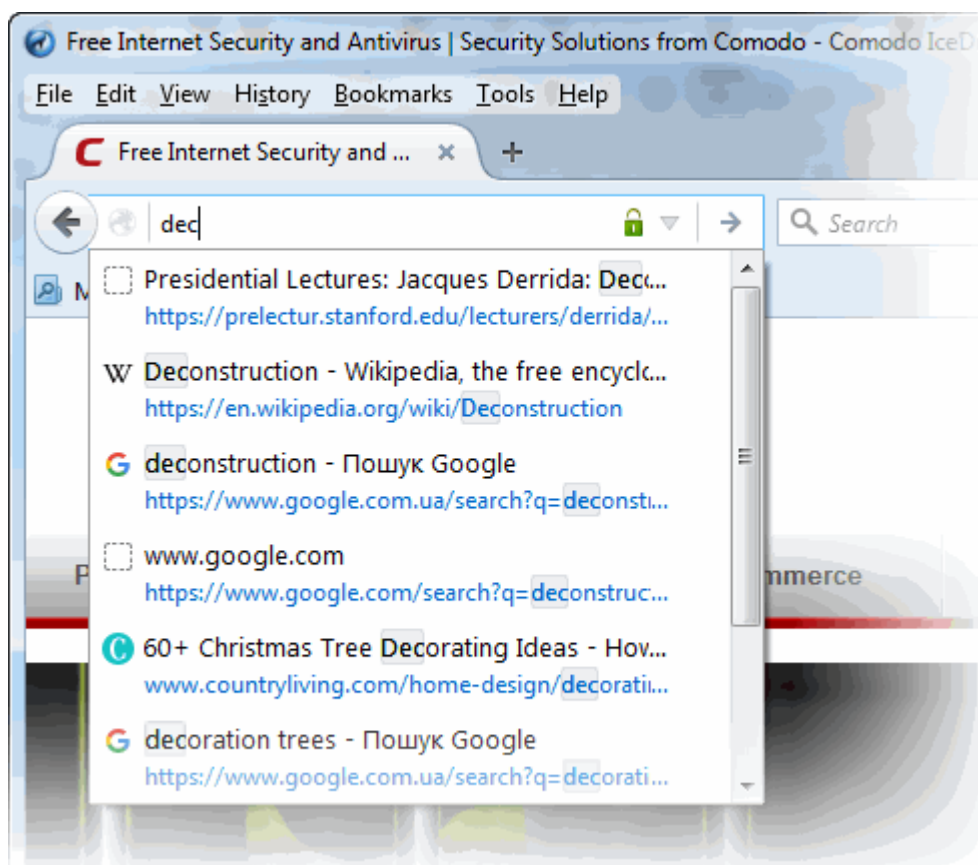
- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Privacy' tab in the 'Options' dialog



- **Request that sites not track you** - Tells websites that you want to be tracked by advertisers and other third-parties.
- **Use Tracking Protection in Private Windows** - Enabled by default, this feature blocks user tracking content when using private browsing.

7.6. Configuring Suggestions while Entering Website Address

Comodo IceDragon uses your browsing history and bookmarks to provide you suggestions when you start typing a website address in the address bar. The browser searches the addresses stored in history and the bookmarks for the letters/words/phrases you type in the address bar and shows the address with matching strings as suggestions in a drop-down, from which you can select the page you want to revisit.



You can configure how the browser should provide suggestions to you.

IceDragon allows you to select the sources from which the suggestions are to be given or to stop suggestions all together.

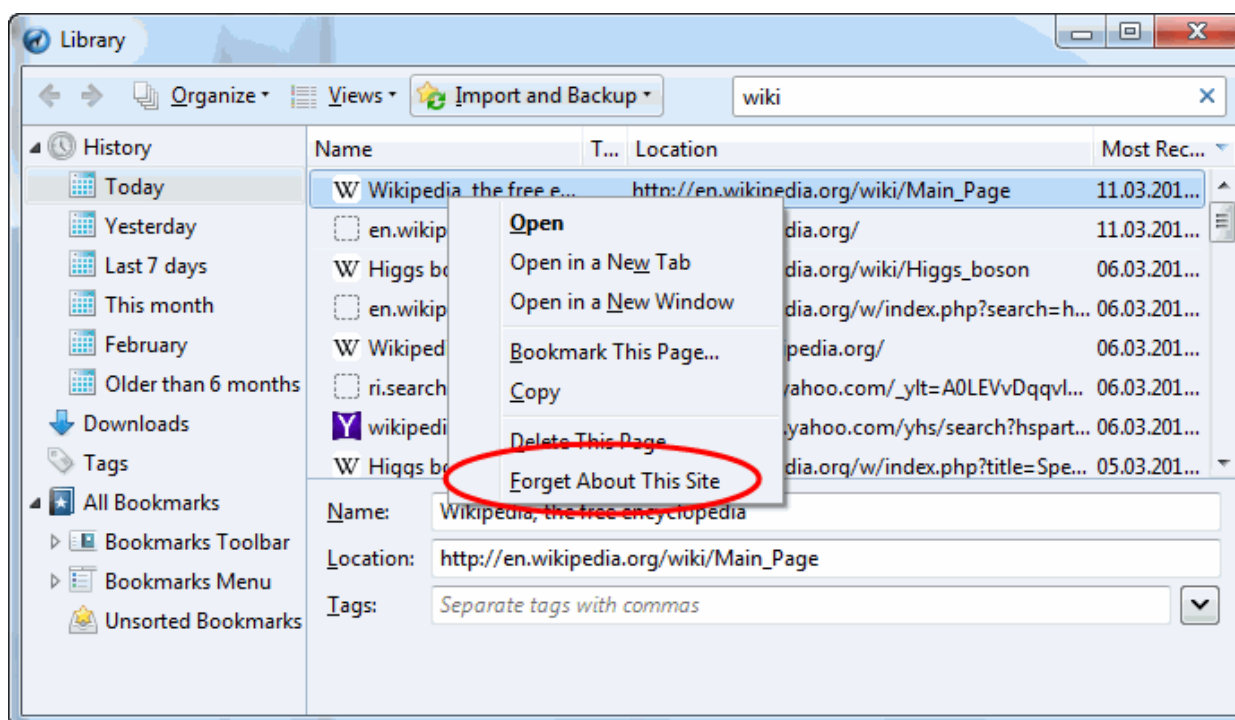

- Click 'History' > 'Show All History' or click 'Bookmarks' > 'Show All Bookmarks'. The 'Library' window will be displayed.
- Type the name of the website in the 'Search History' box and press enter



- Right click on a page of the website you wish to remove and select 'Forget About This Site' from the context sensitive menu.

All the pages from the website from the history, bookmarks and from the suggested sites.

Excluding a Single Webpage from Suggestions

- Type a part of the webpage address in the address bar
- Hover the mouse over the suggestion you want to exclude and press 'Delete' key from the keyboard

7.7. Managing Automatic Installations of Add-ons and Blocking Insecure Add-ons

Add-ons are small pieces of software added to Ice Dragon to expand it's functionality. Add-ons are broadly classified as:

- **Extensions** - Add new features to the browser like auto update of Facebook profiles, analyze your typing skills, comparing prices from different emerchants to name a very few.
- **Appearance** – Customize how the browser should appear by applying themes, button text styles and so on.
- **Plugins** - Support different kinds of file types from Internet, e.g. to open .pdf files, play video and audio files, play online games and so on.
- **Services** - Add social features from various websites right in the Comodo IceDragon browser to keep in touch with your friends.

You can add any number of add-ons to your browser manually as per your needs. Refer to '[Introduction to Add-ons](#)' for more details.


In addition, some websites install their add-ons to your browser in the background to support the file/data types they render, display their webpages with their themes and so -on. While most of the add-ons from different websites are genuine, some may be harmful, injecting rootkits, keyloggers and other malware to steal your confidential data.

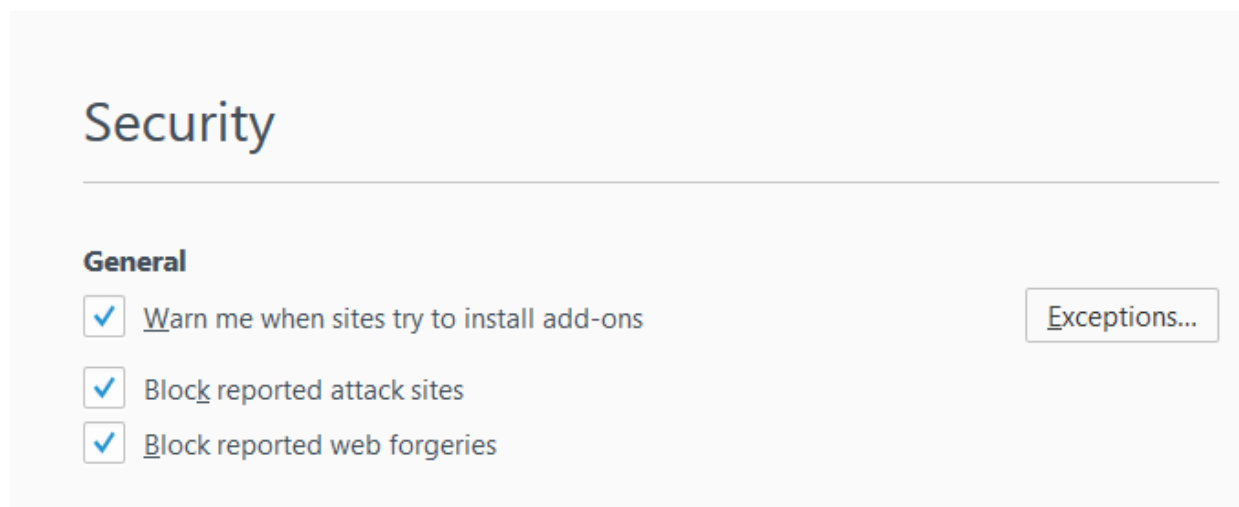

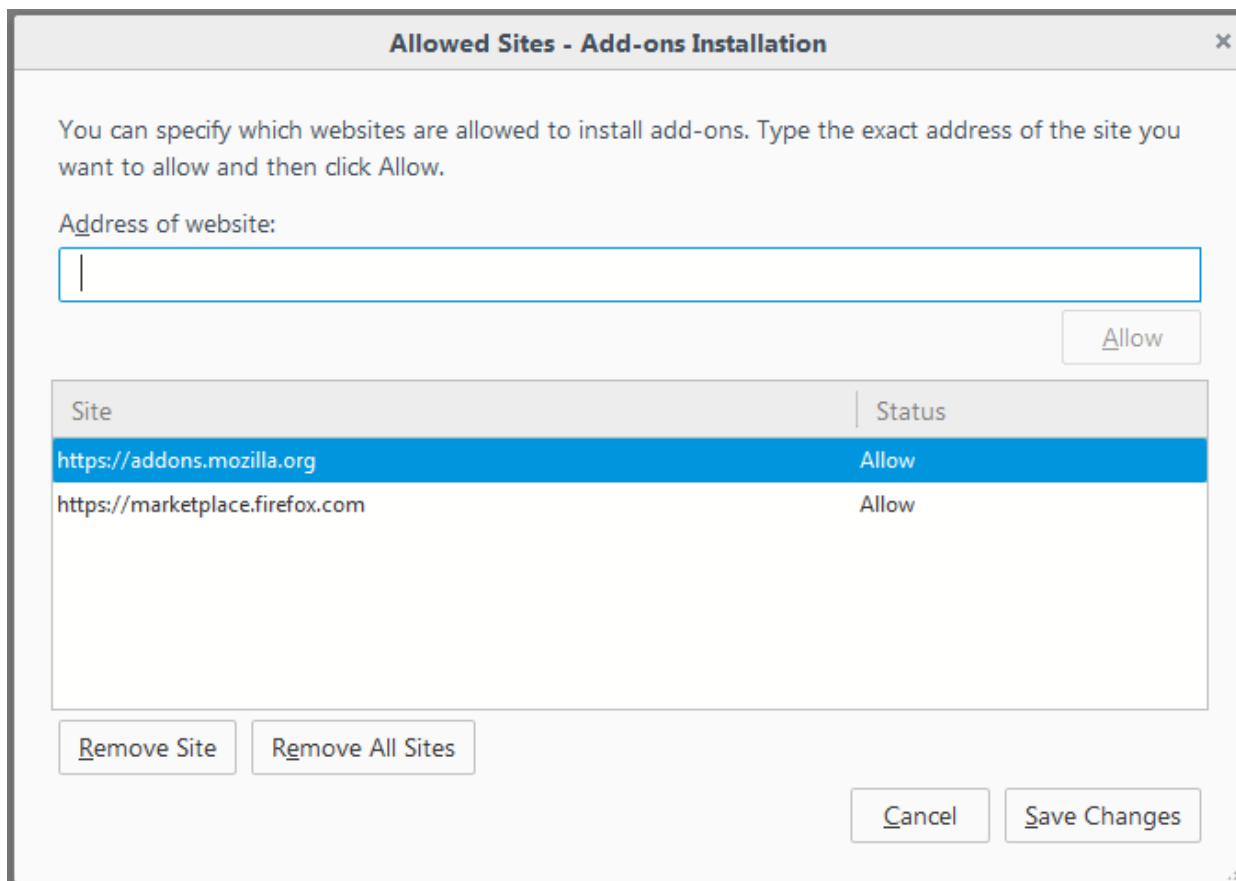

- **'Block reported web forgeries'** - Blocks known phishing sites. An alert will be displayed you if you try to connect to a phishing site.

To add exceptions for automatic installation of Add-ons

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Security' tab in 'Options' dialog
- Click 'Exceptions' beside 'Warn me when sites try to install add-ons' checkbox



The 'Exceptions' dialog will be displayed.

- Enter the url of the website for which you want to allow add-ons permanently
- Click 'Allow'. Regardless of whether the checkbox 'Warn me when sites try to install add-ons' is checked or not, the add-ons from this site will be allowed for automatic background installation.

The website will be added to the list with the 'Allow' status.

 - Click the Comodo IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
 - Click 'Options' > 'Security'
 - Click 'Exceptions' beside 'Warn me when sites try to install add-ons'
 - Select the website and click 'Remove Site'
 - To remove all the sites from the exception list, click 'Remove All Sites'
- Click 'Save Changes'

7.8. Managing Passwords

Comodo IceDragon can securely remember the usernames and passwords you enter to log-in to websites and automatically enter them the next time you visit. This can be a great time saver but is not recommended for shared computers. This page explains how the 'Remember Password' system works from a user point of view before explaining how you can configure advanced password settings.

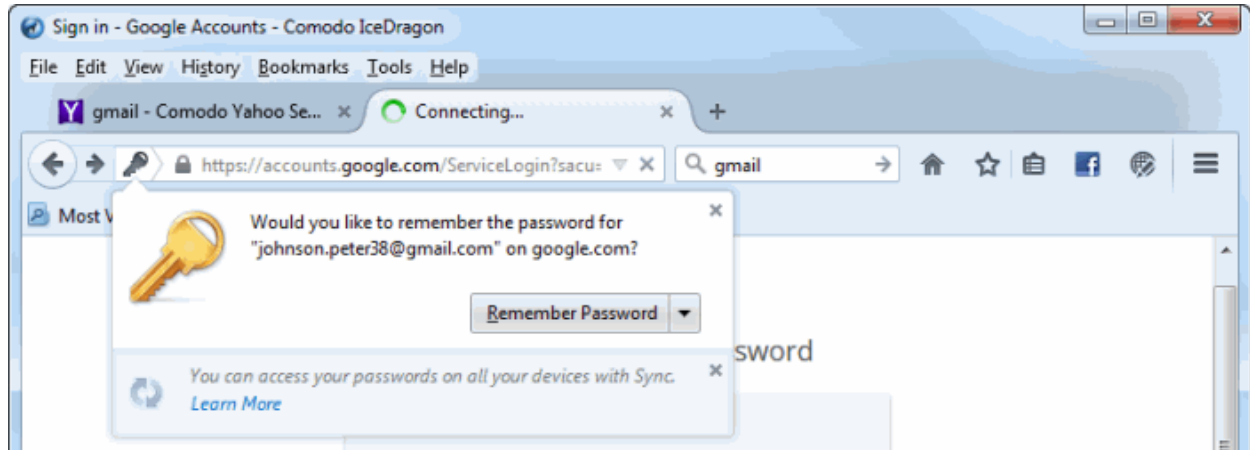

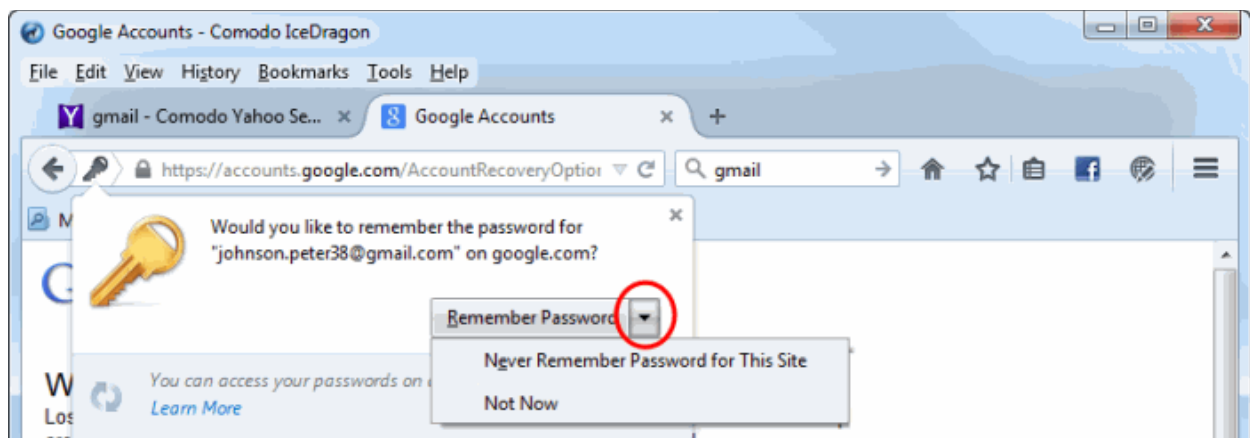

The 'Remember Password' prompt

When you enter your username and password in a log-in form, IceDragon will offer to remember your password.



- For the browser to save your password, click 'Remember Password'
- For additional options click the drop-down arrow beside 'Remember Password'



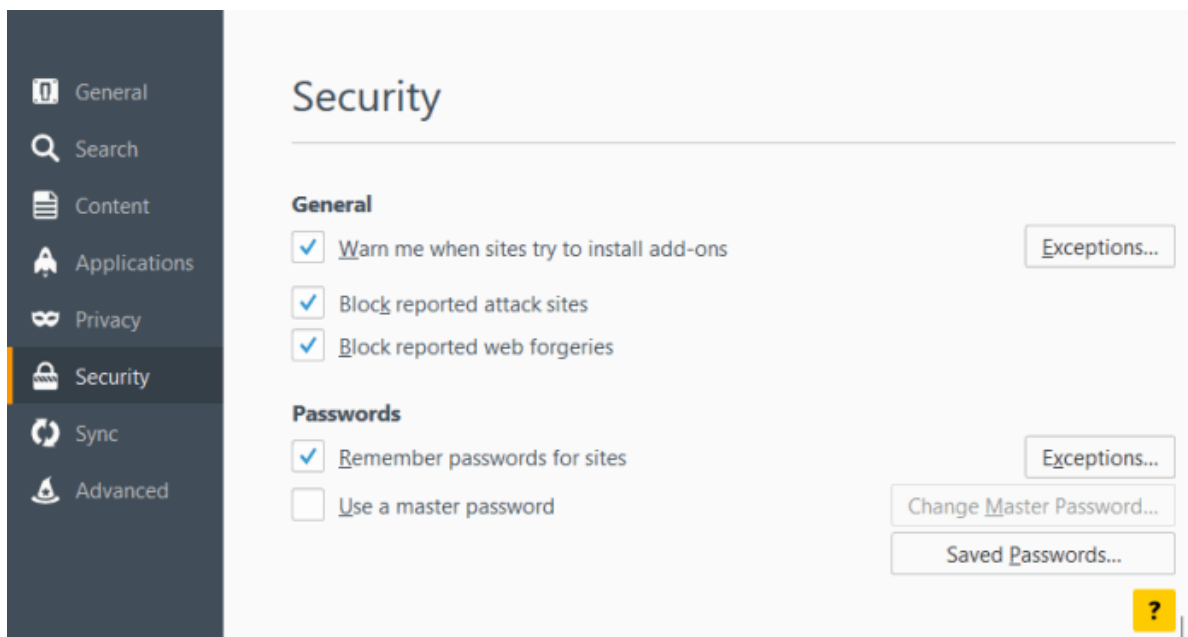
Click the option for remembering password for this site

- **Never Remember Password for This site** – Select this option if you do not want to save the password for this site. The website will be added to Exclusions list. The password you entered will not be saved. Also from next time you access the same site, the prompt for remembering your password for this site will not appear.
- **Not Now** – Select this option if you want the browser to save the password for the website at a later time. The password you enter this time will not be saved. But when you enter your password for the same website for the next time, the prompt for remembering password will appear.

Configuring 'Remember Password' option

- Click the Comodo IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Select 'Options' > 'Security' button
- If you deselect the 'Remember passwords for sites' box then IceDragon will no longer offer to remember passwords for sites that you log in to.
- Master Passwords can be used to protect saved website passwords. You will be asked to enter this password once per session when you next come to log-in to one of your websites. After entering the master password once, all

subsequent password fields will be auto-completed. This can provide an acceptable compromise between security and the convenience of automatic website log-ins.



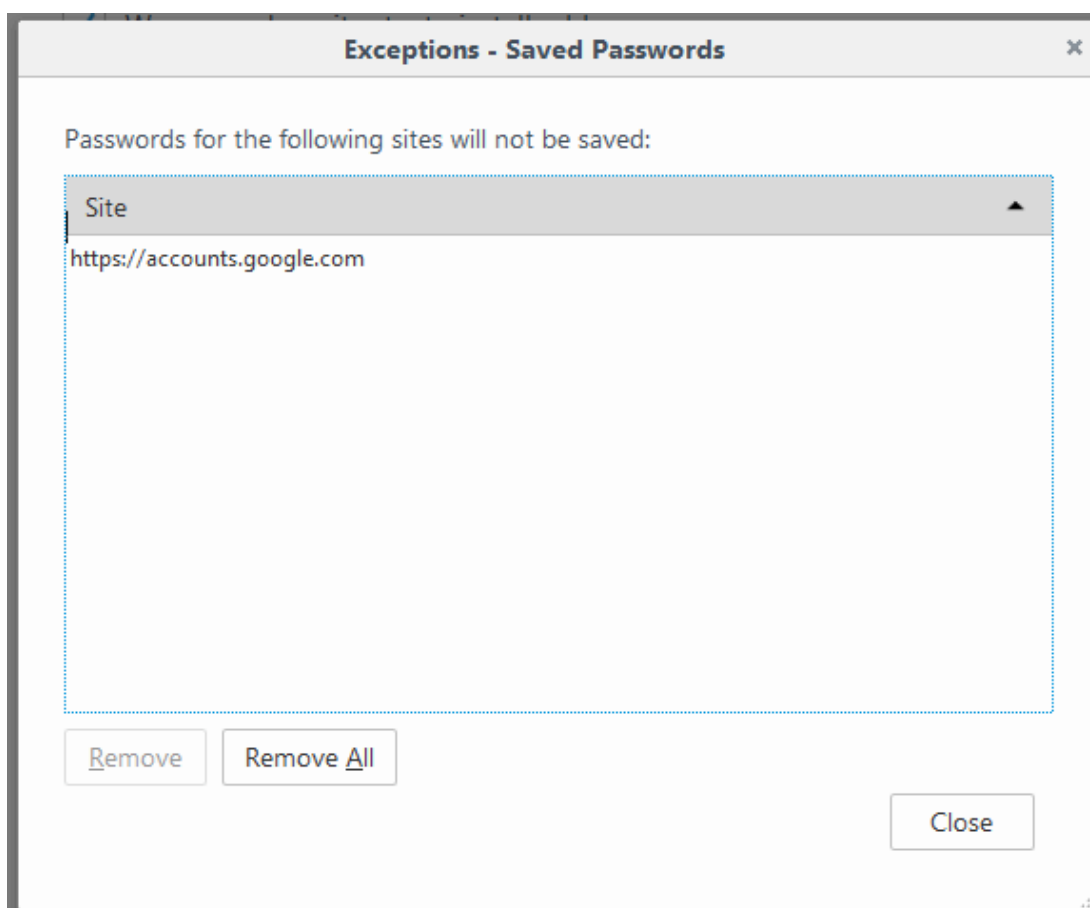
Configuring Exceptions

The websites for which you chose 'Never Remember Password for this site' from the **Remember Password prompt dialog** will be automatically added to exclusions. The passwords for those sites will not be saved, also the Remember Password prompt dialog will not appear during the successive logins to the excluded sites. You can view and remove those sites from exclusions.

To view exception sites

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Select 'Options' > 'Security' button
- Click 'Exclusions' beside 'Remember Passwords for sites'

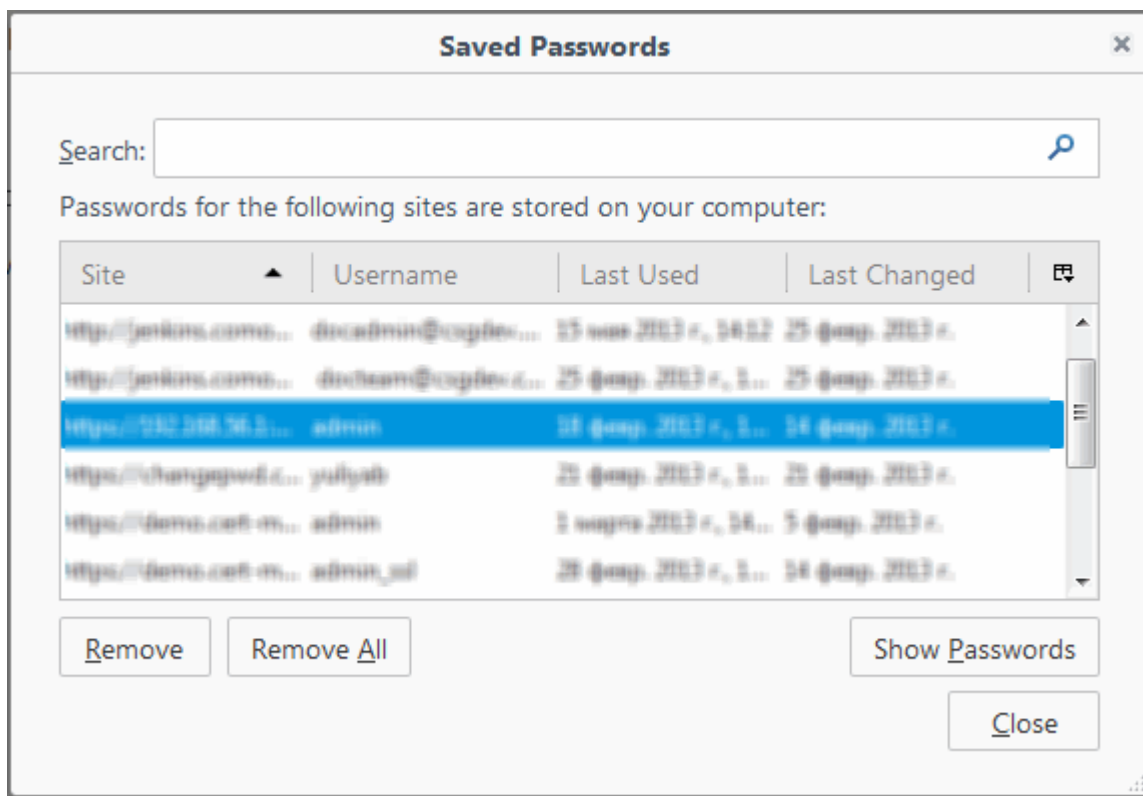

The 'Saved Passwords' interface shows list of sites that have stored passwords associated with them. You can search the list for a specific username or website by entering it fully or partially in the search bar.

- To delete all stored passwords, click 'Remove All'.

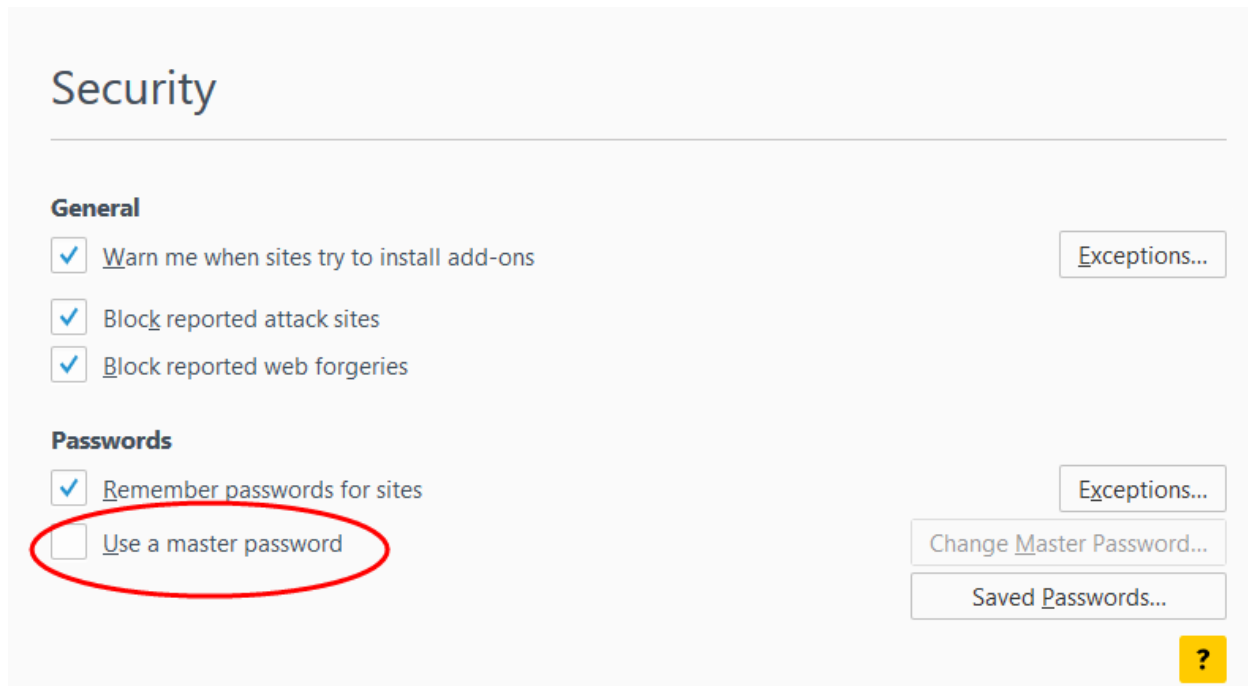
Set a master password

If you have asked IceDragon to remember your usernames and passwords, then they will be automatically entered whenever you visit a particular website. While this is very convenient, it can present a security risk if somebody else sits at your computer, visits the login page of one of your websites and then automatically gains access to your account. The master password feature allows you to overcome this by requiring a password before IceDragon will enter your login data.

Important: Do not forget your master password. If you do, you will not be able to access your saved passwords.

To specify a master password

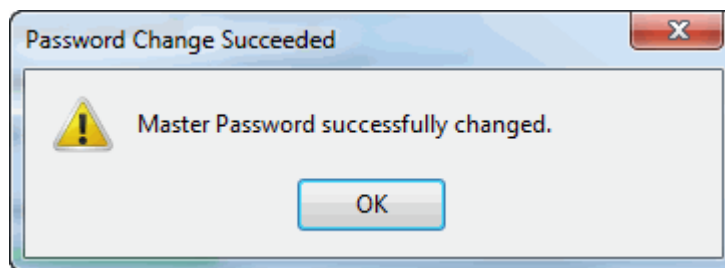

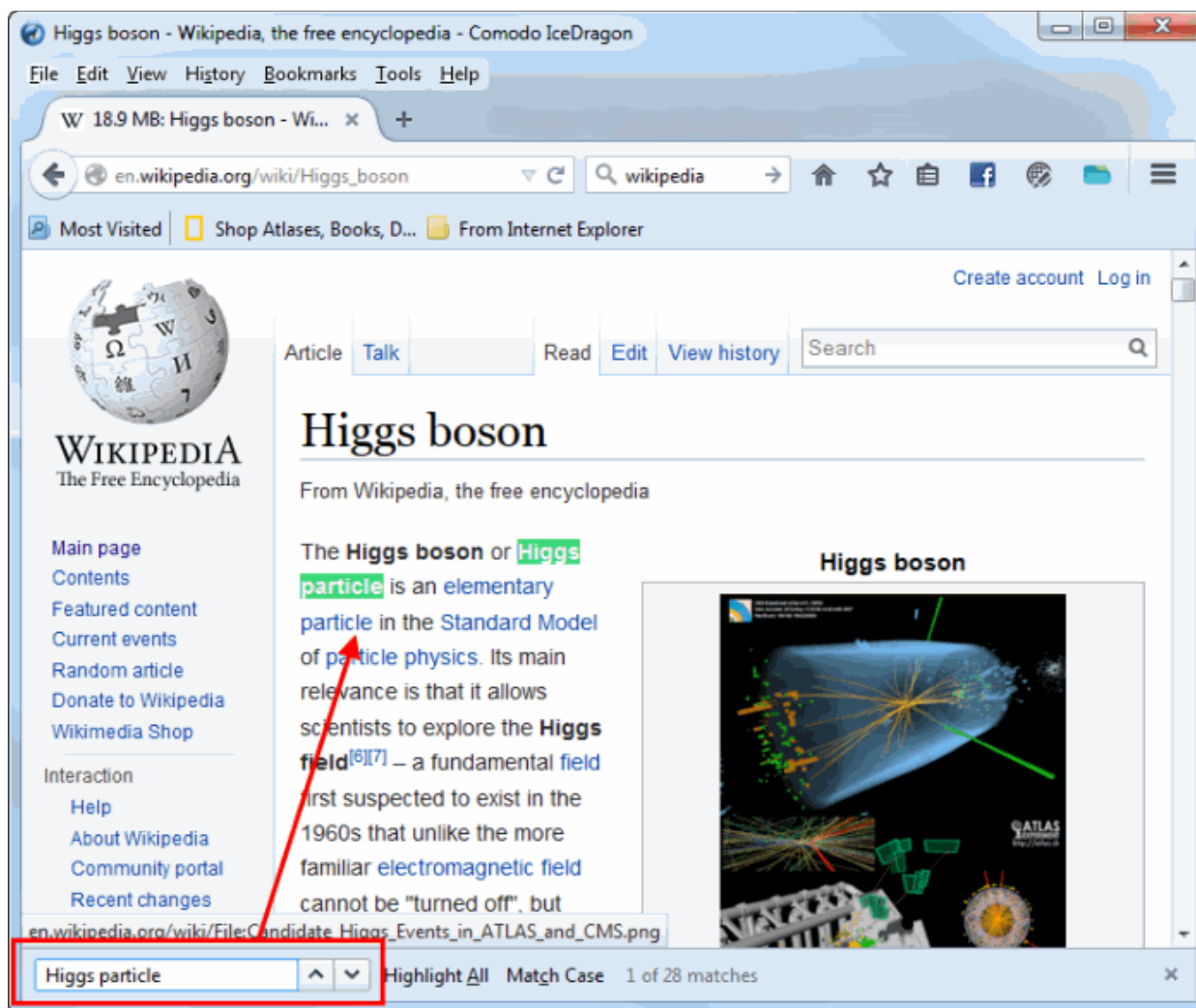
Accessibility Options

- **Always use the cursor keys to navigate within pages** – Enables 'Caret browsing' within the webpage – displays a blinking text selection cursor that can be moved using the arrow keys in your key board. The cursor enables you to select a piece of text from the webpage to your clipboard directly, point to links, move from field from field and so on, using the keyboard.

Alternatively, this option can be enabled by pressing F7 from your keyboard.



- Click 'Yes' to enable caret browsing
- **Search for text when I start typing** - When enabled, the browser displays a 'Quick Find' bar at the bottom of the window when you start typing a search keyword shows the search results within the currently open webpage.



- **Warn me when websites try to re-redirect or reload the page** - When enabled, the browser, displays a warning when the page you visit automatically re-redirects you to another page or re-loads itself.

Example: This is useful for security against phishing attacks. If you accidentally land into a page fraudulent or phishing website may be, by typing the url with typographic errors, you will be immediately alerted on the moment when the phishing site re-redirects you to genuine site after logging your sensitive information like credit card data and password.

Browsing Options

- **Use auto auto-scrolling** – Makes the currently open webpage to scroll automatically when you click the center mouse button or the scroll wheel and move the mouse up or down.
- **Use smooth scrolling** – Makes the page to scroll up or down smoothly when pressing 'Page Up' and 'Page Down' Keys. This option is useful when reading lengthy pages as it makes it easier to resume from where you have left, when scrolling a page up or down.
- **Use hardware acceleration when available** - Instructs the browser to use graphics processor, if present in your system, to display the graphics from webpages, reducing the load to the computer's main processor. This increases the speed at which the webpages are loaded and improves your browsing experience.
- **Check my spelling as I type** – If enabled, the browser will check the spelling of every word/phrase you type into various fields of a web-form. This feature requires dictionaries to be downloaded. To download a dictionary, while typing inside a field in a web-form, right-click on the field, select 'Languages' from context sensitive menu and select 'Add Dictionaries'. You will be taken the webpage from which you can download required dictionaries.

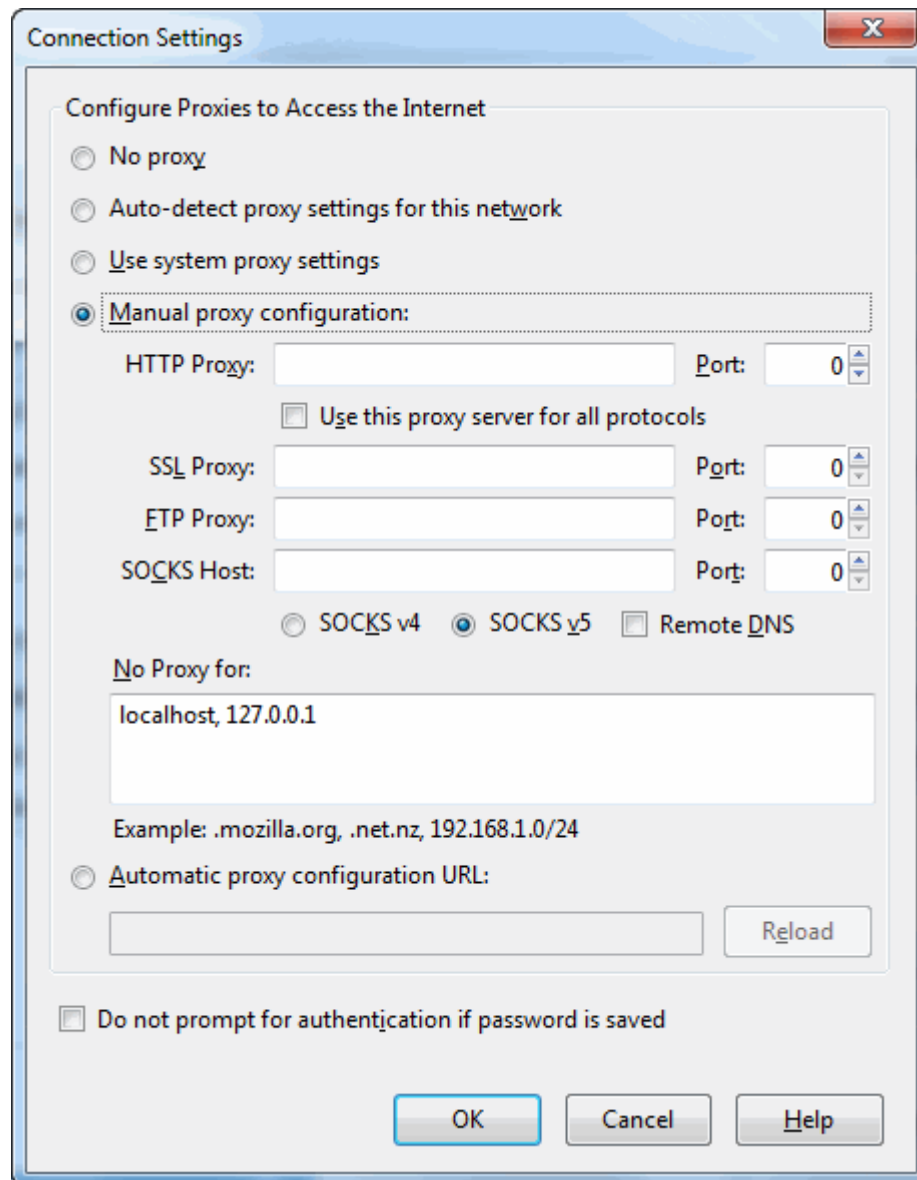

Connection Settings

The 'Connection Settings' interface enables you to configure how IceDragon should connect to Internet. If your organization or you Internet Service Provider (ISP) requires you to connect to Internet through a proxy server, you can configure the proxy connection settings from this interface.

To access 'Connection Settings' interface

- Click 'Settings...' under 'Connection' in 'Options' > 'Network' interface




- **No proxy** - Select this option if you are not using any proxy server to connect to Internet
- **Auto-detect proxy settings for this network** - Select this option if you want Comodo IceDragon to automatically detect the proxy settings from your network.
- **Use system proxy settings** - Select this option if you want Comodo IceDragon to use the proxy settings configured for your Operating System (OS). (**Default**)
- **Manual proxy configuration** – Select this option if you want to configure the proxy server settings manually. This is useful if your network uses more than one proxy servers to connect to Internet. Specify the hostnames and port numbers of the proxy servers to be used for different connection protocols. For hostname and a port number, contact your Network Administrator. If same single proxy server and port number settings are to be applied for all protocols in the list, select 'Use this proxy server for all protocols' checkbox.
 - **No Proxy For** - Specify the hostname or IP Address of servers and websites, which can be connected without using the proxy servers.
- **Automatic proxy configuration URL** – Select this option if you have a proxy configuration file in .pac format stored in your locally or in your network or from Internet. Enter the path or url of the configuration file in the field.
 - **Reload** - Click 'Reload' for the browser to load the configuration file from the url specified.
- Click 'OK' for your settings to take effect.

Cached Web Content Management

Comodo IceDragon stores the webpages you visit in a dedicated cache storage for quicker loading if you visit the same page in future. The default disk space for the cache storage is 50 MB. You can re-configure the disk space allotment for the cache

storage through 'Cached Web content' settings. You can also clear the cache if you want.



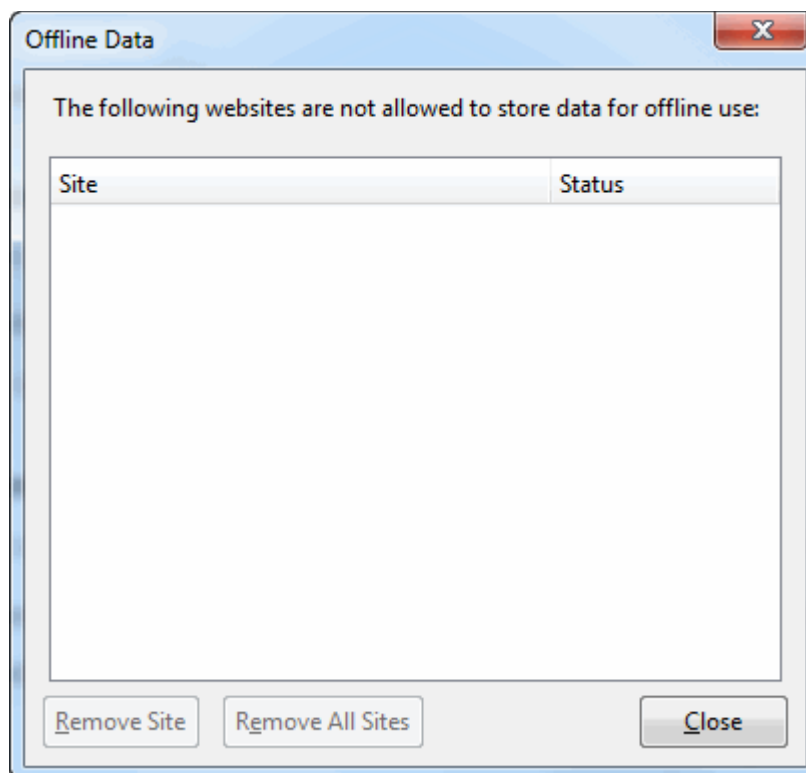

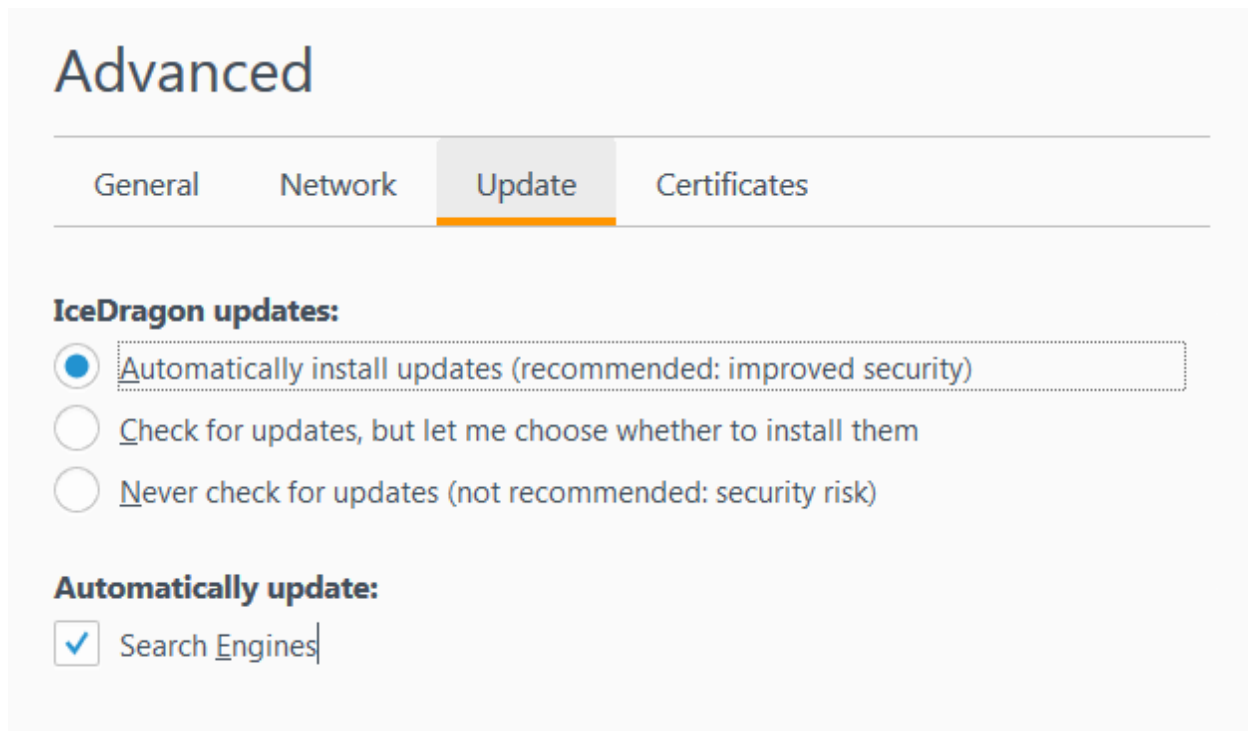

 - **Never check for updates (not recommended: security risk):** IceDragon won't check for updates. Note: Selecting this setting will disable you from receiving critical security updates that may keep you safe online unless you frequently do a manual check for updates.

Certificates Settings

Comodo IceDragon is a secure browser that allows encryption of data in transit between it and the website. You can configure the encryption settings for IceDragon under the 'Encryption' tab.

To access the Encryption Settings interface

- Click 'Options' > 'Advanced' tab
- Click 'Certificates' tab from Advanced Settings interface

SSL certificates are used to encrypt the connection between a browser and a website whenever sensitive data is being passed between the two. You may have noticed the address bar turns green and a padlock symbol appears whenever you make a purchase online. This green address bar/padlock indicates that confidential information such as credit card details are securely encrypted and cannot be intercepted en-route by a thief.

For more details on SSL certificates, refer to [SSL Certificate Encryption](#).

You can configure how Comodo IceDragon should use these certificates for encrypted browsing sessions.

Personal certificates, Client Certificates or Email Certificates are SSL certificates that are used to authenticate people. You may use a Client Certificate to digitally sign a document, digitally sign and/or encrypt an email, authenticate yourself to websites and so on. For all these you need your personal certificate installed in your browser. For more details on Client Certificates and to enroll for one, please visit <http://www.comodo.com/e-commerce/email-certificates/email-privacy.php>

If a website requires a personal authentication when you perform a data transaction, your browser produces one from its certificate store.

- If you want IceDragon to select one automatically from its certificate store, choose 'Select one automatically'
- If you want to manually select the certificate yourself when a website asks for a personal certificate, select 'Ask me every time'
- If you do not want firewalls block requests that aren't over port 80, leave the checked 'Query OCSP responder servers to confirm the current validity of certificates' box

The interface also allows you to view and manage the SSL certificates. For more details refer to [Managing SSL Certificates and HTTPS Security](#).

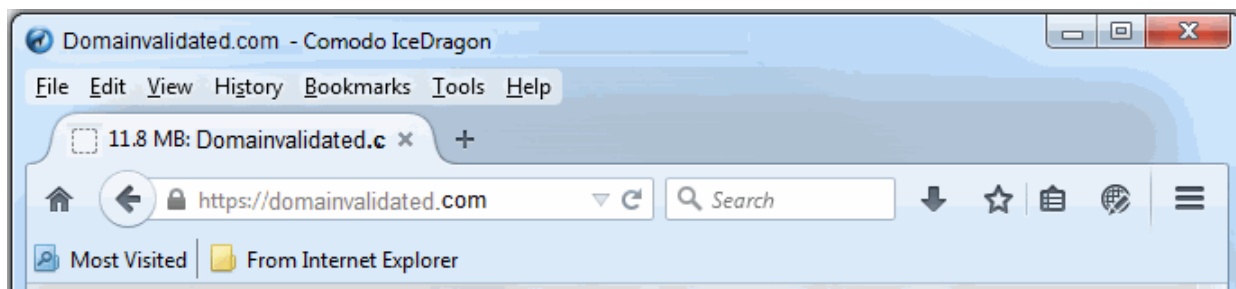
7.10. SSL Certificates and Secure Connections

Whenever you successfully make a secure connection to a website, the beginning of the URL will change from HTTP to HTTPS (with the 'S' standing for secure) and a padlock will be displayed to the left of the address. This indicates that the page is using an SSL certificate to encrypt all communications between you and the website. However, not every type of certificate should be trusted to the same degree. Uniquely amongst browsers, Comodo IceDragon distinguishes between all three types of SSL certificate and clearly indicates which type is being used by the website.

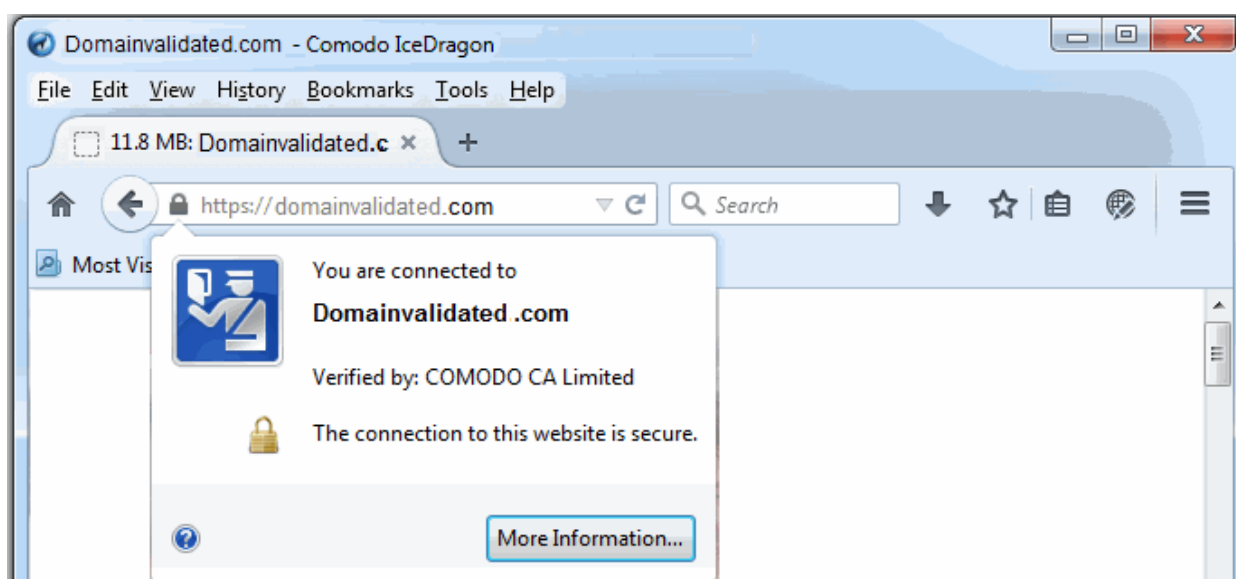
There are three main types of certificate – Domain Validated (DV), Organization Validated (OV) and Extended Validation (EV).

Domain Validated (DV) – These certificates are the lowest cost means of securing a website but do not provide authentication or validation of the business behind the website. Unlike EV and OV certificates, DV certs provide are validated and provisioned automatically via an online interface using a system of 'challenge-response' emails. If the site you are on is using a DV certificate

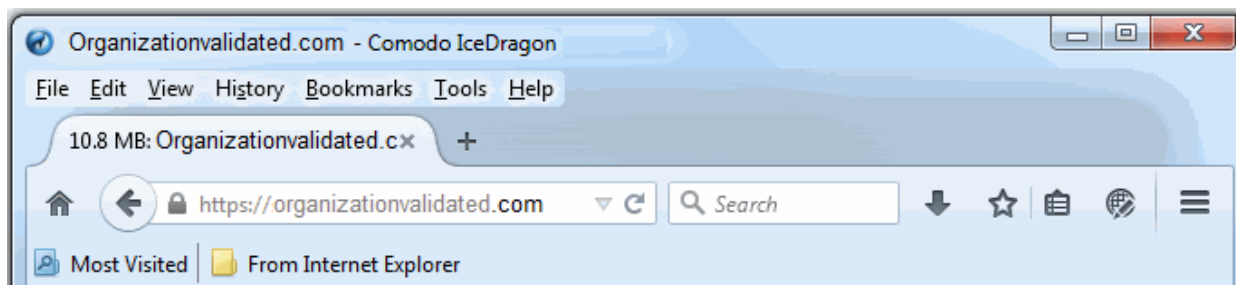
then IceDragon will place a yellow alert symbol over the padlock. This is to inform you that the organization behind the website has not been authenticated so you may want to proceed with caution:



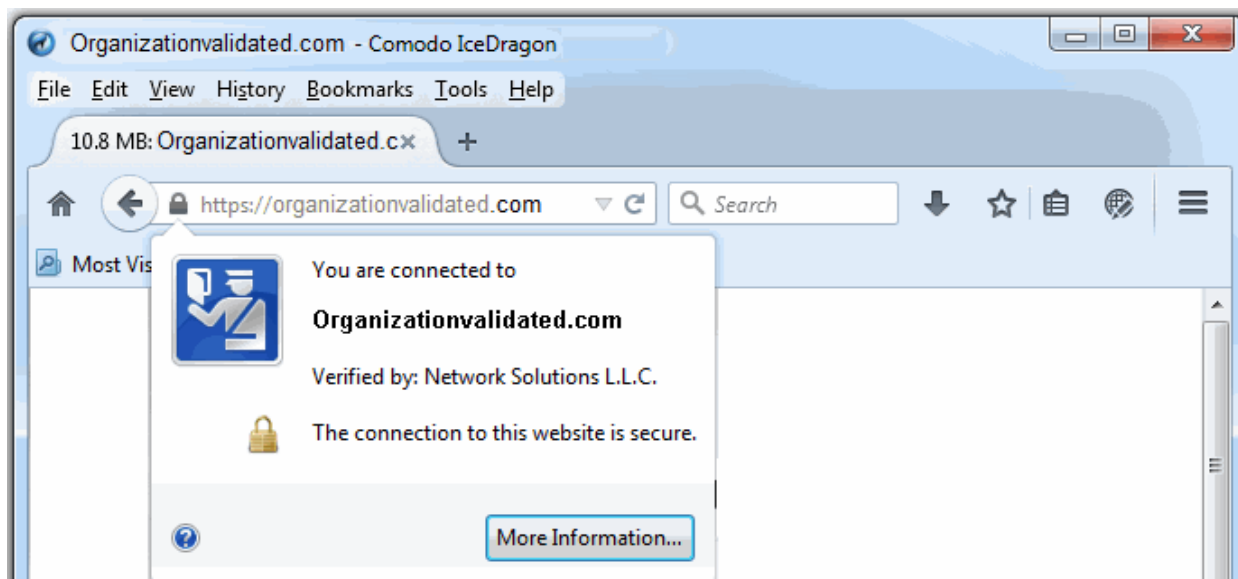
Comodo IceDragon uniquely warns the user if a https connection is only secured using a DV certificate and asks them whether they wish to continue. However, users can check manually by inspecting the certificate details:



Organization Validation (OV) – These certificates include full business and company validation from a certificate authority using currently established and accepted manual vetting processes. Because of this requirement, these certificates provide significantly higher levels of trust and security than DV SSL certificates but are not validated to the stringent standards set by the CA/B forum and do not possess the ability to turn the address bar green in the latest browsers. If the site you are on is using an OV certificate then IceDragon will display the grey padlock. This is to inform you that the business behind the website has been validated and it is safe to proceed with any transaction:

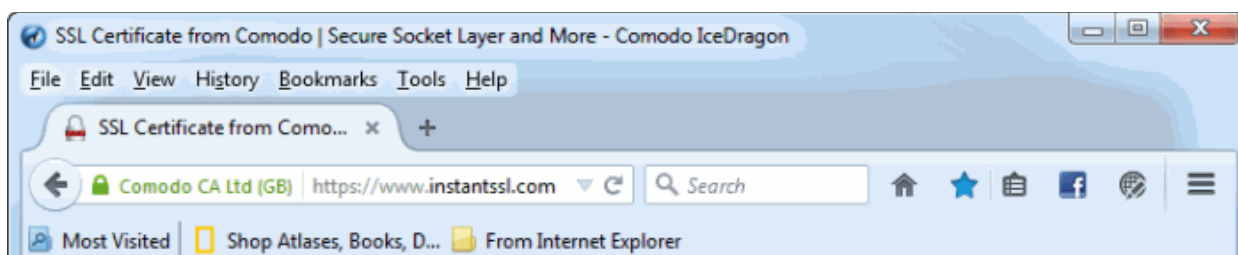


Comodo IceDragon uniquely warns the user if a https connection is only secured using an OV certificate and asks them whether they wish to continue. However, users can check manually by inspecting the certificate details:



One of Comodo IceDragon's additional secure features is its ability to warn users whenever an 'Extended Validation' (EV) SSL certificate is being used by a website for a https connection.

Extended Validation (EV) - EV certificates are validated to the rigorous guidelines set by the CA/B Forum – an independent standards body that requires in-depth verification of the legality and probity of a company before it is issued with a certificate. Because of this, EV certificates provide the highest levels of security and trust to end-users. To indicate this higher level of trust, Comodo IceDragon turns the entire address bar green if you are on a site which is using an Extended Validation certificate:



Trust between the person using the browser the website they are connected to is only possible when two stages of validation are completed.

1. Verification that the certificate applicant owns the domain name of the website.
2. Verification that the certificate applicant is a legitimate and legally accountable business.

Step 2) is carried out by a Certificate Authority (CA) such as Comodo or Verisign. A CA employs human operatives to carry out strict vetting of the applicant's business and legal standing. Only once this layer of company validation has been completed can a website be truly 'trusted'.

Comodo IceDragon uniquely warns the user if a https connection is secured using a EV certificate. However, users can check manually by inspecting the certificate details:

7.11. Website Security Indicators

Comodo IceDragon provides a newer browsers that have security features designed to help you determine if a website you are browsing is a valid and a trusted site. Comodo IceDragon address bar indicates that the connection to a site is encrypted by changing the background color of the location bar and displaying a padlock icon.

Icons on the address bar:


- The Globe icon  appears when you visit a site that does not have an SSL certificate. This icon is also shown when the connection is only partially encrypted. For example, the page is showing a mixture of secure content and insecure content (like images) on the page.
- The Lock icon  appears when Comodo IceDragon establishes a secure connection with a website that uses an Extended Validation SSL (EV SSL) certificate. The organization's name also appears next to the icon in green text.
- The Lock icon  appears when Comodo IceDragon establishes a secure connection with a website that uses an Organization Validation SSL (OV SSL) certificate.
- The Lock icon  appears when Comodo IceDragon establishes a secure connection with a website that uses a Domain Validation SSL (DV SSL) certificate.

Icons in the identity box:




- - This icon appears when you visit a page that does not have an SSL certificate, so the site doesn't provide any identity information. This icon can also appear when the connection is partially encrypted.



- This icon appears when the site is secured with an OV or DV certificate. The Encryption  icon also appears in the identity box.



- This icon appears when the site is secured with an EV certificate. The Encryption icon  also appears in the identity box.


7.12. Managing SSL Certificates and HTTPS Security

- Website SSL certificates create a secure connection between Comodo IceDragon and a web-server in order to encrypt personal and sensitive information that you are submitting to that website. For example, when you make a purchase online, the order form will be secured with a website SSL certificate. You can tell when you are on an encrypted connection because the website address will begin with <https://> rather than <http://> (with the 's' standing for secure). Other indicators include a padlock in the address bar and, in the case of Extended Validation certificates, the address bar itself will change colour to green. Website SSL certificates also contain authentication information about the website owners, including the company name and physical address. This allows you to verify that the website you are connected to is owned and operated by a legitimate company. For more details on website SSL certificates, please visit <http://www.instantssl.com>
- Personal certificates, client certificates and email certificates are used by individuals to encrypt information and authenticate themselves. For example, you may use a client certificate to digitally sign a Word document or to sign and encrypt an email message. Some websites may request your personal certificate in order to authenticate your identity before they will allow you to login to their secure services. You can store a backup of your certificate(s) for safe-keeping. The backup enables you to re-install them if you have to uninstall and re-install the browser.

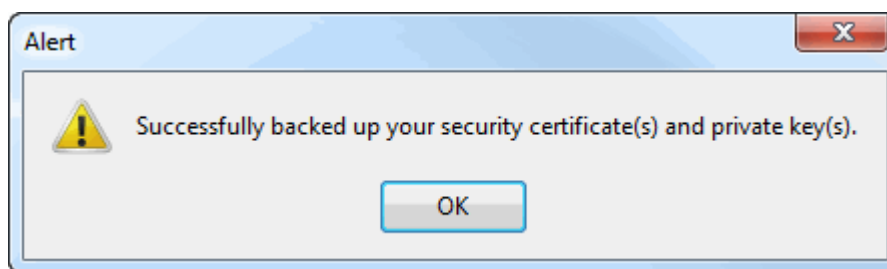
To backup a certificate

- Select the certificate and click 'Backup...'
- Navigate to a safe location in your local computer or your network and enter a file name
- Click 'Save'

You will be prompted to enter a password for the backup. Your certificate will be stored in the backup in an encrypted form with this password. In order to restore your certificate, you need to enter this password.



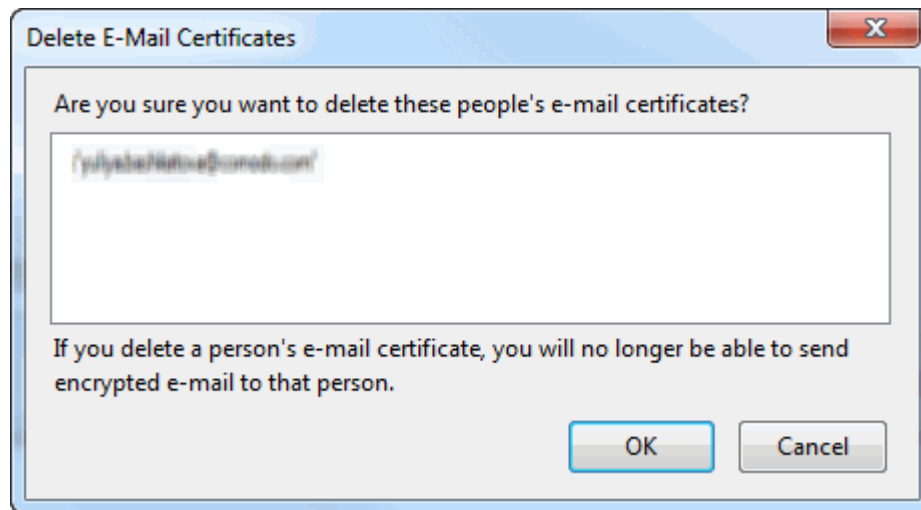
- Type a password and re-enter it for confirmation in respective fields. Choose the password as a mixture of alphanumeric characters, upper and lower case letters and special characters. The password meter displays the strength of the password you have chosen.
- Click 'OK'



- To backup all you certificates at once, click 'Backup All...!' and follow the same procedure.

Deleting a certificate

- Select the certificate to be deleted and click 'Delete'.

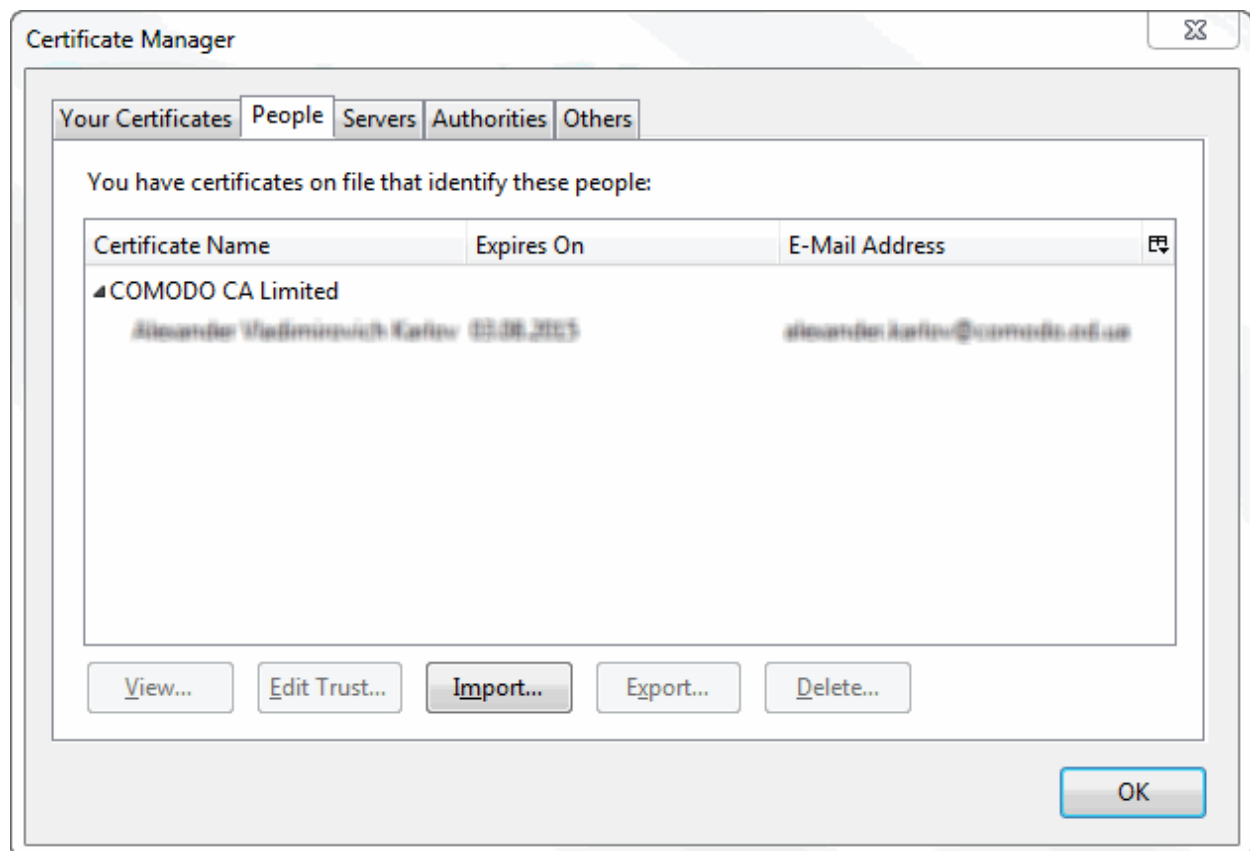


- Click 'OK' in the confirmation dialog.

Note: If you delete your currently active certificate, you will not be able to use it for identifying yourself to the websites that require it.

People

The 'People' tab displays a list of client certificates of the other people that have communicated with you over the secure channel, from the websites. These certificates are necessary for future communication with them through the encrypted channel, as only these certificates will be used to decrypt the messages sent by them.



The dialog enables you to:

- **Import other person's certificate from your local storage to your browser**
- **View the certificate details**

- **Configure trust settings**
- **Export a certificate**
- **Delete expired or revoked certificates**

Importing other person's certificate to your browser

In addition to other people's certificate's certificates automatically stored in your browser, you can manually import some people's certificates with whom you may communicate through encrypted channel. For example, you can export your contact's certificate to your local storage and import into IceDragon browser.

The procedure is same as importing your own certificate. Please refer to **Importing your certificate** in the previous section.

Viewing the Certificate

To view the certificate, select the certificate and click 'View...'. The general information and detailed information on the certificate will be displayed under respective tabs in 'Certificate Viewer' dialog similar to that of your certificate. Normally, when you try to connect securely, sites will present trusted identification to prove that you are going to the right place. However, this site's identity can't be verified.

What Should I Do?

If you usually connect to this site without problems, this error could mean that someone is trying to impersonate the site, and you shouldn't continue.

- If you trust the site, you can click 'I Understand the risks' and proceed with adding this site as a exception.

The 'Add Exceptions' interface allows you to add such trusted websites in advance, to be exempted from the security check.

- Type the url of the site to be exempted from the security check and click 'Get Certificate'.

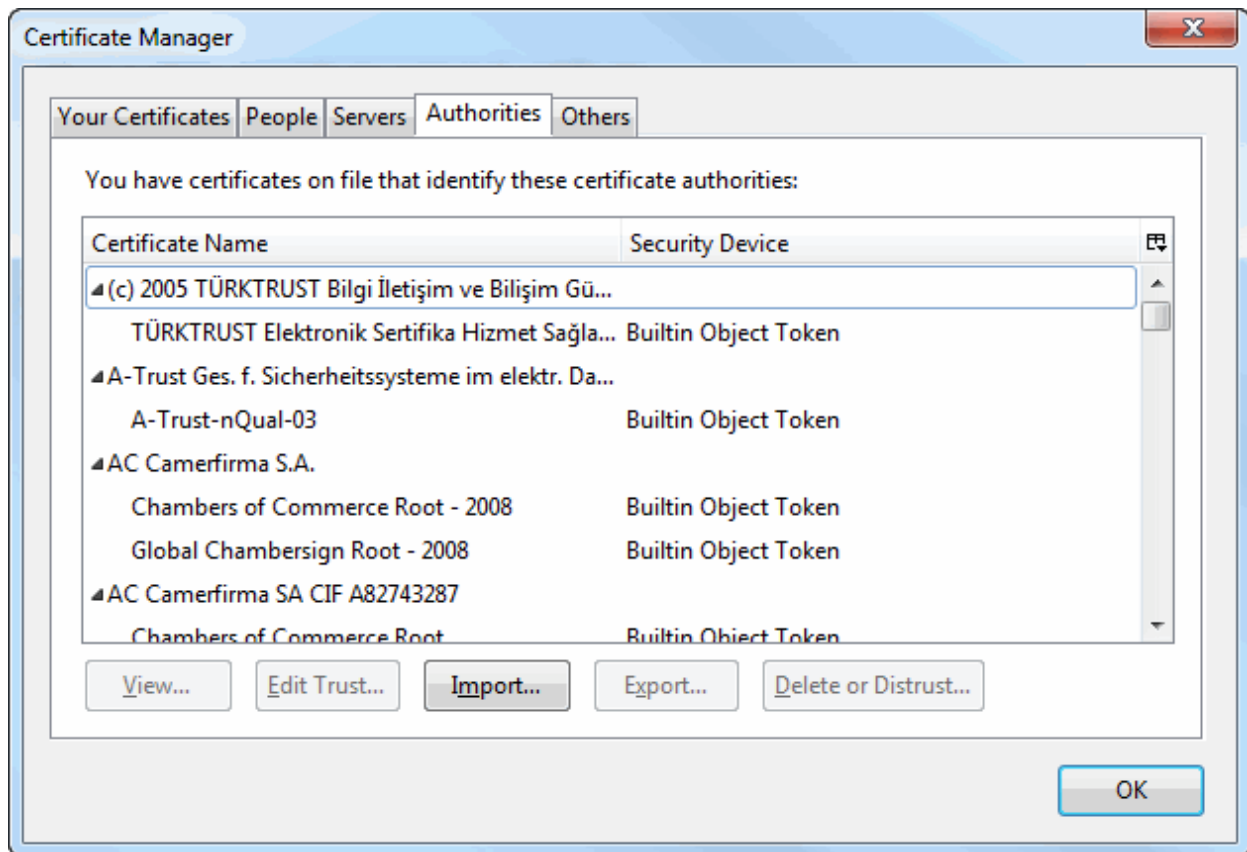
The browser fetches the certificate, checks for its legitimacy and displays its status.

- If you trust the site, click 'Confirm Security Exception'.

The website will be added to the exceptions and transactions through it will be allowed by the website even if the certificate is not trusted.

Authorities

The 'Authorities' tab displays the root certificates of trusted CAs that are pre-embedded in Comodo IceDragon.

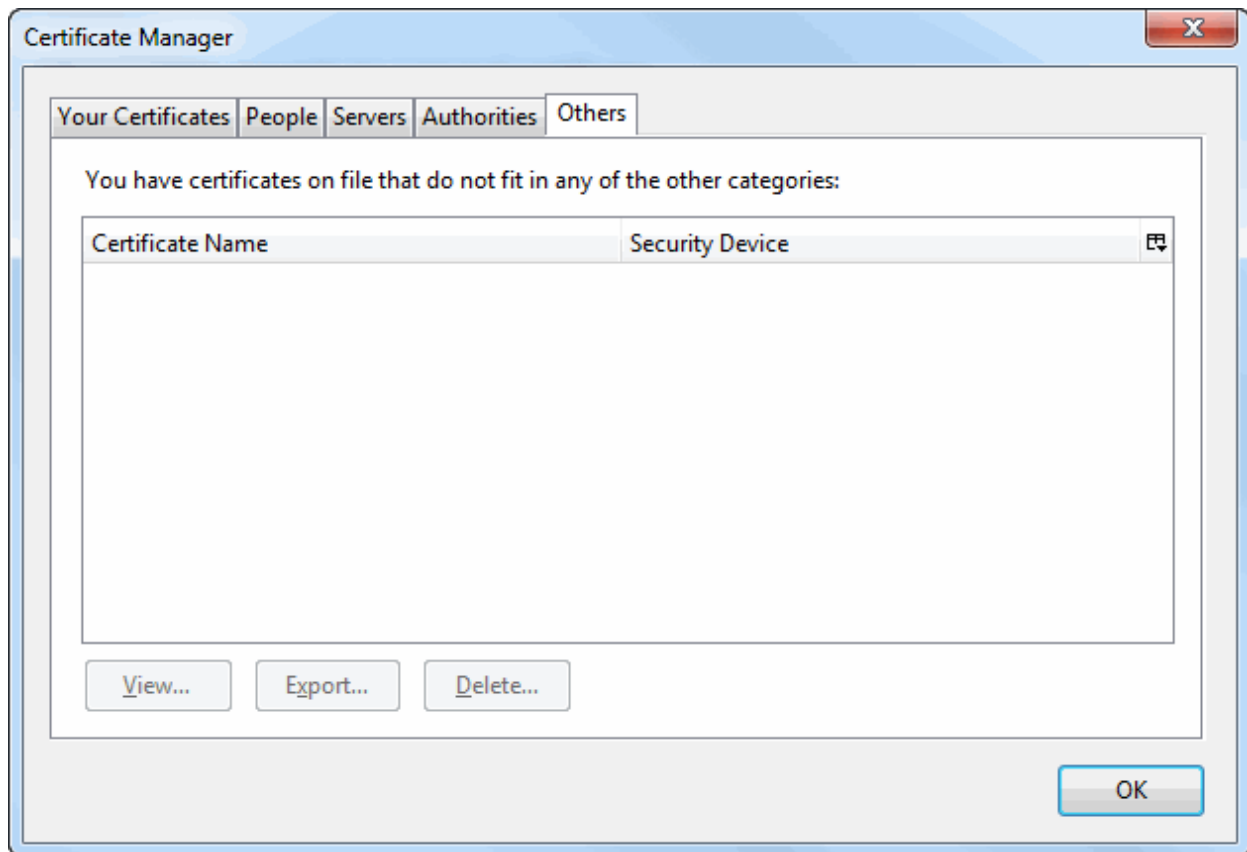

Configuring Security Modules that store Certificates and Passwords

Comodo IceDragon contains built-in security modules to store your passwords and certificates securely. In addition for enhanced security, you can use external security devices like smart cards to store your certificates and passwords, and configure IceDragon to fetch your certificates and passwords from them.

Security Modules

A Security Module or a PKCS#11 module is a program to manage encryption and decryption using the PKCS #11 standard. A PKCS #11 module can control a software security devices as well as hardware security devices like a smart card or token, in a reader inserted into a slot dedicated for the module

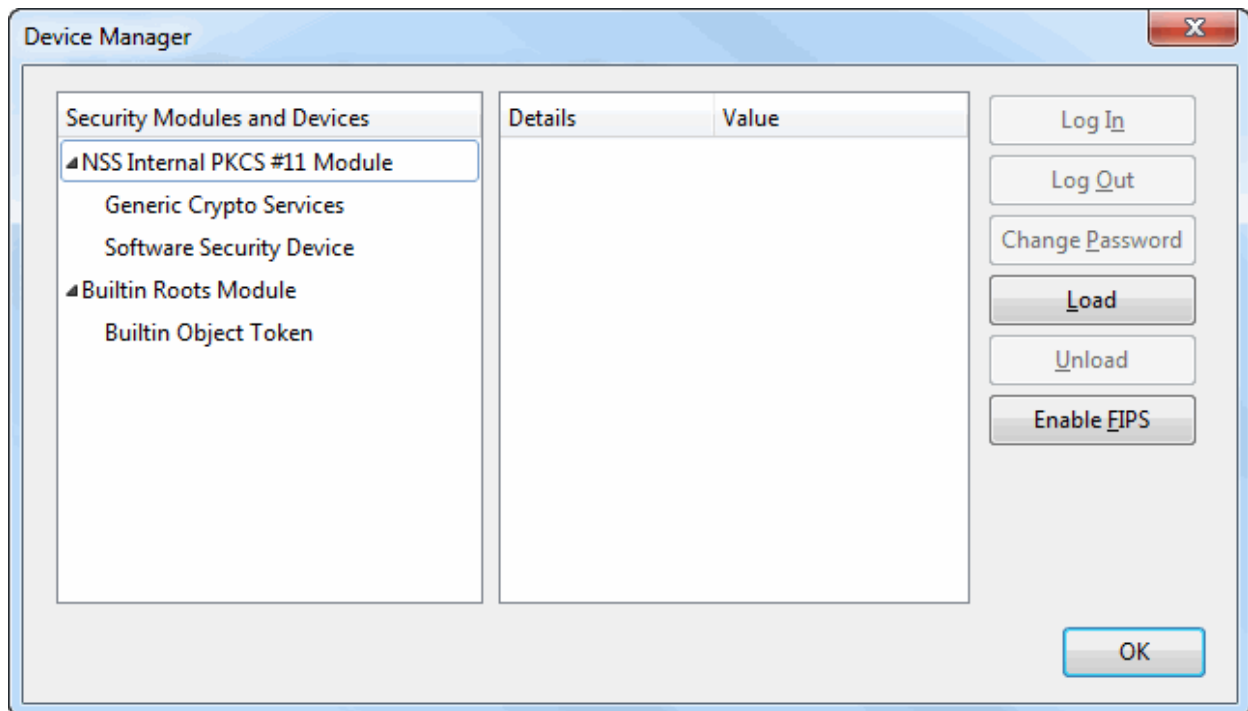
By default, Comodo IceDragon has two internal PKCS#11 security modules

- **NSS Internal PKCS #11 Module** that controls two types of security devices:
 - **Generic Crypto Services** - A special software security device for all cryptographic operations required by the Netscape Internal PKCS #11 Module.
 - **Software Security Device** - A software security device for storing your certificates and passwords that cannot be stored on external security devices, including any CA certificates that you have installed in addition to default CA certificates that came with the browser.
- **Built-in Roots Module** controls a special security device called the Built-in Object Token.
 - **Built-in Object Token** - A token that stores the default CA certificates that came with the browser.

Managing Security Modules

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Advanced' tab
- Click 'Certificates' tab from 'Advanced' interface
- Click 'Security Devices'

The 'Device Manager' dialog will be opened

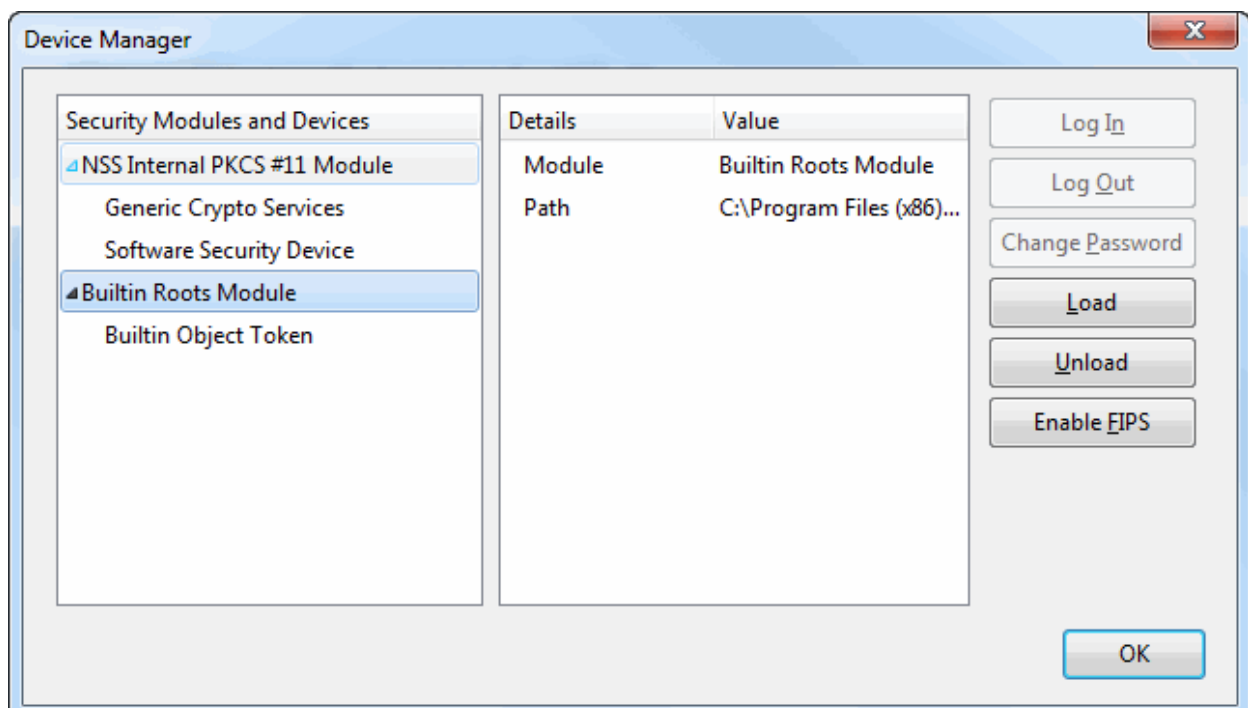

Adding a new security device

If you want to use an external security device like a smart card, you need to first install the module software following the instructions that came with the security device. You may have to physically connect the device to the port specified in the instructions during installation. After installation:

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' menu > 'Advanced' tab
- Click 'Certificates' tab from 'Advanced' interface
- Click 'Security Devices'
- Click 'Load' in the 'Device Manager' interface



- Enter a name for the new device in order for the browser to identify it in the 'Module Name' field.
- Enter the path of the module file you installed with the device in the 'Module filename' field. Alternatively Click 'Browse' and navigate to the location in your hard drive where you have installed the module and click 'Open'
- Click 'OK'

Your new module will be loaded> you can set a password and login to the device for the browser to access the certificates and passwords stored by the new device.

- To remove a module, select the module and click 'Unload'

Enabling FIPS Mode

Federal Information Processing Standards Publications (FIPS PUBS) 140-1 is a US government standard for implementations of cryptographic modules - hardware or software that encrypts and decrypts data or performs other cryptographic operations (such as creating or verifying digital signatures).

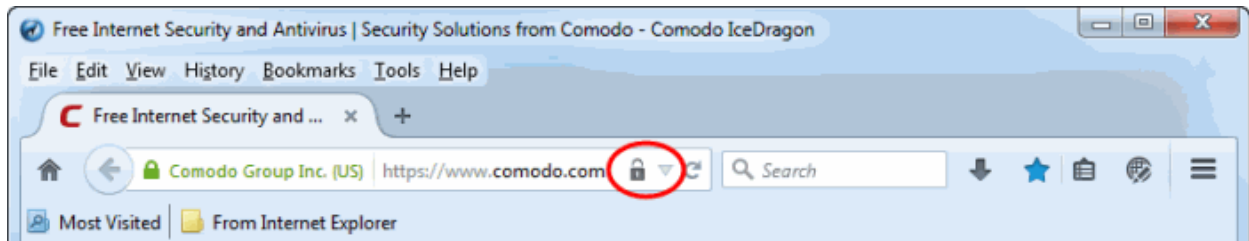
All the encryption and decryption processes of Comodo IceDragon can be configured to adhere to FIPS PUBS 140-1 through the Device Manager interface.

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Options' > 'Advanced' tab
- Click 'Certificates' tab from 'Advanced' interface
- Click 'Security Devices'
- Click 'Enable FIPS'

7.13. Force Secure Connections

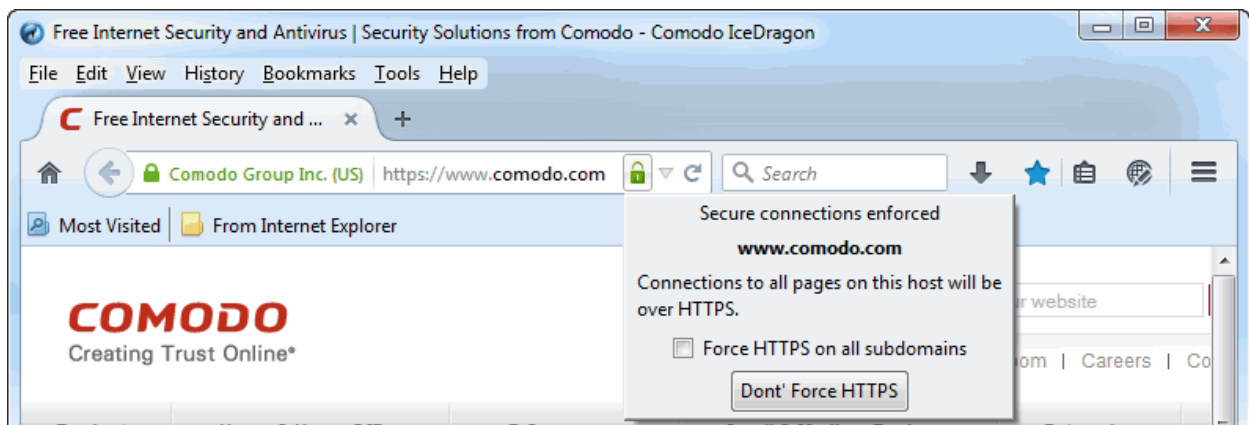
The 'Force Secure Connections' feature allows a user to specify that all future connections to a particular website are made with a secure HTTPS connection. You also have the option to enforce HTTPS connectivity with any sub-domains.

When you visit a site using a HTTPS connection, Comodo IceDragon will display a padlock icon on the right hand side of the address bar:



By default, the padlock is gray, meaning secure connections are not yet enforced. No additional actions will be performed if the page is loaded again.

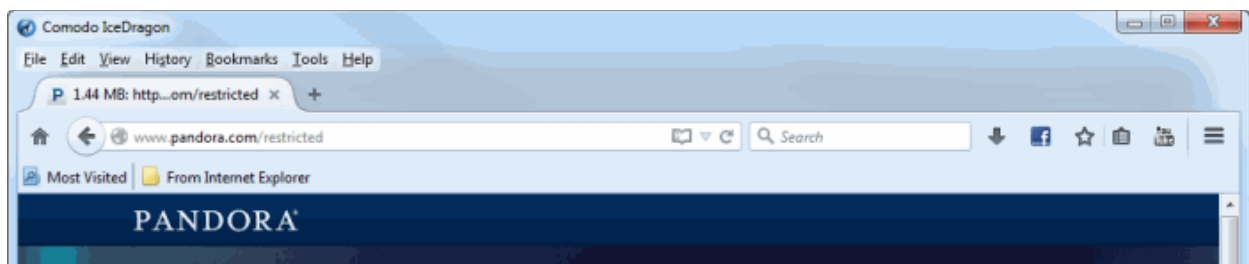
Click the padlock icon to enforce secure connections:



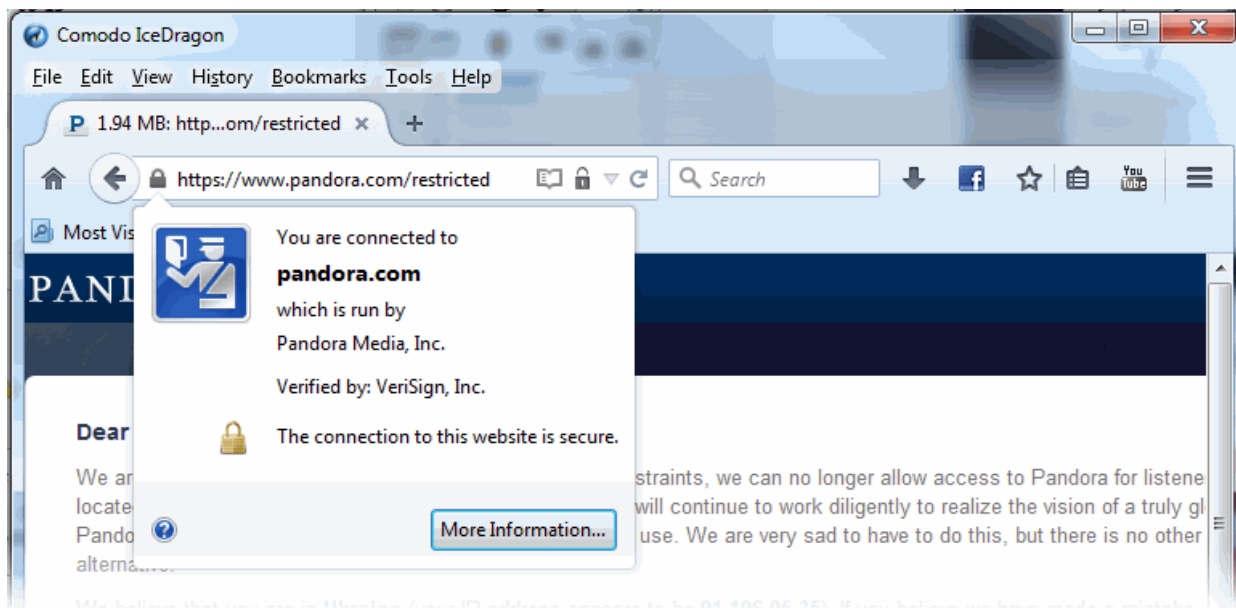
- The address bar padlock will turn green, meaning secure connections are enforced for this session and all future visits
- All information exchanged between you and this website will be encrypted using the strongest available algorithms
- Check 'Force HTTPS on all subdomains' box if you want secure connections throughout the domain
- If you wish to disable forced secure connections, click 'Don't force HTTPS'.

Example usage

This feature is particularly useful for websites that do not, by default, use secure connections on their login pages. For example, the Pandora sign-in page does not ordinarily have HTTPS connections on its log-in page. Note the address is plain HTTP instead of HTTPS - the 'S' stands for secure:



It's possible your credentials may still be posted to HTTPS once you click the 'Sign in' button, but the absence of a certificate on this page means you cannot verify the authenticity of the website. Furthermore, loading the sign-in page over HTTP also means you cannot verify the page's integrity - it may have been modified by a 3rd party before it loaded in your browser.



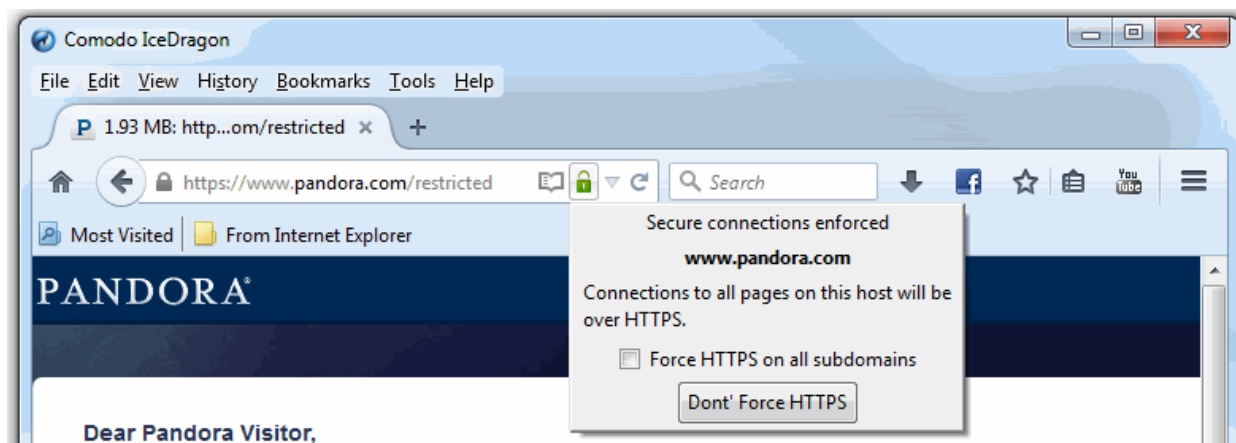
With a HTTPS connection, you can click the lock on the left of the address bar to view the website's SSL certificate. Apart from encrypting the information you submit and ensuring page integrity, the certificate also contains critical website identity information which allows you to verify that you are connected to the genuine Pandora website.

To force secure connections on the Pandora log-in page:

- You first have to physically change `www.pandora.com` to `https://www.pandora.com`
- Do this by placing your mouse cursor in the IceDragon address bar and typing 'https://' before `www.pandora.com` so the full URL says `https://www.pandora.com`
- Press enter. The page will re-load with a secure connection and thus make available the 'Force Secure Connections' padlock on the right:



- Click the padlock to enforce secure connections. All future visits to the Pandora log-in page will be automatically conducted over a secure, encrypted connection:



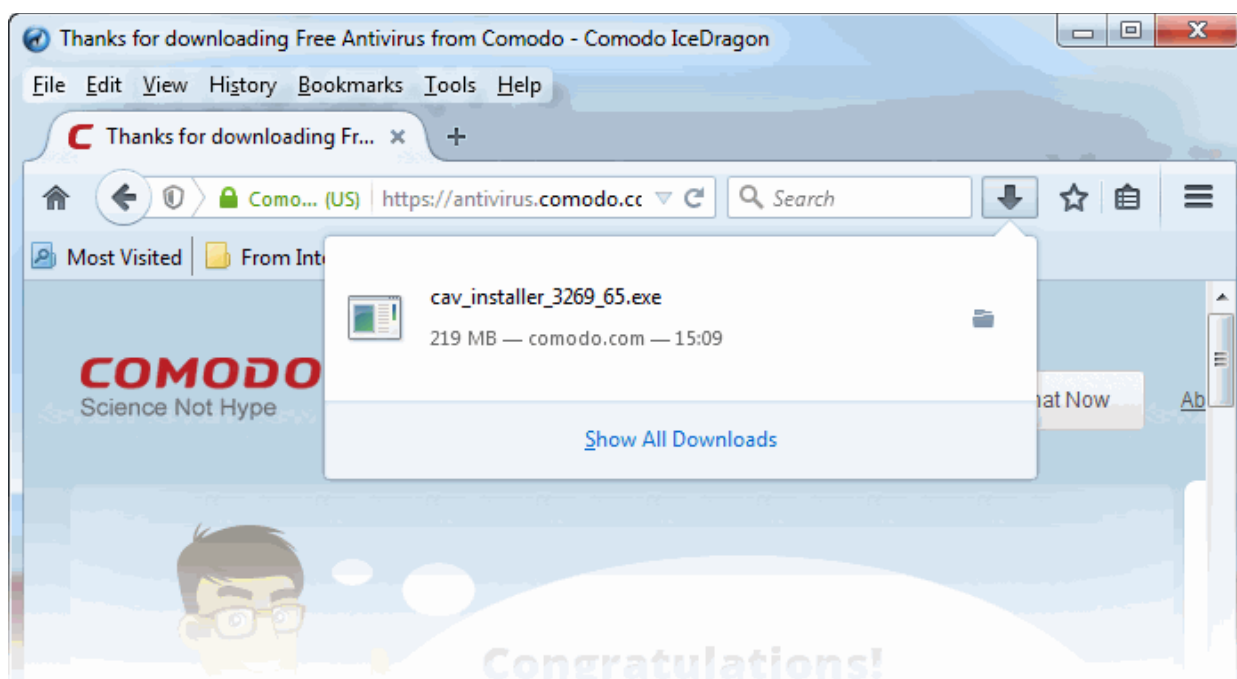

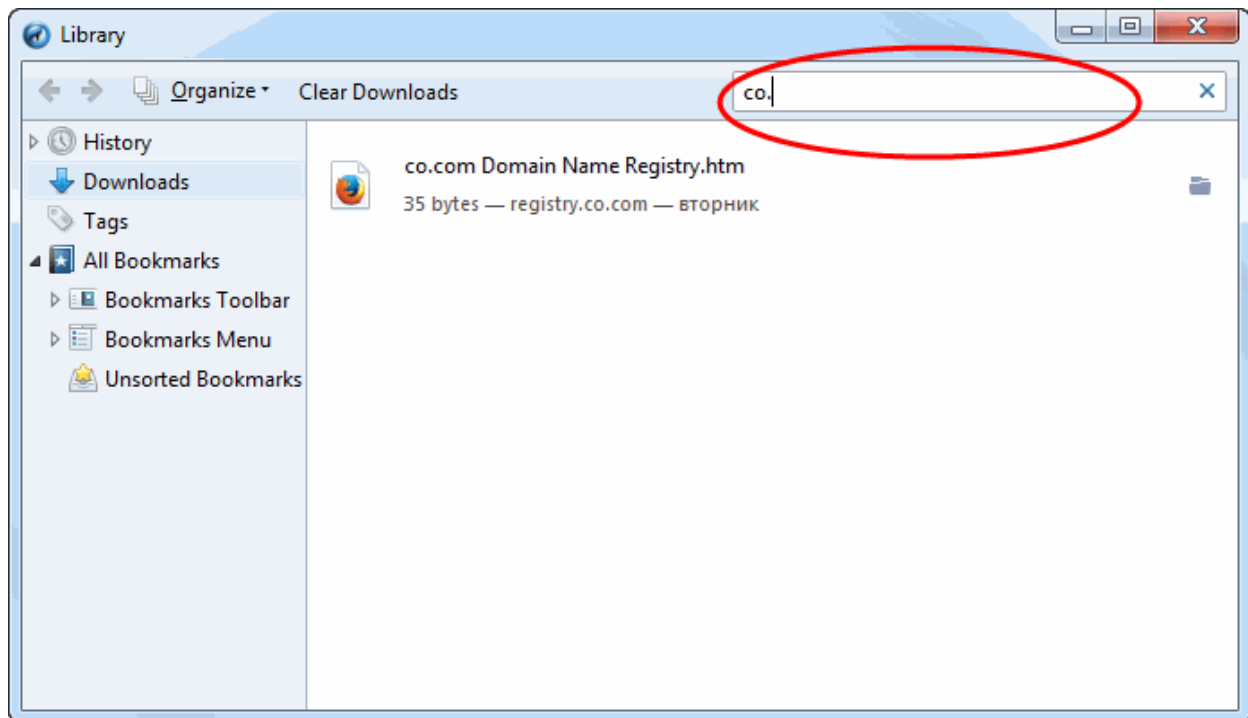
8.1. Downloading a File

When you start downloading a file from the Internet, Comodo IceDragon displays the progress of the download in Navigation toolbar. It also scan for viruses to prevent automatic download of malicious software into your computer. The Downloads window displays information about each download, such as the file name, file size, time remaining before the download is complete, where the file was downloaded from, and the time or date of the download.






To **view** app/file from the list of downloads, click the arrow in the navigation toolbar type. The list currently downloaded items will be listed. To view all downloads, click the 'Show All Downloads' or you can achieve through the 'Tools' > 'Downloads'

To **search** app/file from the list of downloads, type the name in the download search box.



From here you can:

- **Pause:** Pauses any downloads currently in progress by clicking the  button beside the file entry. When you want to continue downloading those files, simply use the  button to finish those downloads.
- **Cancel:** To cancel the download click the  button beside that file entry to cancel it.
- **Open the file:** Double-clicks on the entry to open the file.
- **Open the file's folder:** Right-clicks on an entry for a file that, select Open Containing Folder.
- **Remove the file's entry:** If you do not wish to keep a record of a particular download, right-click the file entry, select Remove From List. This will not delete the file itself.
- **Retry a Download:** If for any reason a download does not complete, use the **Retry** button next to the file entry and IceDragon will restart the download.
- To clear the whole list click the **Clear Downloads** at the top of the window. This will not delete the downloaded files.

8.2. Changing Download Location

By default, Comodo IceDragon saves all downloaded files in `\Documents and Settings\\My Documents\Downloads`. You can change this location or change settings so that you are asked for the location every time you start the download.

To change the download location

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click the Options menu > General.
- On the 'Downloads' section check the box:

- Always ask me where to save files

- **Save files to** - IceDragon automatically saves all downloads to the specified folder. If you want to download the application in a location other than the default location, click 'Browse' to choose a different location.
- **Always ask me where to save file** - IceDragon asks you to select a folder for every download you wish to save.

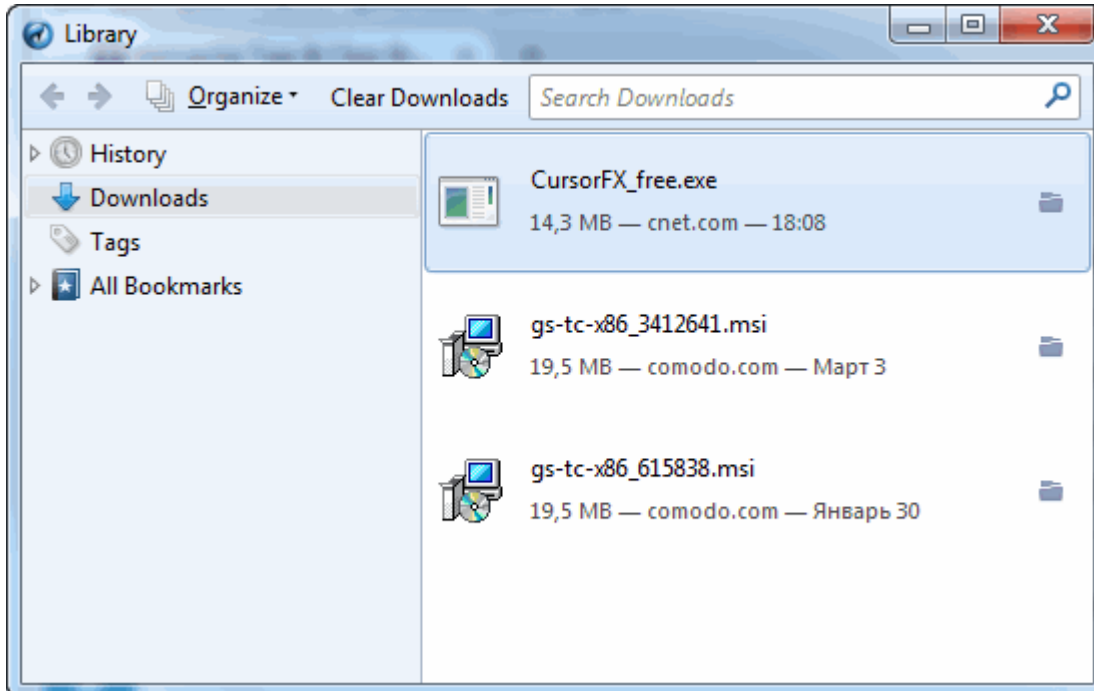

You can view the list of downloaded files in the Downloads page. The files are listed in chronological order.

To view your download history

- Select 'Tools'> Downloads from the menu
- The Library page will be displayed



- Click on the file name to run it.
 - Click 'Remove From History' to remove a specific download.
 - Click 'Open Containing Folder' to see the location of the file in your computer. Please note that this will not work if the file has been moved. Click 'Go to Download Page' opens the web page.

9. Introduction to Add-ons

Add-ons, extensions and plug-ins help expand the basic feature set of Comodo IceDragon with additional capabilities. These include, for example, the ability to play certain video formats; the ability to handle more file types; the ability to change the IceDragon theme; the ability to use animated mouse pointers; the ability to quickly update your Facebook profile and much, much more.

To open the Add-ons interface, click the 'Tools' menu then click the 'Add-ons' menu entry:



Comodo IceDragon enables you to install three types of Add-ons

- **Extensions** - Allow you to add new features or modify existing features. Examples include extensions to block advertisements, to download videos from websites, to add features from other browsers and to integrate IceDragon with websites like Facebook.
- **Appearance** - IceDragon 'Themes' allow you to change the look of overall look of the browser including buttons, menus and other browser elements. 'Personas' decorate the menu bar and tab strip with a background image.
- **Plugins** - Allow you to add support for different kinds of Internet content. This includes patented formats like Flash, QuickTime, and Silverlight that are used for video, audio, online games, presentations.
- **Services** - Allow you to add social features to Comodo IceDragon browser to keep in touch with your friends.

Searching using 'Find' feature

- Click the IceDragon button menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click Find or press Ctrl+F from your keyboard to search for a word or phrase in the page you are viewing
- A Find field will appear in the bottom-left of the window
- Type the keyword/phrase in the 'Find' field

The first occurrence of the keyword in the page will be shown highlighted in green.



- To search for the successive occurrences, click Next
- To highlight all the occurrences of the keyword/phrase, click 'Highlight all'
- To narrow down your search only for the keyword/phrase in the same case (upper and lower case) of characters you type-in, select 'Match case'
- To search for previous occurrences from the currently highlighted one, click 'Previous'

Launching Auto-search

For the browser to launch an auto-search when you start typing a keyword, you need to configure the security settings accordingly.

10.3. Form Autofill


Comodo IceDragon can keep records of your entries into text fields of various webforms and webpages like login screens, entry forms and search engines. When you visit the same page next time, and start typing the first few letters in a field, the browser will display the previous entries you made in the same field during your previous attempts, as a drop-down and allows you to re-use an entry by clicking it.

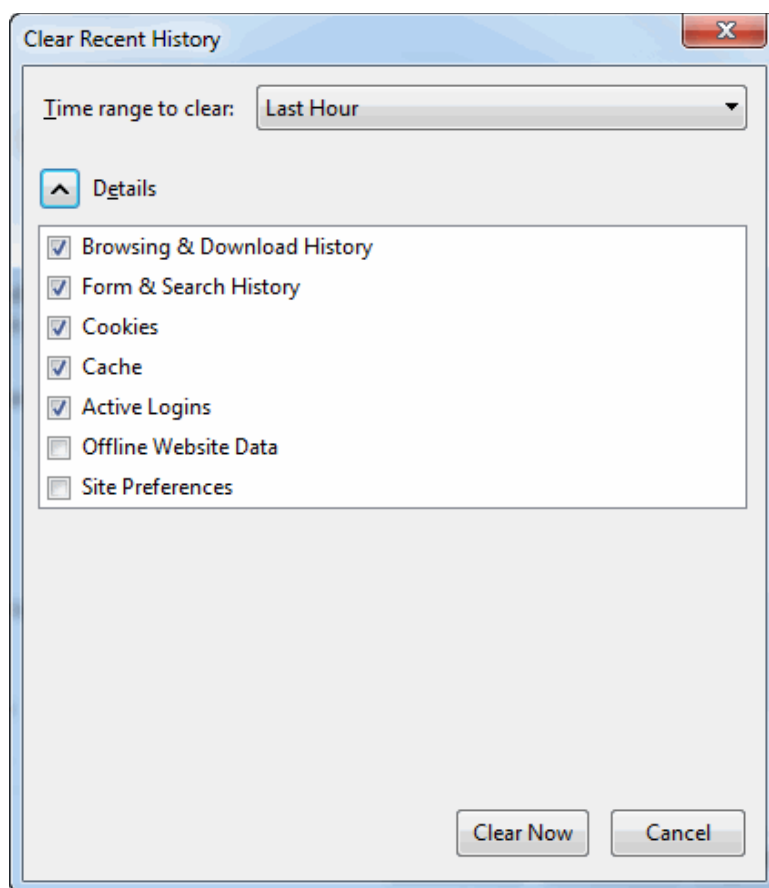

11.1. Opening the Tools Console

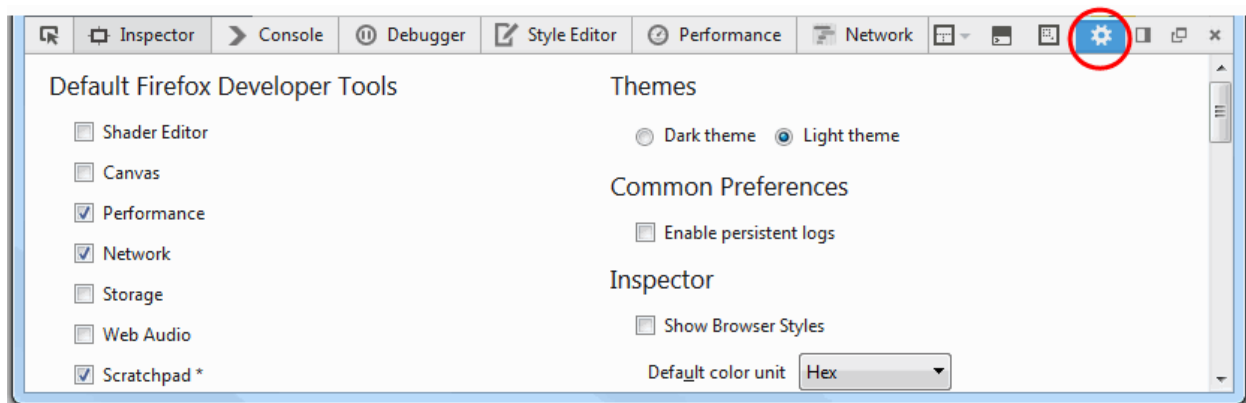
To access the Tool interface

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer'
- Select 'Toggle Tools'

The 'Toggle Tools' interface will open.



- **Toolbox Option** - Provides an access to the settings for the Toolbox itself and for the tools it hosts.



- **Default Firefox Developer Tools** – Check any box to make available the feature in question.
- **Available Toolbox Buttons** – Choose which tools will be displayed on the toolbar.
- **Theme** - Allows you to switch between a Light and a Dark theme.
- **Common Preferences**
 - Enable persistent logs - Control whether or not Web Console and Network Monitor clear their output in order to navigate to the new page
- **Inspector**
 - Show browser styles – Determines whether or not the style applied by the browser will be displayed in the Inspector's Rules view
 - Default color unit: drop down – Select the colors will be presented in the inspector. Available:
 - Hex
 - HSL(A)
 - RGB(A)
 - Color Names
- **Web Console** - Enable timestamps - If enables, the console clears the output when you navigate to a new page.


- **Style Editor** – Allows you to view and manage original sources and autocomplete CSS
- **Editor Preferences** – Defines which items will be used in developer tools
 - Detect indentation: Auto-indent new lines based on the current indentation
 - Autoclose brackets
 - Indent using spaces
 - Tab size = 2 (By Default)
 - Keybindings: drop down - Select CodeMirror keybindings or keybindings:
 - Vim
 - Emacs
 - Sublime Text
- **Advanced settings,**
 - **Show Gecko platform data** – Display Gecko platform symbols
 - **Disable Cache (when toolbox is open)** - Allows you to disable session caching
 - **Disable JavaScript** (Current session only, reloads the page)- Loads the current tab with JavaScript disabled
 - **Enable Service Workers over HTTP (when toolbox is open)** – Allows you to service worker registrations from insecure web sites
 - **Enable browser chrome and add-on debugging** - Allows you to use developer tools in the context of the browser itself
 - **Enable remote debugging** - Allows you to debug code running remotely in a different process or on a different device
 - **Enable worker debugging (in development)** – Allows you to perform worker debugging in a different process or on a different device
 - Restart your browser for the settings to take effect.
- **Web Console** - Displays logged information and other error messages. Allows developers to upload/download files to/from server, edit text files directly on a server and much more.
- **Inspector** – Analyze the layout of a web page, finds and fix web page issues. It allows developers to see which elements in the source files (including server-side code) have produced the HTML markup to be rendered in the browser. Page Inspector also lets you modify CSS properties and DOM element attributes to see the changes reflected immediately in the browser.
- **Debugger** - Finds errors in other programs. A debugger allows a web developers to stop a program at any point and examine and change the values of variables.
- **Style Editor** - Allows developers to edit a style sheet to apply a style of your own choice to required elements.
- **Profiler** - Allows developers to find and eliminate bottlenecks in your JavaScript code.
- **Network** - Displays a list of all the network requests made while loading the page.
- **Highlighted painted area** – Helps to figure out whether your website is causing the browser to repaint more than it needs to.
- **3D View icon** – Clicking the 3D view button opens page into the 3D view mode. This view makes it easy to visualize the nesting of your content. This button is available if your system supports WebGL. If you don't see the 3D button, it is possible that your graphics driver needs to be updated.
- **Scratchpad** – Opens the Scratchpad window to edit and run JavaScript code, execute it on the web page before final implementation. Web Console also can be used for editing and running Java Script codes.
- **Responsive Design Mode** – Makes it easy to see how your designs will look on different sized screens such as mobile phones or tablets. Use the resize handle at the lower right of the content area to change the size of the content area.
- **Dock to side of browser window** - To optimize the space in the bottom of the pane, transpose the pane to the vertical space.
- **Show in separate window** – Opens a separate Developer Tools.

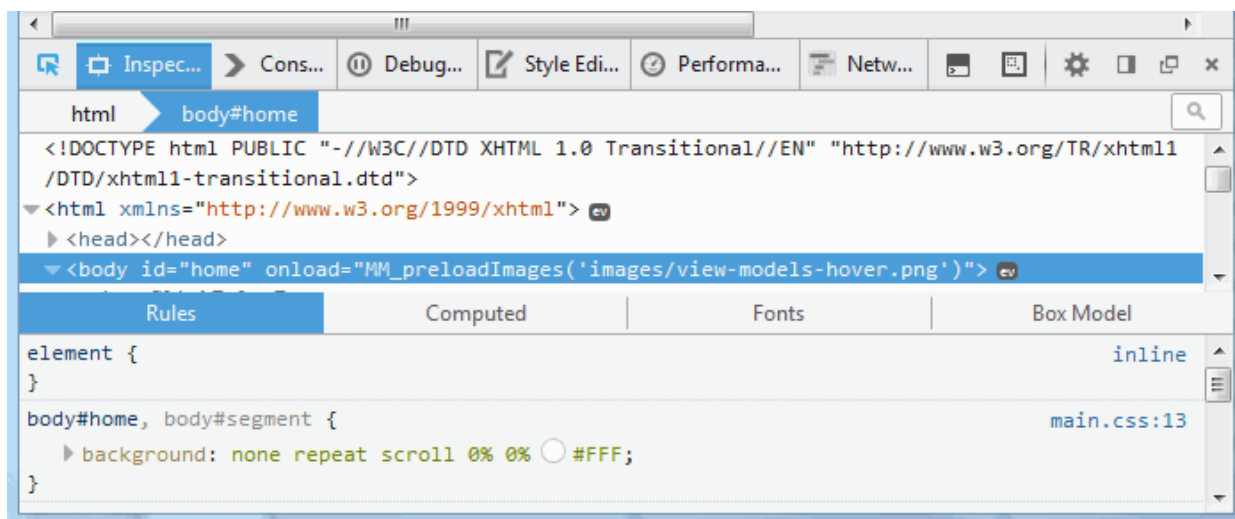
Click on the 'X' at the far right to close the tool bar.

11.2. Inspect Page Elements

Page Inspector tool in IceDragon is a very useful tool for web developers to analyze the layout and a the structure of a web page.

To open inspect element tool

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer' > select 'Inspector'.
- Alternatively, right-click on the page or an element in the page and select 'Inspect Element' from the context sensitive menu. The page inspector tool bar will be displayed at the bottom of the IceDragon.



Move the cursor over the page and a pop-up will provide information about the element that you are hovering on. Select an element that you want to inspect and click on it for more information on it.

The page inspect toolbar will be placed at the bottom of the browser. HTML, the top-level element in the hierarchy of all nested elements, is at the left of the toolbar and the selected element in the right. All the parent elements will be in the left and respective child elements in the right of the tool bar.

- Use the arrow keys in the left and right to navigate to the elements in the tool bar.
- Click on the 'HTML' button to view the HTML code of the selected element. Clicking on it again will close the HTML panel.
- At the far right of the tool bar, click on 'Computed' to open the Style panel. The CSS of the selected element will be displayed. They're listed in alphabetical order.
- At the far right of the tool bar, click on 'Fonts' to open all the fonts in use by the selected element.
- At the far right of the tool bar, click on 'Rules' to show all the rules that apply to the selected elements. The most recently applied styles are listed first. Styles are grouped by source. The 'inline' group lists styles applied using the HTML *style* attribute.
- At the far right of the tool bar, click on 'Box Model' to open a blue box with the total space taken by the element on the page. It provides information about the currently selected page element's layout: the outside numbers displays an amount of padding is on each side of the element. The numbers in squares on the borders displays the border of each side. Then, the margins around the element and the center, is the size of the element's content.

11.3. Using the Web Console

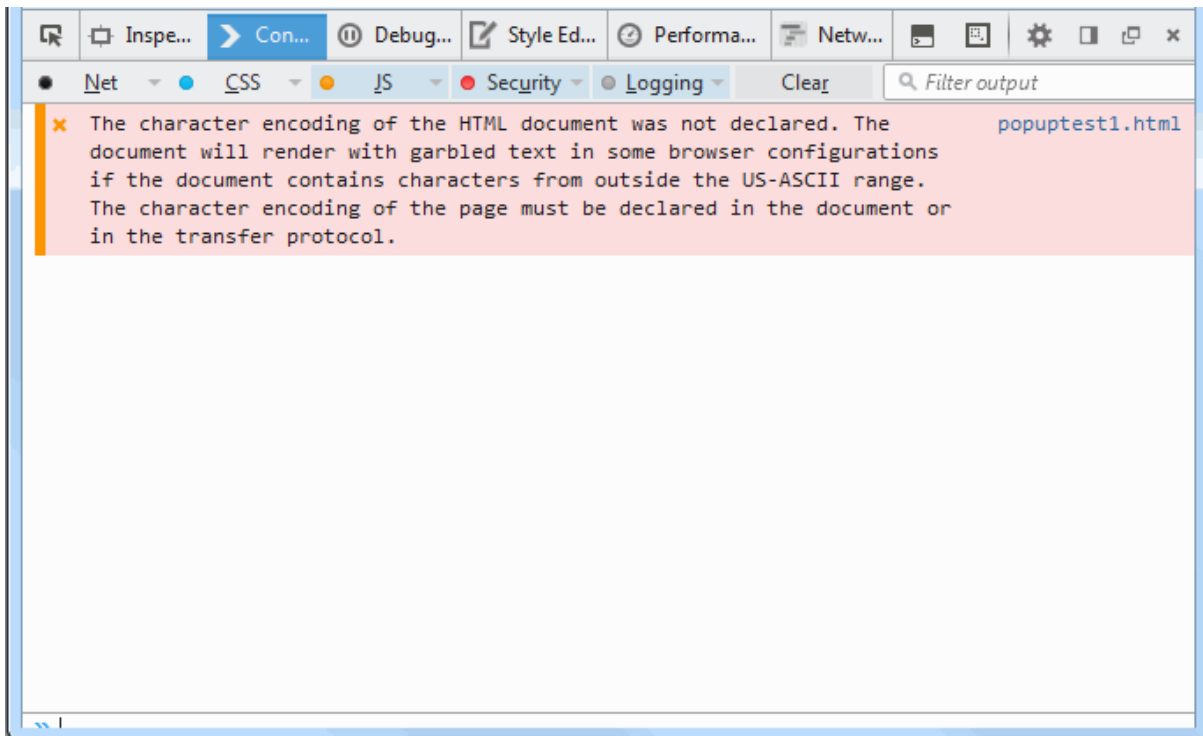
Web Console is a very useful tool for web developers, which displays logged information and other error messages. It also allows them to check Javascript and acts as a debugging tool for your web application or web site.

To access Web Console

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser

- Click 'Developer' > select the 'Web Console'

The 'Web Console' interface will open.



- Use the 'Position' drop-down menu beside the Filter box to place the Web Console above or below.
- Use the 'Filter' box to search for particular item(s) from the list.

The Web Console displays messages about Network requests, CSS, JavaScript and Logging.

- **Network messages** – Displays messages about network requests generated by your web browser. Click on network request log to view full its details such as request headers and response headers.
- **CSS Messages** – IceDragon generates these messages to inform about the CSS errors that occurred while loading a web page.
- **JavaScript Messages** - IceDragon generates these messages to inform about the JavaScript errors that occurred while rendering a JavaScript code.
- **Security Messages** - IceDragon generates these messages to inform about security warnings and errors that occurred during runtime.
- **Logging Messages** – These are outputs of JavaScript code executed on the console object in IceDragon.

Messages that are generated multiple times are listed only once with an indication in the right displaying how many times the message was output in the Web Console.

You can choose what information should be displayed in the log area by selecting the respective item, that is, Network, CSS, JS, Security and Logging. You can further filter them from the drop-down menu to display messages about errors, warnings, info and log.

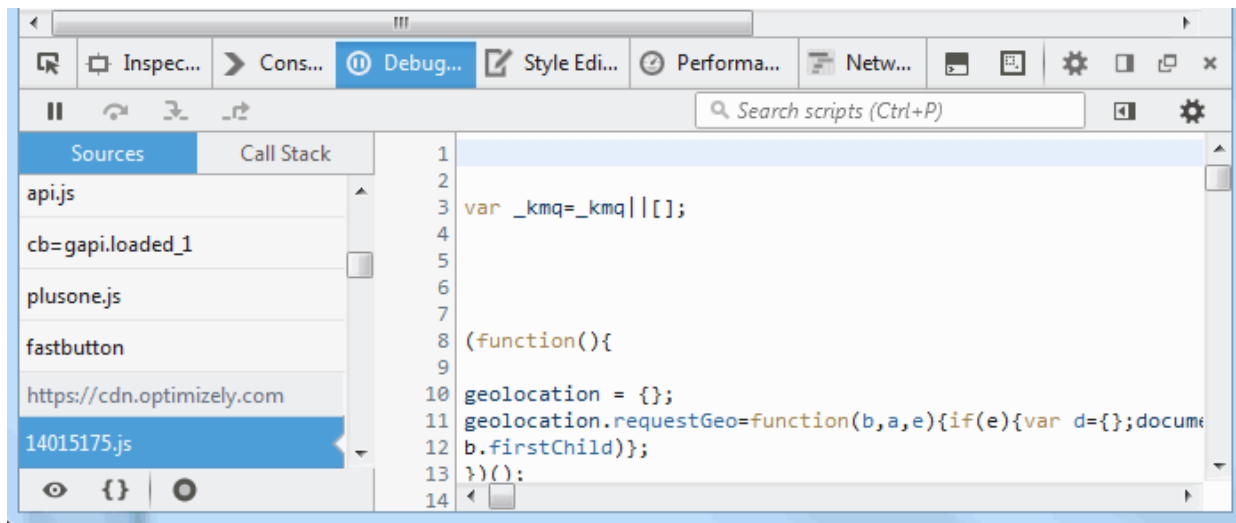
Below the log information area, a command line box allows you to execute JavaScript in real-time.

11.4. Remove Inconsistencies with HTML, CSS and Javascript

Debugger feature is available for debugging content running directly in Comodo IceDragon and allows you to step through the page's code line by line and examine the values of variables. It is useful when you create a web page and site and then to use the debugger to examine the page as it is running.

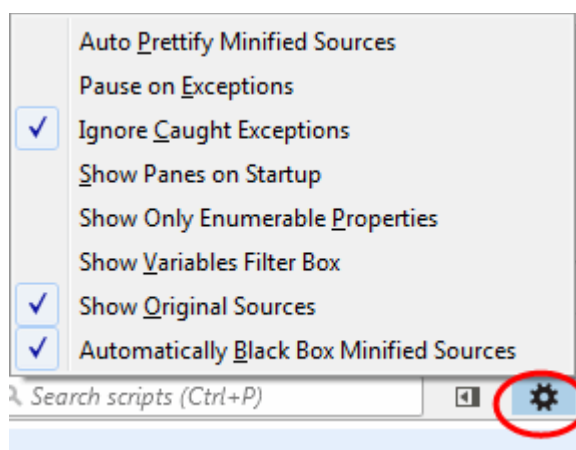
To open debugger element tool

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer ' > Select 'Debugger'



The debugger toolbar consists of:

- **Pause/Resume** - Pauses or resumes execution of the script you're debugging.
- **Step Over** - Steps across the current line of JavaScript code.
- **Step Into** - Steps into the function call on the current line of JavaScript code.
- **Step Out** - Runs the script until the current function exits.
- **Script Chooser** - This pop-up menu lets you select one of the running scripts in order to read its code, set breakpoints, and so forth.
- **Script Filter** - The script filter (which doubles as a search box) lets you type a string to filter what scripts should appear in the Script Chooser.
- **Expand Panes** - Expands or contracts the window to show or hide the sidebar panels.
- **Debugger Options** - Pops-up a menu to configure the debugger.



- **Auto Prettify Minified Sources** – If enabled, the debugger will automatically detect minified JS files and pretty-print them.
- **Pause on exceptions** -If enabled, execution of script will automatically pause whenever a JavaScript exception is thrown.
- **Ignore on exceptions** - If enabled, the debugger will automatically pause the execution of the script whenever a JavaScript exception is thrown.

- **Show panes on startup** - If enabled, the debugger's two sidebar panes are visible when you first start the debugger; by default, they are not.
- **Show only enumerable properties** - If enabled, allows you to filter the displayed list of variables after the "Filter variables" search box to will be added the variables panel.
- **Show variables filter box** - If enabled, do not display non-enumerable JavaScript properties
- **Show original sources** - If enabled, allows you to use source maps to see the original source for code.

11.5. View and Run Experimental Style Sheets on a Webpage

The Style Editor web developer tool in IceDragon allows you to view the list of cascaded style sheets (css) used in the currently displayed webpage. You can edit a style sheet to apply a style of your own choice to required elements and have a preview of the implementation of the style sheet in the displayed webpage. Also you can save style sheets from a webpage for use in your webpage and import CSS's developed by you to apply on required elements of the displayed webpage.

The Style Editor tool is helpful for webdevelopers to have a preview of the page developed by them and to experiment on different style sheets before final implementation.

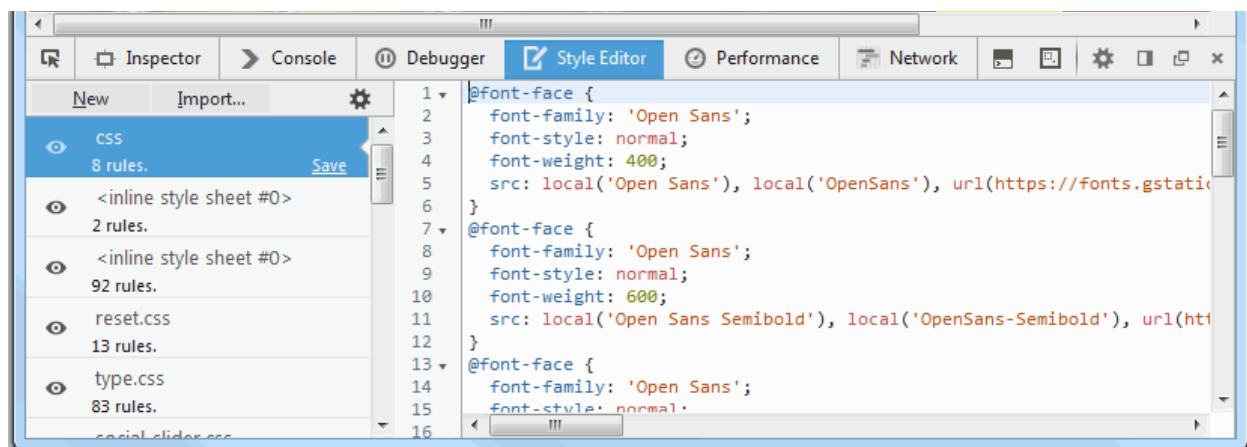

To view the list of style sheets used in the currently displayed webpage

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer' > Style Editor

The Style Editor dialog will be displayed.



The list of external and inline style sheets used for the webpage will be displayed in the left hand side pane and the rules defined in the style sheet selected from the LHS pane will be displayed in the right hand side pane.

- To view the elements and styles defined for the elements in a style sheet, click on the style sheet listed in the left hand side navigation pane.
- To switch and preview the page with and without the application of a selected style sheet, click on the 'eye' icon beside the style sheet name in the LHS pane.
- To edit and experiment with styles, find the style rule applied to the desired element from the right hand side pane and change the parameters as you wish. The changes will be immediately reflected in the webpage viewed. But these changes are temporary and will be lost when the page is reloaded.

Tip: To identify the rule applied to a desired element, right-click on the element and select 'Inspect element' from the context

sensitive menu. The lower pane in the window will display the 'div id' of the element. Search for the 'div id' in the style editor window by pressing Ctrl+F from the keyboard and entering the div id in the 'Find...' dialog

To save a style sheet

- Select the style sheet from the LHS pane and click 'Save' link beside it
- Navigate to the location in your computer and enter a file name with .css extension in the 'Save as' dialog.

Applying your style sheet to a webpage

You can create your own style sheet for element(s) in a page and apply to them and have a preview. This is useful for web-developers to experiment of different style sheets for different elements before deciding the final style.

To apply an external style sheet

- Click 'Import', navigate to the location in your system where you have saved the .css file and click 'Open'

The style sheet will be imported and the style rules will be applied to the elements defined in the sheet immediately for a preview.

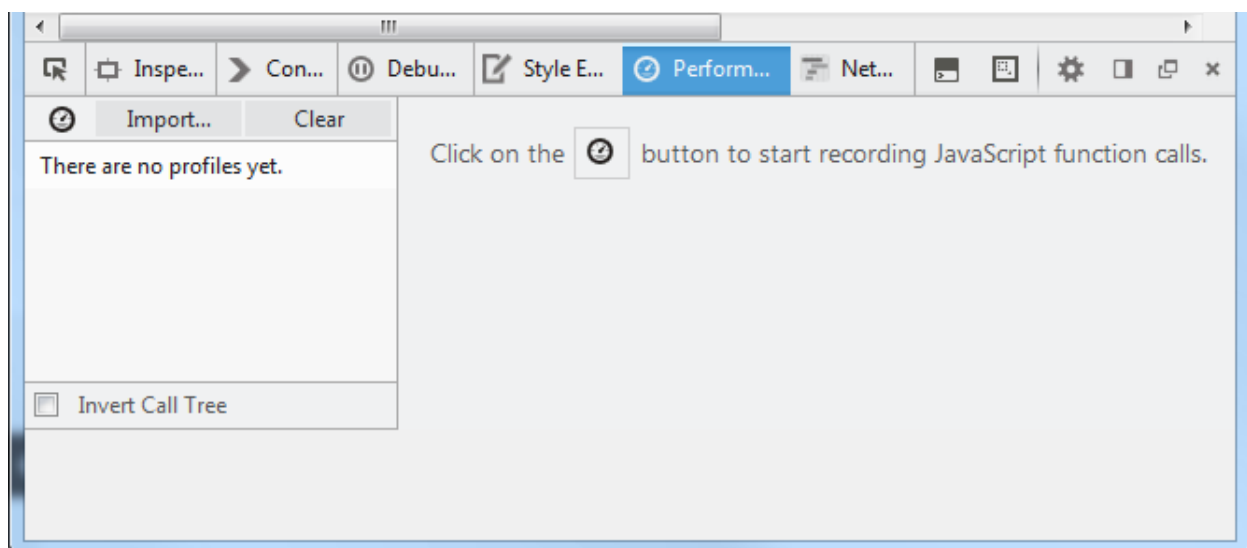
11.6. Improving Web Page/Web Application Performance

The Performance tool allows website and web application developers to optimize their JavaScript code by testing the performance of their web pages in IceDragon within a frame rate timeline.

On executing the code, the performance samples the state of the JS engine and records the code stacks at various time points. The performance then calculates the time spent by the browser to execute each stack and displays a statistical report. The report enables the web developer to analyze and identify the bottlenecks in the code.

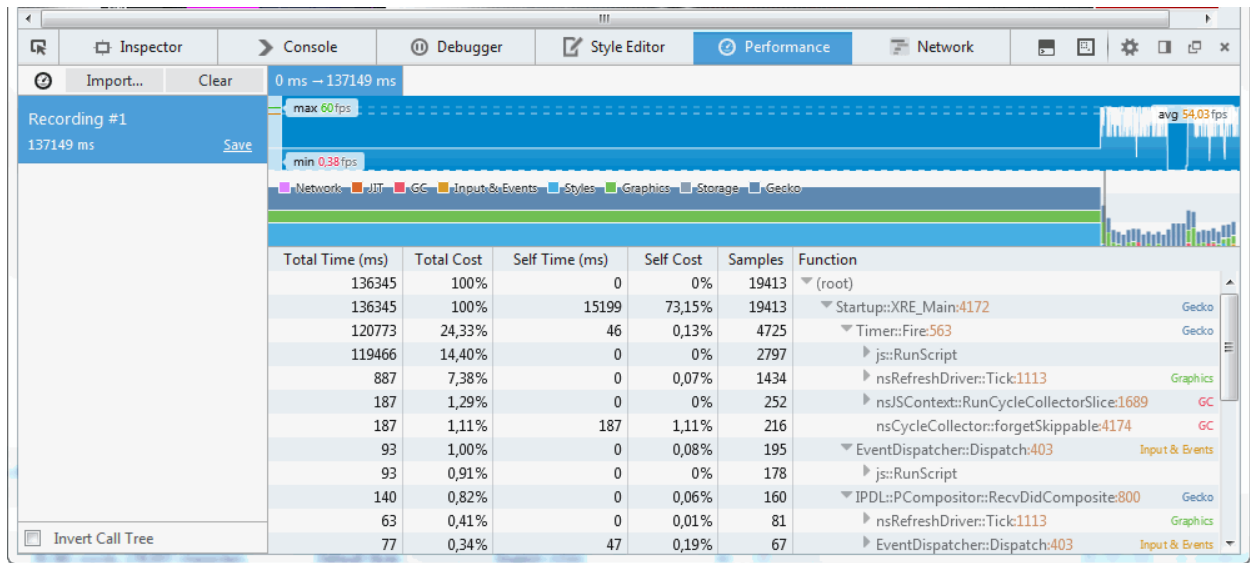
To run the Performance

- Open your code in IceDragon
- Open the Performance toolbox by choosing 'Performance' from 'Tools' > 'Web Developer'



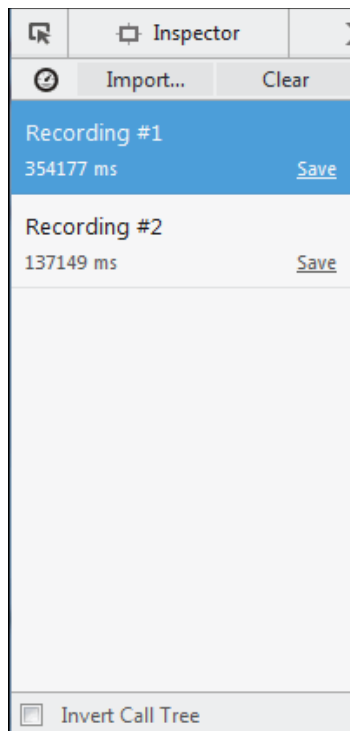
- Leave the profiler to record the samples for required time period and click the 'Stop' button to stop the recording

The **Performance** will compile the results and display the report.



Understanding the Report:

The recording left hand pane of the report displays a list of captured profiles which can be loaded at any time. The right hand pane displays the currently loaded profile.



- Click the 'clock' icon at the top-left of interface and repeat recording the samples and generate several profile reports.
- Click the 'Import' and navigate the folder to upload the profiles
- Click 'Clear' to remove all profiles.
- 'Invert Call Tree' checkbox - If checked, the profiler report will,
 - make a list of all stack frames with a Self Cost greater than zero: that is, stack frames which were actually execute when the sample was taken

- order the list by the number of samples taken while in that stack frame
- for each entry in the list, show the call stack backwards to the top-level function.

The profile contains four main sections provides:

- **breadcrumb trail**
- **frame rate timeline**
- **timeline for platform code execution**
- **detailed output of the JavaScript sampling profiler**

Breadcrumb trail

The upper half of the loaded profile displays a time verses call stack size bar-graph of the profile. The call stack represents the amount of active functions at the time when the sample was taken.

You can analyze the response for the stacks for a specific time range too. Selecting a portion of the graph, by dragging the mouse cursor displays a new tab above the graph indicating the selected portion. Clicking the new tab opens the enlarged view of the selected portion.

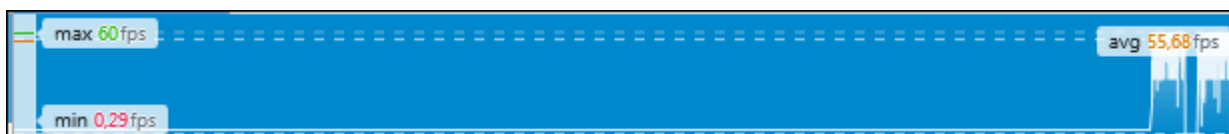
To click and drag in the frame rate timeline or the sampling profiler timeline, will

- highlight the section of the timeline
- show samples that were recorded in that section
- appear "+" in the toolbar at the top. Click the '+' to view the highlighted expanded section. You will see a separate breadcrumb trail the toolbar at the top.

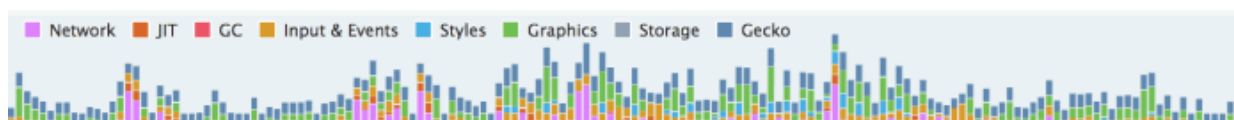
You can switch between the complete profile and the section using the breadcrumbs, zoom in on a subsection within the section.

Frame rate timeline

This item allows you to view the browser's responsiveness within the period covered by the profile. The x-axis is time over the profile period and contains three annotations: the target frame rate (always 60 frames per second), the average frame rate, and the lowest frame rate.

The **'Total Time (ms)'** display the break down view of the stacks that contained specific active functions and their share in total number of stacks in percentage in the first column, the number of stacks called by the functions in the second column and a tree structure view of the functions in the third column.

The **'Total Cost'** indicates the number of samples to be taken in which the corresponding "Function" appeared in the call stack.

The **'Running Time'** indicates the total number of samples executed within the recording time followed by the percentage of stacks that executed the active functions.

The **'Self Cost'** indicates the number of stacks that were called while executing the active functions, and not the stacks that called the function.

The **'Self Time (ms)'** indicates the amount of time spent executing the function, exclusive of any functions called by this function in the percentage of stacks that executed the active functions.

The **'Samples'** indicates the number of samples to be taken in which the corresponding "Function" appeared in the call stack.

The **'Function'** displays the function name, source file, line number and domain that served the file. To debug a specific function, hover the mouse cursor over the function and click on the right arrow that appears at the end of the line.

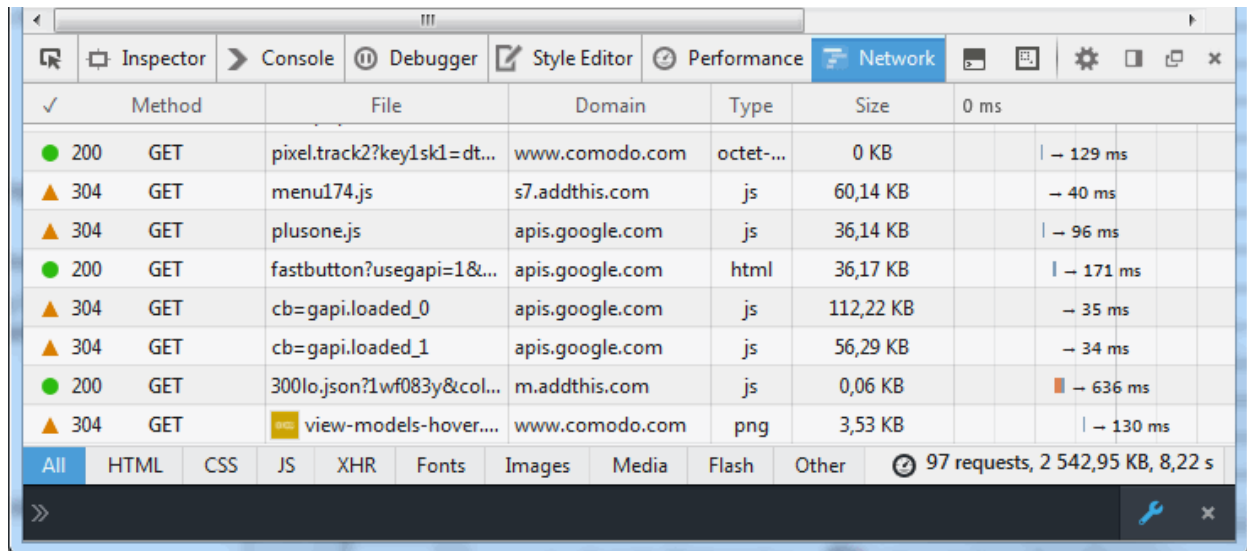
11.7. Network Monitoring

The Network Monitoring request is a tool in the toolbox that allows developers to view a network activity on a site.

To view the page source

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer' > 'Network'

The 'Network' interface will display on the bottom of the browser.



The Network table displays,

- ✓ - The HTTP status code returned. Hover over the icon to see the exact code. Green color-coded icon - success (2XX codes), orange - redirection (3XX), or red - errors (4XX and 5XX).
- **Method**: Shows the HTTP request method.
- **File**: Shows the basename of the file requested.
- **Domain** - Shows the domain of the path requested.
- **Type** - Shows `Content-type` of the response.
- **Size** - Shows the size of the response.
- **Timeline** - Displays a timeline for the different parts of each request.

Each column can be sorted by ascending or descending.

The toolbar will be displayed at the top of the pane and allows you to switch between different pages:

- **Headers** - Provides information about the request: URL, status code, the HTTP request and sent response headers.

The filter header field allows you to filter the headers.

- **Cookies** -Provides full details of any cookies sent with the request or response.
- **Params** - Displays the GET parameters and POST data of a request.
- **Response** - Displays the complete content of the response. Depending of the type of response, it will be displayed in HTML, JS, or CSS as text, JSON as an object, an image will be shown as a preview.
- **Timings** - Provides detailed timeline bar for the request showing how the total wait time is split into the various stages.

The developers can also sort their certain type of files by HTML, by JS, by XHR, by Fonts, by Images, by Media or by Flash type. Click the buttons in the Network toolbar to filter the list by type. This is also allows you to find out the total size and download time for a particular type of file.

11.8. Using the Developer Toolbar

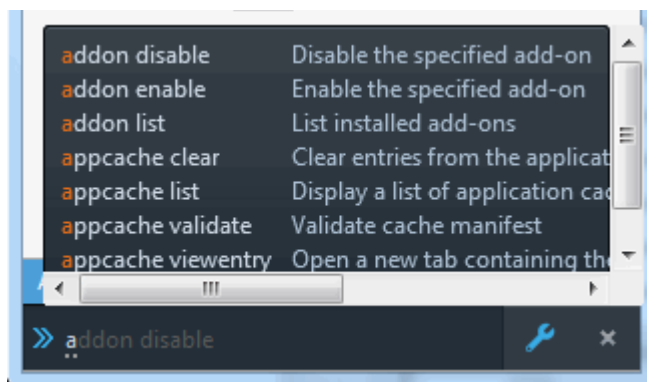
The Developer Toolbar provides a command-line interface to IceDragon to developer tools to navigate and one click access to commonly used tools.

To open developer toolbar element

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer ' > select 'Developer Toolbar'.

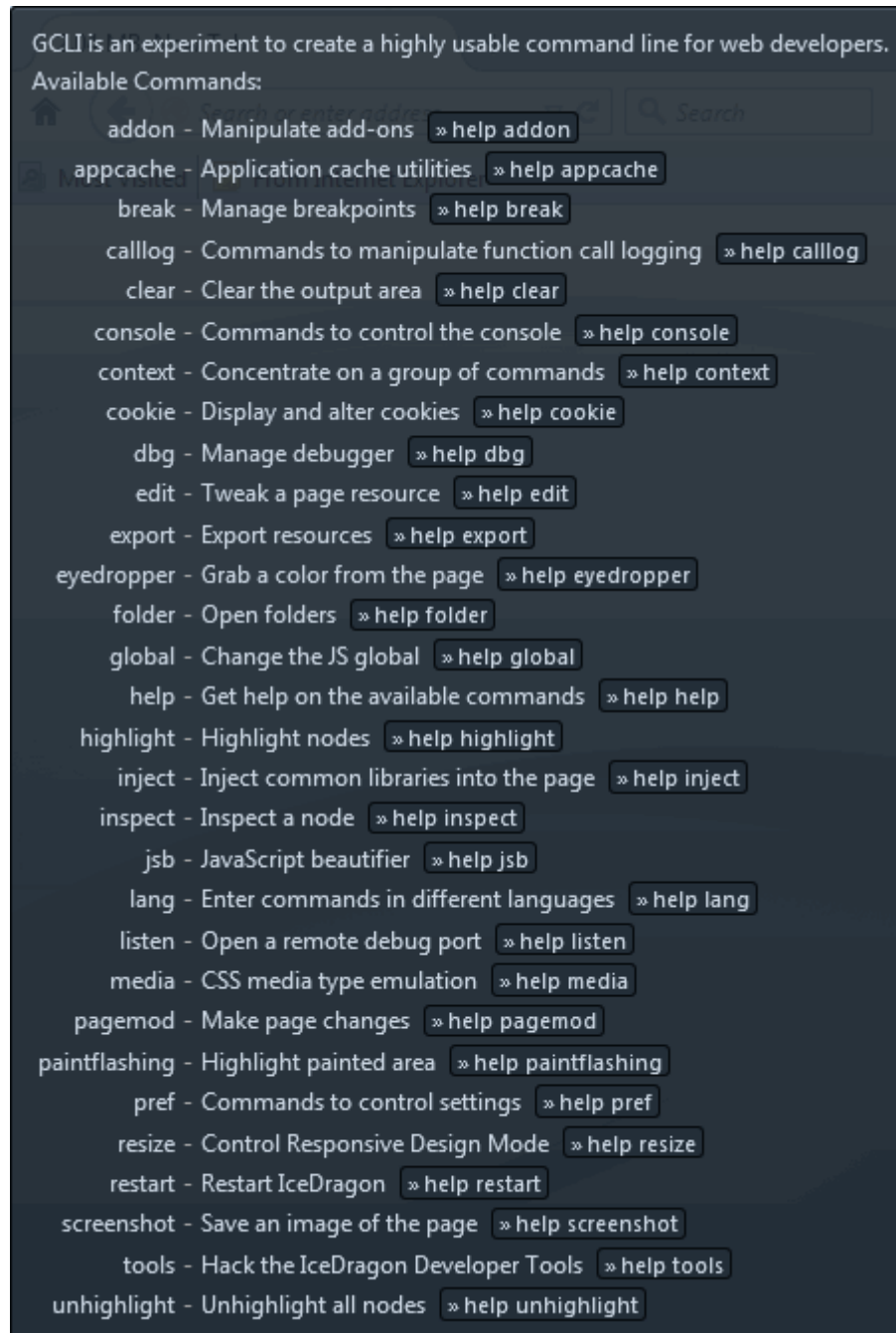

11.11. Responsive Design View

Responsive Design View tool helps web developer to view, read and navigate his web design on the different screen sizes without changing the overall size of his browser window.

To open responsive design view

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer' > 'Responsive Design View'.



11.12. Eyedropper

The 'Eyedropper' tool helps web developers to select colors in the current page and enables you to select with pixel accuracy. Hover the magnifying glass over the page and you will see the color value for the current pixel you have selected in the Inspector web tools.

To open Eyedropper tool

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer > Eyedropper'



To use the eyedropper

- Select a color from the page and copy it to the clipboard

OR

- Change a color value in the **Inspector's Rules view**

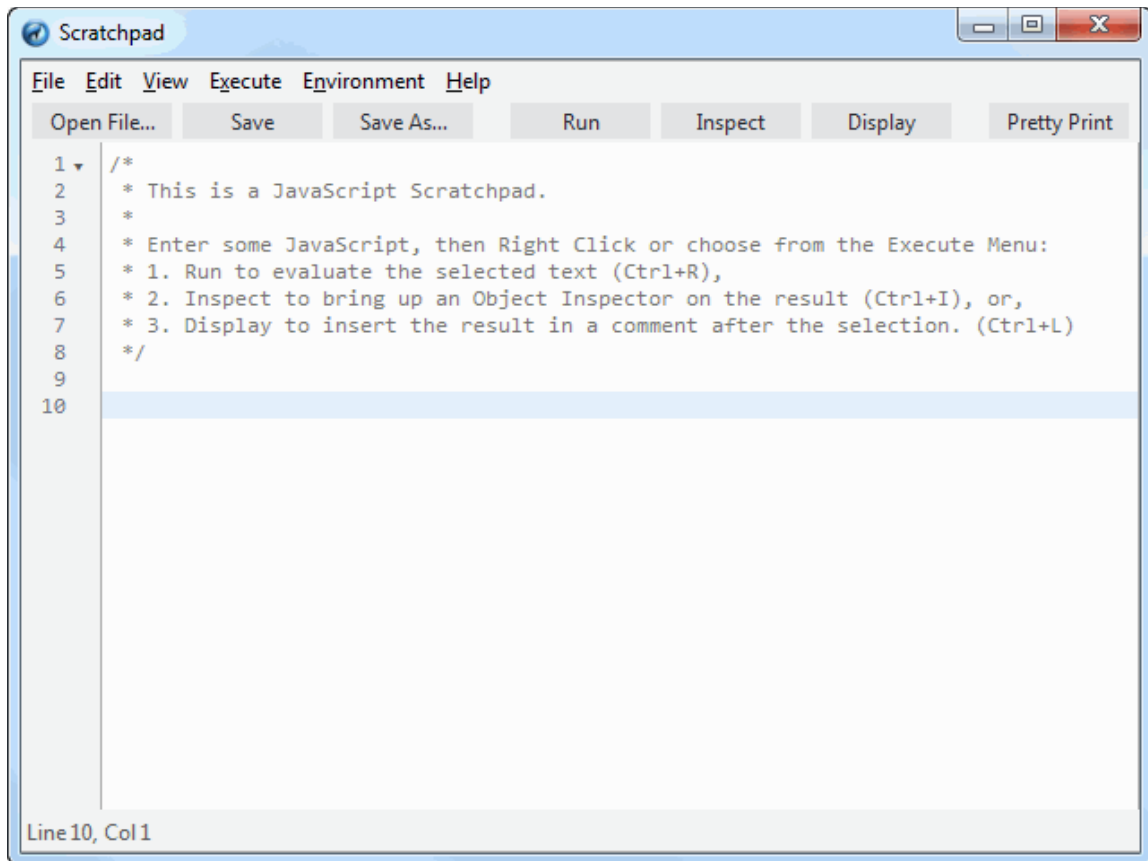
11.13. Run Experimental Java Scripts on Page

The Scratchpad web developer tool in IceDragon allows you to run experimental Java Script code for that page. This tool is very useful for you to try out various ideas and execute them on the web page before final implementation. Web Console also can be used for editing and running Java Script codes but is limited to executing single line of code at a time whereas Scratchpad can be used to execute many lines of codes at a time. Some of the uses of Scratchpad include testing new codes, debugging and to run saved reusable java script codes.

To open Scratchpad tool

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer ' > select 'Scratchpad'.

The Scratchpad editor will open. This contains some brief information about how to use it.



After you have written the code in the Scratchpad, select it and right-click to execute or from the menu bar select 'Execute'. You have three choices to output the code:

- **Run** - Executes the code in the page.
- **Inspect** - In addition to executing the code in the page, an object inspector will be displayed that will help you to analyze the returned value.
- **Display** - After executing the code in the page, the results are inserted in the Scratchpad window as a comment. This will help you to keep track of the changes made in the page.


11.14. View Page Source

Comodo IceDragon enables you to view the source code of the webpage you are viewing. This is useful for web developer to analyze the codes and style rules while they are developing their own web pages.

To view the page source

- Click the IceDragon menu located at the top right corner of the browser
- Click 'Developer > Page Source'

The page source will be displayed in a new window.

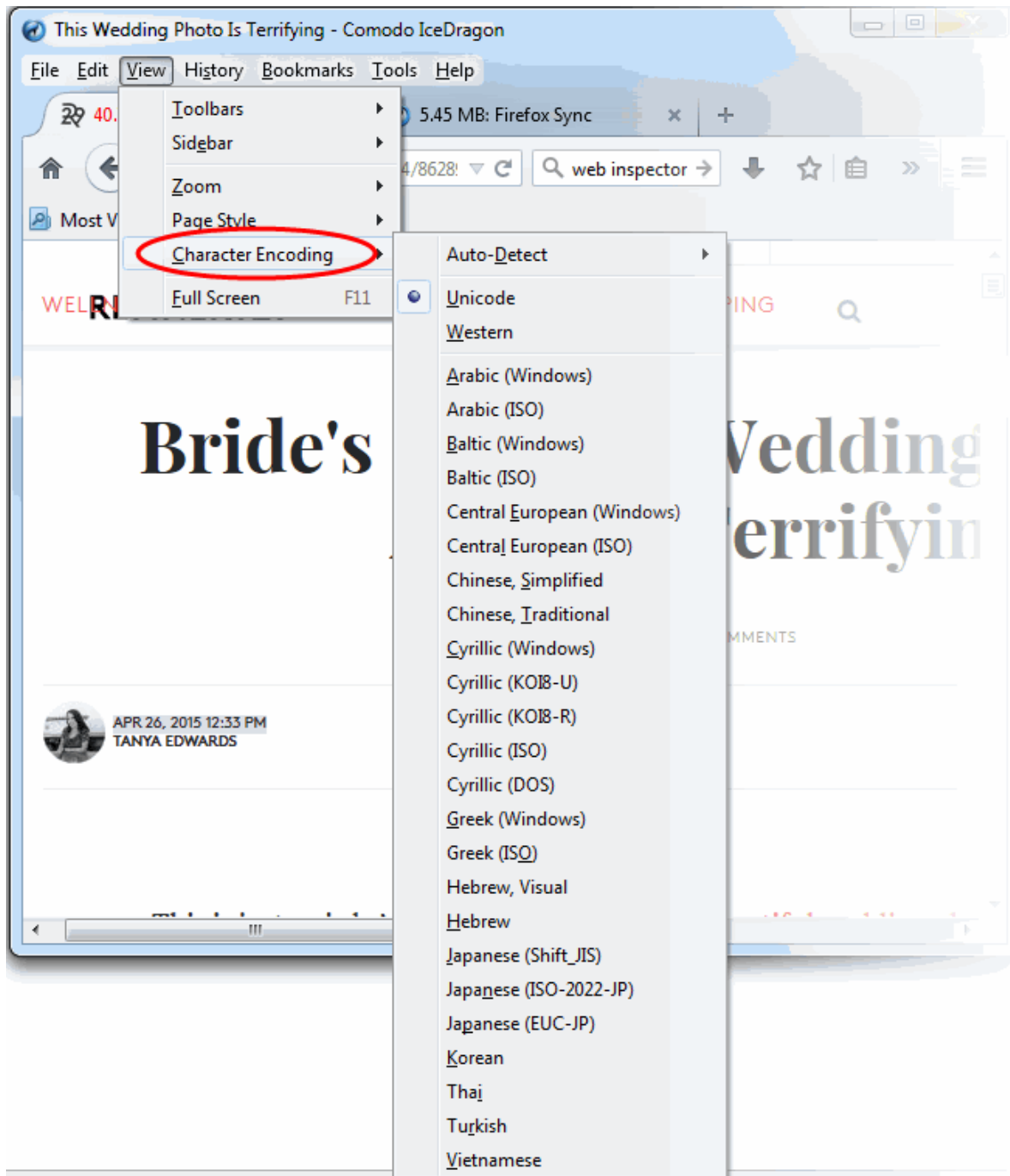

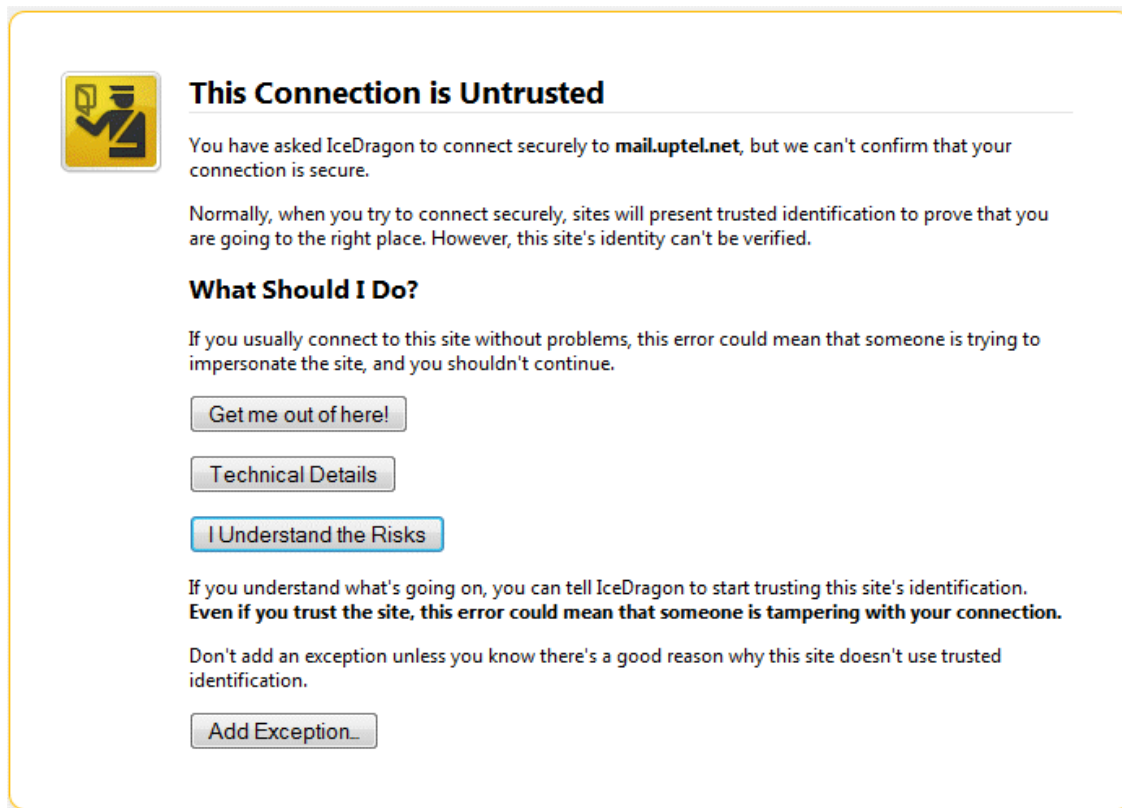
You may find your computer screen throwing up error messages when IceDragon is not able to verify the certificate with the website while using the browser.

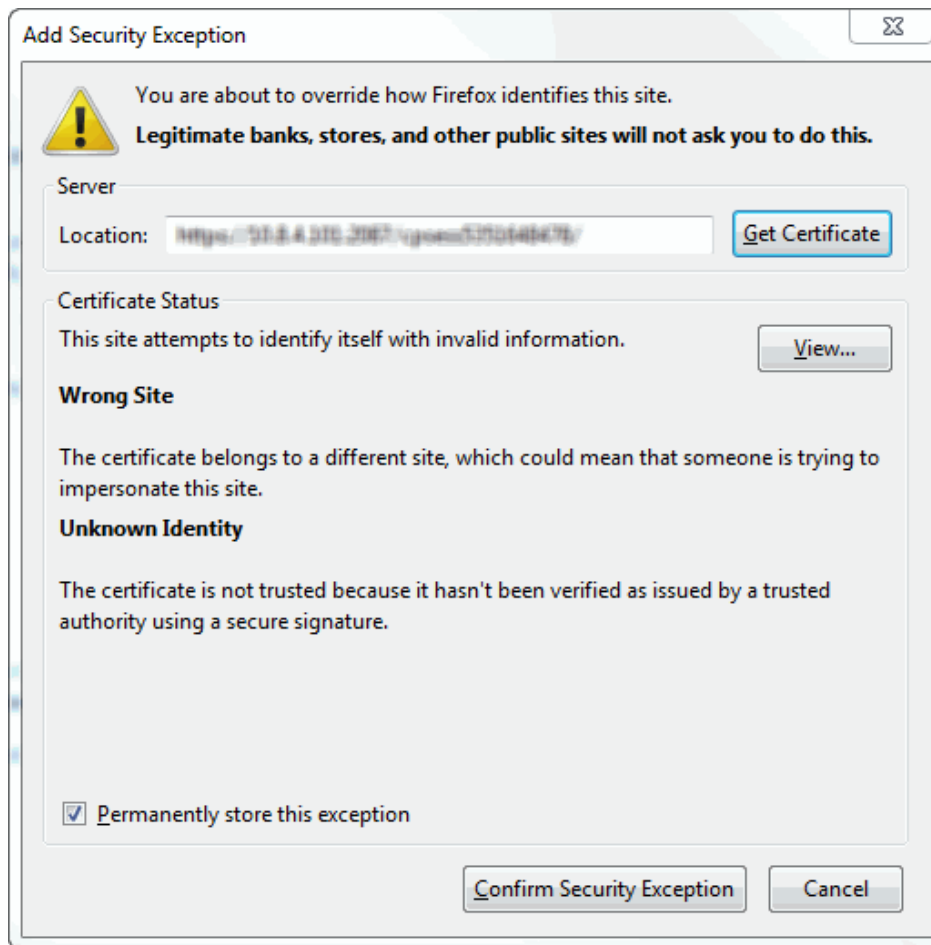

To cancel the error message

- When the error will appear click on "I Understand The Risks"
- Click the "Add Exception" button




The 'Add Exception' dialog will open.



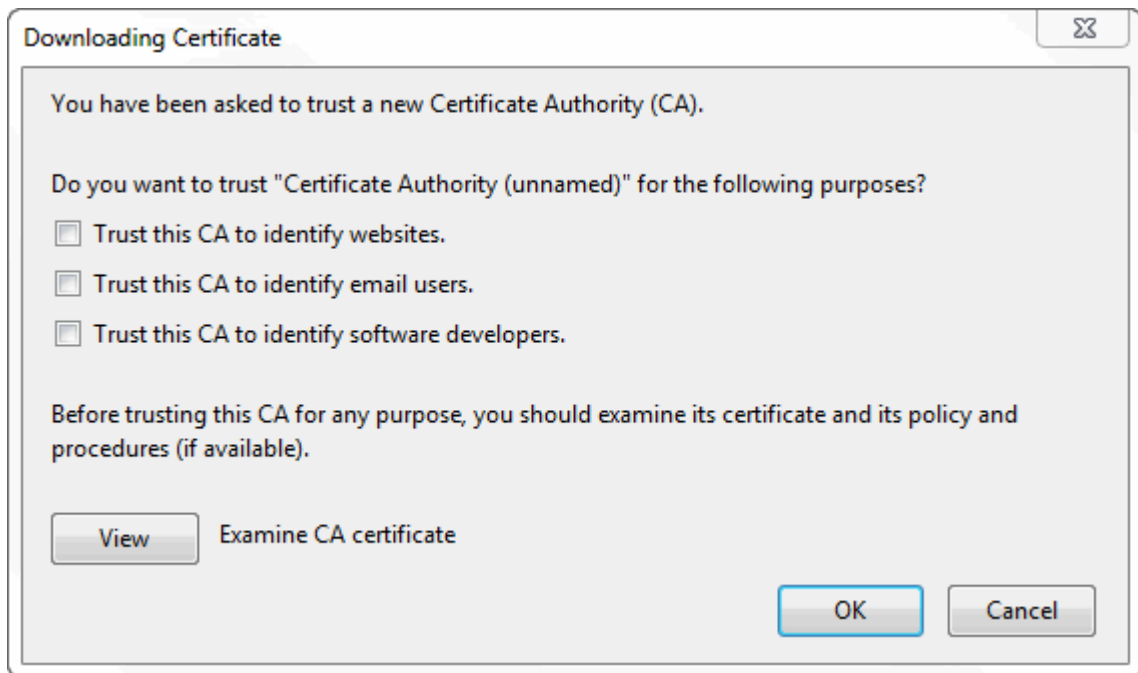
- The 'View' button opens the 'Certificate Viewer' with full info selected cert
- Check the 'Permanently store this exception' box to trust the certificate and store. This tick also cancel the screen again for the next visit.
- Click the 'Get Certificate' button
- Click the 'Confirm Security Exception' button.

Alternatively, you can edit the setting for the CA

- Click the IceDragon menu  located at the top right corner of the browser
- Open the Options menu > select the Advanced tab > Encryption under the 'Certificates' section select 'View Certificates' button
- Click the 'Authorities' and find the MIT CA
- Select the MIT CA > click 'Edit Trust'
- Check the box to allow the CA to identify websites.

Install the certificate authority (MIT CA)

- Download the MIT CA (Certificate Authority)
- The 'Certificate Authority' dialog will open
- Check the 'Trust this CA to identify websites' and press 'OK'



- View button opens the 'Certificate Viewer' with full info of selected cert
- Trust this CA to identify websites - Check the box if you trust the CA to issue certificates for Web site certificates that handle e.g., financial transactions
- Trust this CA to identify email users - If you send email users confidential information in encrypted form to identify prospective certificate owners
- Trust this CA to identify software developers - Check the box if you trust the CA to issue certificates that identify the origin of Java applets and JavaScript scripts.

The CA will be installed in IceDragon. Try again to access the site.
