2. System Requirements

To ensure optimal performance of Comodo Dragon, please ensure that your PC complies with the minimum system requirements:

- Windows 10 / Windows 8 (Desktop Mode) / Windows 7 / Windows Vista / Windows XP
- 128 MB RAM
- 40 MB Hard Disk Space

3. Downloading and Installing Comodo Dragon

You can download Comodo Dragon from:

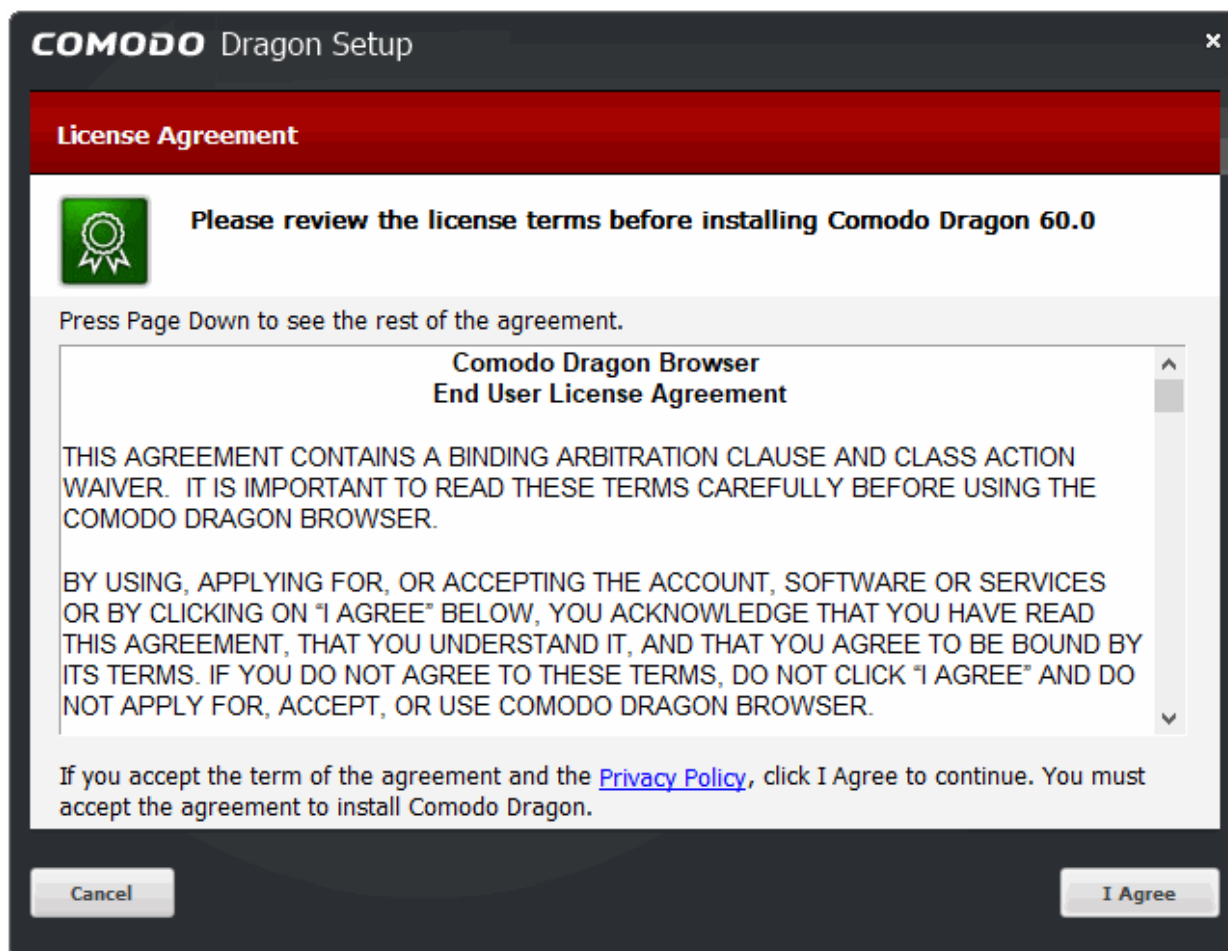

After downloading the setup file to your hard drive, double click Setup.exe to start the installation wizard.

Note: Dragon can be also installed in silent mode using the command line interface with the /S switch. For example, C:\>Download Directory>DragonSetup.exe /S. See '[Installing in silent mode](#)' for more details.

Step 1 - End User License Agreement

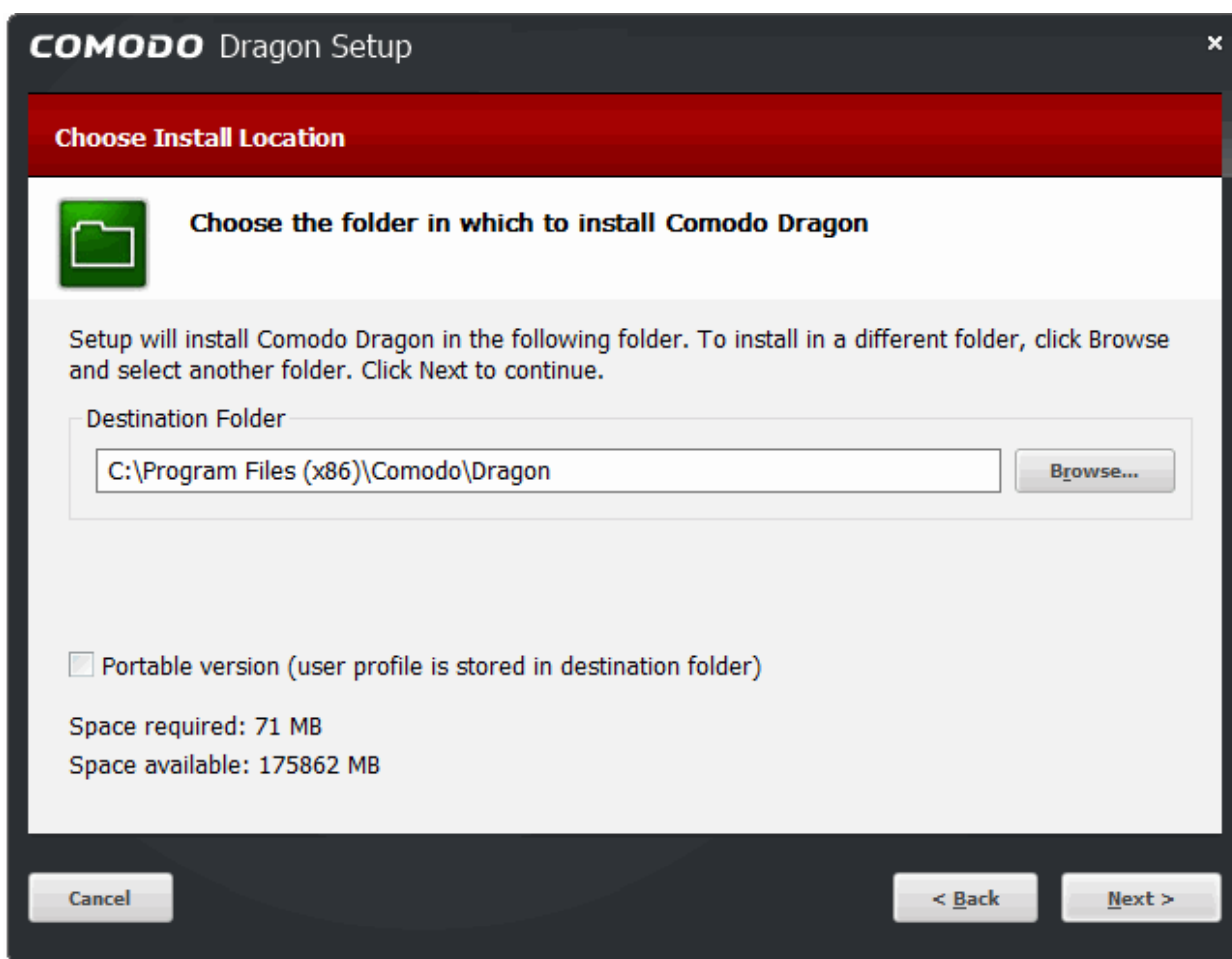


The EULA screen of the setup wizard is displayed. Complete the initialization phase by reading and accepting the End User License Agreement (EULA).

- Click 'I Agree' to continue the installation. Click 'Cancel' to abort the installation.

Step 2 - Select Installation Folder

The next screen allows you to select the folder in your hard drive for installing Comodo Dragon. The default path is C:\Program Files\Comodo\Dragon.

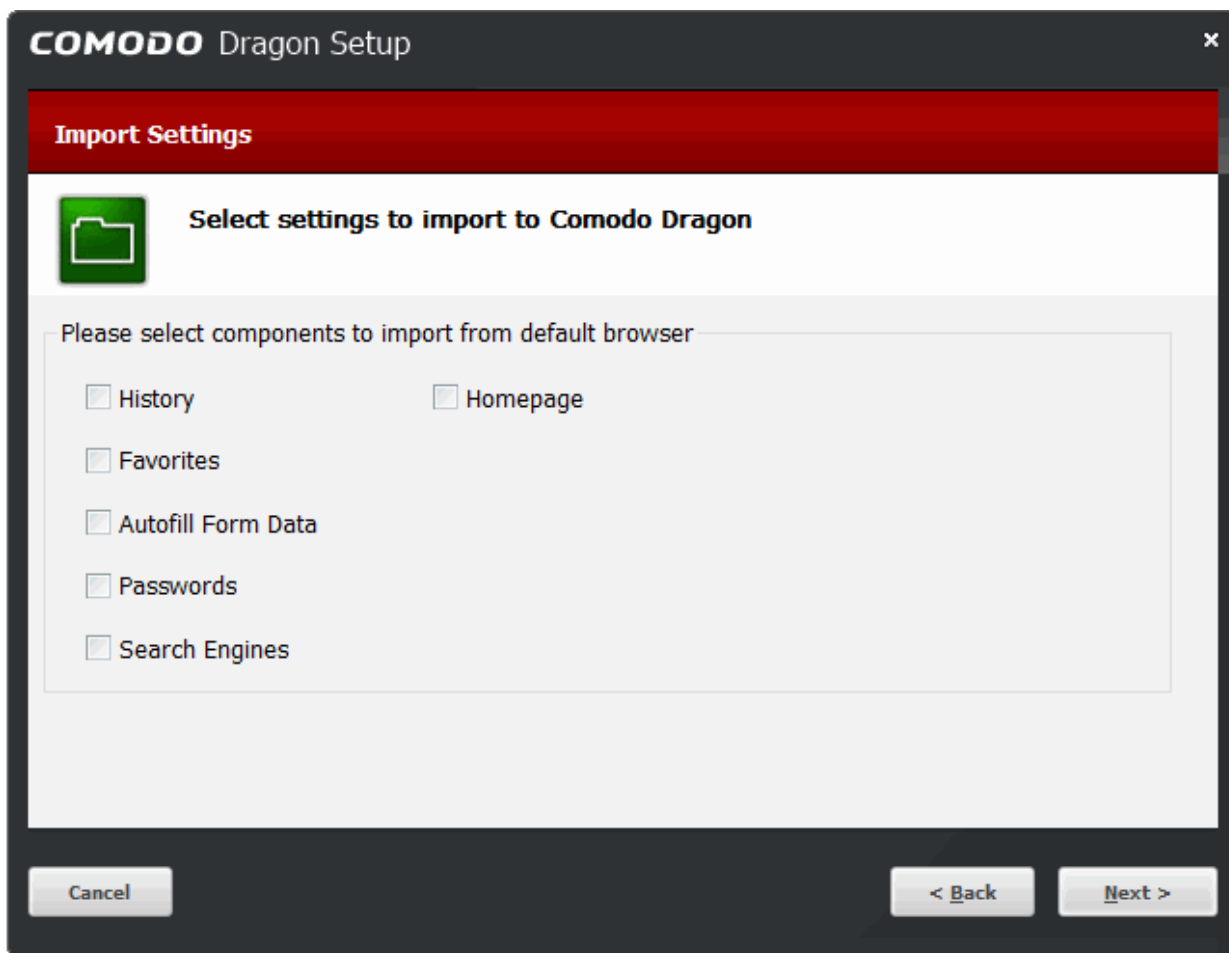


If you want to install the application in a location other than the default location, click 'Browse' to choose a different location and click 'Next'.

Step 3 - Import Settings

The next screen allows you to select the components that you want to import from the current default browser in your computer to Comodo Dragon.



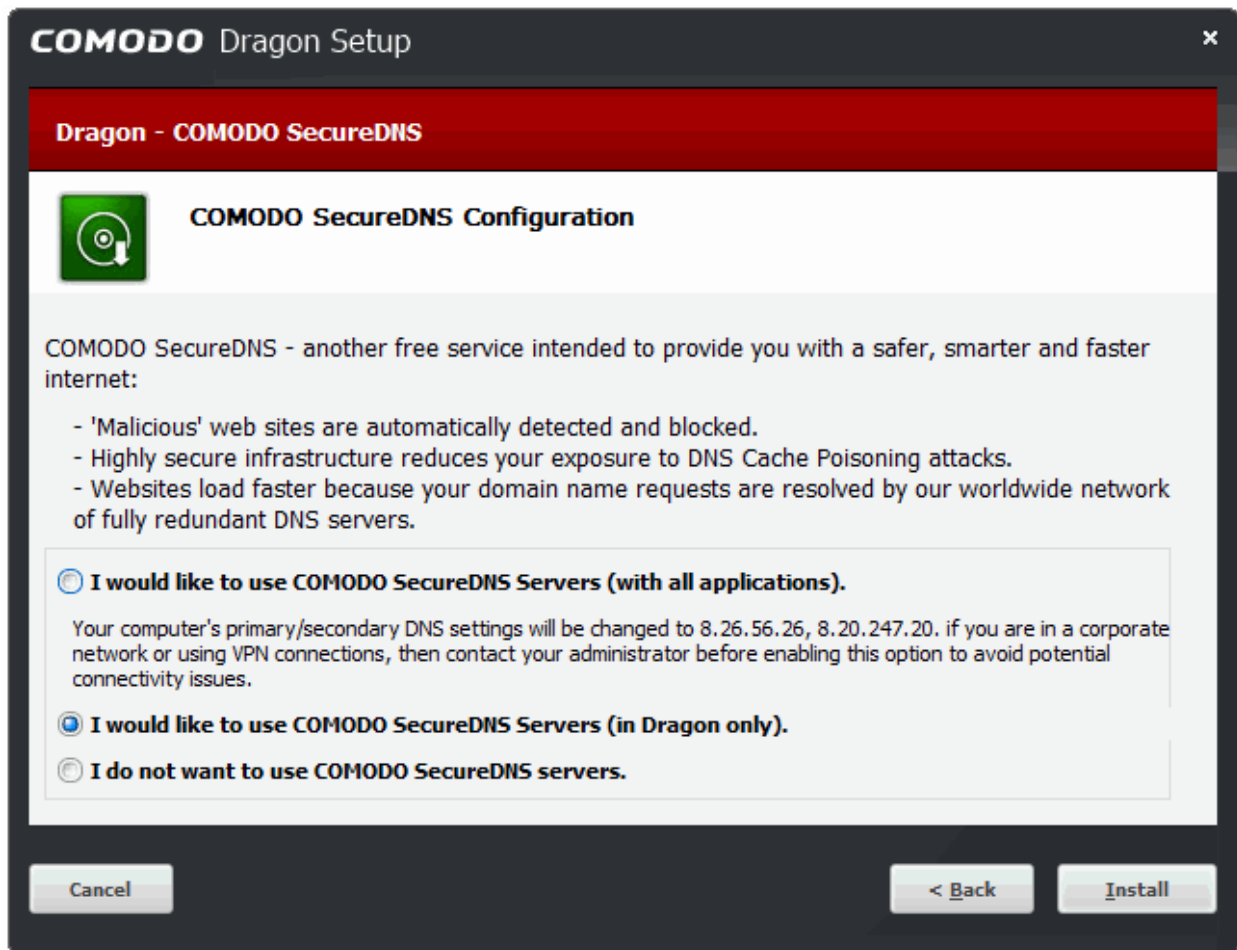
Select the checkboxes besides the records that you wish to import from your default browser at this time.

Tip: You can also import the records at later time if you have not selected any records at this time.

- Click 'Next' to continue.

Step 4 – Configure your DNS Settings

The 'Comodo SecureDNS' configuration dialog will open:



Comodo Secure DNS service replaces your existing Recursive DNS Servers and resolves all your requests exclusively through Comodo's servers. Our worldwide network of redundant high-performance DNS servers resolve your request of webpages at high speed and make the webpages to load faster than the DNS server provided by your ISP.

Also, SecureDNS references a real-time block list (RBL) of harmful websites like phishing sites, malware sites, spyware sites, and parked domains that contain excessive advertising and hence provides secure Internet browsing experience without any hardware or software installation.

You can choose:

- To use Comodo Secure DNS server for all applications in your computer that access the Internet.
- To use Comodo Secure DNS server only for Comodo Dragon browser. All other applications will be connected through your default DNS server.
- To retain your default DNS server.

In addition, Comodo's Secure DNS ensures safety against malware attacks by preventing any program running in your system from accessing malicious websites.

By default, 'I would like to use Comodo SecureDNS Servers (in Dragon only)' is selected. Select the option you want to use and click 'Install'.

Note: The option to use Comodo Secure DNS Servers can be selected at a later stage also in the Privacy section under the 'Show advanced settings' link. Select the '**Enable malware domain filtering (Comodo Secure DNS)**' checkbox.

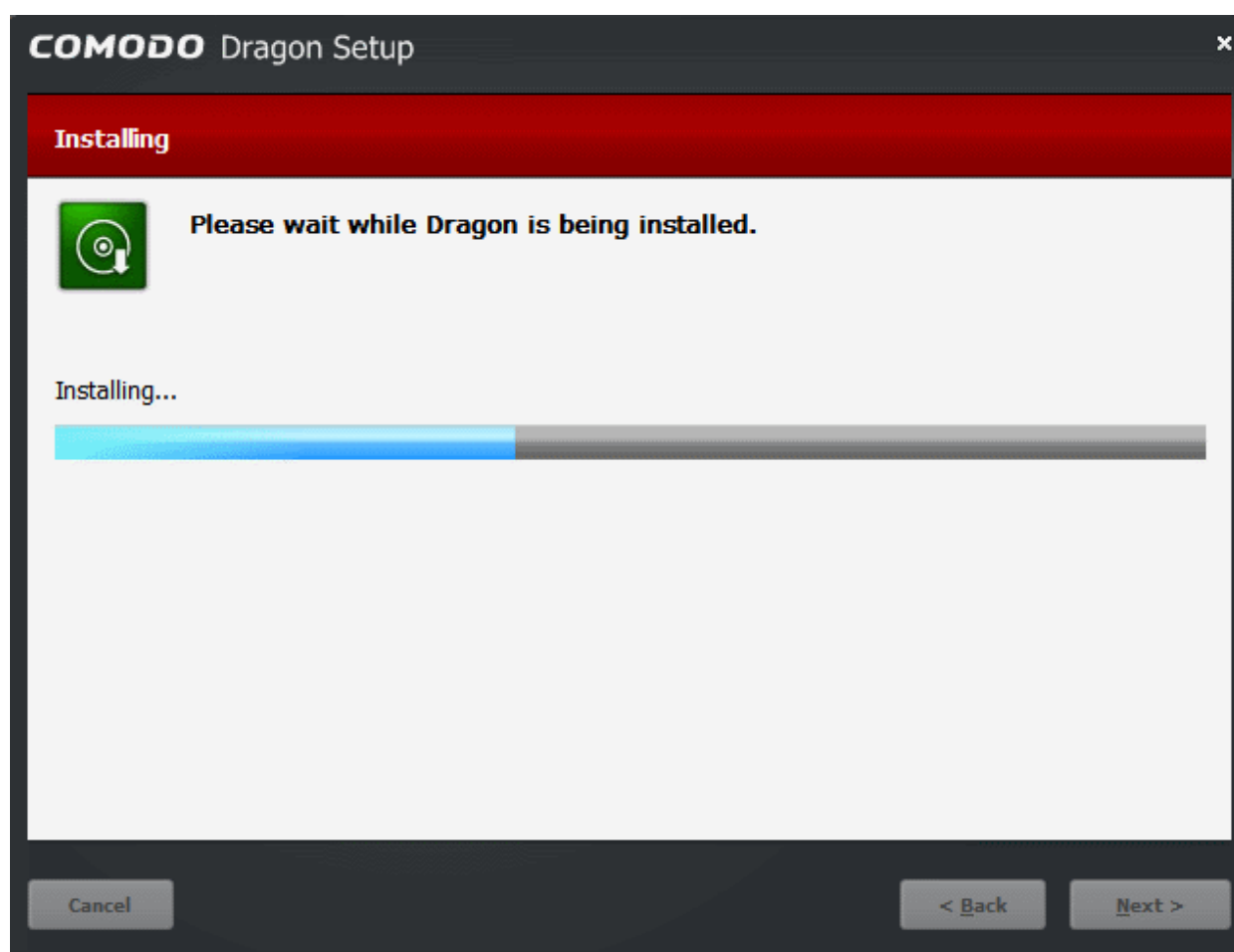
Select the checkboxes besides the records that you wish to import from your default browser at this time.

Tip: You can also import the records at later time if you have not selected any records at this time.

- Click 'Install' to continue.

Step 5 - Setup Progress

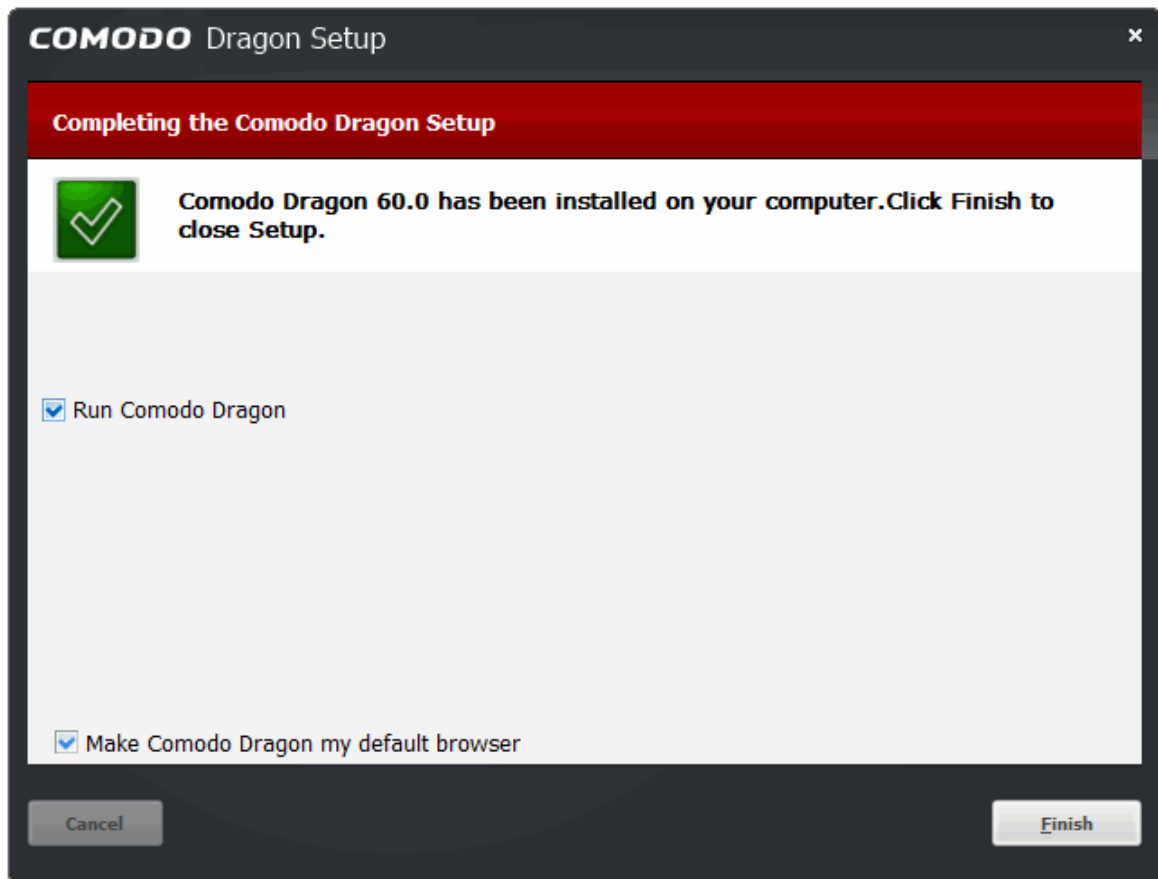
A setup status dialog box is displayed.



- Click 'Next' after the installation process is completed.

Step 6 - Installation Complete

The 'Installation Complete' dialog indicates installation is finished:



- Leave 'Run Comodo Dragon' selected to launch the browser immediately after you click 'Finish'
- Leave 'Make Comodo Dragon my default browser' if you want to use Comodo Dragon as the default choice for opening web-pages.
- Click 'Finish'.

You will be offered the opportunity to set your search engine provider to Yahoo:

- Making Yahoo your default search engine means:
 - When you enter a search item into the address bar of a supported browser, the search will be carried out by Yahoo
 - A 'Search with Yahoo' menu entry will be added to the right-click menu of supported browsers
 - Yahoo will be set as the default search engine in the 'Search' box of supported browsers
 - The instant 'search suggestions' that you see when you start typing a search item will be provided by Yahoo
- Click 'Decline' to continue using your current search engine and home page

Installation in silent mode

Dragon can be also installed in silent mode using the command line interface with the /S switch. For example, C:\>Download Directory>DragonSetup.exe /S

```
DragonSetup.exe /S
```

Steps done by the silent installer:

- Uninstall the previous version (if exists).
- Copy installation files in to default installation folder.

- Create shortcuts on desktop and in programs menu.

Steps not done:

- Making Dragon the default browser.
- Importing from default browser.
- Installing system-wide Comodo Secure DNS.

If Dragon is already installed then it will update the installed version.

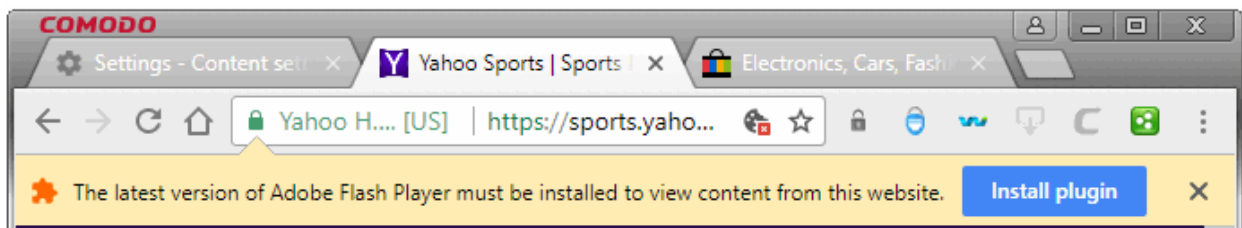
If the installer fails, the process is closed with error code not equal to 0.

To run the silent installer in waiting mode and check return code:

```
start /wait DragonSetup.exe /S  
  
echo %ERRORLEVEL%
```

The silent installer will fail if Dragon or another instance of the installer is already running.

If you do not have flash player installed, Comodo Dragon now requests for Adobe Flash Player plug in to be installed under main menu to display some missing web elements.

4.1. Start Comodo Dragon

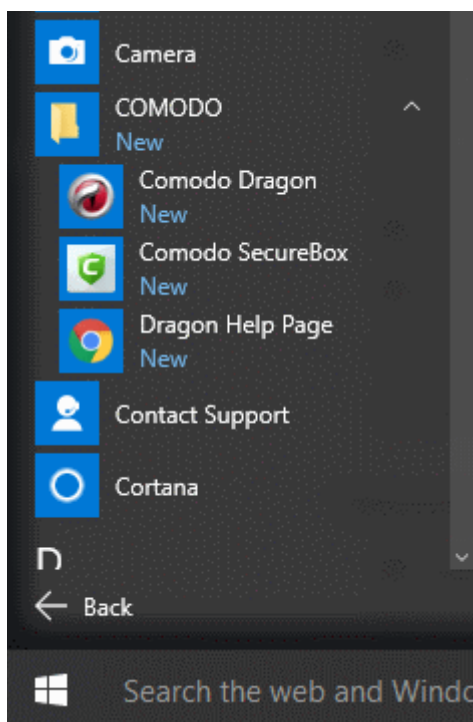
There are two different ways to start Comodo Dragon:

Start Menu

You can launch Comodo Dragon via the Start Menu.

- Click *Start* and select *All Programs > Comodo > Dragon > Comodo Dragon*



Desktop

- Just double-click the Comodo Dragon icon on your desktop.

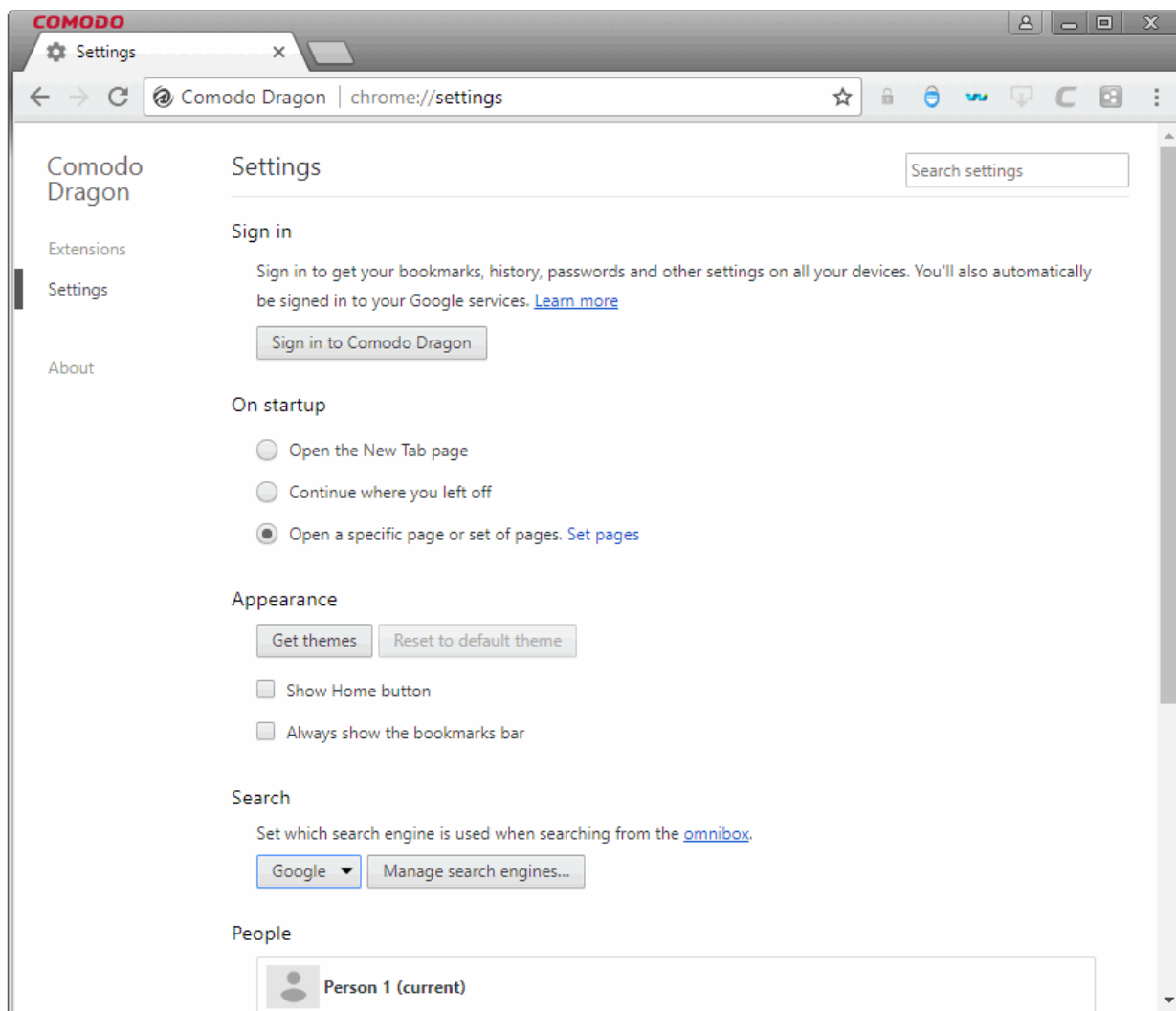

4.2. Setting up Your Homepage in Comodo Dragon

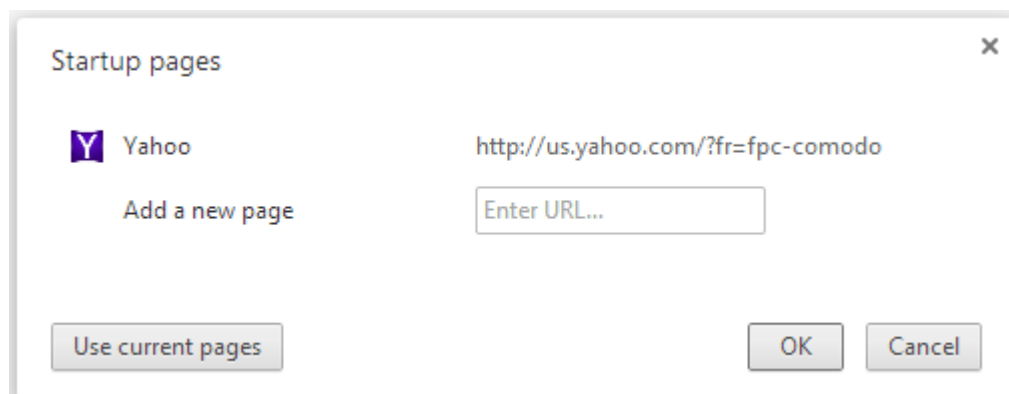
You can configure Comodo Dragon to open your desired web-page as soon as you start the program.

To set your home page

- Click the menu  button located at the top-right corner.



- Select 'Open a specific page or set of pages' in the 'On startup' section
- Click 'Set pages' to open the 'Startup pages' dialog.



- Select 'Add a new page' or 'Use current pages' on the 'Startup pages'.
- Enter the desired homepage web address in the text box.
- Click 'OK'.
- Select 'Open the New Tab page' to set a blank tab as your homepage.
- Select 'Continue where you left off' to open at the same page you were looking at last time.

4.3. Search the Internet Using Comodo Dragon

The address bar in Comodo Dragon also acts as a search field. The default search engine that the address bar should use can be set in 'Basics' from the 'Options' menu.

To search the Internet

- Type the search item in the address bar.
- Press 'Enter'.

Comodo Dragon uses the default search engine to search for the item that you have entered. You can choose to use a different search engine to the default should you wish.

Alternative search method

You can perform a specific website search, search within the page and use the search fields in History page, Bookmark manager and Download page to find the items.

To search a specific website

- Start entering the address of the web site that you want to search.

If a web site is present in Dragon's search engine list (*chrome://settings/searchEngines*), it offers the option to search for that site or type the keyword of the search engine in the address and press 'Tab'. For example, if you have given the keyword for yahoo.com as yahoo, you can enter yahoo in the address bar and press the Tab button. You can view 'Search Yahoo' appear in the address bar.

If you enter the search keyword and press enter, Yahoo search engine will now perform the search function for the item instead of the default search engine.

To search within a webpage

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Find'.

Alternatively use the keyboard shortcut CTRL + F keys.

A 'Find' field appears on the top right side of the page.

- Type the search item in the find bar and press the 'Enter' button.

As you type the search item in the find bar, Comodo Dragon searches for the page automatically and highlights the possible matches in yellow. You can also see the results of the matched items in the find bar.

To search using right-click option

- Use your cursor to highlight any text on a webpage.
- Right-click on the highlighted item and select the option to search.

To search using copy and paste method

- Use your cursor to highlight any text on a webpage.
- Right-click on the highlighted item and copy it.

- Right-click on the address bar and select 'Paste and search'.

To search using the drag and drop method

- Use your cursor to highlight any text on a webpage.
- Right-click on the highlighted item, drag and drop it in the address bar.

Comodo Dragon uses the default search engine and displays the search results for the highlighted text.

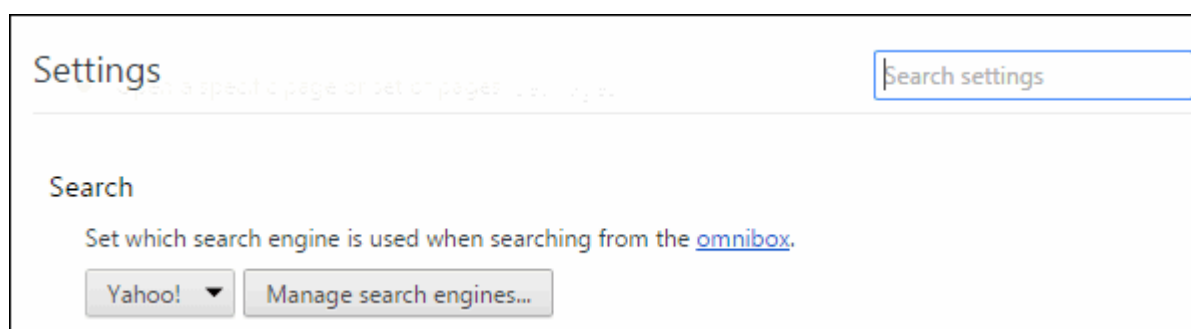

4.4. Setting Default Search Engine

The address bar in Comodo Dragon acts as search box as well. You can set the default search engine that the address bar should use for your searches.

To set your default search engine

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select the 'Settings' from menu.



- In the 'Search' section, select the search engine that you want to set as default.

If the desired search engine is not available from the drop-down box, click the 'Manage search engines' button to add the search engine. See [Manage Your Search Engines](#) to know more about managing search engines.

- Click 'Done' when you have finished.

4.5. Comodo Dragon Logging Policies

If you have enabled Instant feature in Comodo Dragon, the browser will automatically start loading the web-page as you finish typing the URL in the address bar and even before you press the Enter button. The search results are further augmented if supported by your default search engine and as you type in the address bar, inline predictions appear instantly.

As you type text in the address bar, the default search engine set in the browser will be requesting results and the results depend on the logging policies of the search engine. If you had set Yahoo as your default search engine, the text entered in the address bar is sent to Yahoo search engine and its logging policies will apply for the search.

If you have opted to disable both the Dragon Instant feature and address bar prediction service, as per the yahoo search engine's policy, only after you press Enter the searches will be logged. For example, if you type 'course' in the address bar and pause, nothing is displayed. Only after you press the enter button, yahoo search engine logs

'course' as a search.



If you have opted to enable both the Dragon Instant feature and address bar prediction service, as per the Yahoo search engine's policy, it retrieves predictions even as you type in the address bar of the browser. Select the desired prediction, if it appears, and press the Enter button. The search results for the word is displayed. If you pause for more than three seconds without pressing Enter, the text typed is treated as partial query data by Yahoo search engine. This is stored for up to two weeks in its database and then deleted.

If you have opted to disable Dragon Instant feature and enable address bar prediction service, as per the Yahoo search engine's policy, it retrieves predictions even as you type in the address bar of the browser. To make the prediction service more efficient, yahoo search engine at random logs two percent of these requests and anonymizes this information within 24 hours.

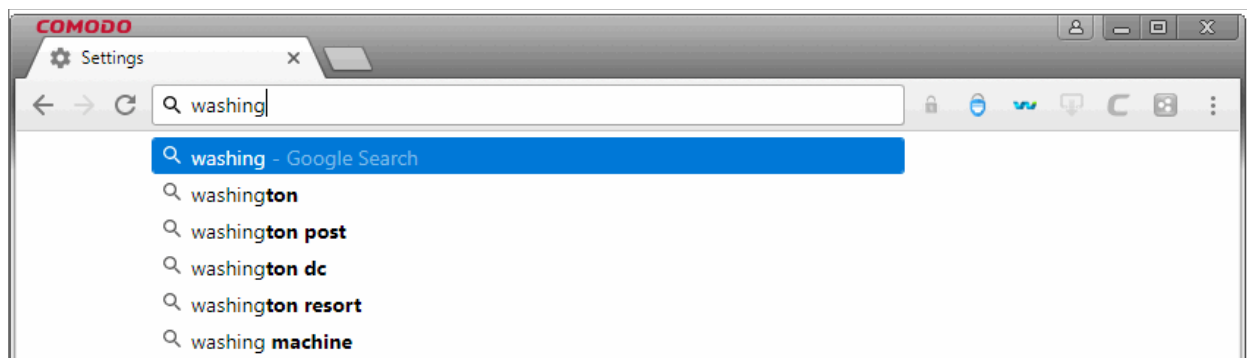

4.6.Prediction Service

When enabled, Comodo Dragon will show predictions as you type into the address bar. Predictions can come in the form of suggested searches or suggested web addresses. If you see the  icon next to the item in the address bar drop-down, it indicates a suggested search term while the  icon indicates a web address.


For example, if you typed 'washington post' in the address bar, you may see search suggestions for 'washington post', 'washington post crossword' and 'washington post jobs'. Clicking on any of these items will take you to the search results pages for those terms as if you had typed them directly into a search engine. You may also see the Washington Post website listed (<http://www.washingtonpost.com/>).

- Click this suggested item to take you directly to their website homepage.



The prediction service is disabled in Comodo Dragon by default.

To enable the prediction service

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' from the menu.
- Check 'Use a prediction service to help complete searches and URLs typed in the address bar' option in the 'Privacy' section.

Note: Apart from the browser displaying a web address using predictions, it also displays matches from your browsing history. If you do not want to see matches from your browsing history, you can clear your browsing history.

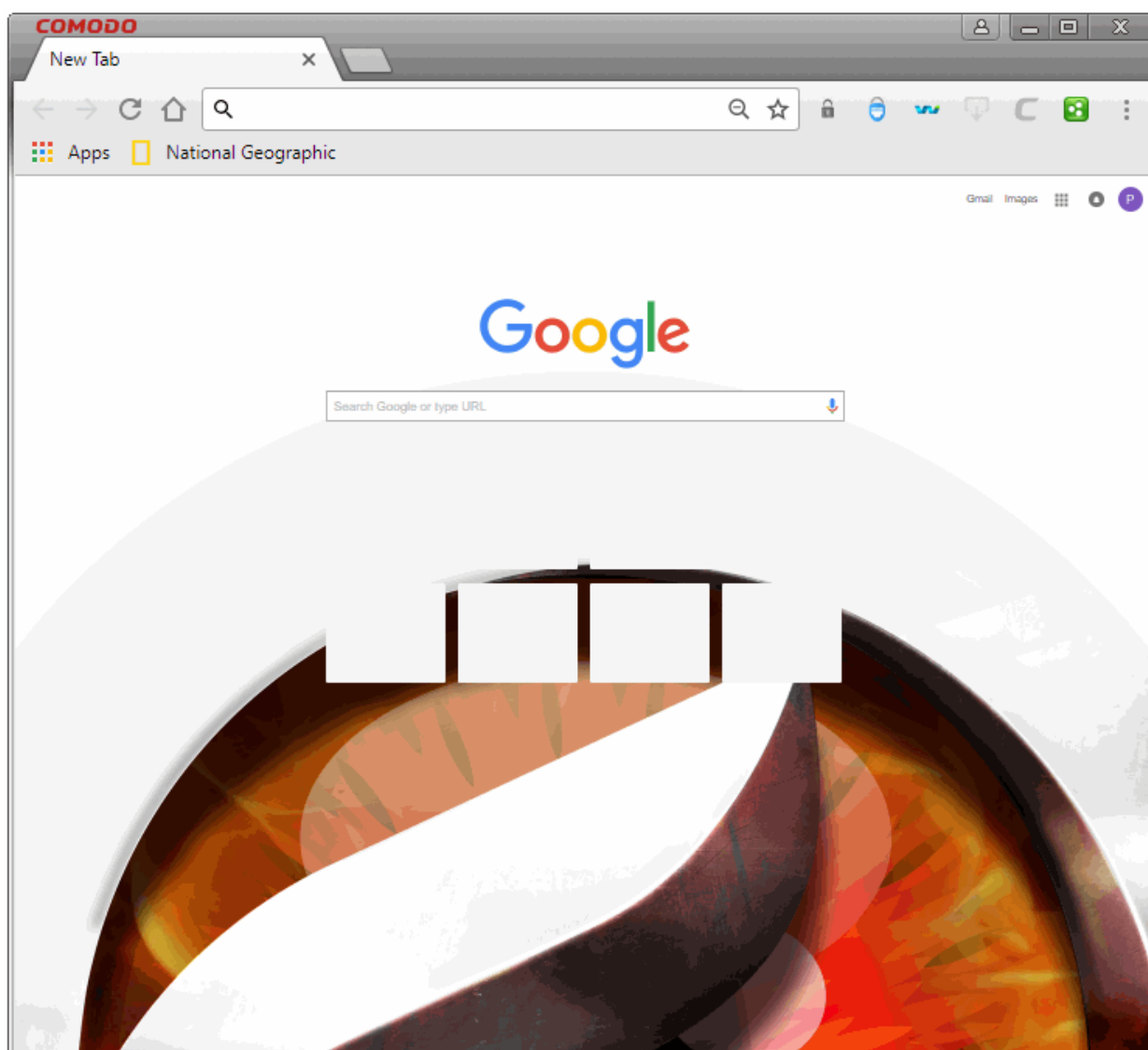
4.7. Re-opening Most Visited and Recently Closed Websites

You can reopen an accidentally closed page even if you have not bookmarked the page. To view the page again, then you can use the 'Most visited' feature. This will display a thumbnail list of your most recently visited pages so you can quickly re-open them.

To open most visited and recently closed websites


- Click the new tab  button, which is next to the last tab.

A new tab page will open and you can see thumbnails of most visited sites in the center.



- Select 'Reopen closed tab', by right clicking on an opened tab.

Comodo Dragon remembers your preference and opens 'Most visited' section when you open a new tab page.

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select the 'Recent Tabs' from menu, beneath Bookmarks. The frequently visited websites will be displayed.

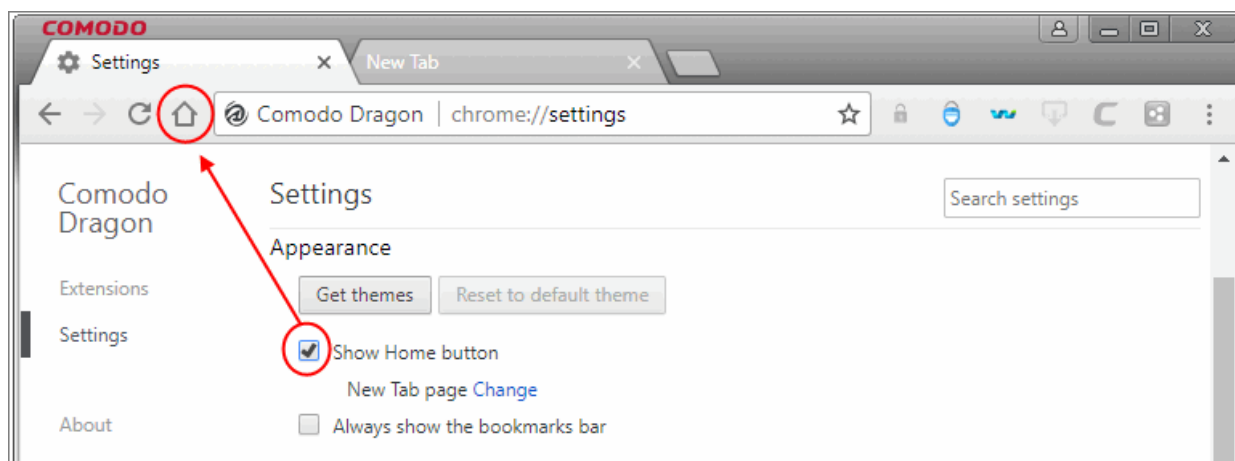

4.8. Add Home Button to the Toolbar

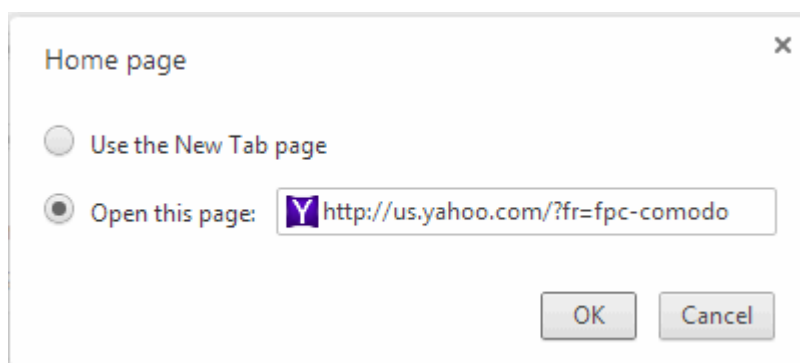
The 'Home' page button added to the toolbar in Comodo Dragon, allows you to quickly navigate to the home page.

To add the home button to the toolbar


- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' . check 'Show Home' option in the 'Appearance'. Home button is now added to the browser toolbar.



- To set your homepage, click 'Change' link and choose 'Use the New Tab page'.
- Choose 'Open this page' option to set your home page.



To add themes

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Go to 'Settings' > 'Appearance' > 'Get themes'.
- You will be directed to the web store gallery.
- Preview different themes and click 'Free'.
- The theme is downloaded as a .crx file to your computer. The theme will be applied immediately.
- Click 'Undo' at the top of a page to return to the previous theme.
- To remove a theme in the 'Appearance' section, click 'Reset to default theme'.



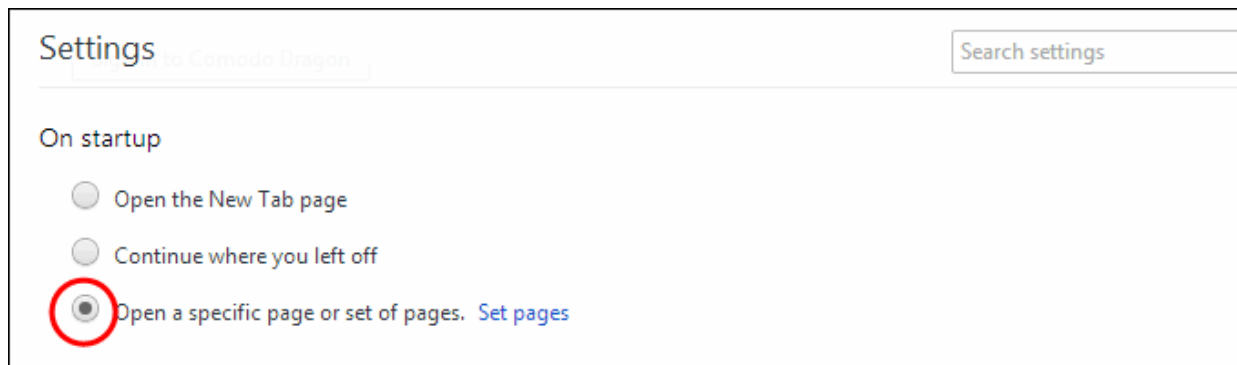

4.9. Opening Preset Pages on Startup

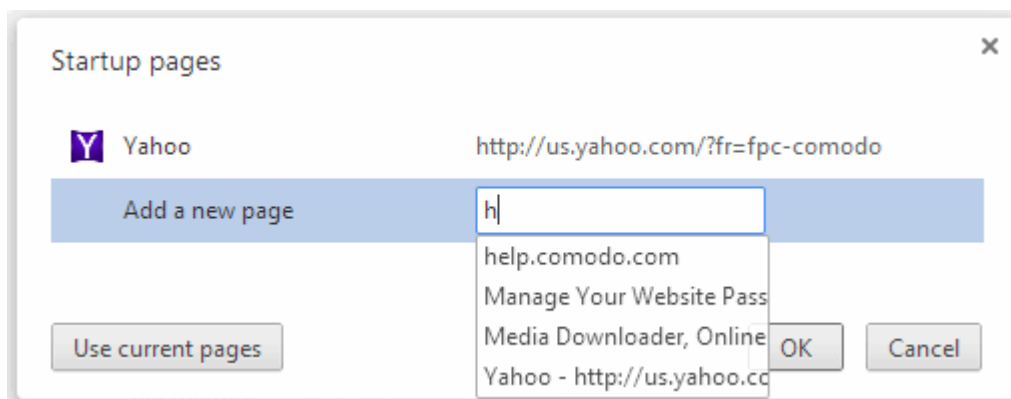
You can configure Comodo Dragon to open your favorite webpages in different tabs on startup.

To open preset pages on startup

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' from the menu.



- Select the 'Set pages' link, from the 'On startup' section,



- To add the pages that are currently open in the browser, click 'Use Current pages'.
- Click 'Add a new page' and select the pages that you want to open on startup in the 'Add Page' dialog or type the web address of the web-page in the URL box.

4.10. Viewing Browsing History

Comodo Dragon will keep a record of websites that you have visited in the past 10 weeks.

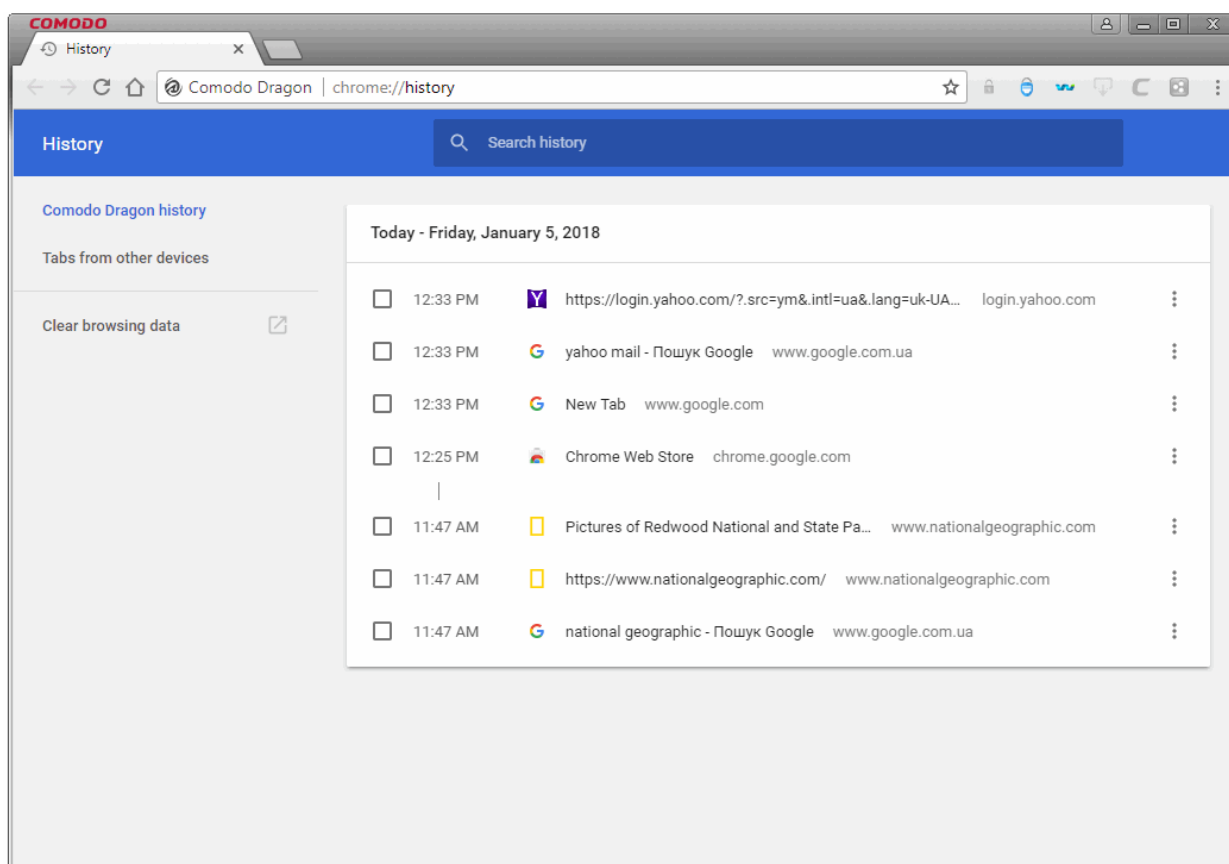
Note: The history will be stored when Comodo Dragon is used in standard mode and not in incognito mode. Also it will not store pages from secure websites.

To view your browsing history

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.

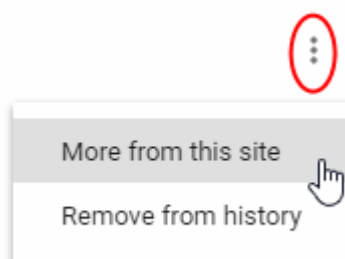
- Select 'History' from the menu.

The 'History' page will open in a new tab.



From here you can:

- Click 'Clear browsing data' to delete all browsing data or delete only selected items. See **Deleting Browsing History** if you need help with this.
- View pages that you have visited in your present browsing session by clicking and holding down the forward and backward arrows adjacent to the address bar
- Use the 'Search History' context menu to search more visited links from that site
- Check the box next to the webpage you want to delete from the list
 - Click the ellipsis then select 'More from the history' to view more results from the current web page
 - Click the ellipsis then select 'Remove from history' to delete a single entry.




- Click 'Tabs from other devices' to synchronize Comodo Dragon tabs on your other devices with this installation of Dragon. Note: to use this option, you need to sign in to Comodo Dragon.

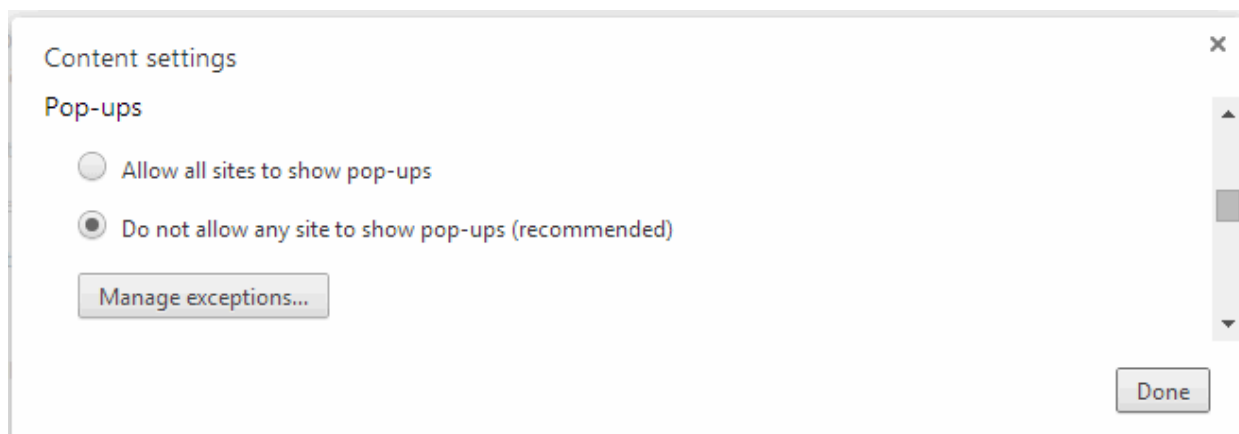

4.11. Configuring Pop-ups

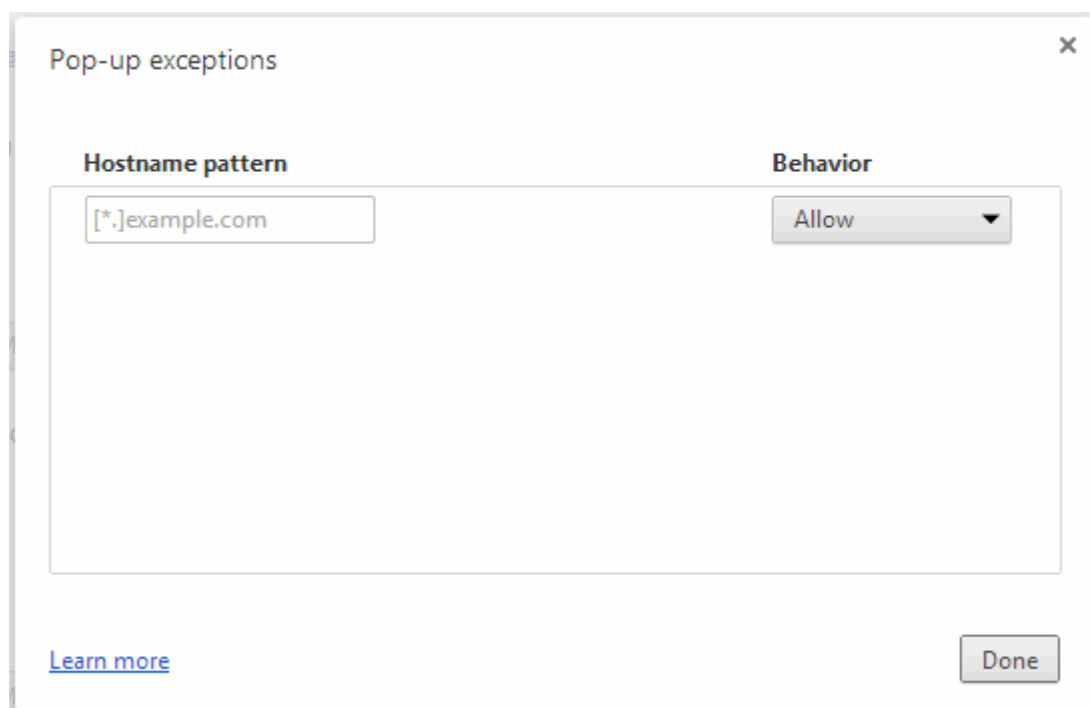
You can configure Comodo Dragon to block, allow or selectively allow pop-ups. You can see the icon  in the top-right side of the address bar of the browser whenever a pop-up for a site is blocked.

To configure pop-ups

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' from the menu and choose 'Show advanced settings' link
- Go to 'Privacy' section
- Click 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' section
- Select 'Pop-ups' from the list of features in the 'Content Settings' dialog.

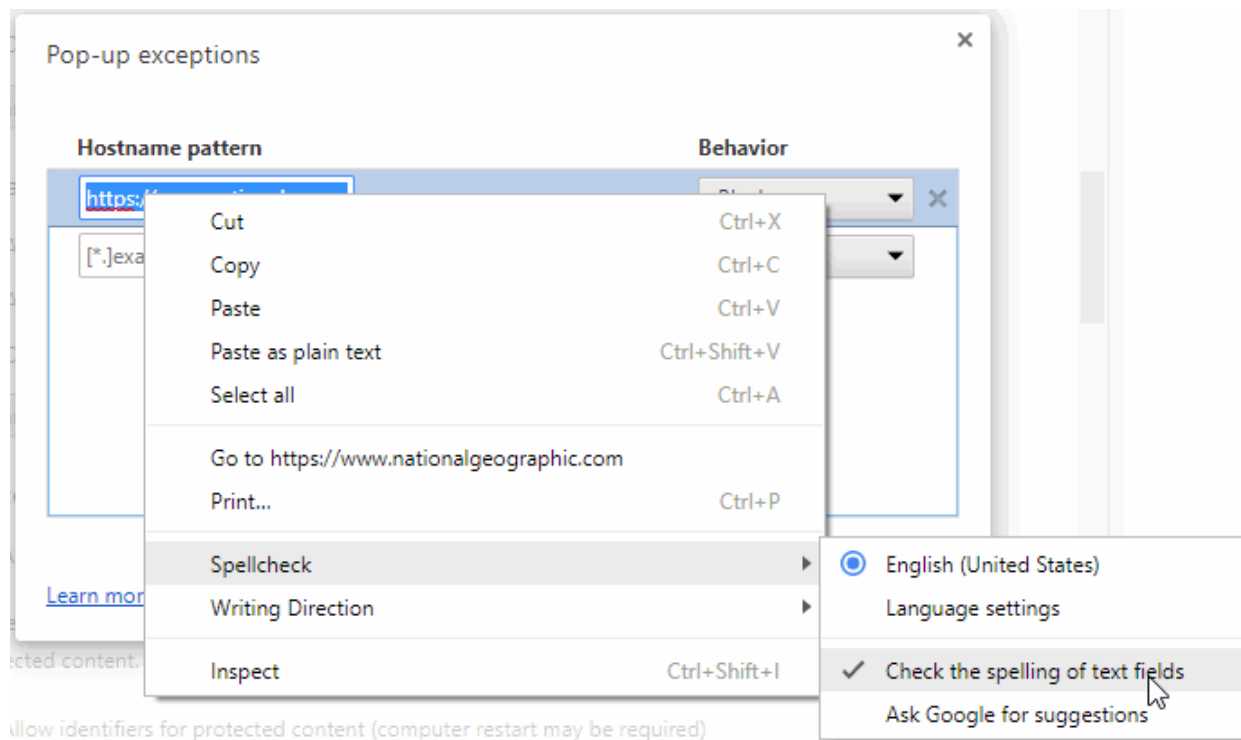


- Select 'Allow all sites to show pop-ups' for all pop-ups to display.
- Select 'Do not allow any site to show pop-ups (recommended)' to block all pop-ups.
- Click the 'Manage exceptions...' button to customize your settings for allowing or blocking pop-ups.

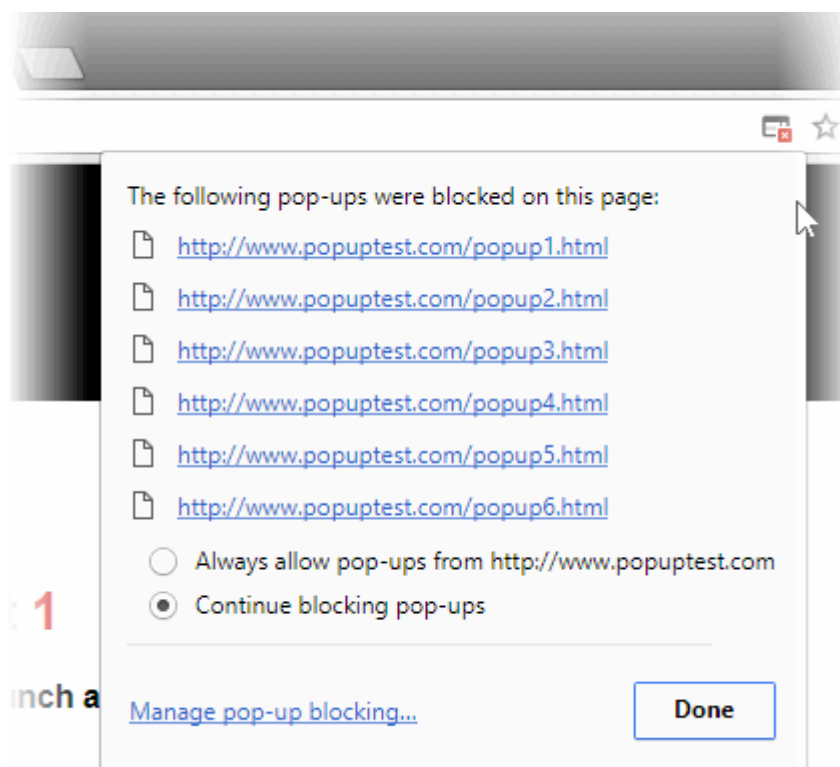


- Enter the web address of the web-page in the 'Hostname pattern' text-box.
- Select 'Allow' or 'Block' in the 'Behavior' drop-down.
- Click 'Done' to close the dialog.

You will be able to view the website added to the list of pop-up exceptions. Right-clicking on any website in this list opens a context menu which allows you to add or remove websites and specify other settings such as spell-checker options.



You can also view the list of pop-ups that were blocked by clicking the  icon in the address bar.



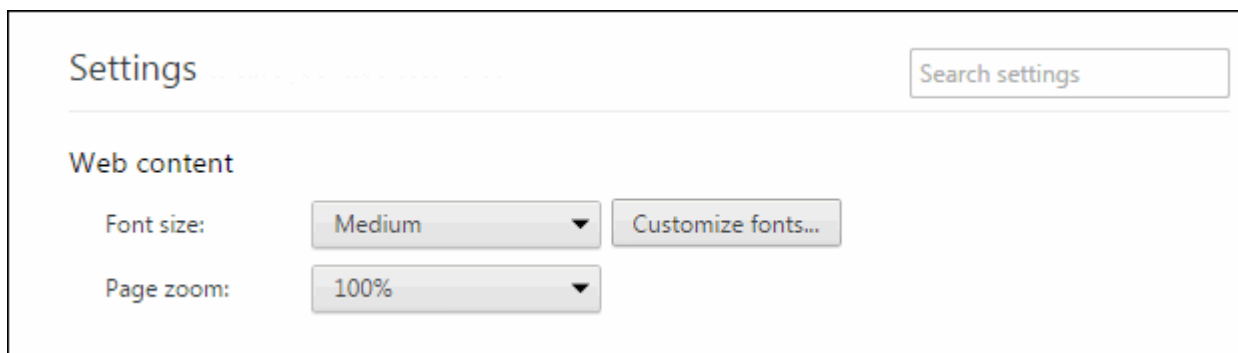
In the list that is displayed, you can view the pop-up window by clicking on it.

- Select 'Always allow pop-ups from <webpage name>' for unrestricted view of all pop-ups from that particular website. It will be automatically added to the exception list.
- Click the 'Manage pop-up blocking' link to configure how you want Dragon to handle pop-up windows.

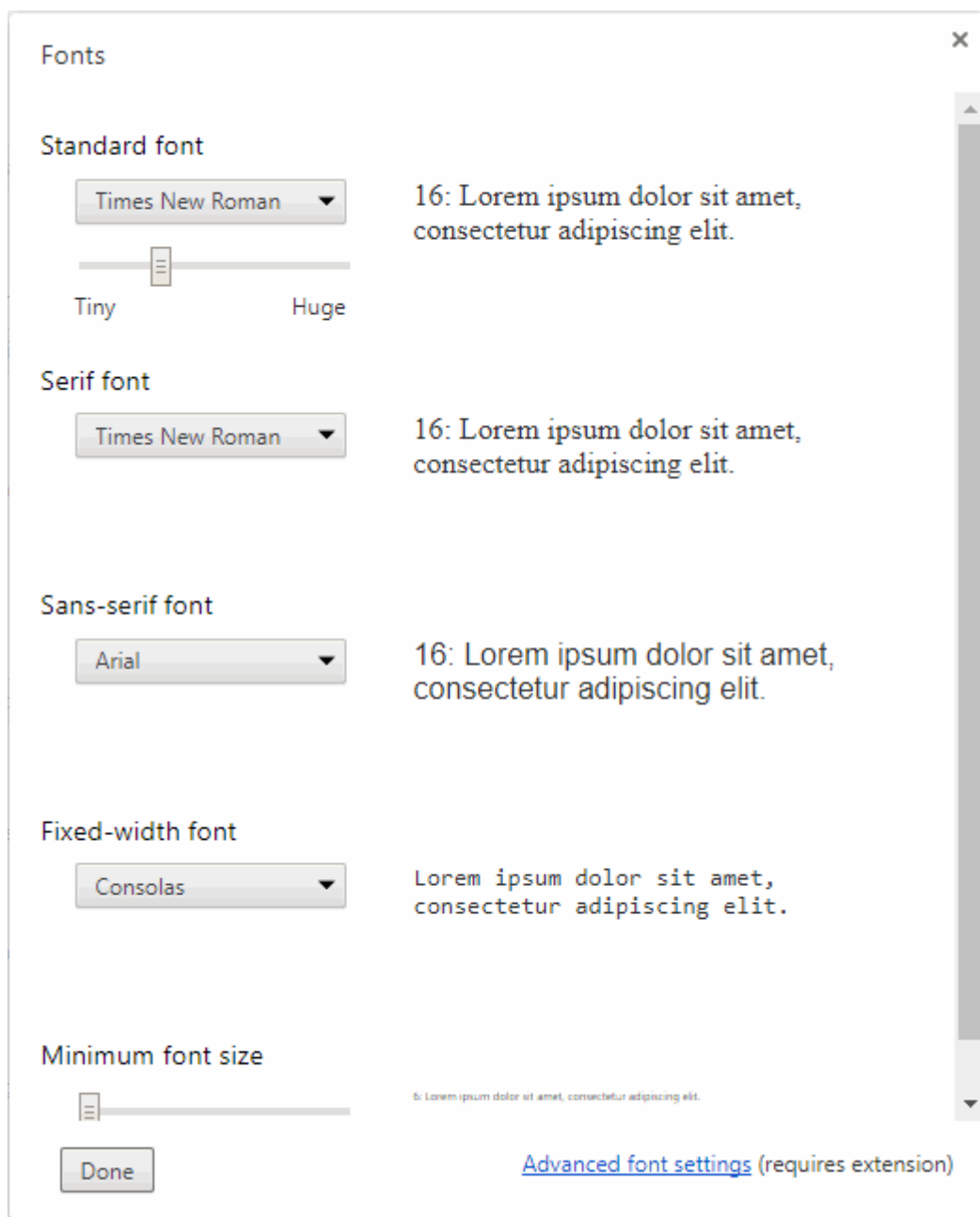
4.12. Setting Browser Language, Fonts and Encoding

Comodo Dragon allows you to configure the font and language that is displayed in the browser.

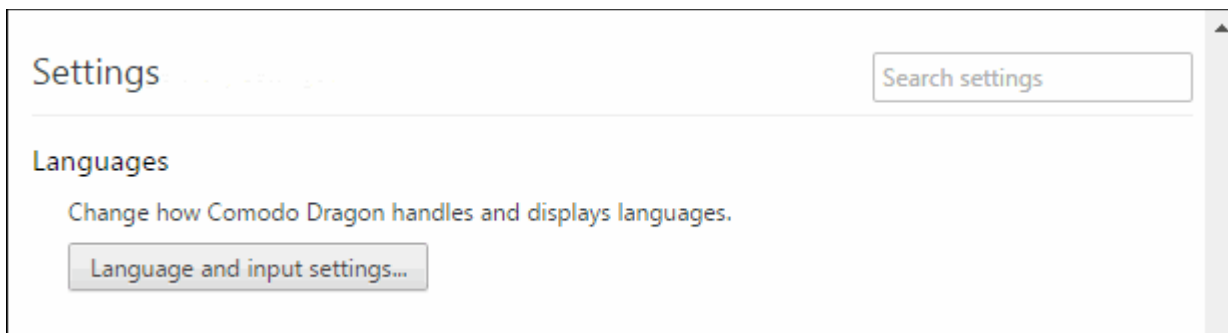
- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link
- Click 'Customize fonts' in the 'Web Content' section



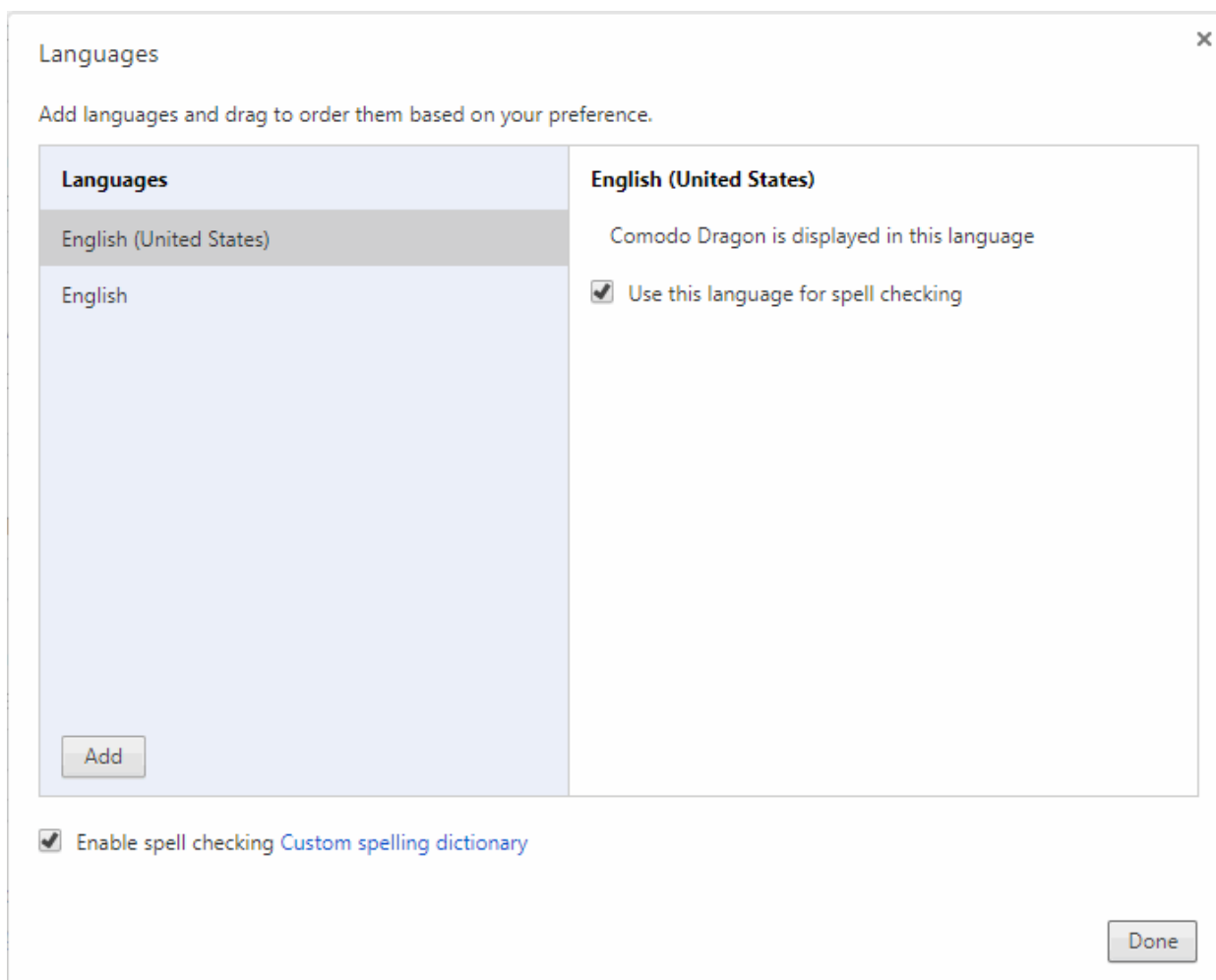
The 'Fonts' dialog will open:



- In the 'Fonts' dialog, select the font and encoding settings that you want the browser to display. Note that the text in the website may not be displayed correctly if the default encoding is not compatible with the one that is required by the website.
- Click 'Advanced font setting' to customize font settings for different language scripts. This will take you to the Google web store.
- Click 'Done' to close the dialog.
- Click the menu located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link.



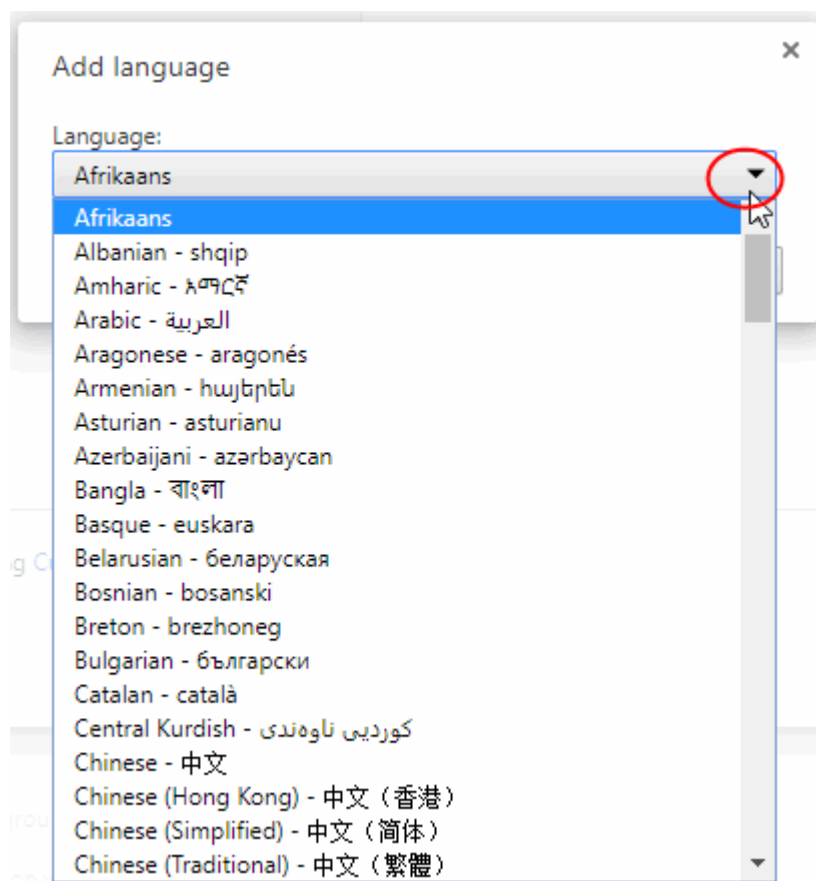
- Click 'Language and input settings' in the 'Languages' section to set the language that you want the browser to display.



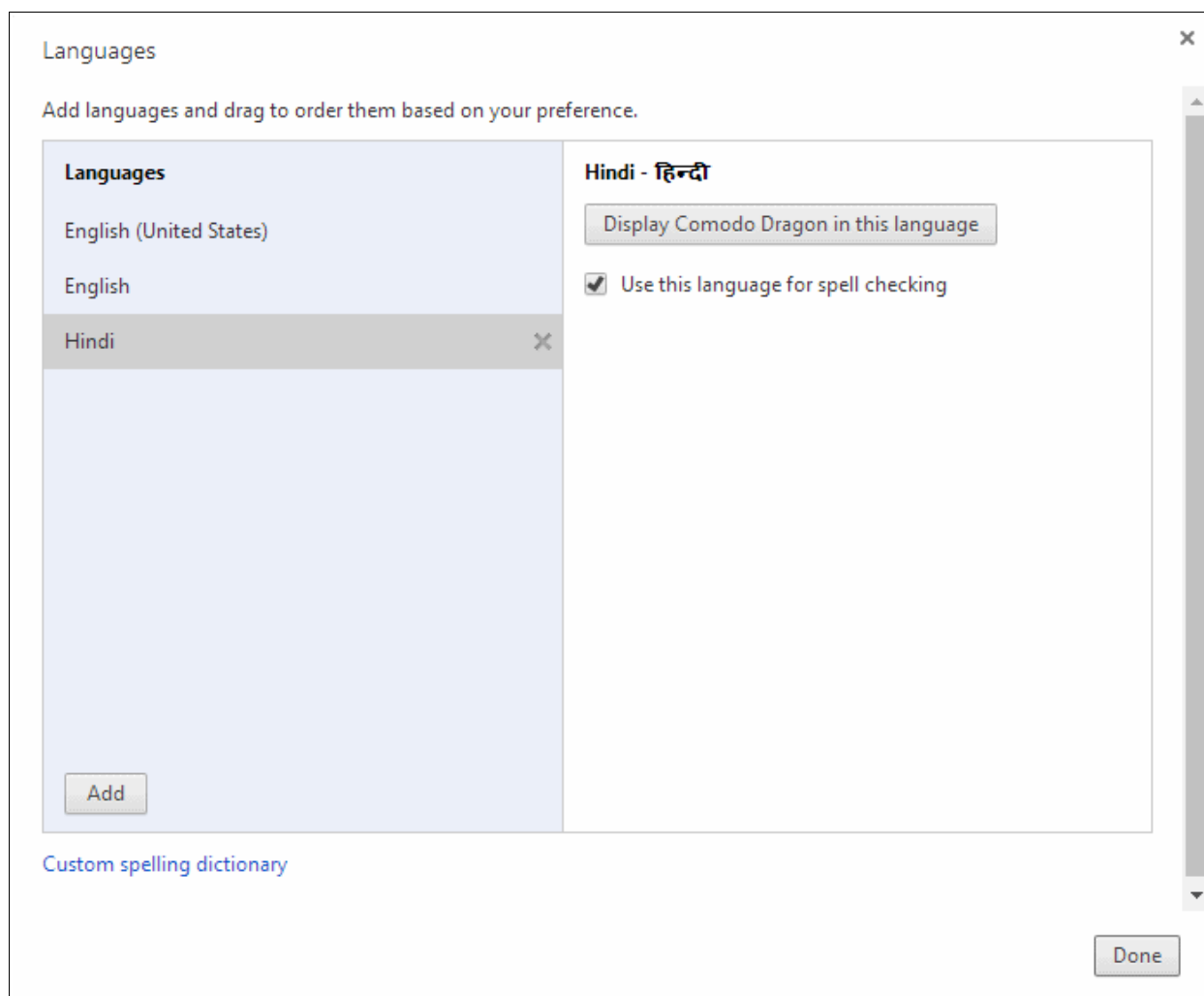
- The default Comodo Dragon language is English (United States). Select your preferred language from the drop-down.

The 'Languages' dialog will appear:

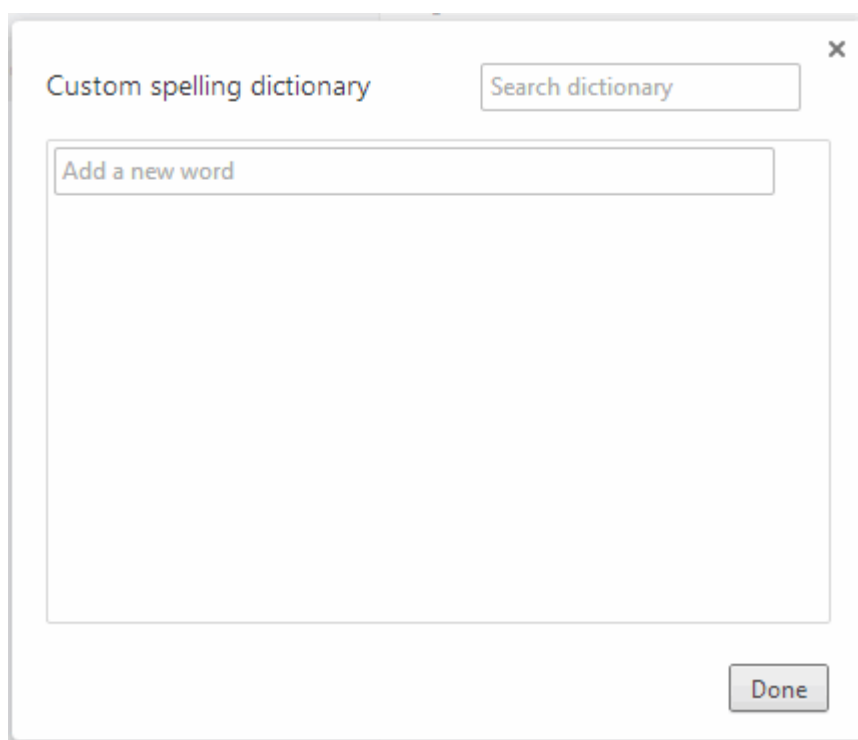
- Click 'Add' at lower-left to include more languages:



- You can remove languages as well by clicking the 'X' next to the name of language.
- The browser will display content in the language you select:



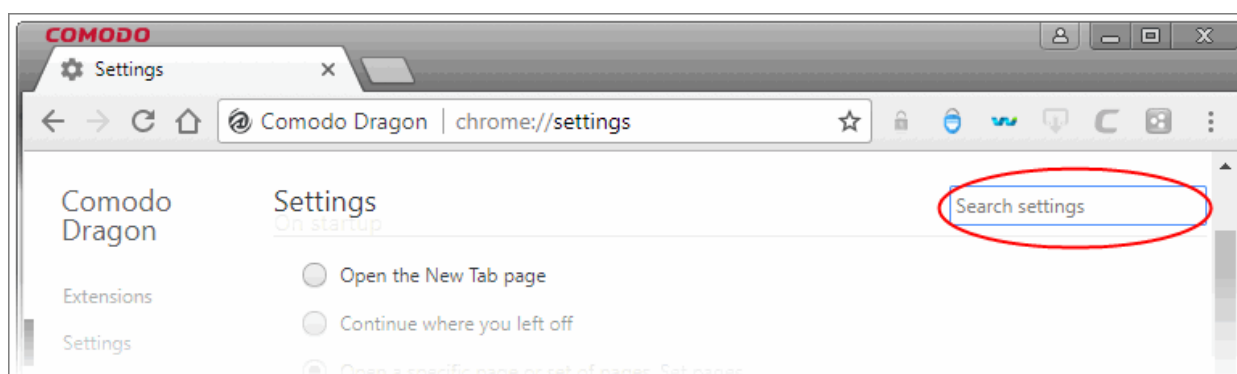
- To revert to default language, you need to select the default language and check the option 'Use this language for spell checking'
- When 'Enable spell checking' is on you can add a new word to the dictionary.
- Click the 'Custom spelling dictionary' link in the bottom of the interface.




- To check spelling for added word, you can enter a new word in a web interface like yahoo search field to compare with those added in your dictionary in future.
- Click 'Done' to apply the settings.

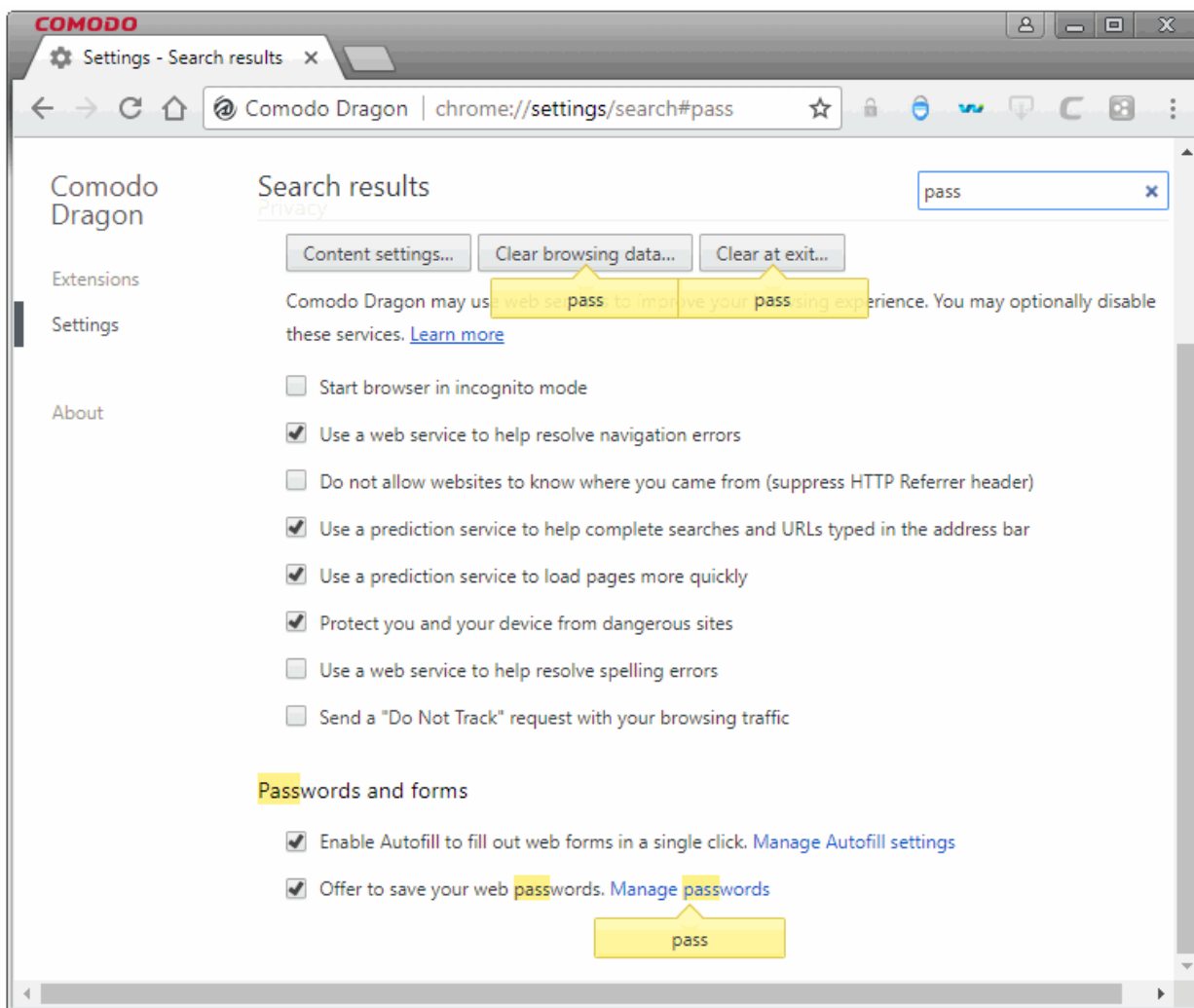
4.13. Search for Important Browser Settings

- If you do not know where to find a setting, use the search box to at the top-right of the settings screen.
- For example, if you want to know how to manage passwords, you could simply type 'passwords' in the search box.
- Every Dragon setting related to passwords will be collected and shown on the right. You can review and modify the required settings right away.



To access the settings search box

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' from the menu
- The settings search box is located at the top-right hand side of the browser.
- Type any keyword in the search box and you will be instantly presented with the relevant controls in the right pane

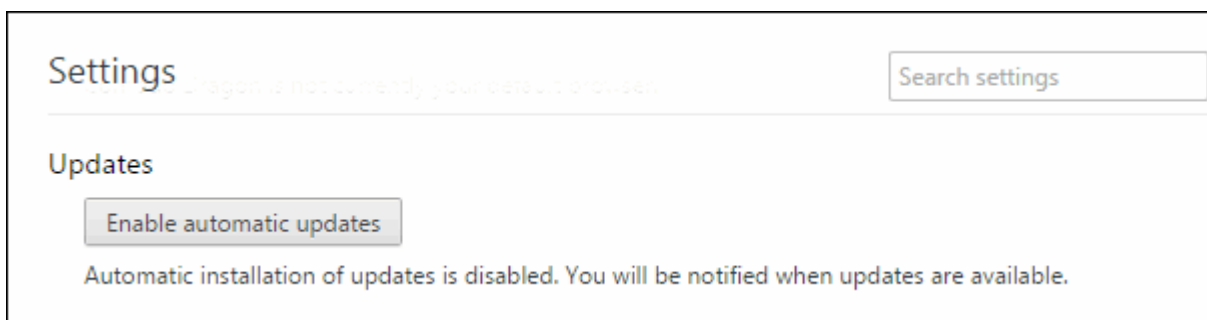


4.14. Configuring Dragon Updates

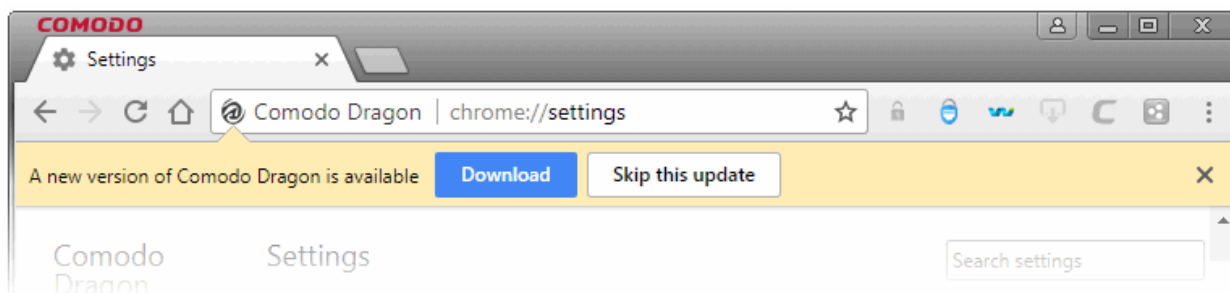
To make sure your browser is protected by the latest security updates, Comodo Dragon automatically/manually updates whenever it detects the latest version.

To configure updates

- Navigate to the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' from the menu.



If automatic updates are disabled then Dragon will not automatically install updates. Instead, you will be alerted when updates are available via the yellow notification bar.



- Click 'Download' to install the update
- Click 'Skip this update' will, not install the update and will stop the yellow notification bar from appearing every time Dragon launches (for the duration that this particular update is available). It will reappear, however, when the next update after that is available.


4.15. Manage Website Passwords

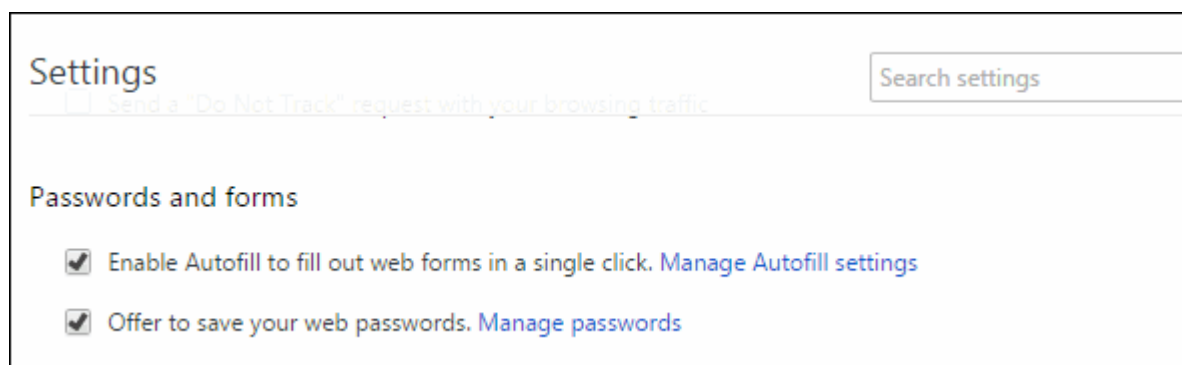
- Comodo Dragon allows you to save login data for your favorite websites so you can automatically sign in without having to manually enter your username/password.
- This saves you having to remember passwords or writing them down on insecure media such as post-it notes which can be lost or stolen.
- All saved passwords are securely stored in your Dragon user profile.

Note:

- Your passwords, along with your other personal Dragon settings, can be synced with your Google account.
- This lets you retrieve your passwords when using a different computer.

To access password settings

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Click 'Settings' then click 'Show advanced settings' at the bottom of the page.
- Scroll down to the 'Passwords and forms' section:



- Offer to save your web passwords- If enabled, Dragon will ask you if you wish to save your password every time you sign in to a new website. You will be offered the following options:
 - 'Save' – Dragon will auto-complete your password on subsequent visits to the login page.

- 'Never' - Your password is not saved and the site is added to a list of passwords that are never saved.
- Leave the check 'Auto sign-in' box enabled to automatically sign-in to applications and websites connected to your Google account.

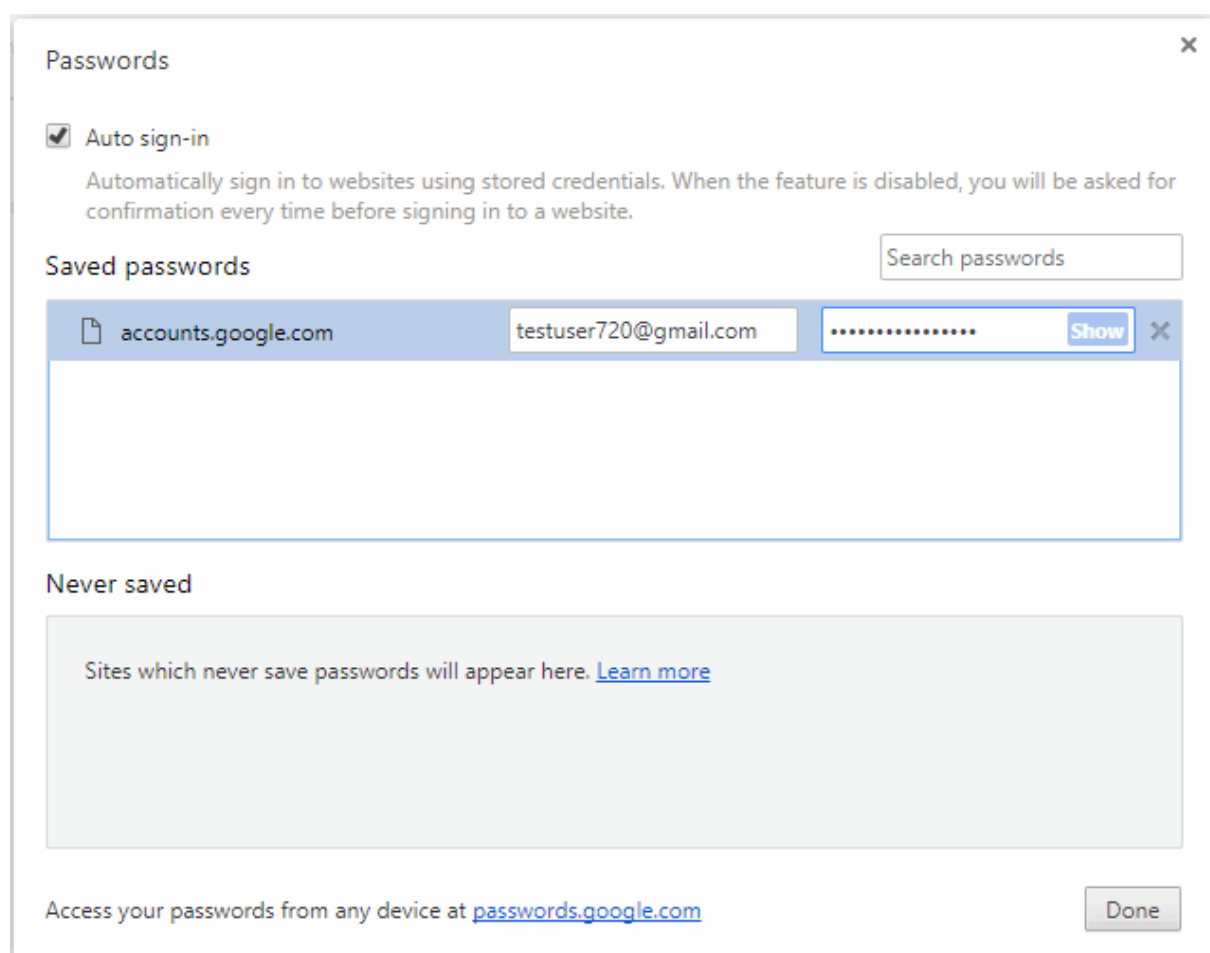
To edit the 'Never saved' list:

- In the 'Passwords' dialog go to the 'Never saved'
- To remove a site from this list, select a site and click the 'X' that appears at the end of the row.

Now revisit the website and you see the prompt to save your password information again, if you have allowed Google Chrome to show the prompt.

To delete saved passwords

- In the 'Passwords' dialog go to 'Saved passwords'
- Hover over your mouse to the site whose password you would like to remove
- Click the 'X' that is shown on the right.



To view saved passwords

- Click 'Show' next to the site whose password you want to see
- Log in to your Dragon account.

Comodo Dragon allows you to sign-in with saved password you use in other devices through the Smart Lock for Password. All passwords used to sign-in via different devices will be listed at passwords.google.com beneath the 'Never saved'.

Note: To use this option, you need to sign in to Comodo Dragon.

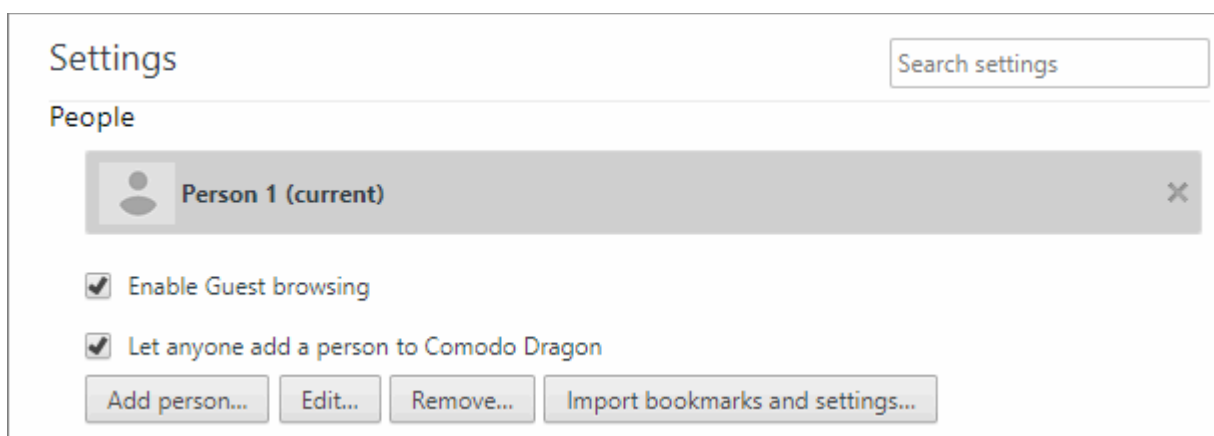
You can import bookmarks, saved passwords, search engines, browsing history and auto-fill form data into Dragon from the following browsers:

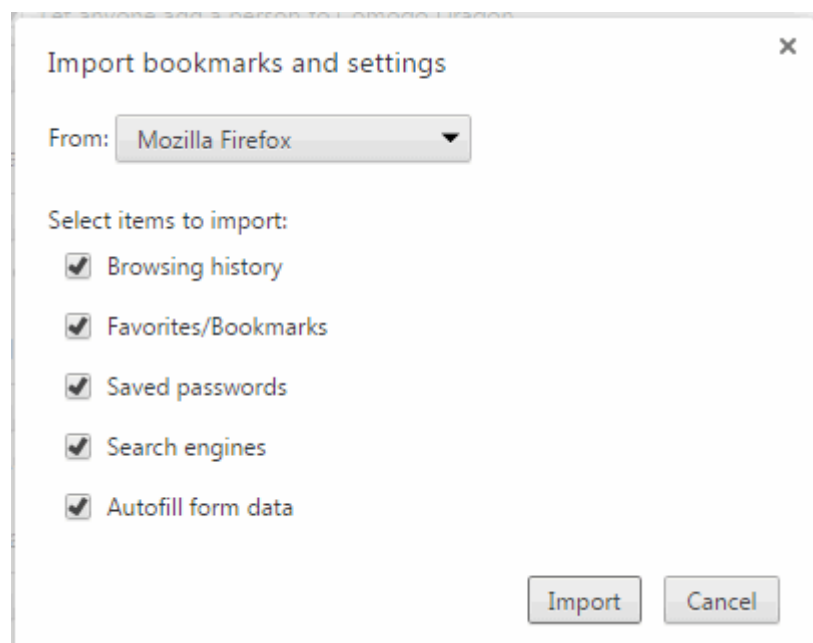

To import data

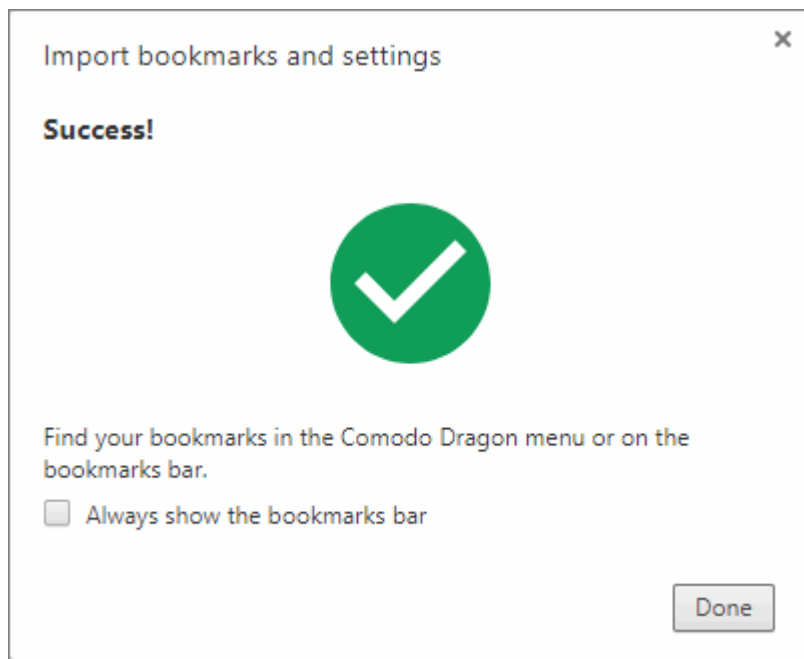
- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'People'
- Click 'Import bookmark and settings' button.



- Alternatively, click the ellipsis at the top-right > 'Bookmarks' > 'Import bookmarks now' link
OR
- Click the 'Import bookmarks now' on the tool bar
- The 'Import bookmarks and settings' dialog will appear:



- Choose the browser from which you would like to import
- Select the types of settings you wish to import
- Click 'Import', a confirmation about successful importing process will be displayed



- Enable 'Always show the bookmarks bar' so your bookmarks are always available at the top of the Dragon interface.
- Click 'Done'.

Imported bookmarks appear as a sub-folder within the "Other bookmarks" folder at the end of the bookmarks bar.

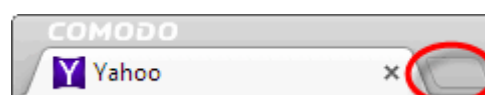

5.1. Open a New Tab

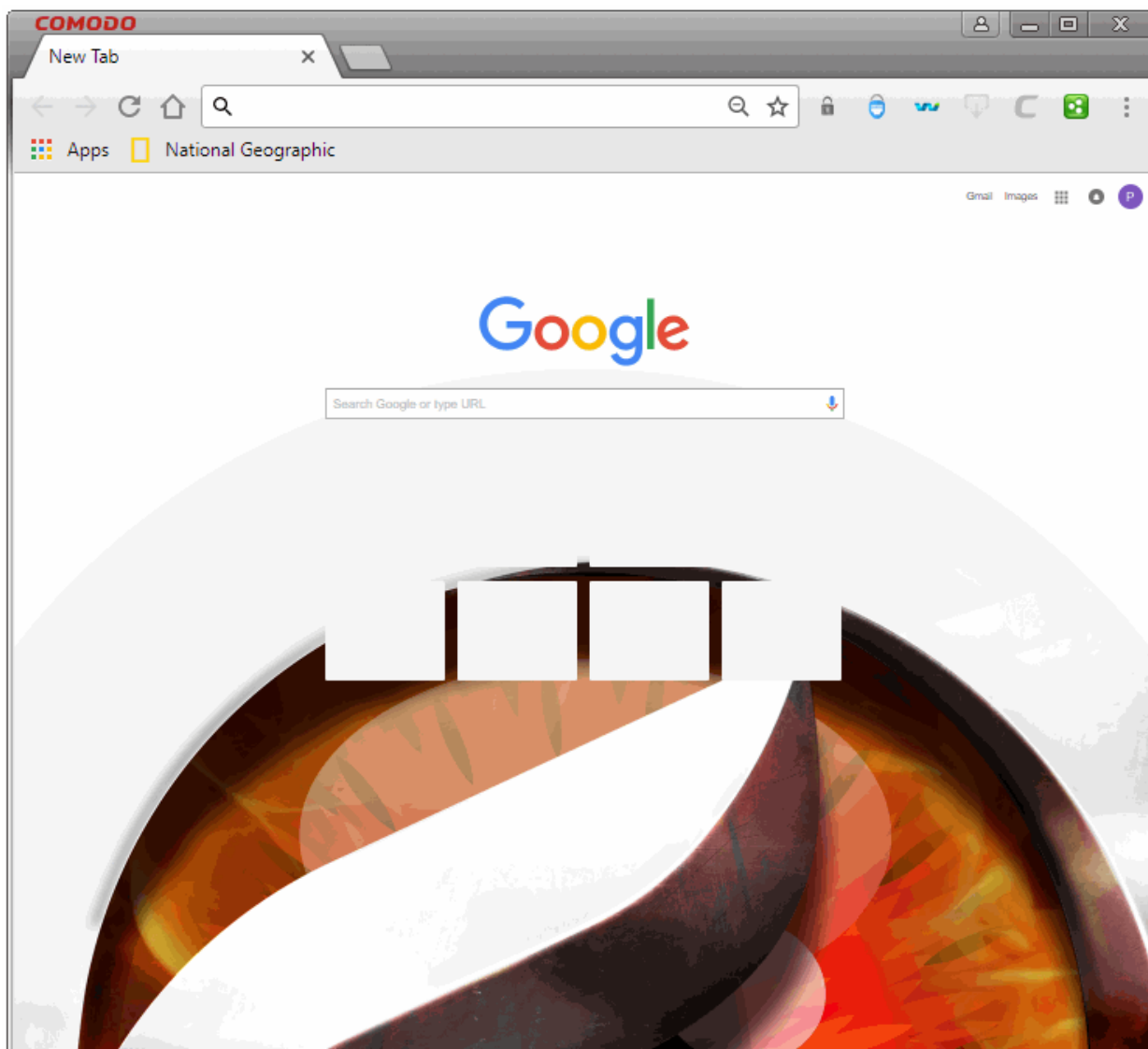
Comodo Dragon allows you to have multiple web pages open simultaneously in separate tabs.


To open new tab

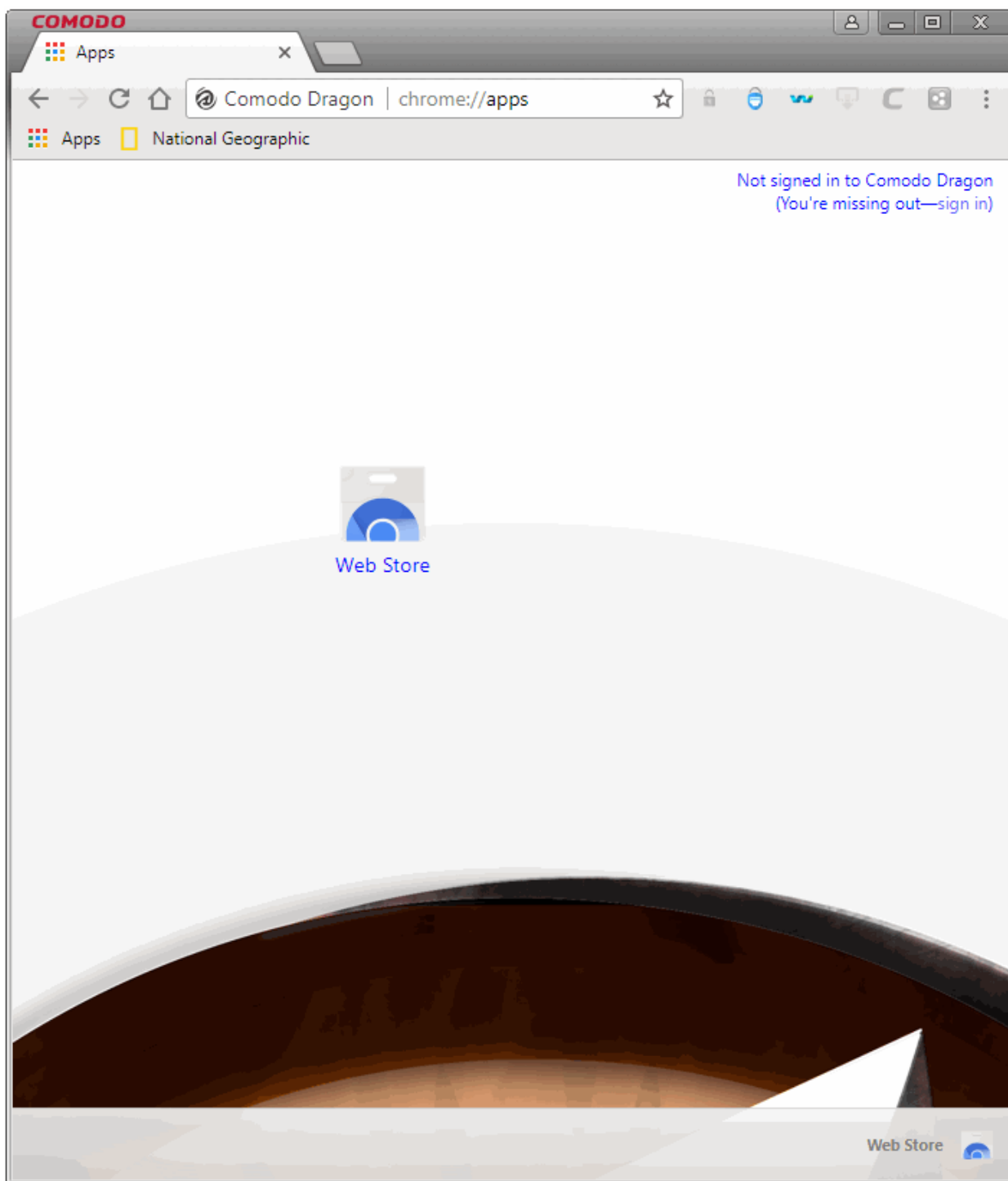
- Click the new tab  icon which is next to the last tab.



The new tab page will open with thumbnails of your most frequently visited sites in the center:



- Click a thumbnail to quickly visit a favorite site
- To remove a thumbnail, place your mouse cursor over the thumbnail and click the 'X' in the upper-right corner.
- To quickly open your most recently visited site in a new window, press **Ctrl+Shift+T**
- The 'Bookmarks' bar at the top shows your favorite webpages.
 - To enable the bookmarks bar, click the ellipsis > 'Bookmarks' > enable 'Show bookmarks bar' .
- You can view installed extensions by clicking the apps  button at top-left:



- If you cannot see any apps, click the back button to return to the 'New Tab' page:
 - Right-click on the bookmark bar and make sure the 'Show apps shortcut' is enabled.

Comodo Dragon remembers your preference and opens the 'Most visited' section or 'Apps' section when you open a new tab page or click the 'Show apps shortcut' button.

5.2. Customize the New Tab Page

- You can move individual tiles around by simply dragging and dropping them to your preferred location
- You can also have multiple sections of website tiles. You can navigate between the sections by clicking the arrows at the left and right side of the new tab page.
- You can then have different sections for different types of websites. E.g, 'Sports', 'News', 'Work' etc.

To rename a section

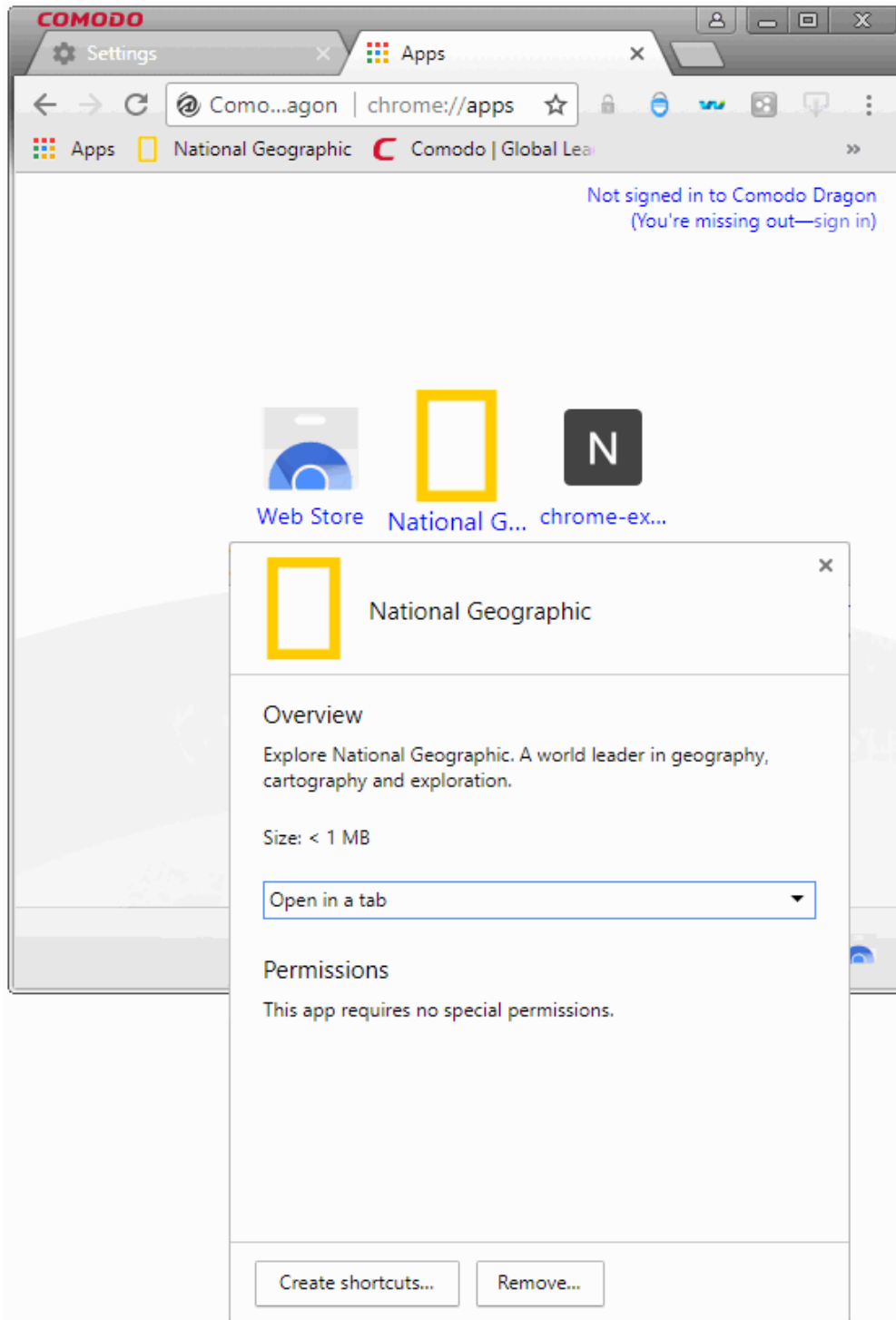
- Click the new tab icon  to open a blank new tab
- Double-click on one of the the 'Apps' tabs at the bottom of the browser.



- You can rename to label according to the category of websites you wish to place on this tab. The label becomes editable for you to rename.

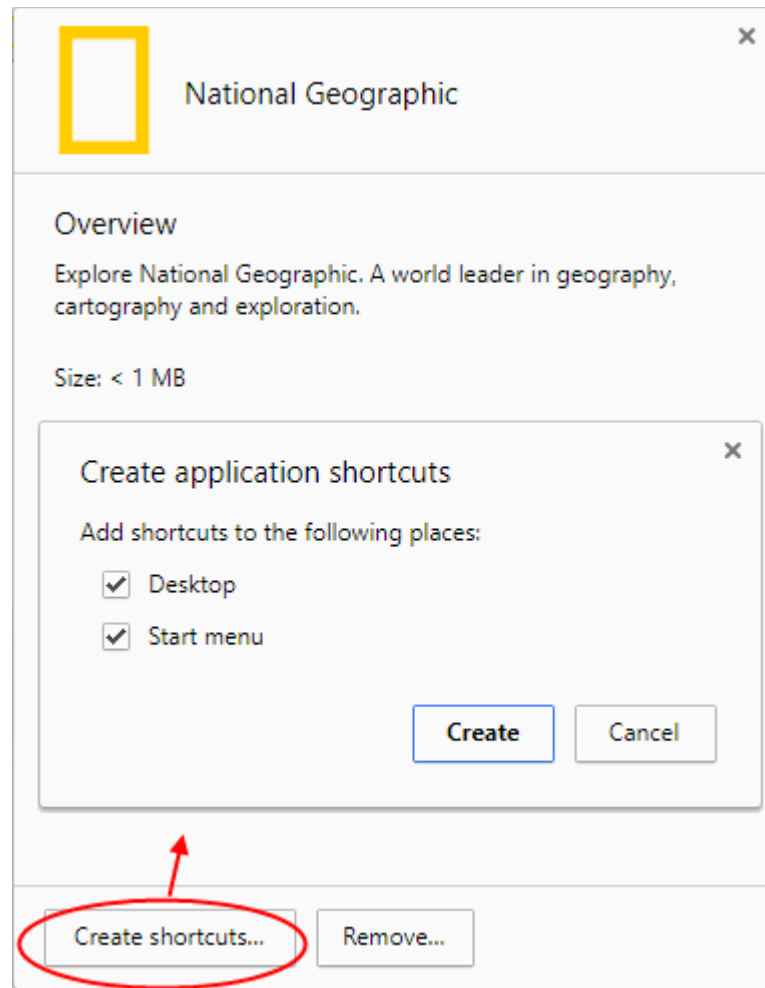
To view app information

- Right-click on the App thumbnail.
- Click 'App info'.



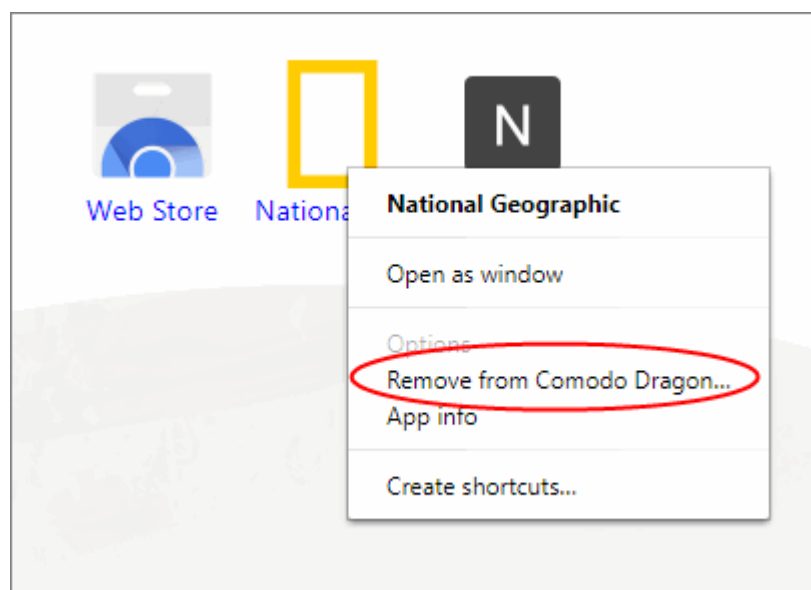
To create shortcut for apps

- Right click on the App thumbnail
- Click 'App info'
- Click 'Create shortcuts'
- In the 'Create application shortcuts' dialog select whether the shortcut will be added to desktop or start menu
- Click 'Create'.

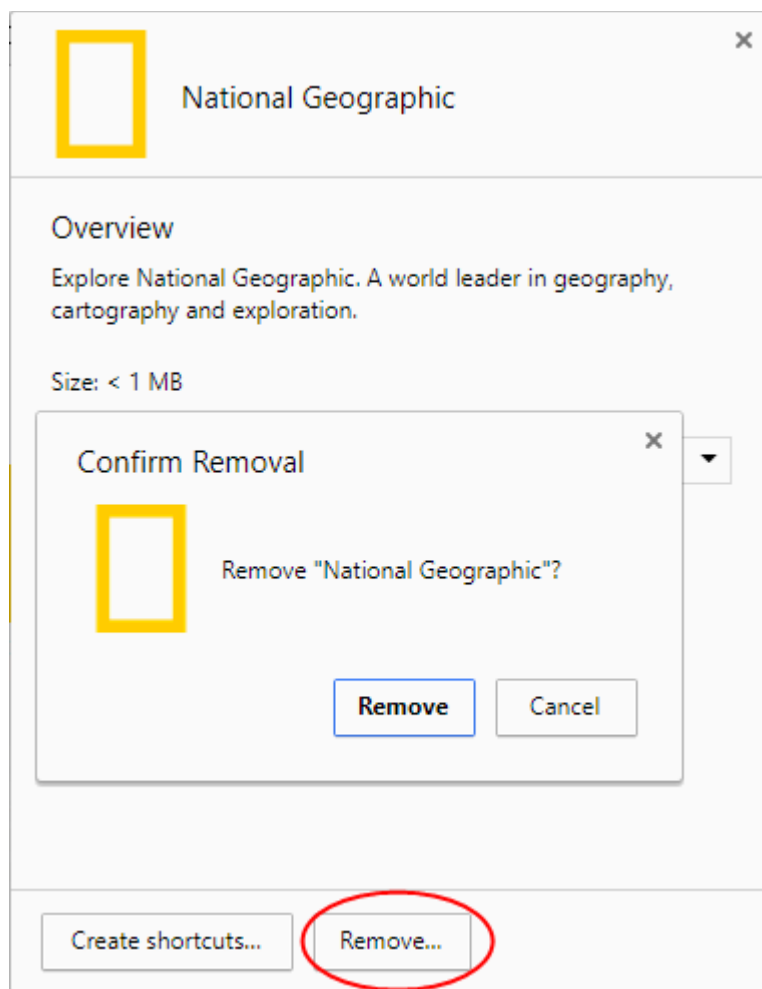


To remove an App

- Right-click on the App thumbnail that you want to uninstall
- Click 'Remove from Comodo Dragon' from the context-sensitive menu.
- Click 'Remove' in the 'Confirm Removal' dialog to confirm your choice.



- Alternately, click 'Remove' from the 'App info' dialogue.



- The app info displays a confirmation of app removal.
- Alternatively, click and drag the app that you want to remove.
- You can see a 'Remove from Comodo Dragon' trash can appear on the lower right corner of the web browser.
- Drop the thumbnail in the trash can.



To remove a most visited sites

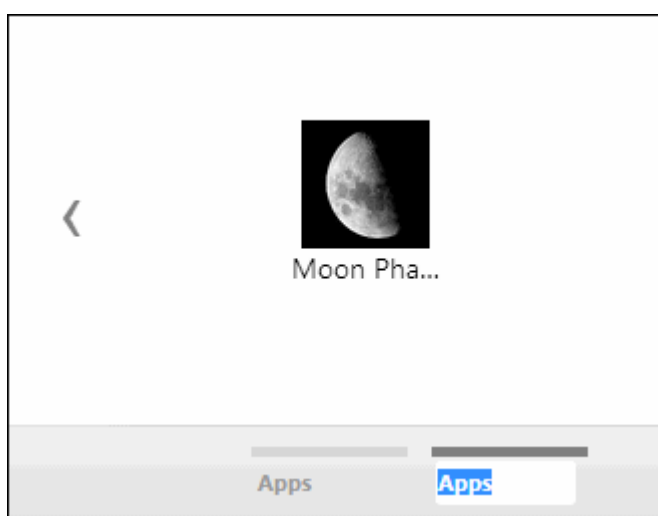
- Hover the mouse cursor on the thumbnail that you want to remove and click on the 'X' that appears in the top-right corner.



The thumbnail is now deleted from the page.

To create a new section

- Drag any tile to a blank area at the bottom of the browser.
- A new section will appear next to the existing sections. Double-click to rename the section.
- Drag any tile you wish into the new section.



To reset a page to show blank thumbnails

You have to clear the browsing history in the tools menu to reset a new tab page to show blank thumbnails. See [Deleting Browsing History](#) to know on how to clear the browsing history.

Note: The default webpage thumbnails will not change even the browsing history is cleared.

5.3. Rearrange Tabs

Comodo Dragon allows you to rearrange tabs or pull out a tab to open in a new window. You can also dock a new window into another Comodo Dragon window as another tab.

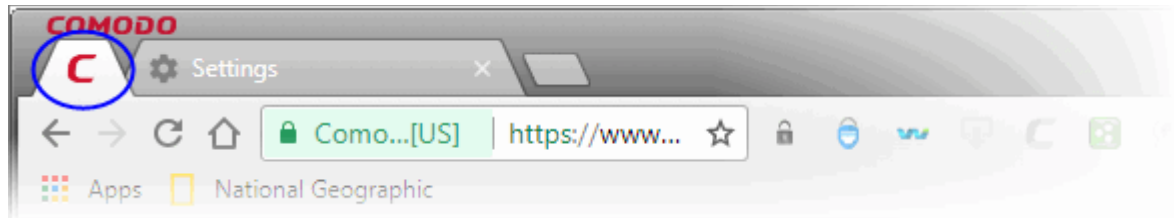
- Just click and hold a tab and move to another position in the same window.
- To open a tab in a new window, click and drag a tab and release it in the page.
- Click and drag a tab in a window and dock it into another window as a tab.

To restore a tab or a window

You can recover a tab or window that you have closed in the 'Recently closed' section on customize and control Comodo Dragon menu> 'History'.

To pin a tab

- Right-click on the tab that you want to prevent from being moved around and select 'Pin tab' from the context-sensitive menu. The tab will be pinned to the left of the browser window.



Right-click options

- Right-clicking on a tab opens context-sensitive menu:
 - **New Tab** - Opens a new tab page to the right of the browser window.
 - **Reload** - Refreshes the page.
 - **Duplicate** - Opens a duplicate page to the right of the browser window.
 - **Pin tab** - Pins the tab to left of the browser window.
 - **Mute tab** - Turns off the sound of a particular tab
 - **Close tab**- Closes the tab.
 - **Close other tabs** - Closes all other tabs.
 - **Close tabs to the right** - All tabs to the right of the browser will be closed.
 - **Reopen closed tab** - Reopens last closed tab in the same tab location of the browser window.
 - **Bookmark all tabs** - All tabs that are currently open in the browser will be bookmarked.

5.4. Close Tabs, Windows and Comodo Dragon

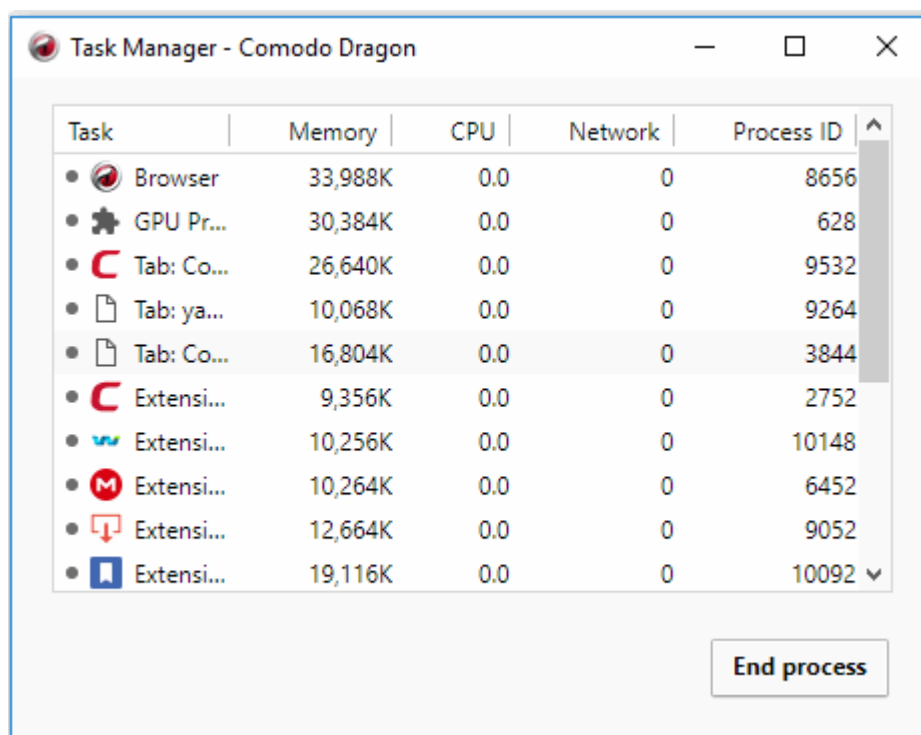
You can close a tab or a window in multiple ways.

To close a tab, a window or Comodo Dragon

- Click 'X' in the tab or use the keyboard shortcut CTRL+W to close a tab.
- Click 'X' in the corner of the window or use the keyboard shortcut Alt+F4 to close a window.
- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner
 - Click 'Exit' in the menu to close all tabs and windows of Comodo Dragon.

To forcibly close an application or a web-page

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'More tools' > select 'Task manager'.



- Select the application or webpage that you want to close and click the 'End process' button.

The page of the affected tab will display a '**Aw, Snap!**, Something went wrong while displaying this webpage' message.

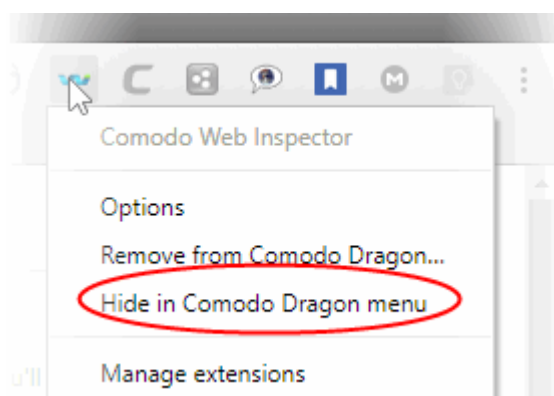
Note: You can also use the keyboard shortcut Shift+Esc to open the 'Task Manager' dialog.

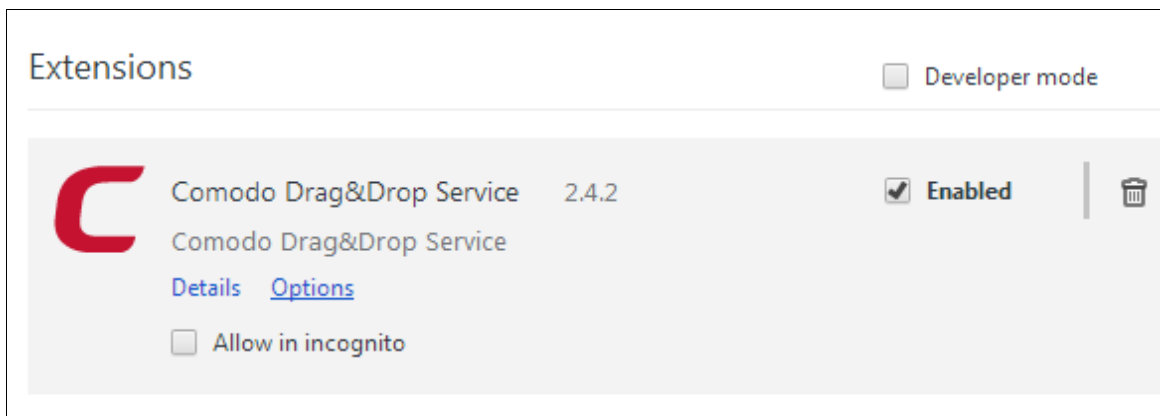
5.5. Display / Hide Application Buttons on the Toolbar

- You can manage the settings of individual extensions from the extension's toolbar button
- By default, Dragon automatically adds extension buttons to the toolbar
- To hide an extension button, right-click on it and select 'Hide in Comodo Dragon menu' in the toolbar
OR
- Open `chrome://extensions` and click 'Disable'.



To reinstate the button to the toolbar:

- Click the menu  at the top-right corner
- Select 'More tools' > 'Extensions'
- Find the extension you want and tick the 'Enabled' checkbox.



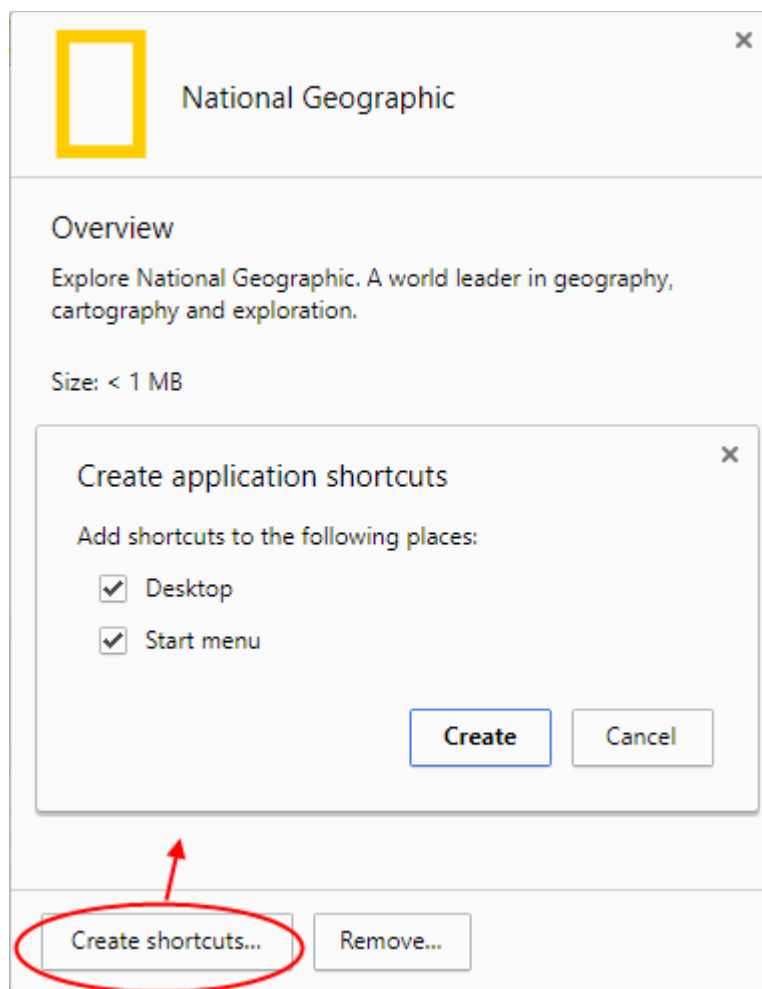
Right-clicking on an extension button also allows you to manage extension specific settings such as (extension) 'Allow in incognito mode' and other options.

5.6. Manage App Shortcuts for Desktop and Start Menu

App shortcuts allow you to quickly access applications from your desktop and/or start menu.

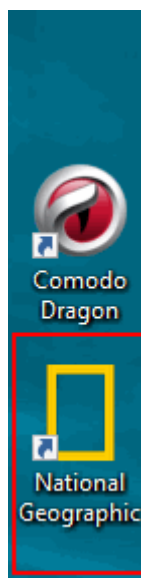

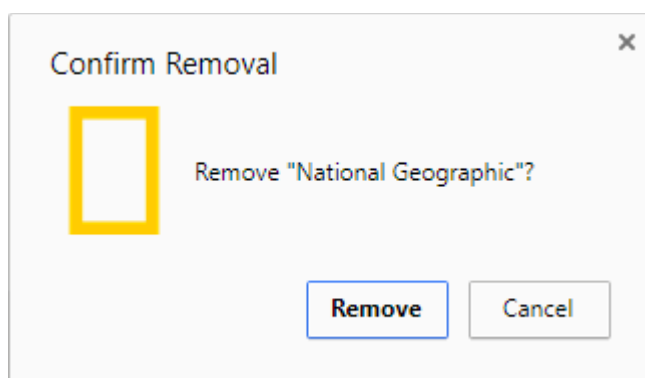

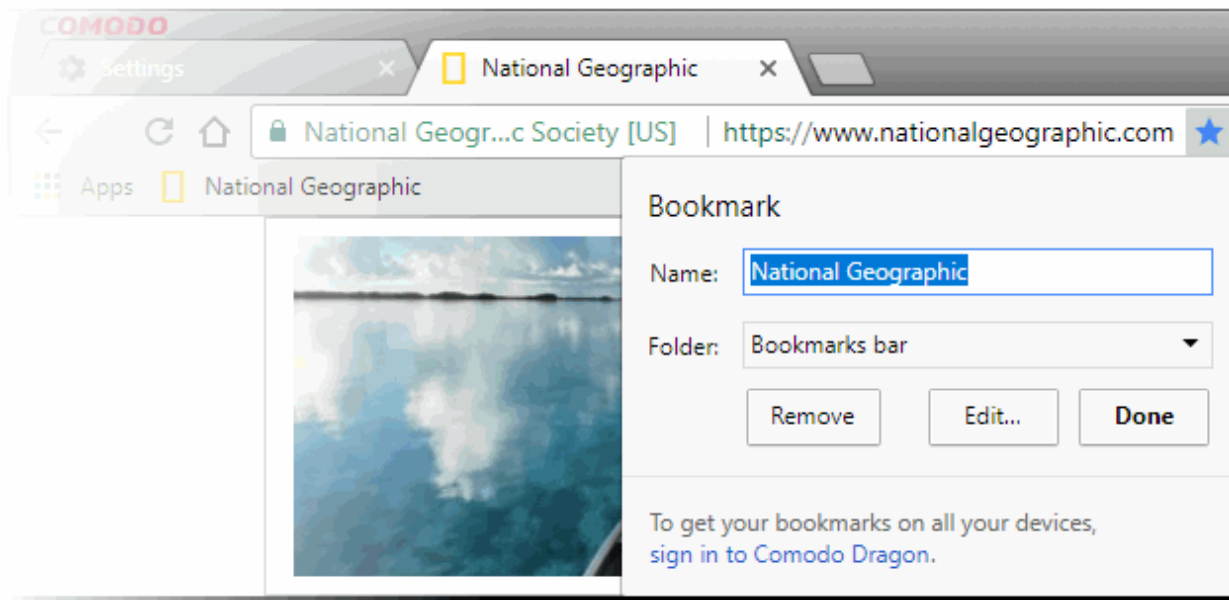
6.1. Create Bookmarks

Comodo Dragon allows you to create bookmarks in multiple ways:

Method 1

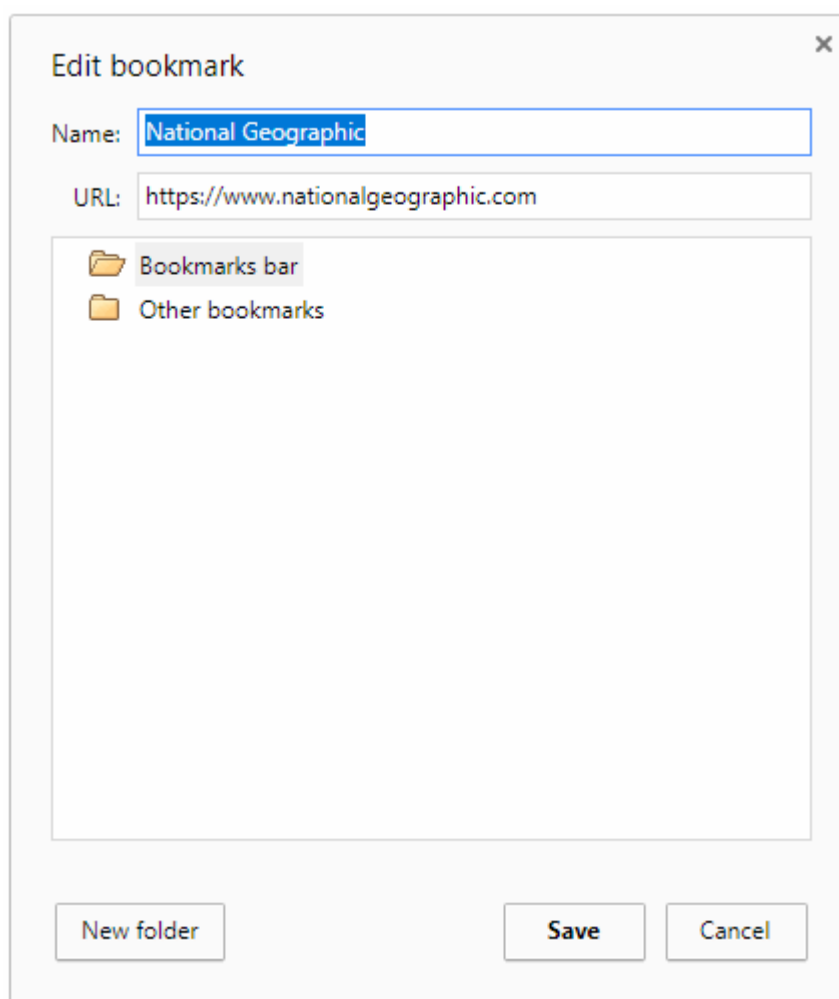
- Visit a website that you wish to bookmark.
- Click the ☆ icon at the right side of the address bar.

The web-page is automatically bookmarked in the recently used bookmarked folder.



In the 'Bookmark' dialog you can edit the name or move it to another folder.

- Click 'Done' to add the webpage to bookmarks.
- Click the 'Remove' link if you do not want to bookmark the page.
- Click the 'Edit' button to open the 'Edit bookmark' dialog. Here you can change the address and name of the web-page or create a new folder.



- Click 'Save' when you have finished.

Method 2

- You can import bookmarks from other browsers. Click the ellipsis button (top-right) > Click 'Bookmarks' > 'Import Bookmarks and Settings...'

Method 3

- Drag a URL from the address bar and drop it onto the bookmarks bar

Method 4

- Use the keyboard short cut CTRL+D to create a bookmark of the web-page that you are currently viewing.

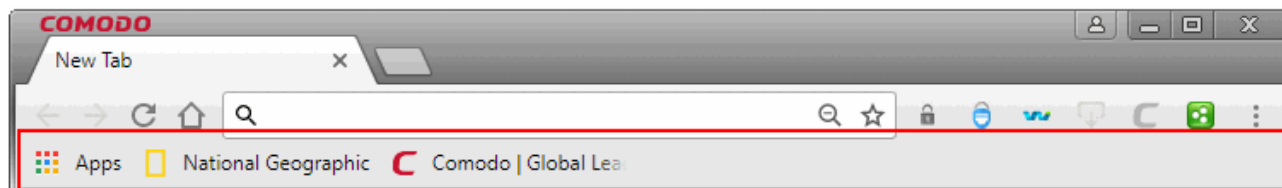
6.2. Find and Edit Bookmarks

The bookmark bar is a convenient way to access all your favorite websites.


To dock the bookmark bar

- Click the  button at top-right
- Select 'Settings' and scroll to the 'Appearance' section

- Enable 'Always show the bookmarks bar'
- The bookmarks bar will appear just below the address bar:

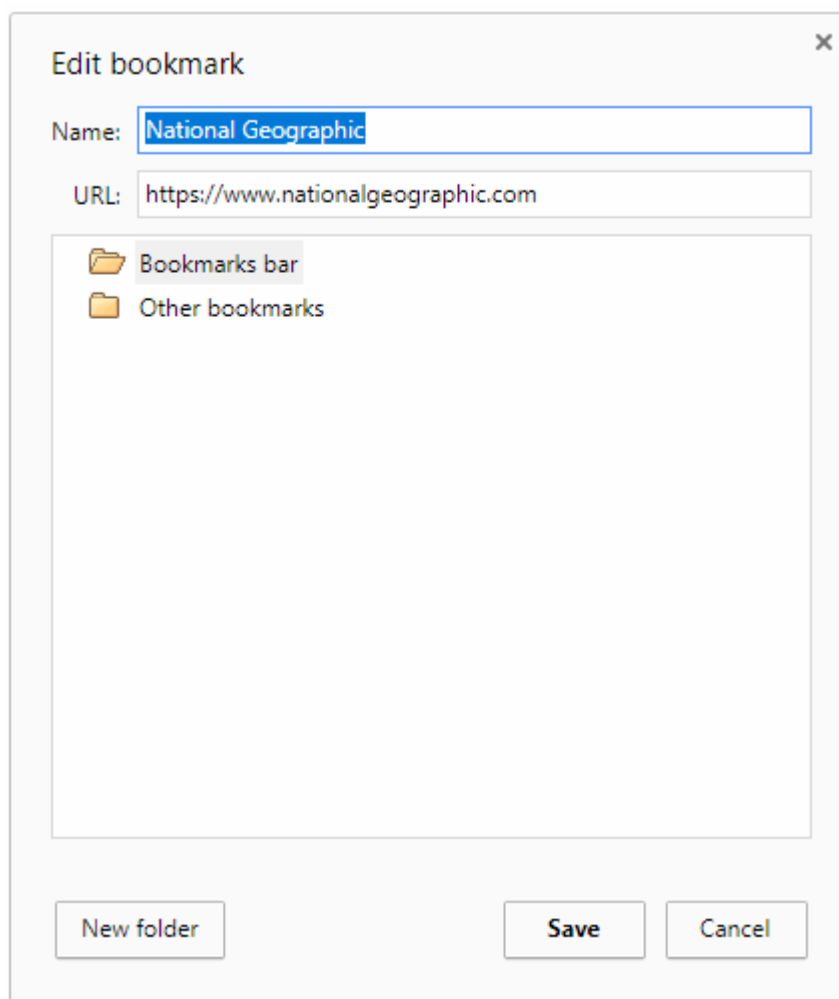


You can add a bookmark to the bar by:

- Highlighting an address in the address bar then drag it onto the bookmarks bar
- Click  then 'Bookmark Manager'. Drag one of your bookmarks to the bookmarks bar

To edit bookmarks

- Right-click a bookmark on the bookmark bar.
- Select 'Edit' from the menu. The Edit bookmark dialog will appear:



Here you can edit the name, web address of the bookmark. You can also create a new folder from here.

To delete bookmarks

- Right-click a bookmark on the bookmark bar.


- Select the 'Delete' from the menu.

The selected bookmark will be deleted. Please note that when you delete a folder, all the bookmarks in the folder will also be deleted.

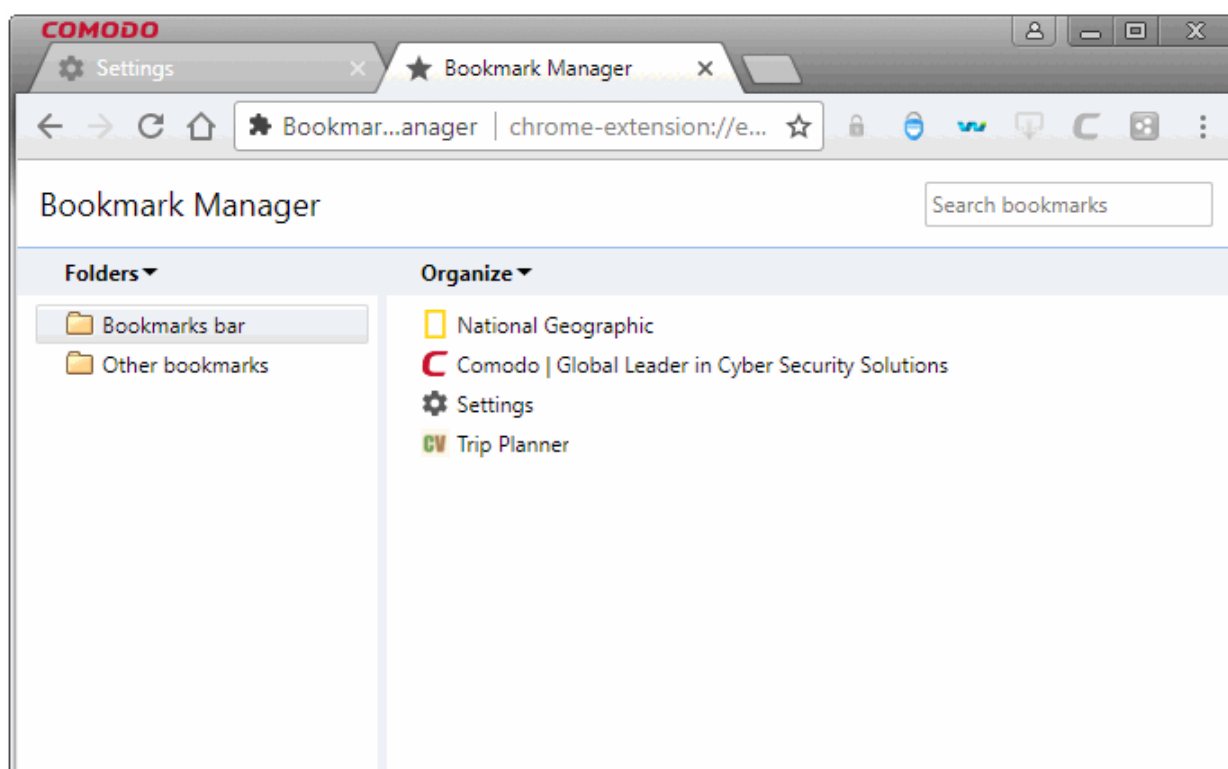
6.3. Manage Bookmarks

- The 'Bookmark Manager' in Comodo Dragon allows you to organize your bookmarks.
- Here you can edit, delete or rename bookmarks and folders.
- Right-click on any of the folder and open all the bookmarks in new tabs, new window or in incognito window.

To open bookmark manager

- Click the menu  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Bookmarks' > 'Bookmark manager' from the menu.

The 'Bookmark Manager' interface will open:



In this interface you can edit, rename, move a bookmark or search bookmarks.

To move bookmarks

- Just click and drag a bookmark or folder to another destination to the folder list in the left side.

To rename a folder, bookmark or edit web address

- Select the bookmark you want to edit.
- Click the 'Organize' menu and select 'Edit' and change the name or web address.
- Select the folder you want to rename.
- Click the 'Organize' menu and select 'Rename'.

You can also right-click a bookmark or folder and edit or rename in the interface or in the bookmark bar.

To search bookmarks

- Enter the bookmark name in the search box in the bookmark manager to search the item.

Search bookmarks

To delete a bookmark or folder

- Select the bookmark or folder you want to delete.
- Click the 'Organize' menu and select 'Delete'.

You can also right-click on the item and select delete from the menu.

To add a new bookmark folder


- Select the location you want to add new bookmark folder in the left side.
- Click the 'Organize' menu and select 'Add folder'.

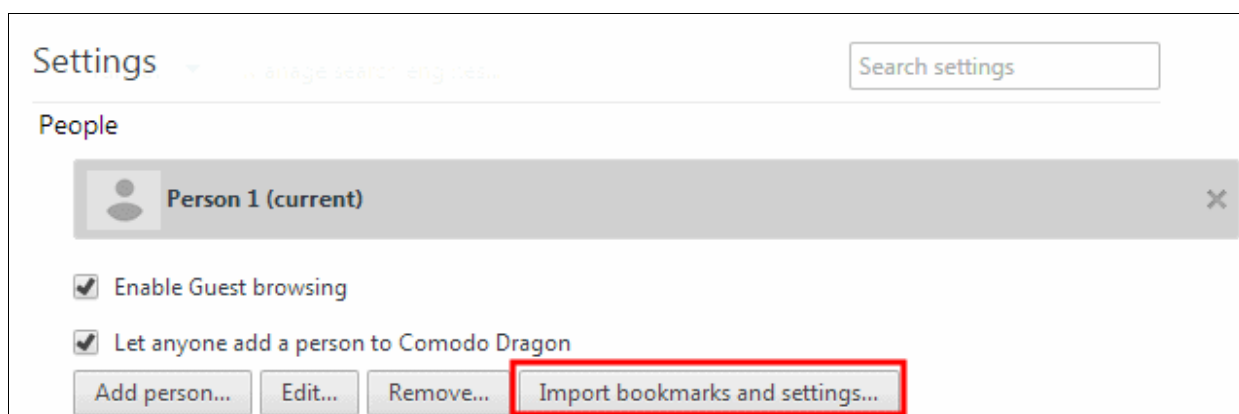
You can also right-click on the desired location and add a new folder from the menu.

6.4. Import And Export Bookmarks

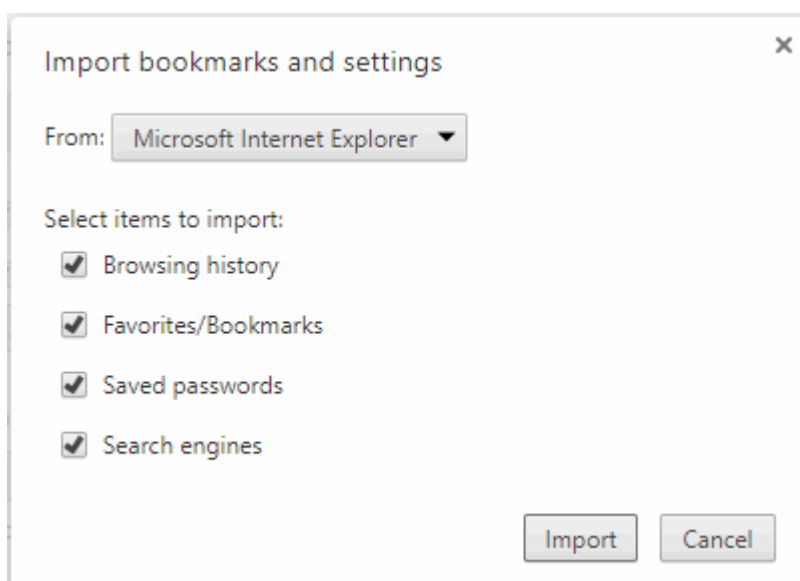
Comodo Dragon allows you to import bookmarks from Internet Explorer, Firefox and Chrome.

To import bookmarks from Internet Explorer, Firefox or Chrome

- Click  at the top-right corner
- Select 'Bookmarks' > 'Import bookmarks and settings'
- OR
- Type *chrome://settings/importData*
- OR
- Select 'Settings' > 'Import bookmarks and settings' in the 'People' section.




The 'Import Bookmarks and Settings' dialog will open:



- Select the browser from which you want to import
- Select the items that you want to import from the browser.
- Click the 'Import' button.


The bookmarks from the other browser will now be available in Comodo Dragon under 'Other Bookmarks' at the top-right of the bookmark bar. You can also view the imported bookmark folder in the 'Bookmark manager' interface.

To import bookmarks from any browser as a HTML file

- First, export your bookmarks to a HTML file from your other browser
- Click  at the top-right of the browser
- Select 'Bookmarks' > 'Import Bookmarks and settings...'
- Choose 'Bookmarks HTML File' in the 'From' drop-down
- Navigate to the HTML file saved in your computer and click 'Open'.

The bookmarks from the other browser will now be available in Comodo Dragon as a sub folder under 'Other Bookmarks' at the top right side of the bookmark bar. You can also view the imported bookmark folder in the 'Bookmark manager' interface.

To export bookmarks from Comodo Dragon

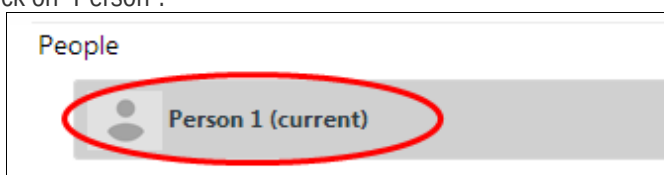
- Click  at the top-right of the browser
- Select 'Bookmark manager' from the menu
- Click 'Organize' > 'Export bookmarks from HTML' from the menu.
- Choose a location where you want the bookmarks to be saved and click the 'Save' button.

The bookmarks will be saved as a HTML file.

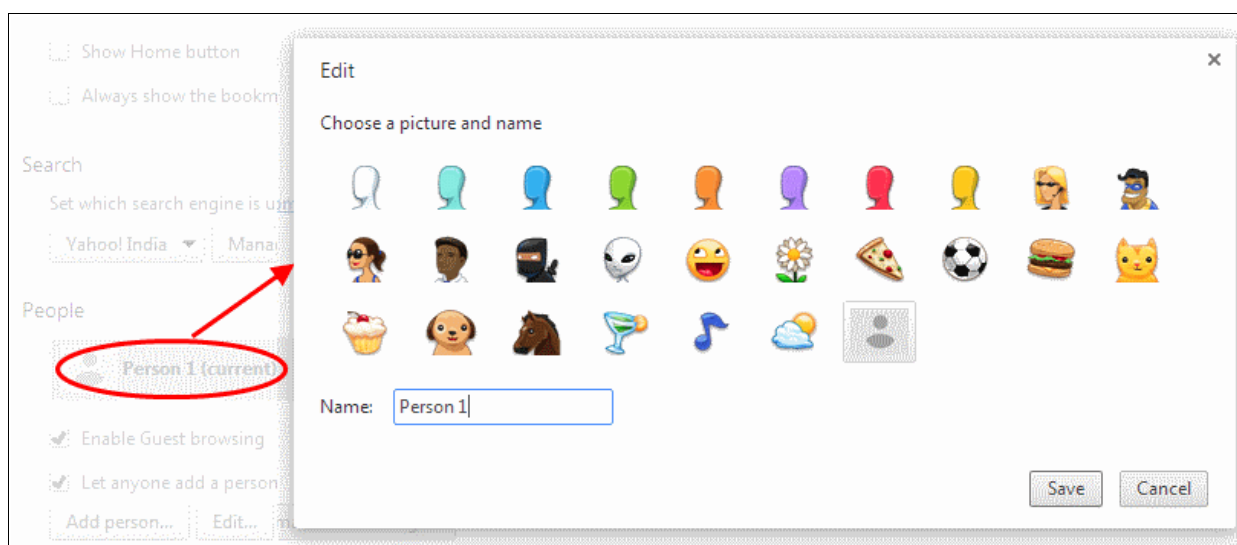
Web interface user

7.1. Delete Browsing History

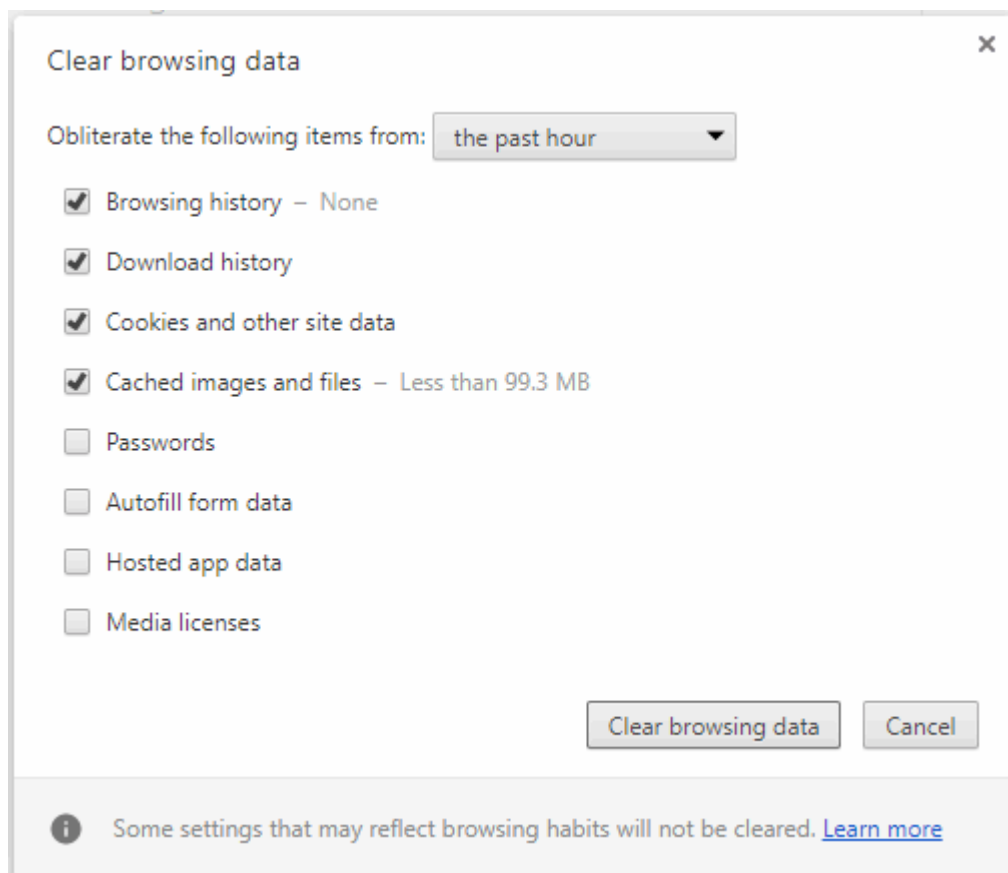
- Comodo Dragon lets you clear your browsing history partially or entirely.
- You can clear history for a specific period of time and select which items should be deleted.
- You can tell Dragon to clear your browsing history each time you close the browser to protect your privacy.
- When you clear your entire browsing history, all cached web pages and browsing history will be removed.

- The action also clears the thumbnails of your most visited pages on the new tab page.

To delete browsing history for a specific period of time

- Click  at the top-right of the browser then:
 - Select 'More tools' > 'Clear browsing data'OR
 - Select 'Settings' > scroll down > Click 'Show advanced settings...'
 - Select 'Clear browsing data' in the 'Privacy' sectionOR
 - Select 'History' > 'History' > 'Clear browsing data'

The 'Clear browsing data' dialog will appear:

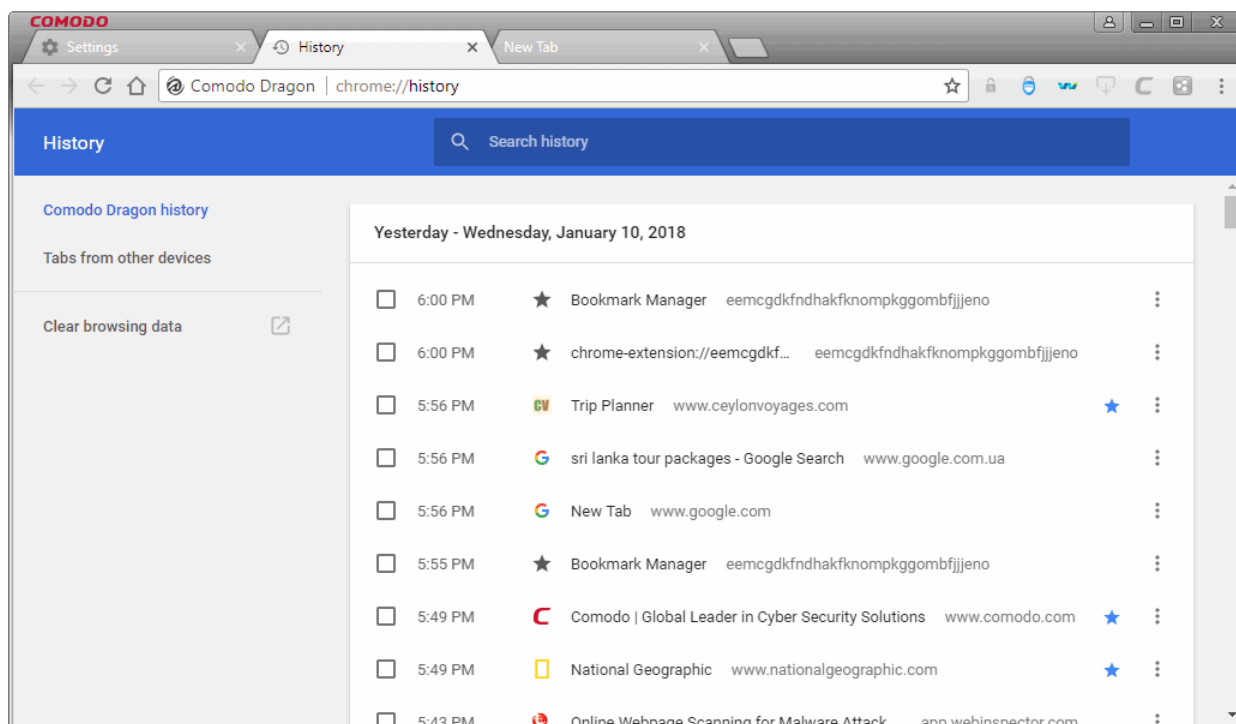


- 'Obliterate the following items from' - Choose the time period for which you wish to delete your browsing trails.
- Select the items you want to delete from the list. Deselect those that you do not want to delete.
- Click the 'Clear browsing data' button

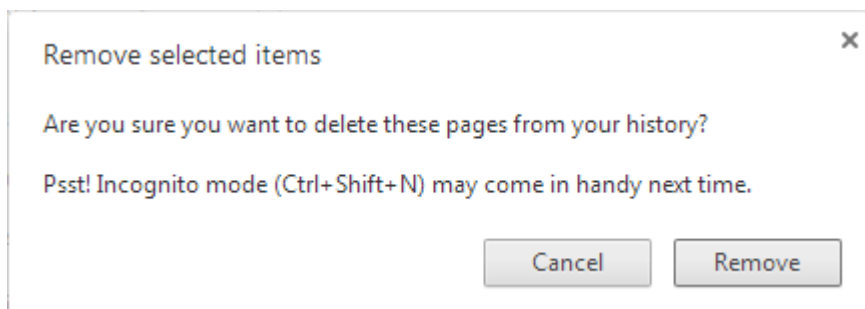
Tip: You can view the list of cookies stored by the websites you visited and remove them selectively. See [Managing Cookies](#) for more details.

To selectively delete your browsing history

- Click the ellipsis at top-right
- Select the 'History' > select 'History' or press Ctrl + H from the keyboard



- Select items to remove and click 'Delete'. Click 'Remove' in the 'Remove selected items' confirmation:



To configure Dragon to delete your browsing history on exit

- Click the ellipsis at the top right
- Select 'Settings' > scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- In the 'Privacy' select 'Clear at exit'

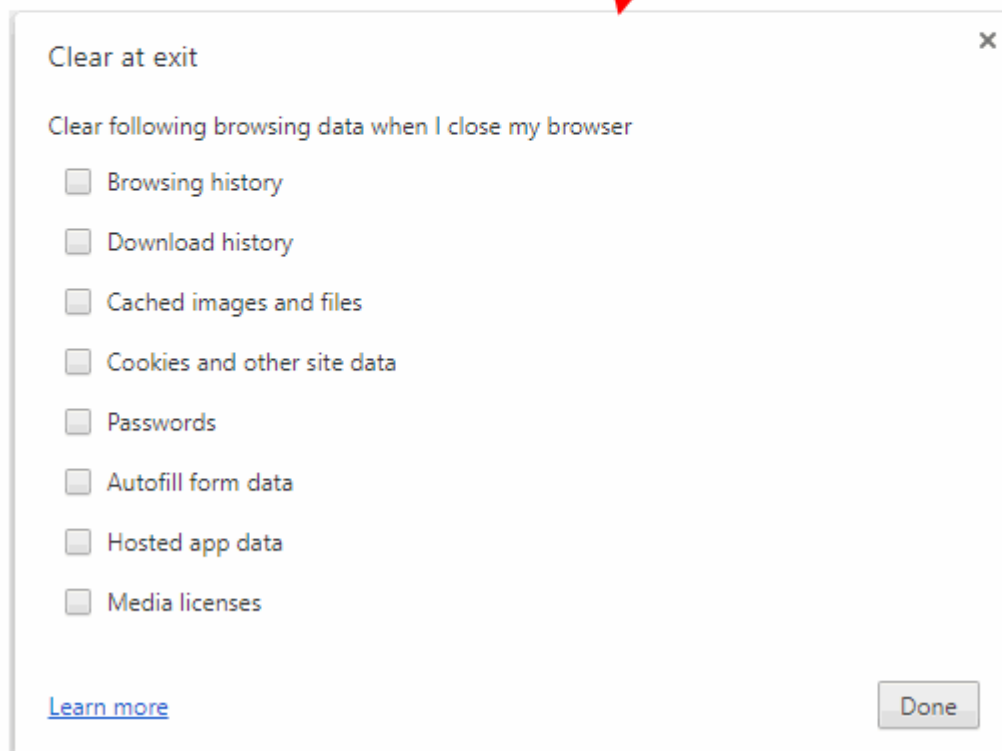

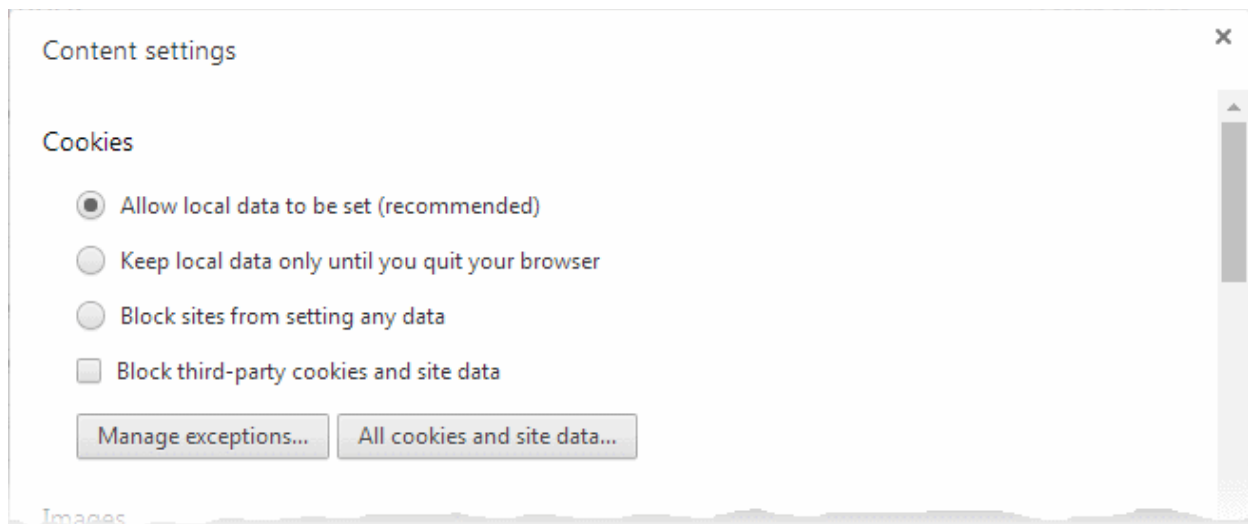

7.2. Managing Cookies


- Cookies are small pieces of information sent by websites that you've visited and stored by your web browser.
- Cookies are used by these websites to store your preferences about that website (for example, if you ask a website to 'Keep me logged in' or similar, it is the cookie that keeps a record of this preference).
- However, a potential privacy concern with cookies is that they can allow websites to track your navigation when you are browsing those websites. So it is vital that you know about cookie settings.
- Comodo Dragon allows you to control how cookies are handled during your browsing sessions:

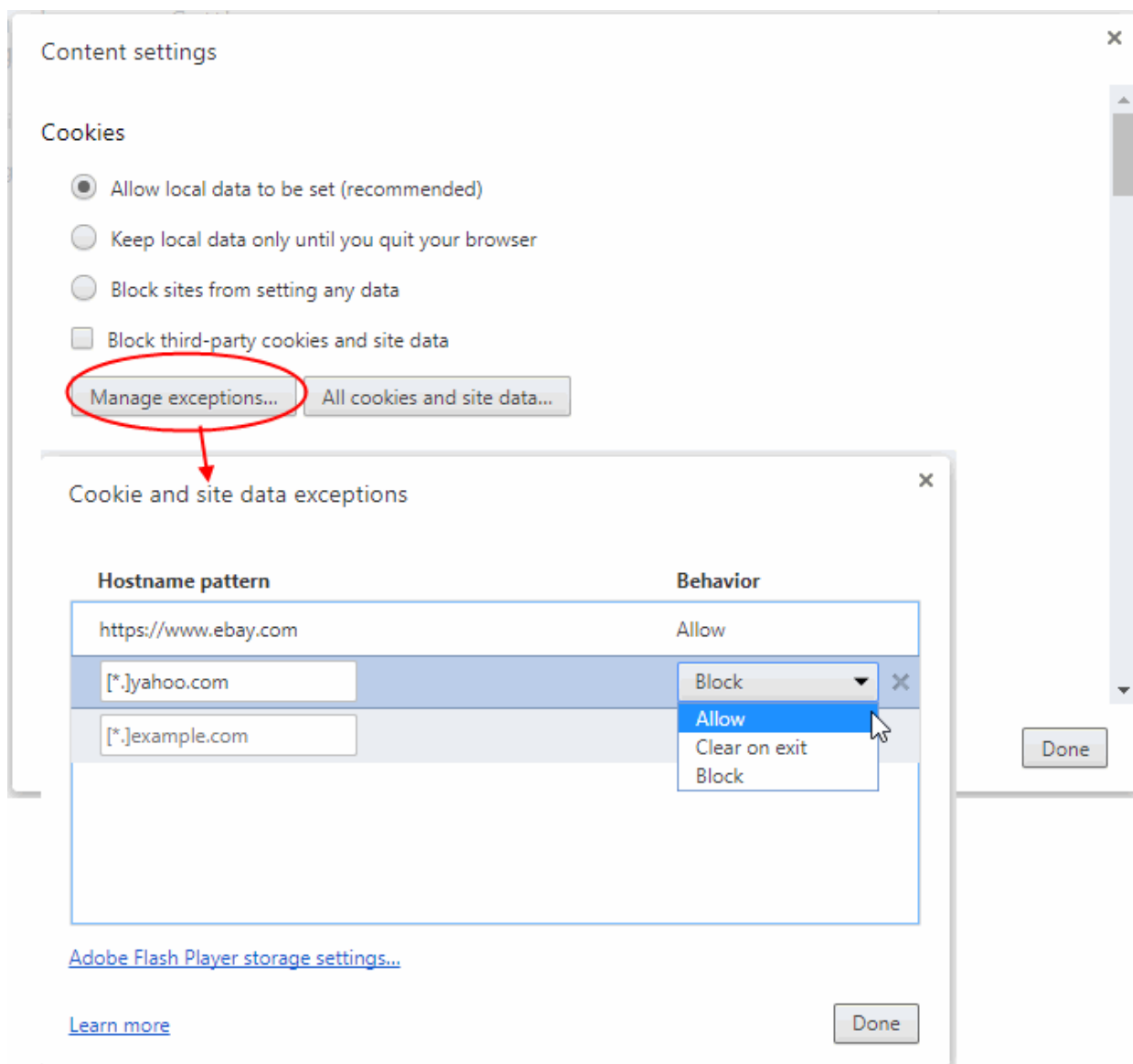
To set cookie permissions

- Click the  button at top-right
- Select 'Settings' > scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click the 'Content settings' button in the 'Privacy' > 'Cookies'



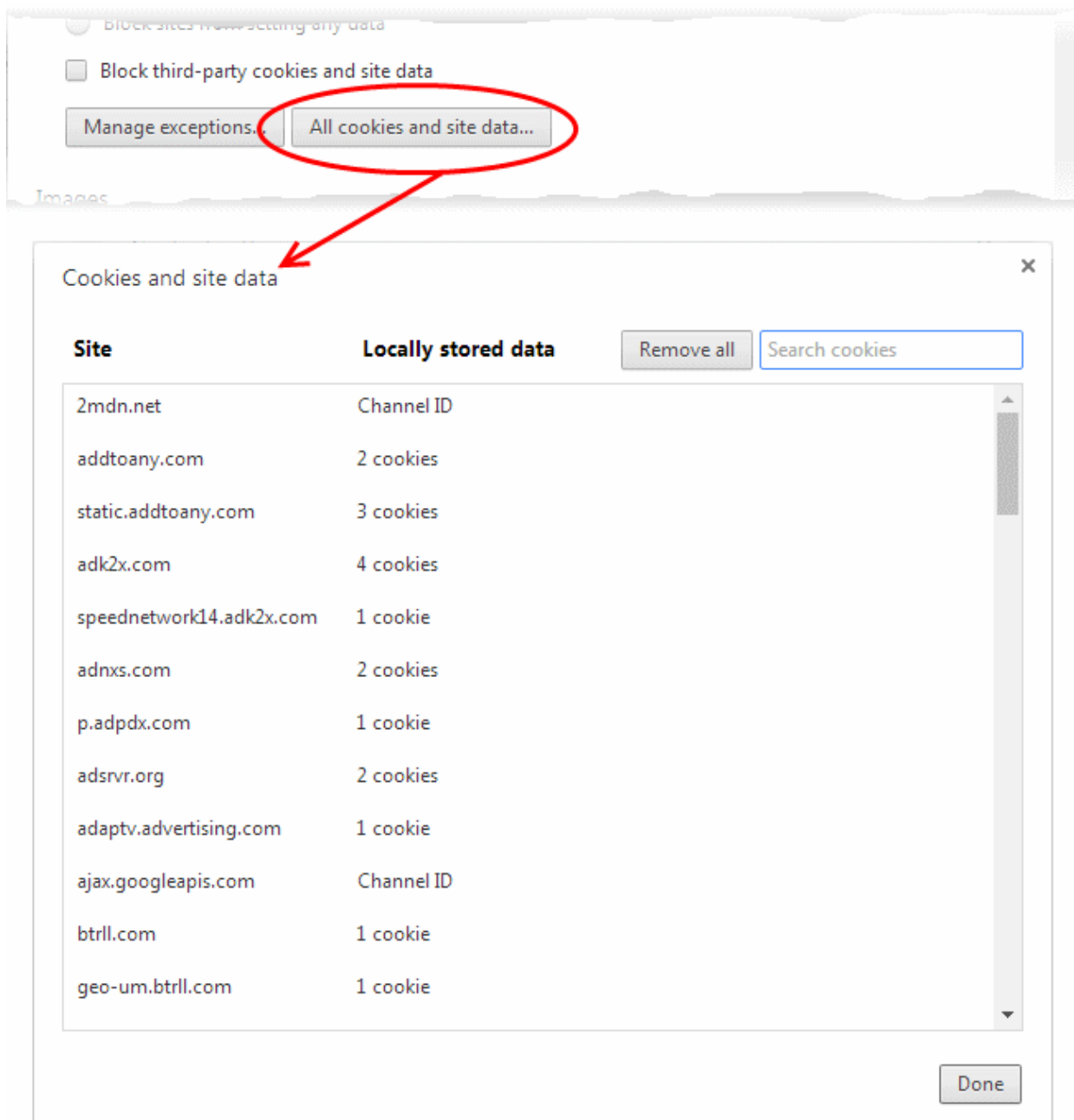
The 'Cookies' area allows you to configure the browser to allow or block cookies selectively, exceptions to the settings. Also, you can view the currently stored cookies and selectively remove them.

- Configure whether or not to allow cookies to be stored.
 - **Allow local data to be set** - Allows both cookies from the webpage you visit and from the third-parties like adverts displayed on the webpage, to be stored on your computer.
 - **Keep local data only until I quit my browser** - Allows sites to store cookies only until the current browsing session. The cookies will be automatically erased once the browser is closed.
 - **Block sites from setting any data** - Blocks any website from storing cookies on your computer. Please note that websites that require your sign-in will not work, if this setting is selected. In the address bar, an icon  will be displayed indicating a cookie has been blocked.
 - **Block third-party cookies and site data** - Allows only the cookies stored by the webpage you visit and blocks cookies from third parties like adverts displayed on the web page.
- To add exceptions to the cookie storage settings as configured above, click the 'Manage Exceptions' button.



The 'Cookie and site exceptions' dialog will be displayed.

- To add an exception for a website, enter the domain name in the "Hostname pattern" field. All sub-domains too, will be automatically added.
- Use the drop-down menu under 'Behavior' to choose whether or not to allow cookies. The options available are 'Allow', 'Block' and 'Clear on exit'.
- Repeat the process to add more websites.
- To remove a website from the list, click 'X' that appears on the right-end of the domain name on selecting it.
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.
- To view and manage the currently stored cookies, click the 'All cookies and site data' button.





A list of all cookies currently stored on your computer will be displayed. You can search for a specific cookie, start typing its name in the 'Search Cookies' text box and choose from the options shown below it.

- To delete a cookie, select it and click 'X' that appears at the right end of it.
- To remove all cookies at once, click the 'Remove all' button

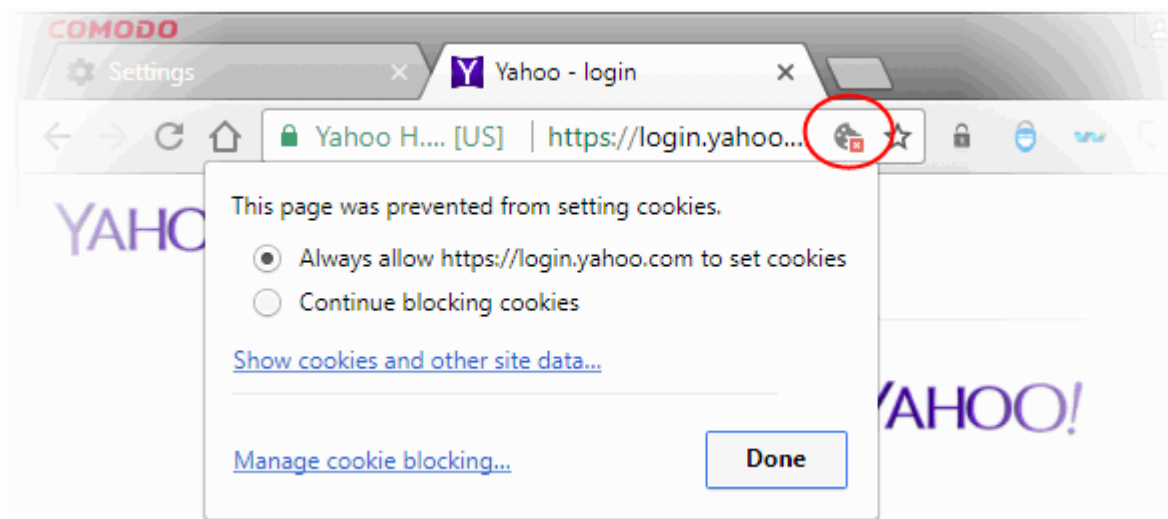
Information about cookies in the current page

Cookie icon will be displayed at the right end of the address bar of the page that you have blocked or set to allow.

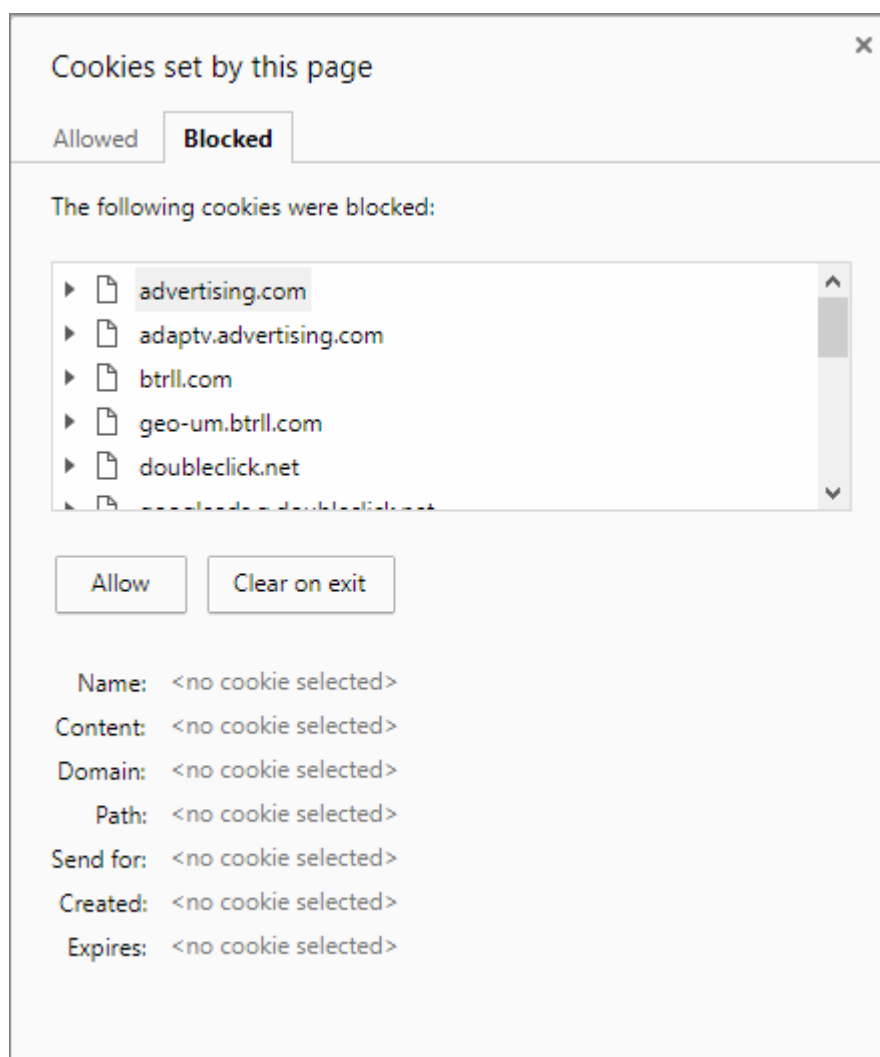
- If you have selected to block all cookies by default, but made exception to allow cookies for a certain page, the  icon will appear in the address bar of that page.
- If you have selected to allow cookies by default, but made exception to block cookies for a certain page, the  icon will appear in the address bar of that page.

You can view the cookies that have been blocked or set by clicking the icon.

- Click the cookie icon in the address bar.



- Click the 'Manage cookie blocking' link to open the 'Cookies and site data' dialog, for managing exceptions. Refer to the explanation **above** for more details.
- Click the 'Show cookies and other site data' to view cookies allowed/blocked from the website you are currently visiting.




- The 'Allowed' and 'Blocked' tabs displays the respective lists of allowed and blocked cookies from the current website.

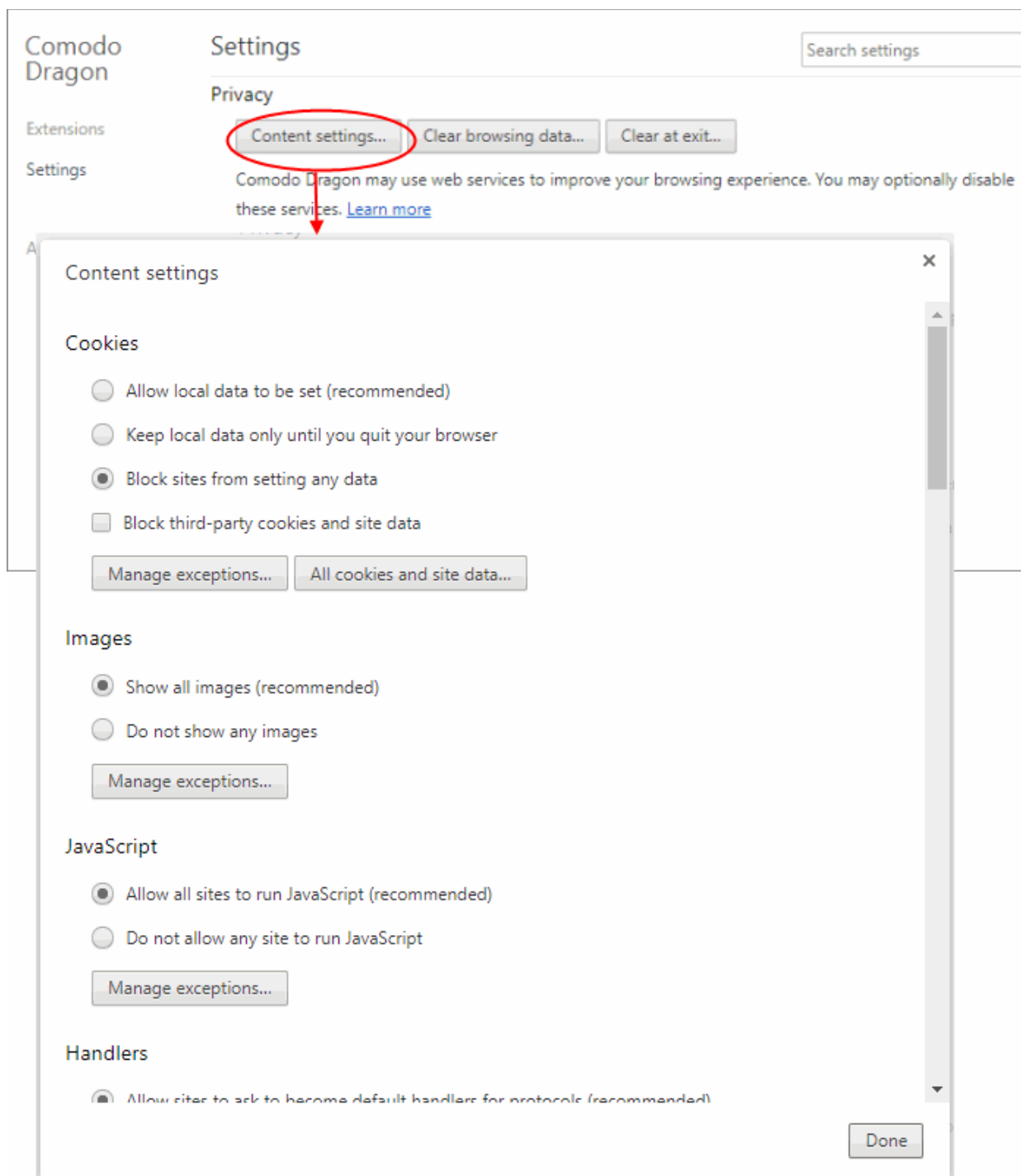
- To allow a blocked cookie, select the cookie from the 'Blocked' list and click 'Allow' or 'Clear on exit' as per your preference
- To block a allowed cookie, select the cookie from the 'Allowed' list and click 'Block'
- To delete a allowed cookie, select the cookie from the 'Allowed' list and click 'Remove'
- Click 'Close' for your changes to take effect.

7.3. Configure Content Settings in Comodo Dragon

Comodo Dragon allows granular configuration of settings that control web page components and content such as images, cookies, plug-ins, pop-ups, location sharing and notifications.

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click the 'Content settings' button in the 'Privacy' section

The 'Content settings' dialog will open:

Cookies

Cookies are small pieces of information sent by websites that you've visited which are stored by your web browser. Cookies are used by these websites to store your preferences about that website (for example, if you ask a website to 'Keep me logged in' or similar, it is the cookie that keeps a record of this preference). However, a potential privacy concern with cookies is that they can allow websites to track your navigation when you are browsing those websites. See [Managing Cookies](#) for more details.

Location

Location feature allows your physical location to be tracked by websites. For example, if you visit a shopping website, the page may request your permission for locating you so that it will display all the shopping malls near you. Comodo Dragon always alerts you whenever a permission is requested for locating you.

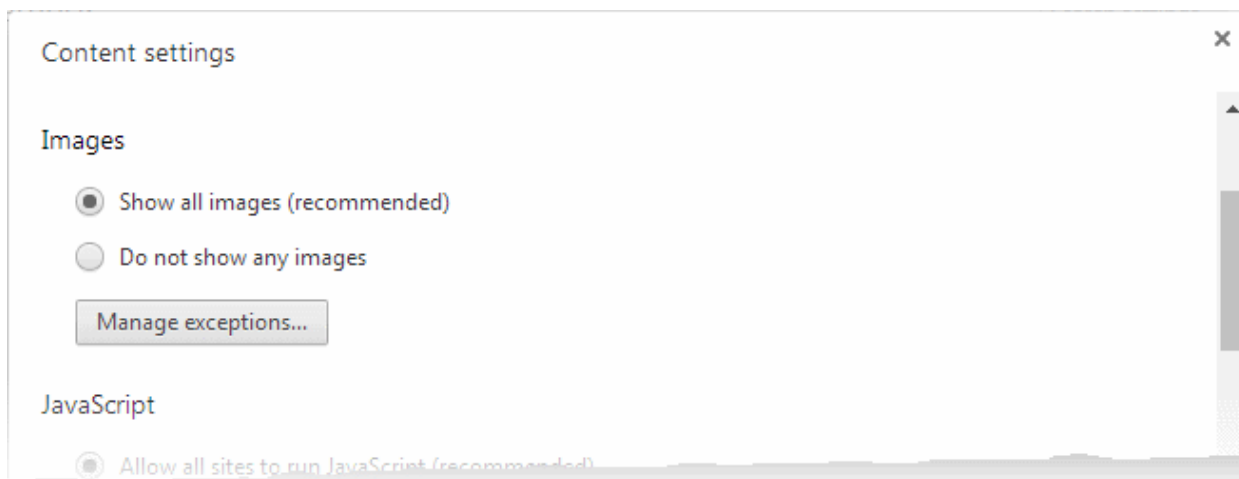
- Open the webpage you want to set your permissions
- Click the security information icon on the address bar
- Click the behavior next to 'Location'
- Select whether allow or block on this site to track your location from the drop-down

Images

Comodo Dragon allows you to configure how the images contained in the webpages you visit should be handled. You can also add exceptions for the global settings you make for the images.

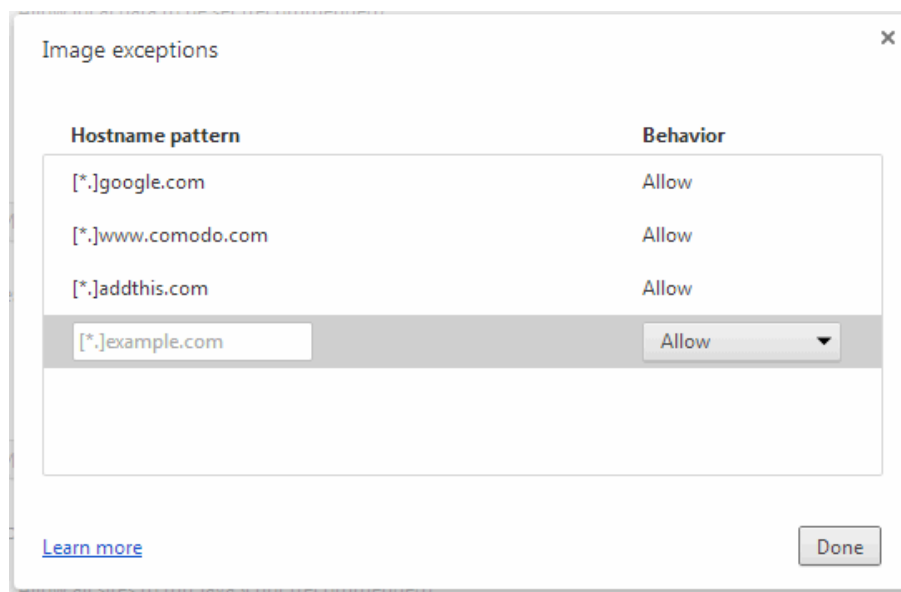
To configure Image settings

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right
- Select 'Settings' > scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Scroll down to the 'Privacy' section
- Click the 'Content settings' button



- Configure the global settings:
 - **Show all images** - Displays all images from all webpages you visit
 - **Do not show any images** - Blocks loading of images from the webpages to the browser. The images will not be displayed. You can use this setting to reduce your bandwidth resource usage
- To add exceptions on a per-website basis, click 'Manage Exceptions'

The 'Image exceptions' dialog will be displayed.




- To add a website, enter the domain name under the "Hostname pattern" field
 - Use the drop-down menu under 'Behavior' to choose whether or not to allow images from the website
 - Repeat the process to add more websites
- OR
- You can set webpage permissions by opening the webpage
 - Click the security information icon on the address bar
 - Click the behavior next to 'Images'
 - Select whether allow or block on this site to show images from the drop-down
 - To remove a website from the list, select a domain name > click 'X' that appears on the right-end of the domain

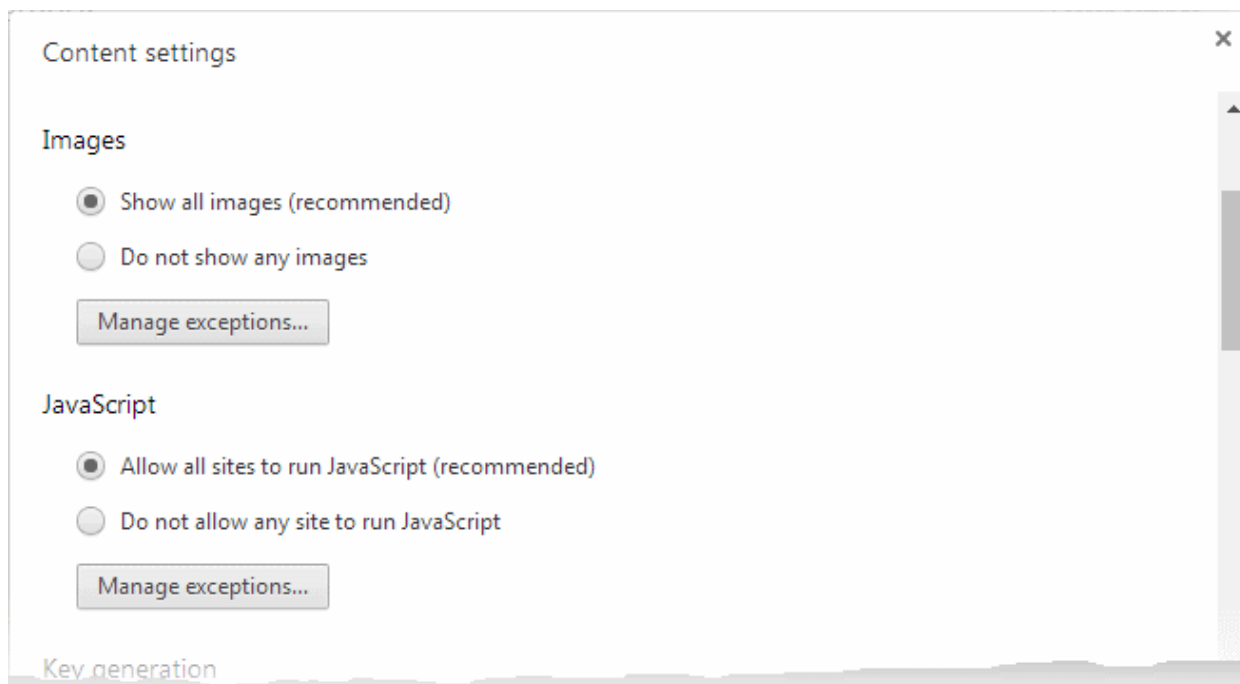
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

JavaScript

To make websites more interactive developers use Java scripts. You can configure whether or not you want Comodo Dragon to load and execute Java scripts and can configure exceptions on per-website basis. Some websites do not work properly if JavaScript is not enabled.

To configure JavaScript settings

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click the 'Content settings' button under the 'Privacy' section

- Configure the global settings:
 - **Allow all sites to run JavaScript** - Loads and executes the Java Scripts from all webpages you visit
 - **Do not allow any site to run JavaScript** - Blocks loading of Java Scripts from any webpages
- To add exceptions on a per-website basis, click 'Manage [exceptions](#)'



- To add a website, enter the domain name under the "Hostname pattern" field.
- Use the drop-down menu under 'Behavior' to choose whether or not to allow Java scripts from the website
- Repeat the process to add more websites.
- To remove a website from the list, click 'X' that appears on the right end of the domain name on selecting it.
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

Protocol Handlers and Web Applications

Handlers feature allows you to open certain links is determined by the default handler for your computer. Learn more about this in [Manage Protocol Handlers](#) section.

Flash

The 'Flash' plugin allows you to simplify streaming and viewing multimedia, audio, watching videos and etc. on your computer or mobile devices. You can configure whether or not the browser should allow run Flash and add exceptions for it. See [Adobe Flash Player Storage Settings](#) section for more details.

Pop-Ups


Comodo Dragon blocks all pop-ups by default. You can configure whether or not the browser should allow pop-ups and add exceptions for it. See [Configuring Pop-ups](#) for more details.

Notifications

Certain websites are capable of showing notifications on your desktop. Comodo Dragon is configured to alert you by default whenever a site wants your permission to show notifications automatically. You can configure whether the notifications are to be allowed or blocked from the websites and can add exceptions on per-website basis.

To configure notifications

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click the 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' > Scroll down to 'Notification'



Automatic Downloads

Certain websites access your MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) devices for transfer of data by exchanging System Exclusive (SysEx) messages, for example, for playing music. You can configure Dragon to globally accept or deny requests from the websites to access the MIDI devices and exception websites, for which the access is to be allowed or denied on a per-website basis. USB Devices

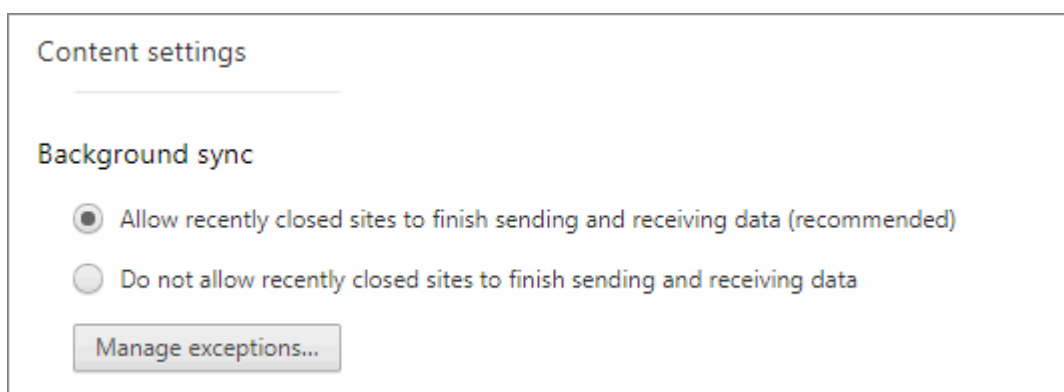
This feature lets a website to get access to usb device to control and record information stored on it. This will allow the site to view and manage all information on the device. This uses to future iterations of web browsers' developers. Note: Grant access only to trustworthy sites.

- Click 'X' that appears on the right end of the domain name on selecting it
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

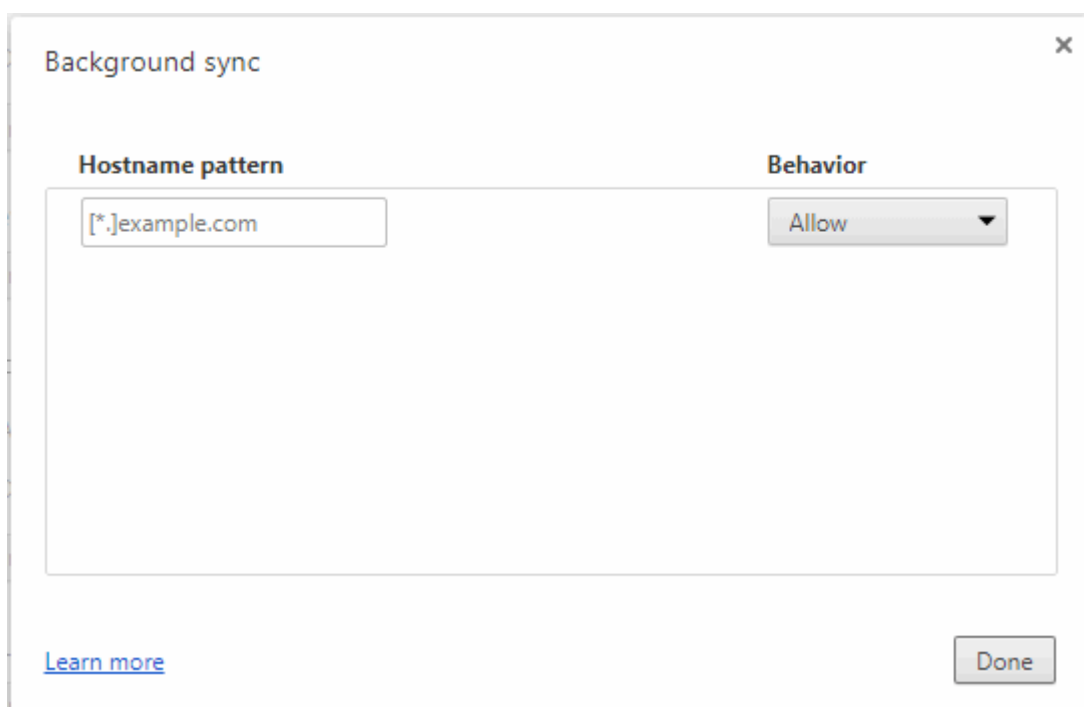
Background sync

This option continue on sync websites to finish sending or receiving data when your computer / device goes offline or you close the tab. For example, this is useful when a browser yet to complete sending the information you submitted in the form on the webpage but you closed the tab.

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click the 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' > Scroll down to 'Background sync'



- Configure the global settings:
 - **Allow recently closed sites to finish sending and receiving data (recommended)** - Allows websites to complete transferring data when website is closed.
 - **Do not allow recently closed sites to finish sending and receiving data** - Blocks sending or receiving information from all web sites.
- To add exceptions on a per-website basis, click 'Manage exceptions'.



- To add a website, enter the domain name under the "Hostname pattern" field.
- Use the drop-down menu under 'Behavior' to choose whether or not to allow to send or receive data from the website.
- Repeat the process to add more websites.
- To remove a website from the list, click 'X' that appears on the right end of the domain name on selecting it.
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.


Zoom Levels

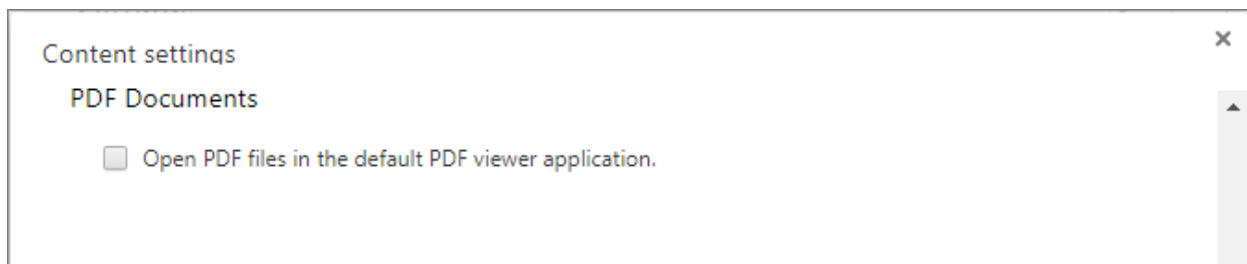

PDF Documents

PDF documents feature allows you to set Dragon to open the pdf file automatically when you are click it.

To open a pdf automatically

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click the 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' > Scroll down to 'PDF Documents'
- Enable the 'Open PDFs files in the default PDF viewer application' box.

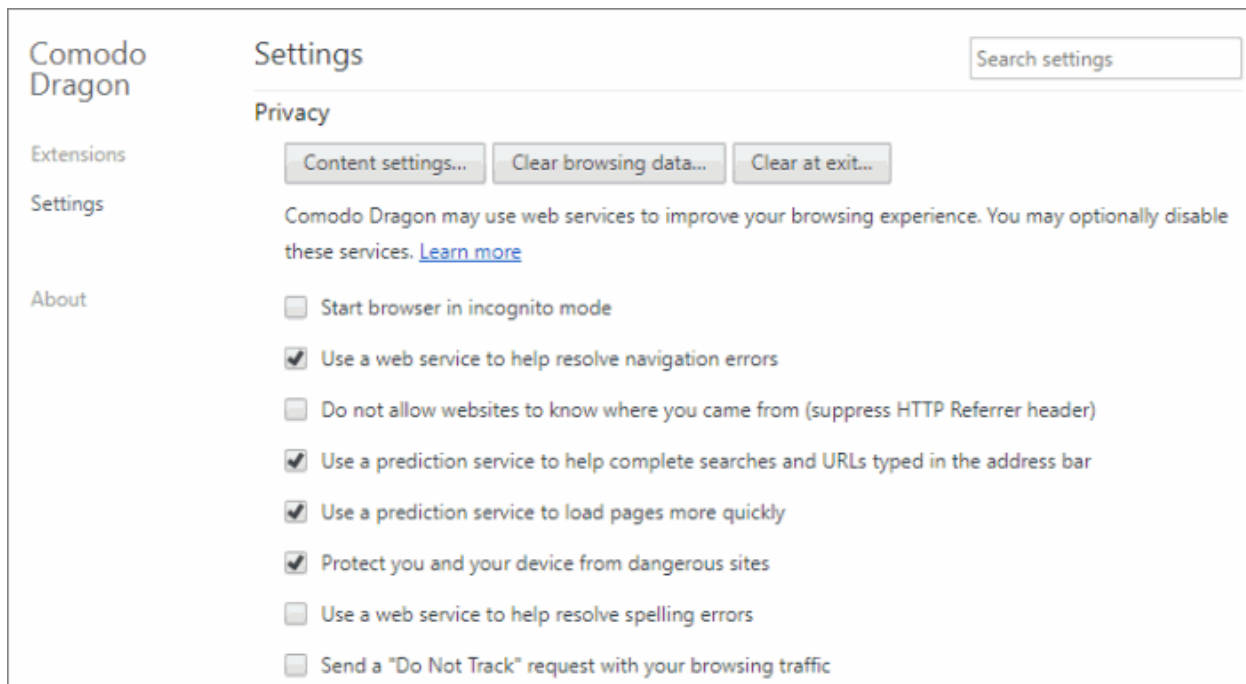

7.4. Configure Advanced Settings

- Dragon allows you to improve your browsing experience by using web services for that offer search key predictions, form auto complete and more.
- Also, you can configure privacy settings help make sure your confidential data remains safe and secure during your online transactions.

To configure advanced settings

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Configure your advanced security options in the 'Privacy' section



- **Start browsing in incognito mode** - The browser does not store your browsing history, search history or other traces such as cookies. For more information, see [Using Comodo Dragon in Incognito Mode](#).
- **Use a web service to help resolve navigation errors** - If you mistype a website address, Dragon uses Google search engine to get suggestions for alternative pages similar to the one you are attempting to reach. This is enabled by default to improve your browsing experience. If you do not want alternative webpage suggestions, deselect this option.
- **Do not allow websites to know where you came from (suppress HTTP referrer header)** - If selected, Dragon does not allow website owners knowing from which webpage you arrived at their website, for example by clicking the link in the webpage. This option is disabled by default.
- **Use a prediction service to help complete searches and URLs typed in the address bar** - See [Prediction Service](#) for details on this option.
- **Use a prediction service to load pages more quickly** - If enabled, Comodo Dragon will perform a look-up on all links on the current webpage to fetch their IP addresses. This will cause the page to load faster should you click on one of the links as the IP address is already resolved. By default, this option is enabled.
- **Protect you and your device from dangerous sites** - Generates instant alerts you if the website that you are trying to visit contains malware or suspected phishing attacks. By default, this option is enabled.
- **Send a 'Do not track' request with your browsing traffic** - If enabled, this setting informs websites of your preference that they should not track your actions. Please note that, while this setting does afford an additional degree of privacy, websites and advertising networks are not legally compelled to honor these requests.

7.5. Using Comodo Dragon in Incognito Mode


- Incognito mode allows you to browse the Internet without leaving any browser traces - meaning you don't

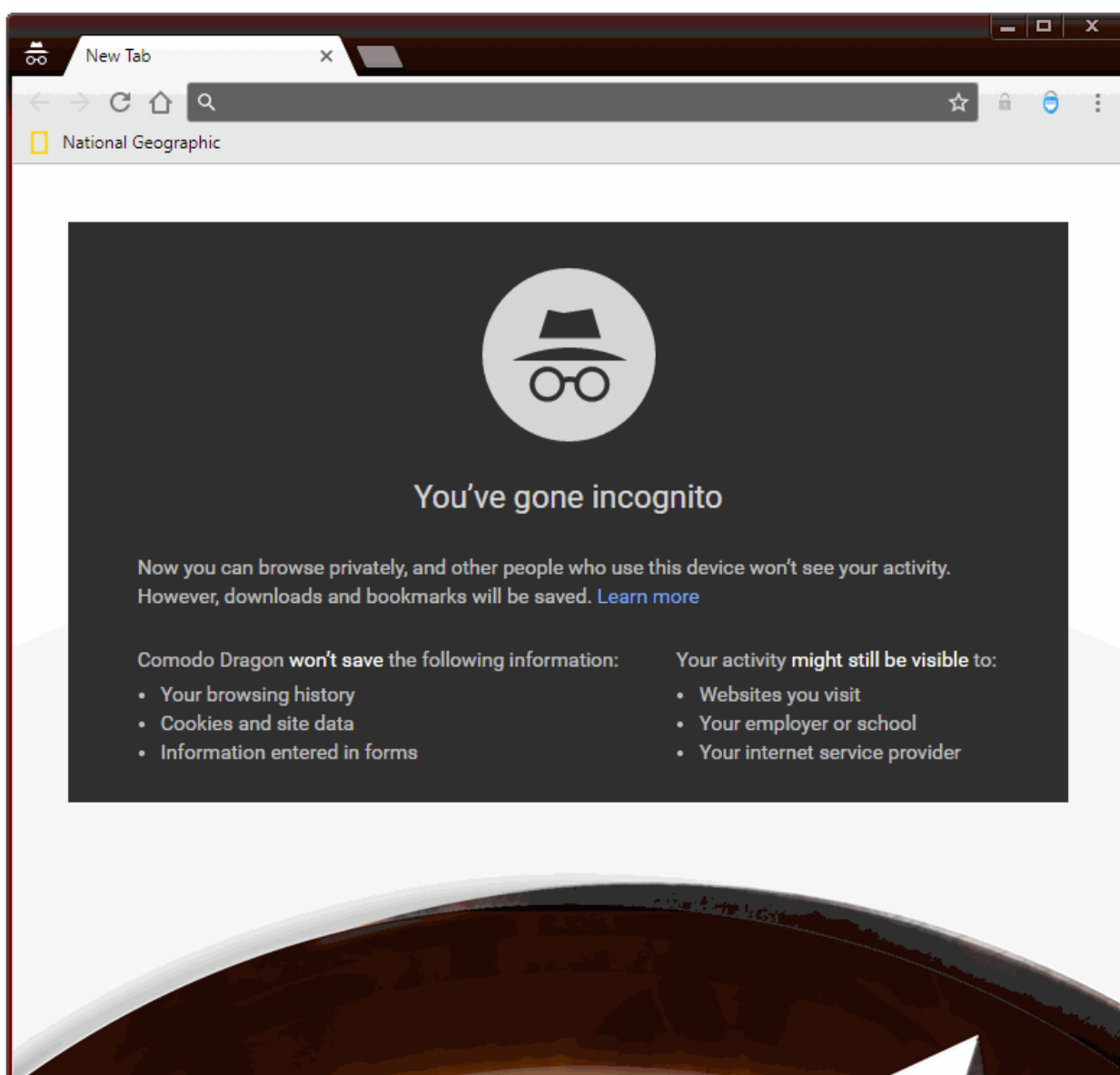
have to remember a bunch of browser clean-up actions like 'Clear History' or 'Clear Cookies' at the end of your session.

- When you use the browser in this mode, there will be no history and other traces such as cookies are removed.
- However, changes made to bookmarks and general settings in this mode are saved.

To open an incognito window

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'New incognito window' from the menu

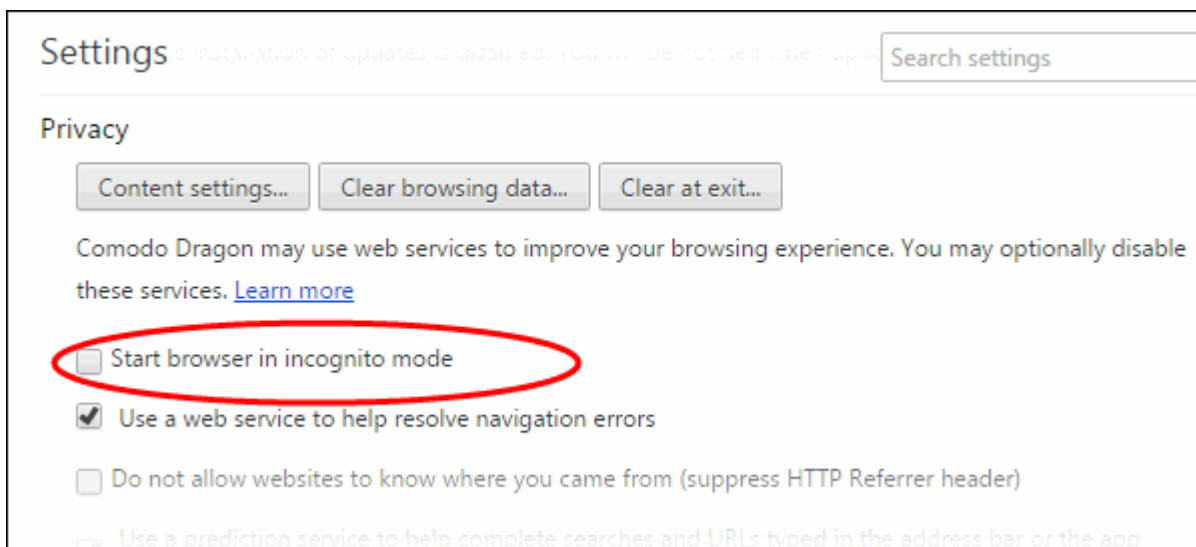
A new window with the  icon at the top-left corner will open:



Please note that even though the browser do not store information about the website that you visit in this mode, the websites that you visited may still have information about your visit. Files downloaded and saved will remain in your computer.

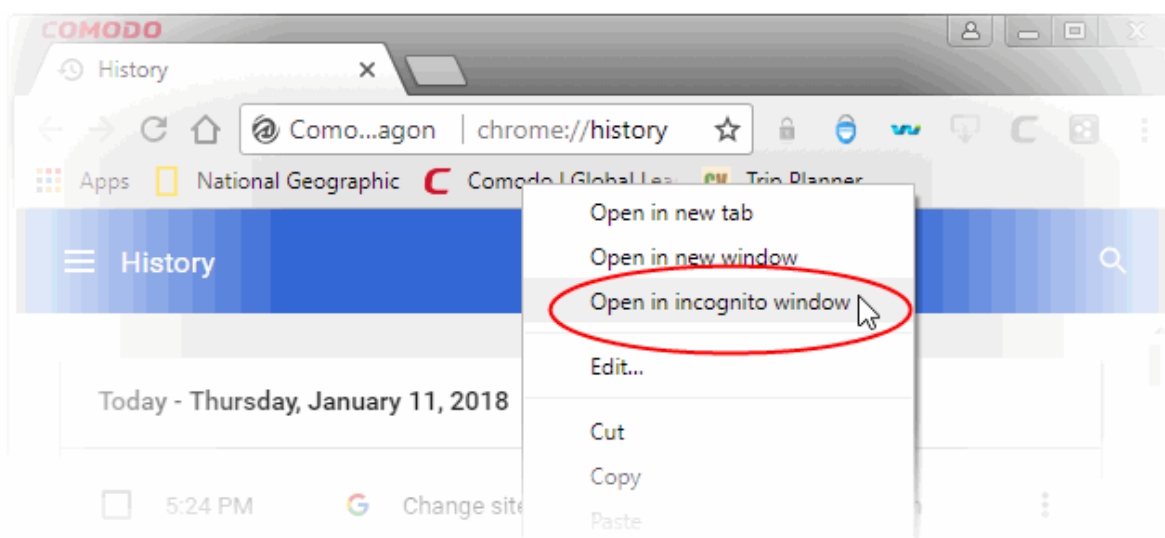
To automatically open browser in incognito mode

- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link > 'Privacy' section.
- Select 'Start browser in incognito mode' checkbox.



Other ways to open in incognito mode

- Right-click on any bookmark in the bookmark bar, bookmark manager or in the history page and select 'Open in incognito window' from the context sensitive menu.



7.6. Using Comodo Dragon in Virtual Mode

- Virtual Mode allows you to surf the internet with far greater protection against online threats.
- With this feature enabled, Comodo Dragon runs in a fully virtualized sandbox which is totally isolated from your real computer.
- Any threats, scripts or malware you may encounter while on the internet will not be able to infect your real computer and all temporary Internet data will be written to a virtual file system.

Notes:

- To use virtual mode, Comodo Internet Security (CIS) 2013 or above must be installed on your computer. This is because CIS provides the underlying virtualization technology required by Virtual Mode. CIS is

completely free of charge and features a fully-fledged antivirus scanner, an award-winning firewall, a host intrusion prevention system, a sandbox for untrusted software and many other essential security features.

- Any files you want to download and keep must be saved to a special folder called 'Shared Space'. By default, this is located at:


C:\Program Data\Shared Space (Windows 7, Windows Vista)

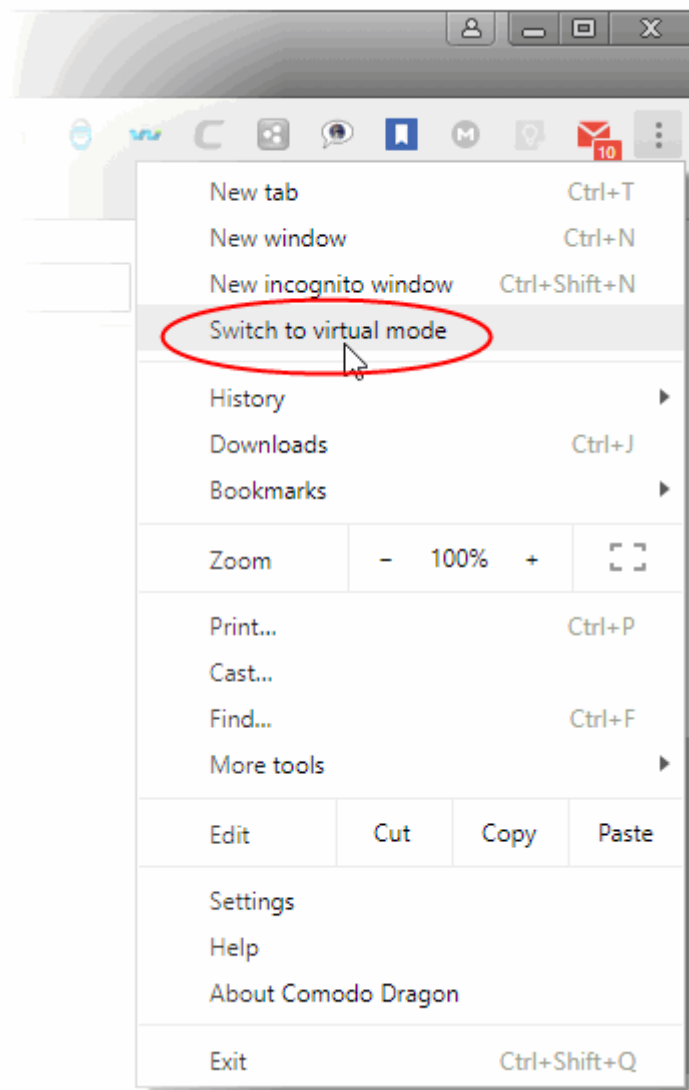

- Alternatively, open Comodo Internet Security and click the 'Shared Space' button.

After entering 'Virtual Mode', we suggest you also engage 'Incognito' mode for additional privacy online. Search history, cookies and other traces are not created while in Incognito mode.

To switch to virtual mode

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Switch to virtual mode' from the menu



- If CIS is not detected, a new tab will open informing you about its unavailability in your system and allowing you to download it for installing.

7.7.SSL Certificates and Secure Connections

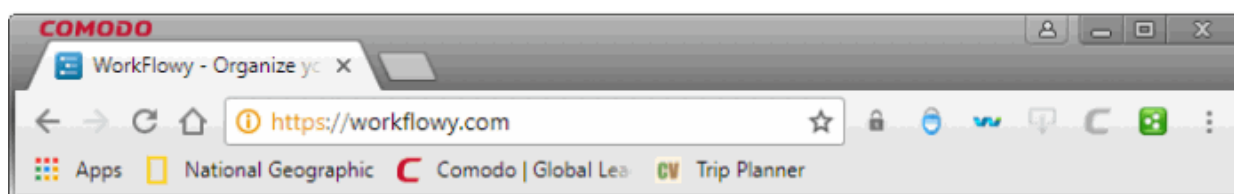
Whenever you successfully make a secure connection to a website, the beginning of the URL will change from HTTP to HTTPS (with the 'S' standing for secure) and a padlock will be displayed to the left of the address. This indicates that the page is using an SSL certificate to encrypt all communications between you and the website. However, not every type of certificate should be trusted to the same degree. Uniquely amongst browsers, Comodo Dragon distinguishes between all three types of SSL certificate and clearly indicates which type is being used by the website.

There are three main types of certificate:

- Domain Validated (DV)
- Organization Validated (OV)
- Extended Validation (EV).

Domain Validated (DV)

- These certificates are the lowest cost means of securing a website but do not provide authentication or validation of the business behind the website.
- Unlike EV and OV certificates, DV certs provide are validated automatically via using a system of 'challenge-response' emails.
- If the site you are on is using a DV certificate then Dragon will change the letters HTTPS to yellow.
- This is to inform you that the organization behind the website has not been authenticated so you may want to proceed with caution:



Organization Validation (OV)

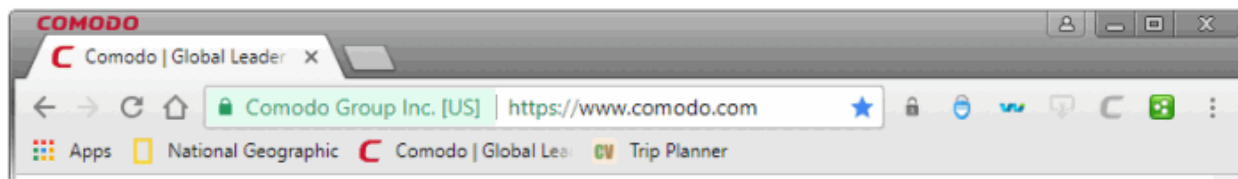
- These certificates include full business and company validation from a certificate authority using currently established and accepted manual vetting processes.
- Because of this requirement, these certificates provide significantly higher levels of trust and security than DV SSL certificates but are not validated to the stringent standards set by the CA/B forum and do not possess the ability to turn the address bar green in the latest browsers.
- If the site you on is using an OV certificate then Dragon will display the padlock and HTTPS in a green color.
- This is to inform you that the business behind the website has been validated and it is safe to proceed with any transaction:



Extended Validation (EV)

- EV certificates are validated to the rigorous guidelines set by the CA/B Forum - an independent standards body that requires in-depth verification of the legality and probity of a company before it is issued with a certificate.
- Because of this, EV certificates provide the highest levels of security and trust to end-users.

- To indicate this higher level of trust, Comodo Dragon turns the entire address bar green if you are on a site which is using an Extended Validation certificate:



Users can enable or disable this feature in the HTTPS/SSL section of 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link > HTTPS/SSL. See [SSL/HTTPS Security Settings](#) for more information.

Background Information

An SSL Certificate can only signify that it is safe to trade with a company when two vital steps are completed prior to its issuance:

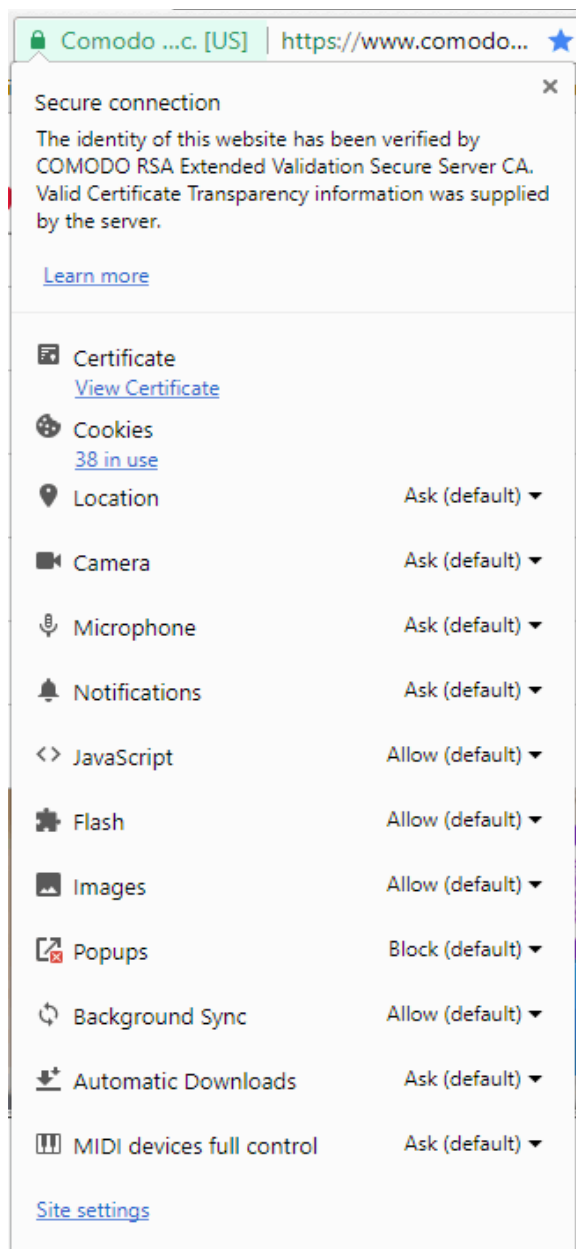
1. Verification that the certificate applicant is in control of the domain name.
2. Verification that the certificate applicant is a legitimate and legally accountable business.

DV certs only establish 1) whereas OV and EV certs establish both 1) and 2)

Trust between the person using the browser the website they are connected to is only possible when BOTH these stages of validation are completed. Step 2) is carried out by a Certificate Authority (CA) such as Comodo or Verisign. A CA employs human operatives to carry out strict vetting of the applicant's business and legal standing. Only once this layer of company validation has been completed can a website be truly 'trusted'.

High Assurance certificates show the full company name and address.


Indicates that background checks were run prior to the certificate being issued to the organization.

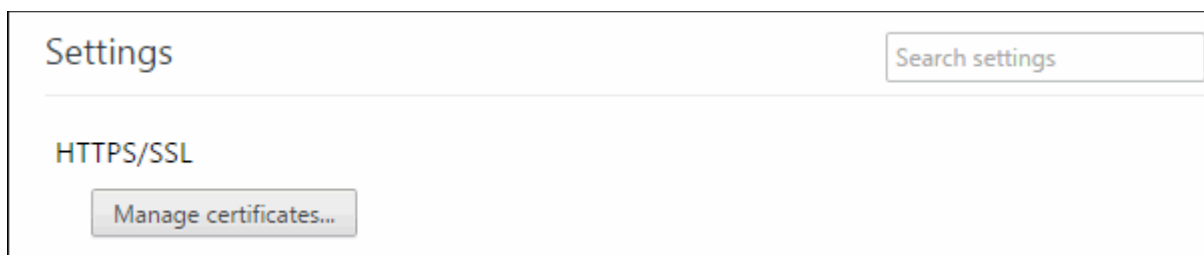


7.8. SSL/HTTPS Security Settings

The 'SSL/HTTPS' security setting allows you to view and modify settings relating to SSL certificates and security protocols.

To view and manage these settings

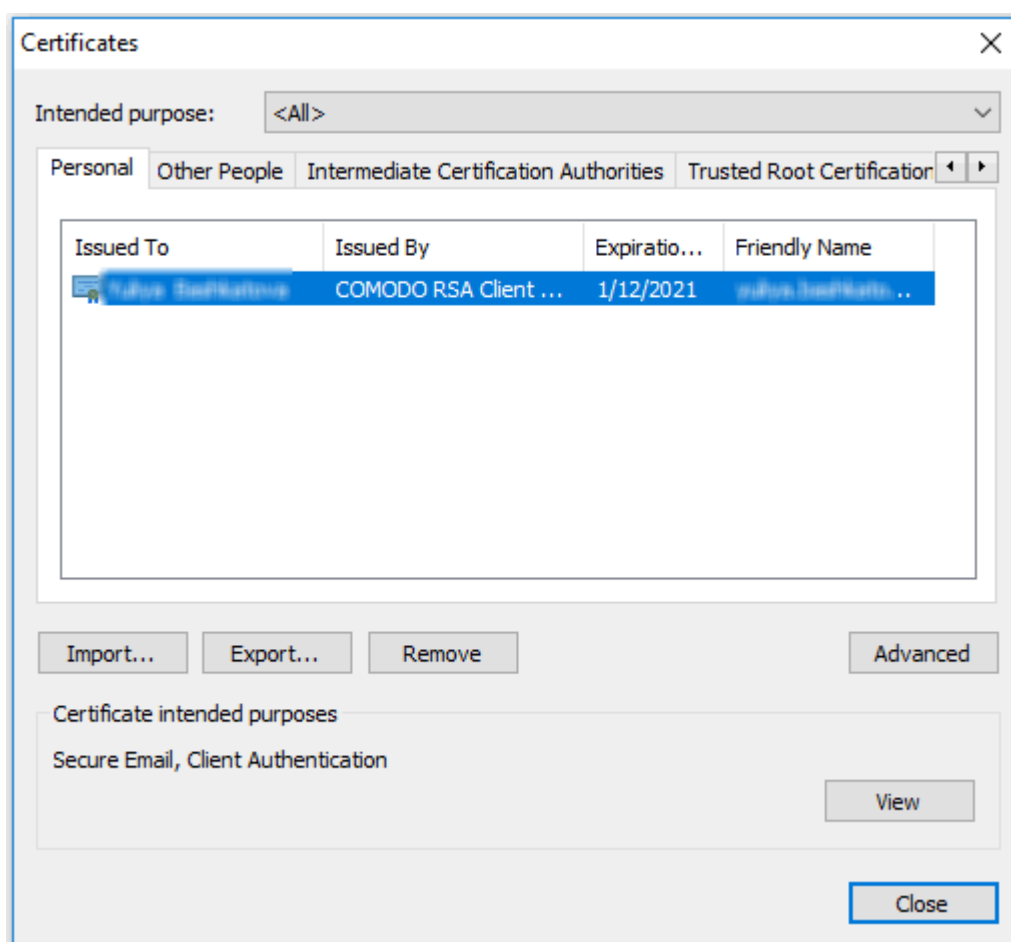
- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings'
- Scroll down to the HTTPS/SSL section



Manage certificates opens the Windows SSL certificate store. This allows you to view, import, export or remove personal certificates and other peoples certificates as well as manage the built in list of trusted root certificate authorities.

To manage certificates

- Click 'Manage certificates'. The 'Certificates' dialog will open:



The 'Certificates' manager has the following tabs:

- Personal - displays your own client/secure-email certificates.
- Other People - displays a list of client certificates belonging to other people (usually your contacts)
- Intermediate Certificate Authorities - displays a list of intermediate certificates. This type of certificate forms a link in the chain of trust between a certificate on a website and a trusted root certificate.
- Trusted Root Certification Authorities - displays a list of trusted root certificates.
- Trusted Publishers - a publisher is a developer who has created a macro, ActiveX control, add-in, or other application extension for use by you and other people. Trusted publishers are reputable developers.
- Untrusted Publishers - a list of untrusted publishers.

The dialog enables you to: Import, Export, Remove your certificates.

To import certificates

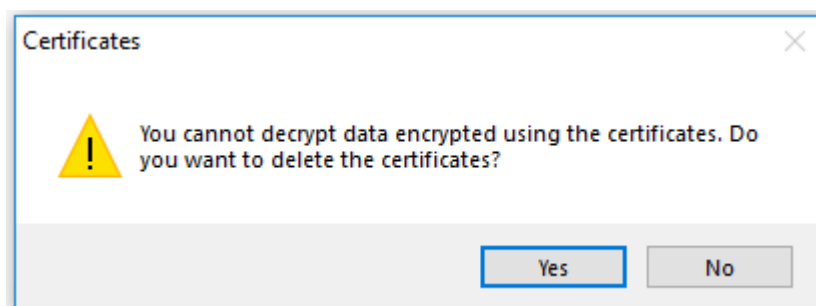
- Click 'Import'.
- Follow the 'Certificate Import' wizard.
- Select the file you want to import and click 'Next'.
- Choose a password which you can remember later. Click 'Next', then check 'Mark this key as exportable. This will allow you to back up or transport your keys at a later time' and 'Include all extended properties'.
- Select Personal Certificate Store you want to save the certificate to.
- You will see a confirmation screen listing the settings you have chosen. Click 'Back' if you wish to amend any details. Click 'Finish' to import the certificate.
- Once finished, the certificate and associated private key is saved as a .pfx file. You can export this into other browsers and mail clients as required.

To export certificates

- On the 'Personal' tab, select the certificate you wish to back up and click 'Export'.
- Follow the Certificate Export wizard.
- When requested, select 'Yes, export the private key'.
- Leave the 'Type' as 'Personal Information Exchange (*.pfx)' and select 'Include all certificates in the certification path, if possible'. Click 'Next'.
- Choose a password which you can remember later. Click 'Next'.
- First create a file-name for the exported .pfx then click the 'Browse' button to choose where you want to save the file to.
- You will see a confirmation screen listing the settings you have chosen. Click 'Back' if you wish to amend any details. Click 'Finish' to export the certificate.
- Once finished, the certificate and associated private key is saved as a .pfx file. You can import this into other browsers and mail clients as required.

To remove expired or revoked certificates

- Select the certificate to be deleted and click 'Remove'.



- Click 'Yes' in the confirmation dialog.

Note: If you delete your currently active certificate, you will not be able to use it for identifying yourself to the websites that require it.

The advanced options dialog displays a list of certificate purposes under 'Advanced Purposes'.

View certificate details

- Click 'Settings' > 'Show Advanced Settings'
- Scroll down to 'HTTPS/SSL'
- Click 'Manage Certificates'
- Select a certificate and click 'View'
- The 'General', 'Details' and 'Certification Path' tabs show issuance, validity and organization details about the certificate.

7.9. Block Insecure Content

You will see this message if the page you are visiting is served over a HTTPS connection, but the page is serving some content from a non-secure, HTTP, source.

If a website is secured using HTTPS then all javascript, plugins and CSS stylesheets used by the page must also be securely delivered. If these other items are not secured then, potentially, hackers could interfere with the website and modify them for unauthorized purposes. If insecure elements are allowed to run then the page cannot be considered as 'HTTPS' secured.

When Comodo Dragon first encounters this issue on an insecure page, it performs these actions:

- Loads only the secure items on the page
- Does not load any insecure items
- Presents the 'This page has insecure items' message bar

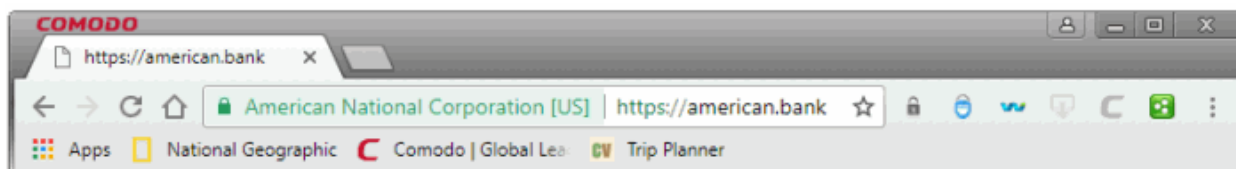
This means the page is still HTTPS as it stands because Dragon has only loaded the secure items. However, because the page is not running certain items, it may cause the page to display incorrectly. Clicking 'Don't Load (recommended)' will maintain the situation described above and all data on the page will be secured. You will see this message if the webpage you are visiting a page over an HTTPS connection but the page is attempting to run non-secure elements.

Developers and advanced users can see which scripts have been blocked by clicking the Comodo Dragon menu located at the top-right corner then selecting 'More tools' > 'Developer tools'.

7.10. Force Secure Connections

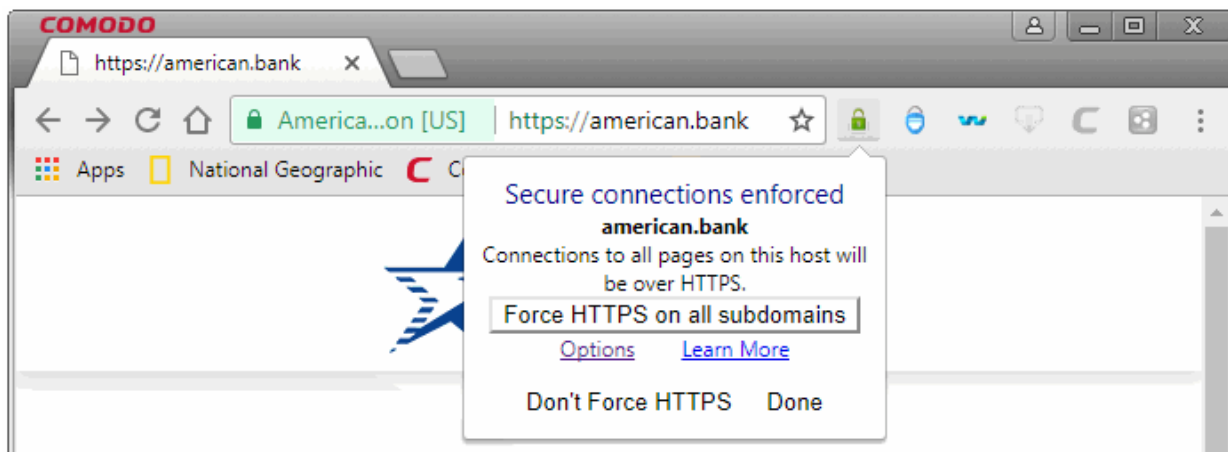
The 'Force Secure Connections' feature allows a user to specify that all future connections to a particular website are made over a secure, HTTPS connection. This feature is designed for websites that have an SSL/TLS certificate installed, but have chosen to default to HTTP on some or all of their pages. You also have the option to force HTTPS connectivity to the site's sub-domains.

When you visit a site using a HTTPS connection, Comodo Dragon will display a padlock icon on the right hand side of the address bar:



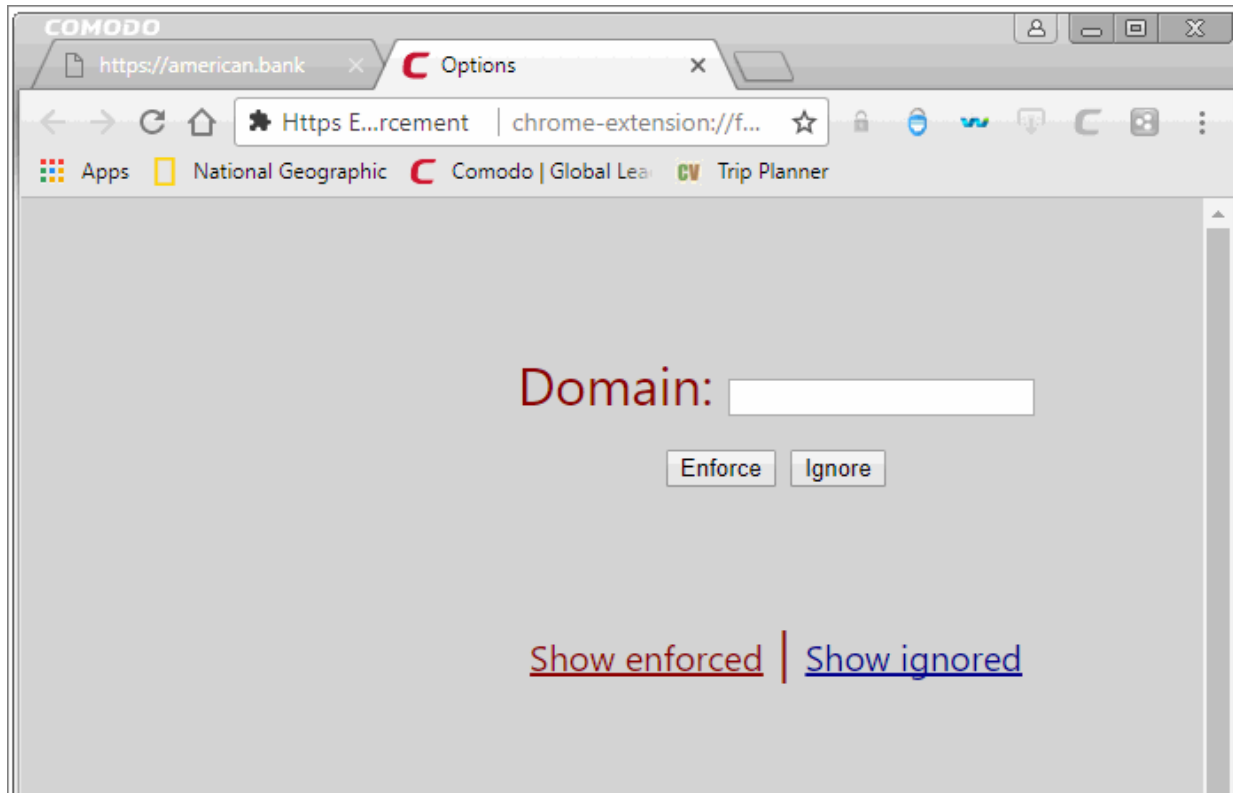
By default, the 'Enforce Secure Connections' padlock on the right is gray, meaning secure connections are not yet enforced. No additional actions will be performed if the page is loaded again.

- Click the padlock icon to enforce secure connections:



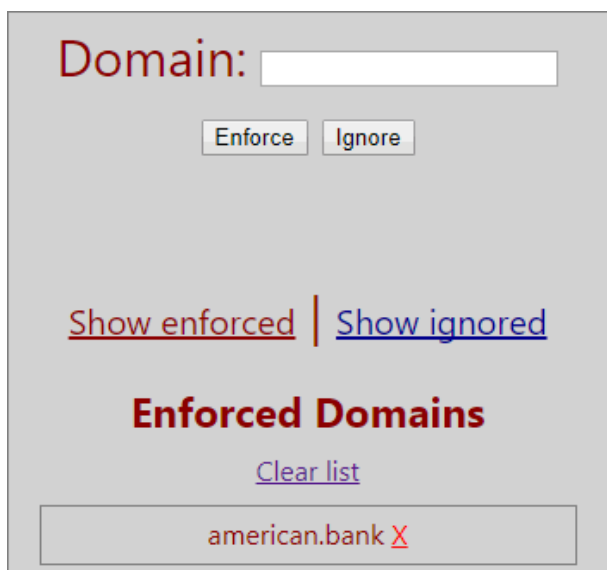
- The padlock will turn green, meaning secure connections are enforced on all pages in the domain for this session and all future visits
- All information exchanged between you and this website will be encrypted using the strongest available algorithms
- Check 'Force HTTPS on all sub-domains' if you want secure connections throughout the domain
- Click 'Done' (or click outside the message box) to confirm you want secure connections enforced
- If you wish to disable forced secure connections, click 'Don't force HTTPS'
- Click the 'Options' link to create a list of websites that you want to enforce or ignore secure connections

The page to add websites will be displayed:



- Enter the URL in the 'Domain' text field and click Enforce/Ignore
 - Enforce - Enforces secure connection for pages that are secured but not enabled by default.
 - Ignore - Secure connection will not be enforced.

- Click 'Show enforced' / 'Show ignored' to view the list

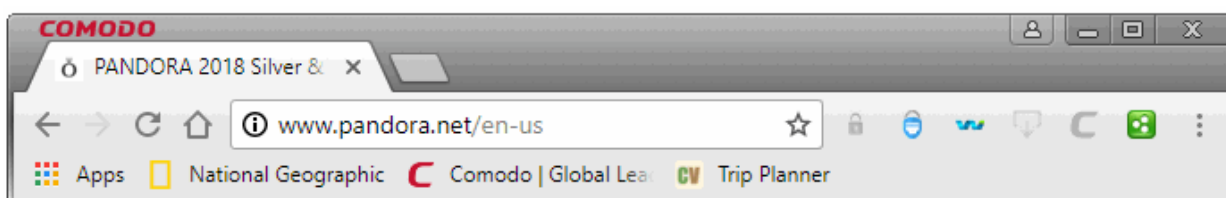


- Click the 'X' mark beside a URL to remove from the list.

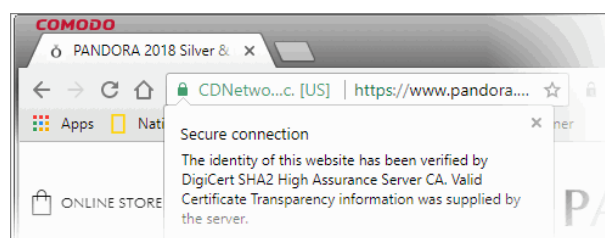
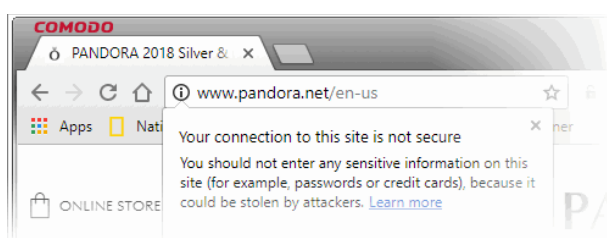
Please note that an error 'Page does not exist' will be displayed if you enforce secure connections for webpages that are not enabled for secure connections.

Example usage

This feature is particularly useful for websites that do not, by default, use secure connections on their login pages. For example, the Pandora sign-in page does not ordinarily have HTTPS connections on its log-in page. Note the address is plain HTTP instead of HTTPS - the 'S' stands for secure:



It's possible your credentials may still be posted to HTTPS once you click the 'Sign in' button, but the absence of a certificate on this page means you cannot verify the authenticity of the website. Furthermore, loading the sign-in page over HTTP also means you cannot verify the page's integrity - it may have been modified by a 3rd party before it loaded in your browser.

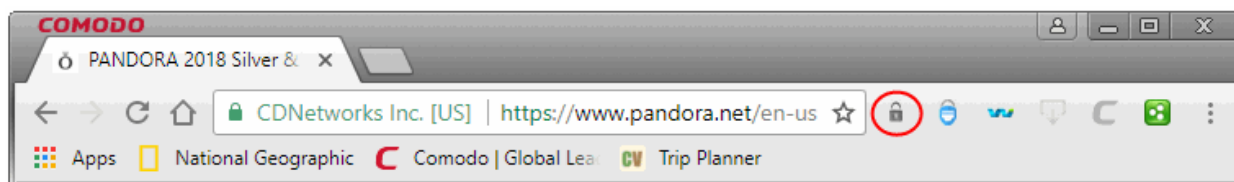


With a HTTPS connection, you can click the lock on the left of the address bar to view the website's SSL certificate.

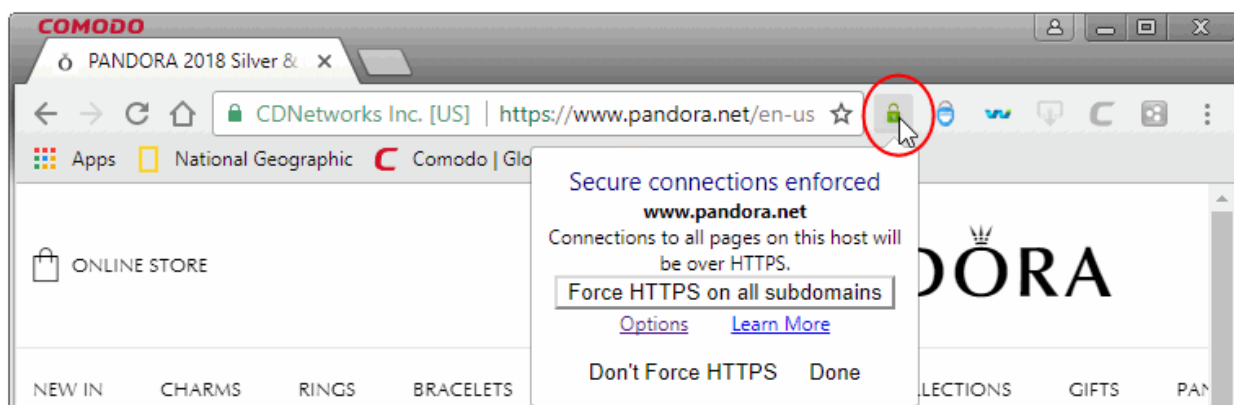
Apart from encrypting the information you submit and ensuring page integrity, the certificate also contains critical website identity information which allows you to verify that you are connected to the genuine Pandora website.

To force secure connections on the Pandora log-in page:

- You first have to physically change www.pandora.com to <https://www.pandora.com>
- Do this by placing your mouse cursor in the Dragon address bar and typing 'https://' before www.pandora.com so the full URL says <https://www.pandora.com>
- Press enter. The page will re-load with a secure connection and thus make available the 'Force Secure Connections' padlock on the right:



- Click the padlock to enforce secure connections. All future visits to the Pandora log-in page will be automatically conducted over a secure, encrypted connection:



7.11. CertSentry

Introduction

Comodo CertSentry software is designed to provide real-time checking of the revocation status of website SSL certificates. Once installed, CertSentry is invoked whenever you run any application that uses the standard Microsoft CryptoAPI.

The ambitions of the application are two fold. Firstly, it is designed to implement effective, SSL revocation checking on popular Windows software such as Chrome, Internet Explorer, Dragon and Outlook. Secondly, CertSentry represents an effort to discover more information about the health of the current revocation checking infrastructure by collecting statistics about the response times of Online Certificate Status Protocol (OCSP) responders operated by Certificate Authorities (CA's). Sharing the data gathered by CertSentry with other CA's and **major** Internet browser providers like Mozilla, Google and Microsoft will, we hope, provide organizations like the Certificate Authority/Browser (CA/B) forum with the information they need to implement a viable, long term strategy regarding certificate revocation checks.

Key functionality and features:

Once installed, CertSentry will become the default SSL certificate revocation provider for Windows. The host application loads `certsentry.dll` into its process space whenever the host application requests a certificate revocation

check. Host applications include browsers such as Dragon, Chrome and Internet Explorer and mail applications such as Microsoft Outlook.

CertSentry will re-enable Online Certificate Status Protocol (OCSP) checking within Google's Chrome browser.

OCSP checking was recently disabled by Google.

CertSentry is also designed to gather statistics on the health of the current revocation checking infrastructure. No personal or identifying data about you or your Internet usage is included in these statistics. All that is revealed is the issuing (root) CA certificate involved in the OCSP check - not the end-entity certificate of the website in question. In other words, it informs us that a revocation check was made for a certificate on an (unknown) website and that the certificate was issued by Certificate Authority X. It also tells us whether the request was answered, the speed of the response and the type of response. It does not inform us of the URL of the website on whose behalf the check was initiated. The data we receive will be enough to compare and contrast the performance and availability of each CA's revocation servers. CertSentry is designed to send it's logs to the CertSentry server every 24 hours and they can be found at the following locations:

Windows XP

C:\Documents and Settings\\Local Settings\Application Data\CertSentry

Windows Vista/7 C:\Windows\system32\config\systemprofile\AppData\LocalLow\Comodo\CertSentry

CertSentry also provides the option to 'hard fail' certificate revocation checks. Ordinarily, if a browser receives no answer to a revocation check then the browser simply assumes the certificate is valid (not revoked) and allows the connection to proceed. This is known as a 'soft fail'. On the other hand, browsers that are set up to 'hard fail' will treat this lack of response as meaning the certificate is invalid (revoked) and will block connections to the website. While soft fails obviously present a potential security issue, enabling a hard fail could lead to an increase in rejected connections if the OCSP responder operated by the CA cannot be contacted for technical reasons. By default, hard-fail is not enabled in CertSentry. To enable it, please add one of the following values to your Windows registry as REG_DWORD type:

To enable "hard-fail" only for certificates issued by Comodo's CA system:

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE/SOFTWARE/COMODO/CertSentry/COMODOFailureMode (value "2")

To enable "hard-fail" for all certificates from all Cas:

HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE/SOFTWARE/COMODO/CertSentry/DefaultFailureMode (value "2")

Please restart your system to apply your changes.

7.12. Managing Multiple Users

- Comodo Dragon allows multiple users to quickly access their 'own' copy of Comodo Dragon.
- Each user can link their Dragon username to a Google account and so synchronize and use their own bookmarks, themes, extensions and other browser settings.
- Once created, users can easily switch to their profile by selecting their user icon at the right of the browser window:




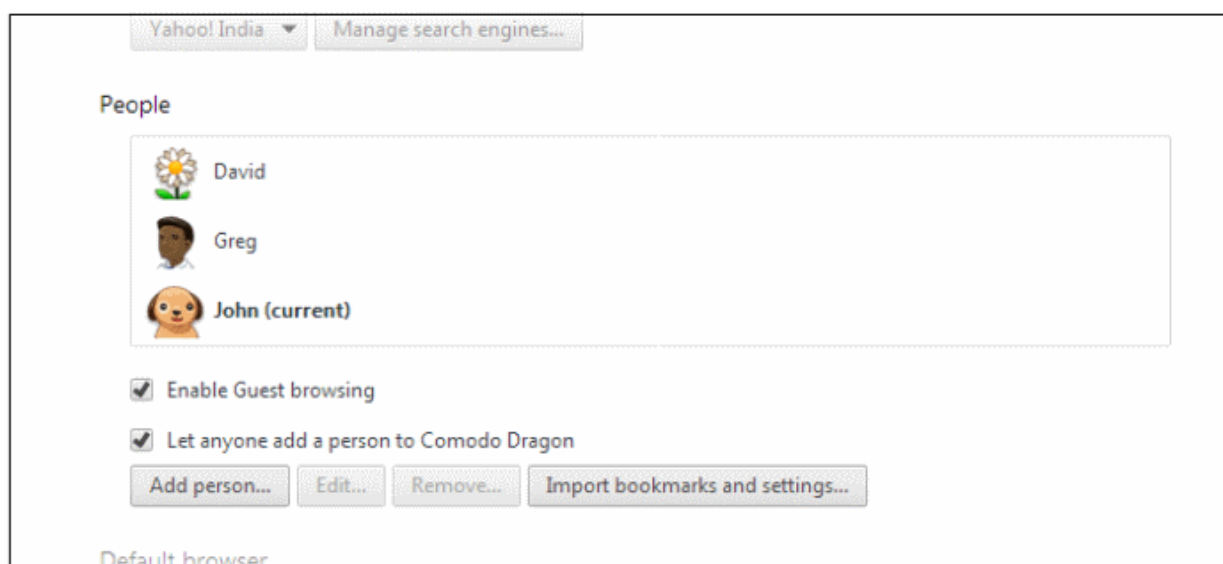
Please be aware this feature is intended to be a simple way of allowing different people (friends/family) who are already sharing Comodo Dragon on the same computer to quickly access a personalized version of the browser. It does not offer true privacy and data security against other people using your computer. For true data privacy, please use your operating system's built-in user accounts.

The 'People' settings allows you to,

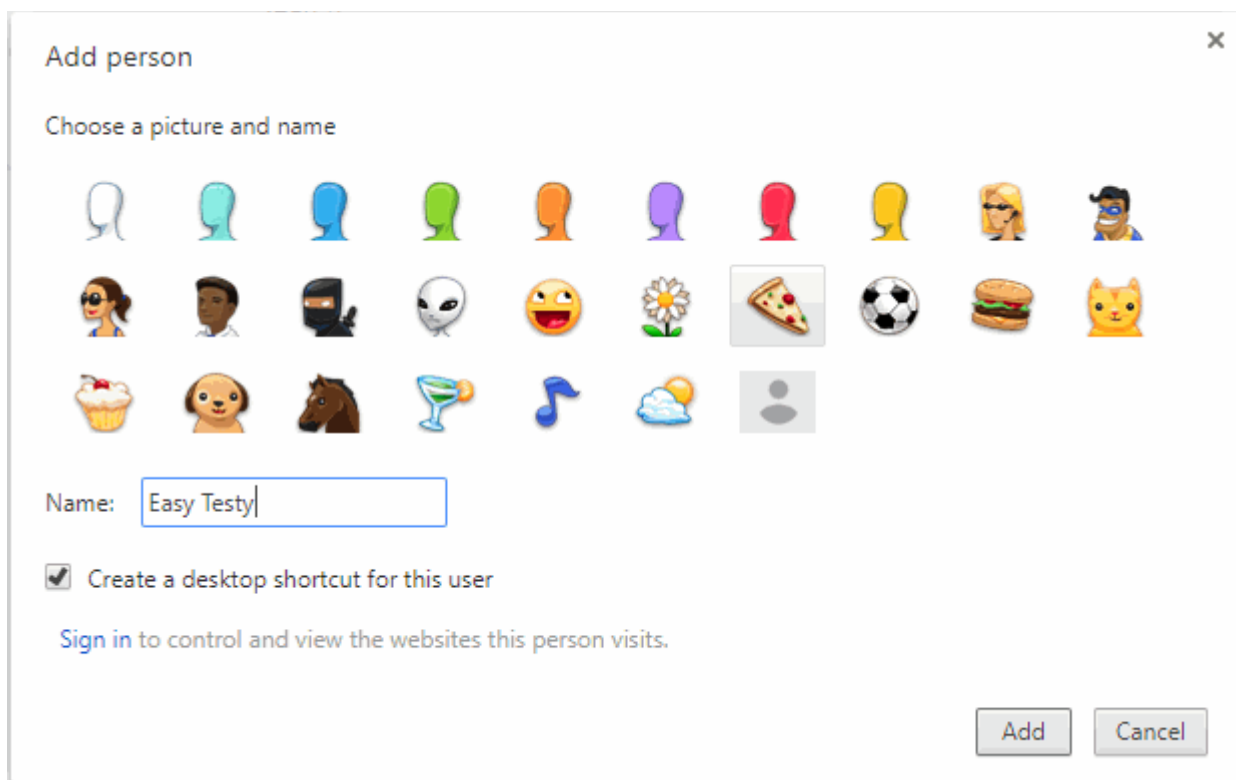
- **Enable Guest browsing** - This settings allows you keep your account private while your guest are browsing the Internet on your computer. That does not leave any browsing history or cookies on your computer
- **Let anyone add a person to Comodo Dragon** - This settings is enabled by default and once your account is set up or you're logged in, anyone is allowed to gain access to Dragon.

To add a new user

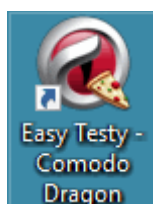

- Select the 'Settings' from the menu > 'People' section
- Click 'Add person'



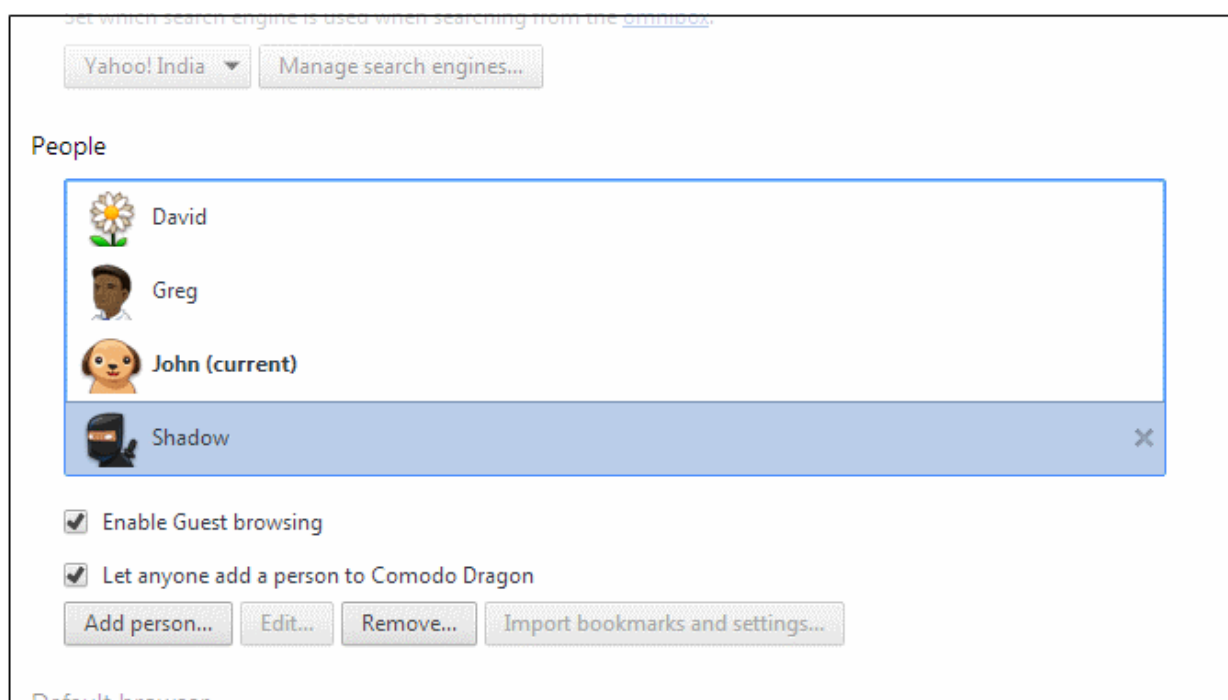
- The 'Add person' confirmation dialog will appear:
- Select a picture and type a name for the new Dragon user



- Leave enabled 'Create a desktop shortcut for this user' checkbox to create a shortcut to their favorite profile and launch it directly from the desktop.



- If you want to create a new supervised user, select 'Control and view the websites this person visits from....' checkbox. For a supervised user you can:
 - allow or prohibit certain websites
 - review websites that the user has visited and
 - manage other settings
- You can sign in to Dragon to access browser settings, such as bookmarks and apps, that have been synced to your Google Account. See **Enable or Disable Sync Settings** for more details.
- Click 'Add'. A new user window will be created.



- Click 'Edit' to choose another picture profile or change your name
- Click 'Delete' to remove your current account and all data associated with it from your computer.
- Click 'Import bookmarks and settings' to import your bookmarks from another browser. See [Import And Export Bookmarks](#) for more details.

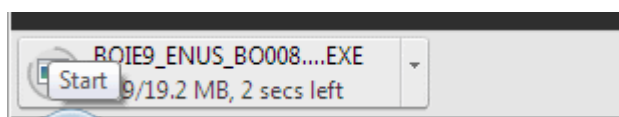

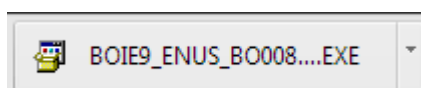

8.1. Downloading a File

When you start downloading a file from the internet, Comodo Dragon displays download progress at the bottom of the interface:



- The file will be available after the download is complete. Click the filename to open the file:



By default, Comodo Dragon saves downloaded files to C:\Users\\Downloads.

Comodo Dragon will alert you if a file is not safe to download:

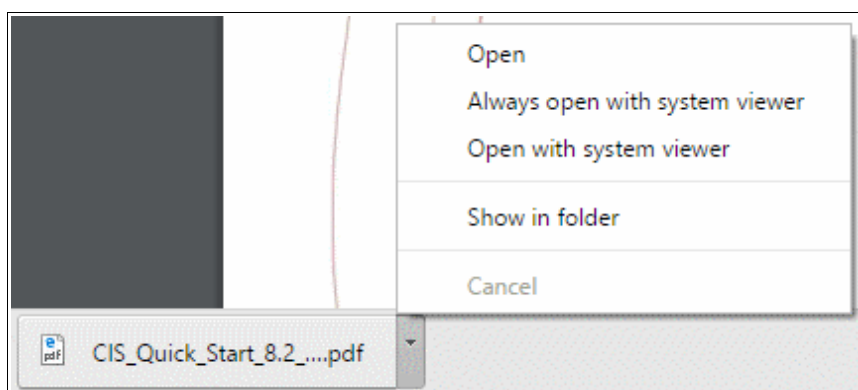


- Click the 'Discard' button if you are not sure about the file.
- Click the 'Save' button to start the download.

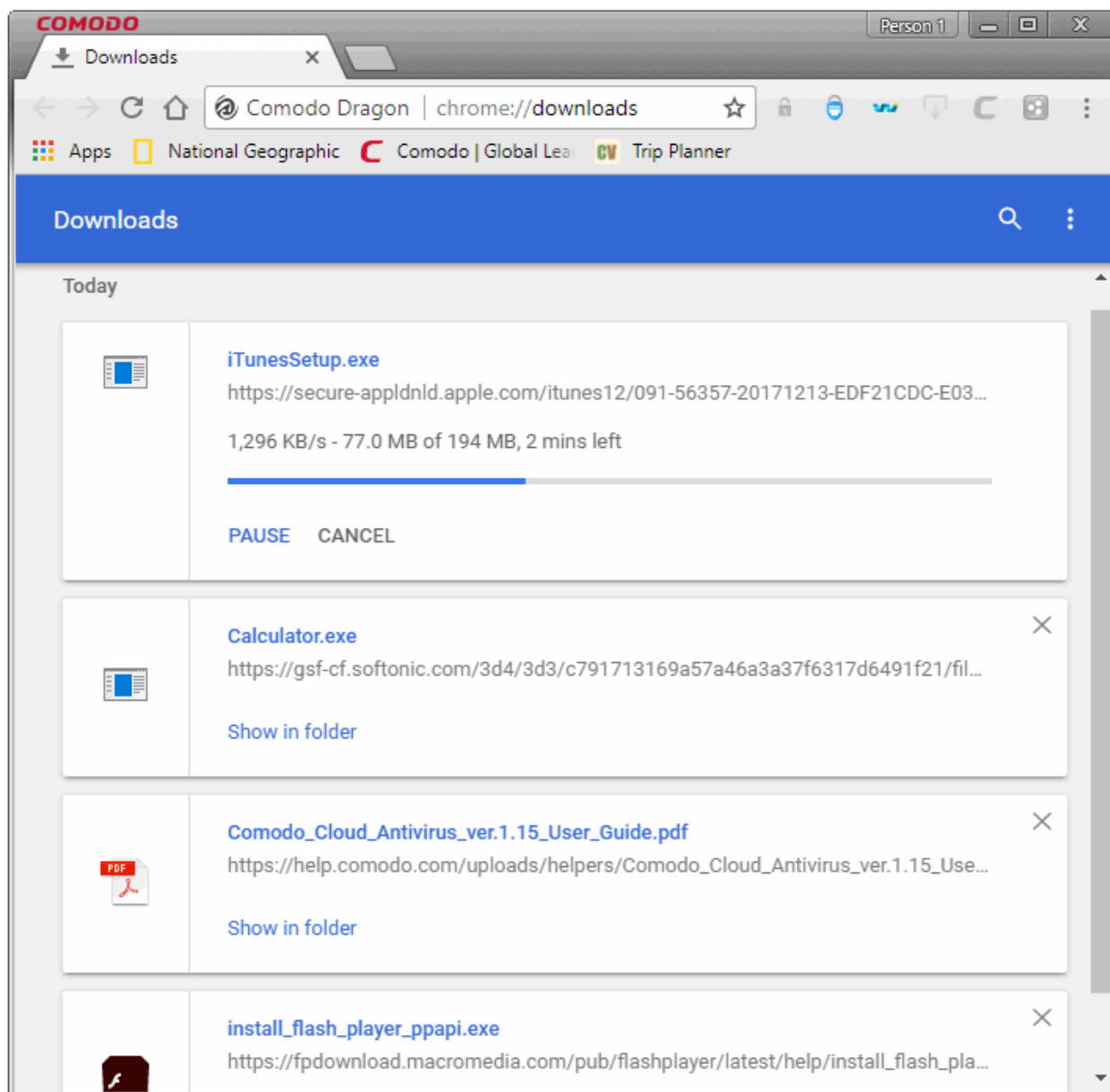
To pause or cancel a download


You can pause or cancel a download in progress.

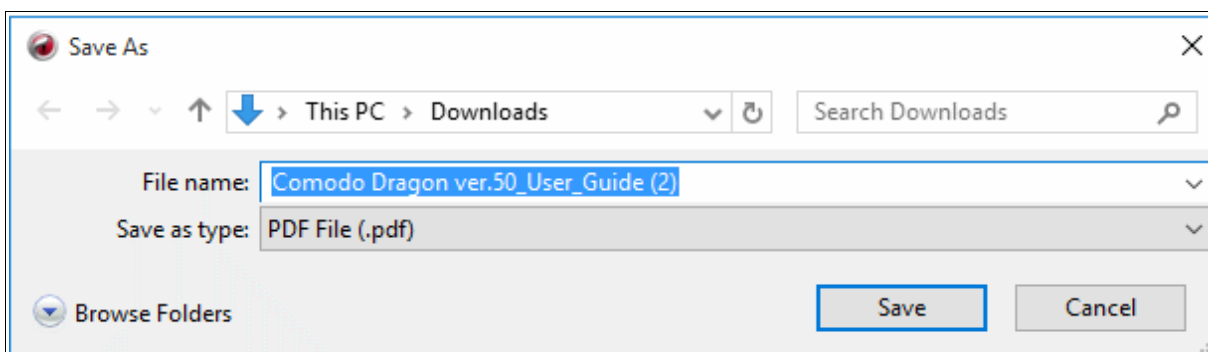
- Click the arrow adjacent to file that is downloaded in the download bar.



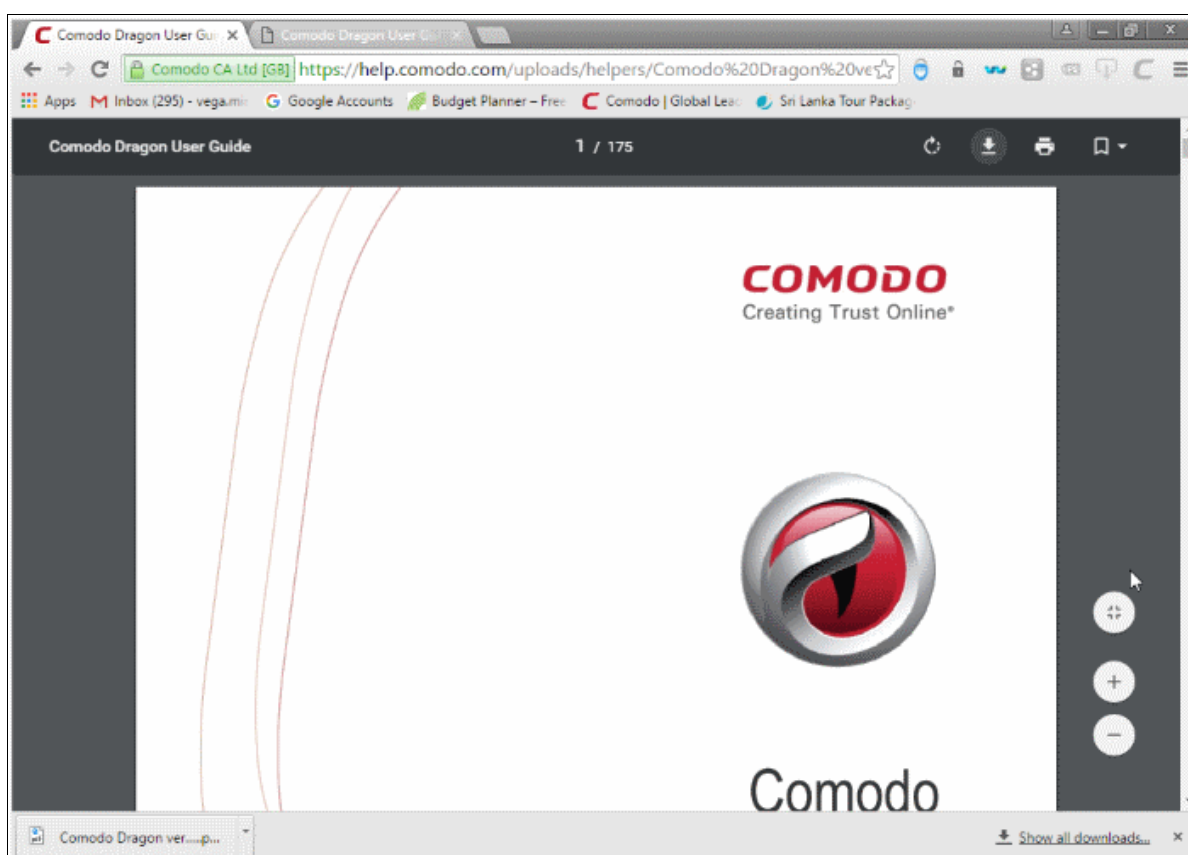
- Select the 'Pause' or 'Cancel' in the pop-up menu.
- Click 'Show in folder' to view the file in the folder in which it is located on your computer.
- Click 'Always open files of this type' to automatically open the file once the download is complete. Please note that this option is not available for executable file types, for eg., .dll, .exe etc.
- You can also pause or cancel in the 'Downloads' page.



- Click the options button at top-right > click 'Clear all' at the right side of the download bar
OR
- Click 'Open downloads folder' see the all your downloads on your computers
OR
- Click the 'Show in folder' link beneath the file to view the currently downloaded item
- Alternately, you can download, when the pdf opens as a link, click  and you will be asked for a location to save the pdf file.



- Dragon will display the 'Save' dialog to get your file location.
- Click 'Save'.



- You will view the automatic file download progress on the bottom left corner of the browser from where you can go to the file location.

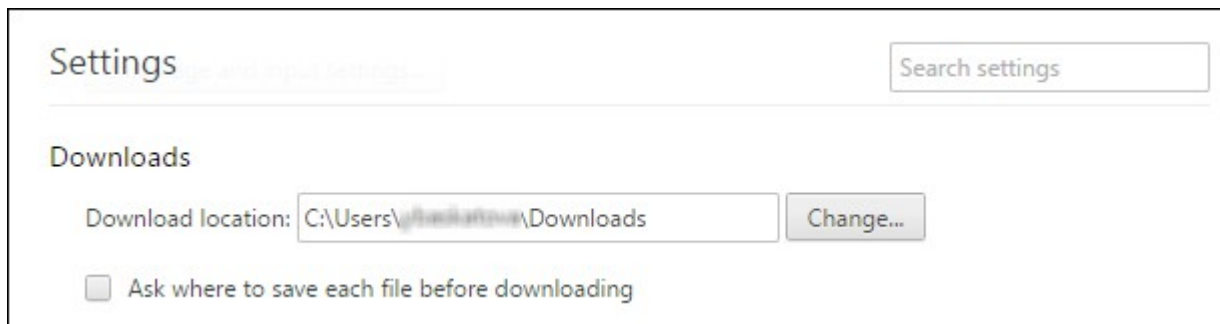

8.2. Change Download Location

By default, Comodo Dragon saves all downloaded files at 'C:\Users\\Downloads'. You can change this location or change settings so that you are asked for the location every time you start the download.

To change the download location

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' and choose from 'Show advanced settings' link.



- In the 'Downloads' section, click 'Change' and select the location where you would like to save the download files.
- Select 'Ask where to save each file before downloading' to select a specific location for each download.

8.3. Clear Download History

Comodo Dragon allows you to selectively or entirely remove downloads from the download list.

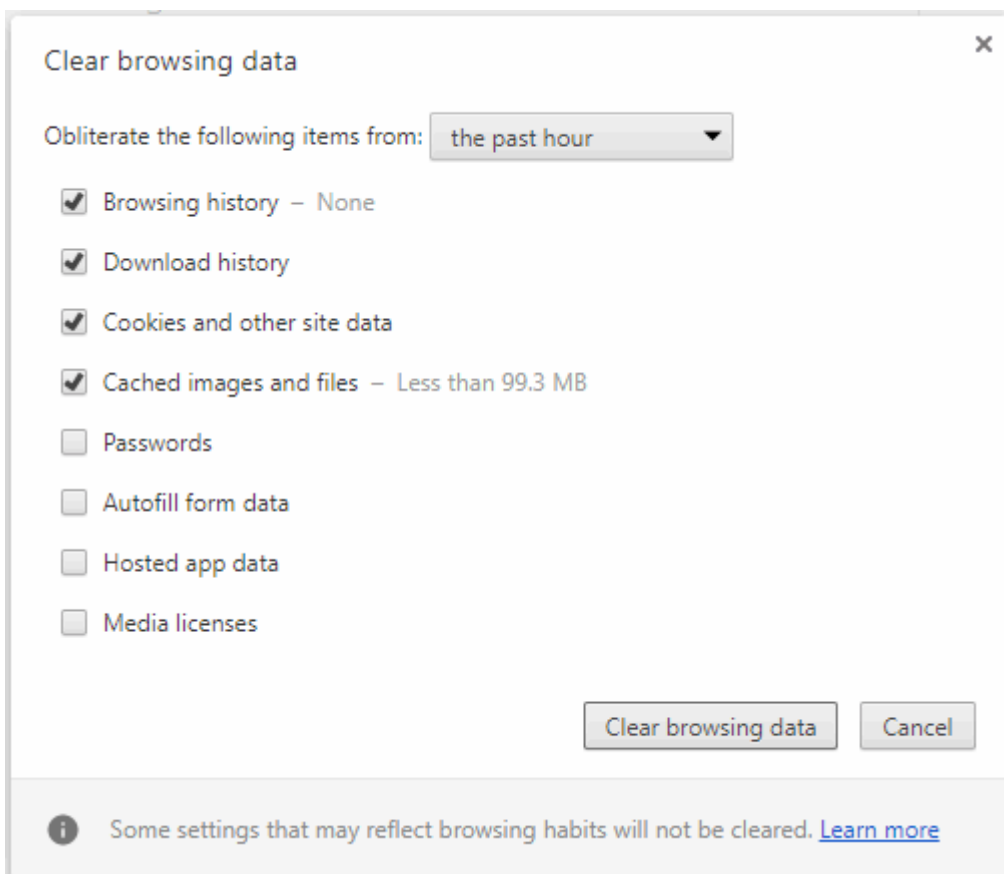
To remove specific items from download history

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.
- Select 'Downloads' > 'Remove from list' link to remove the item.

To clear your download history

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.
- Select 'More tools' > select 'Clear browsing data'.

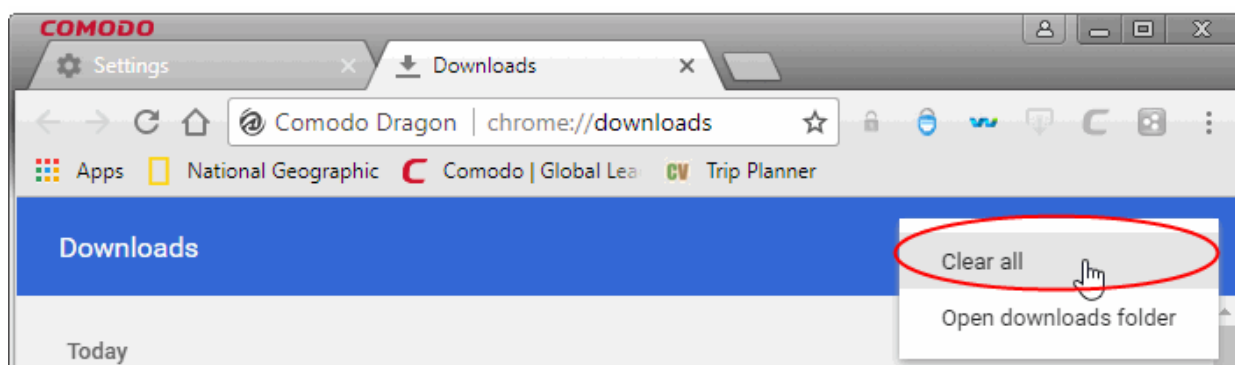

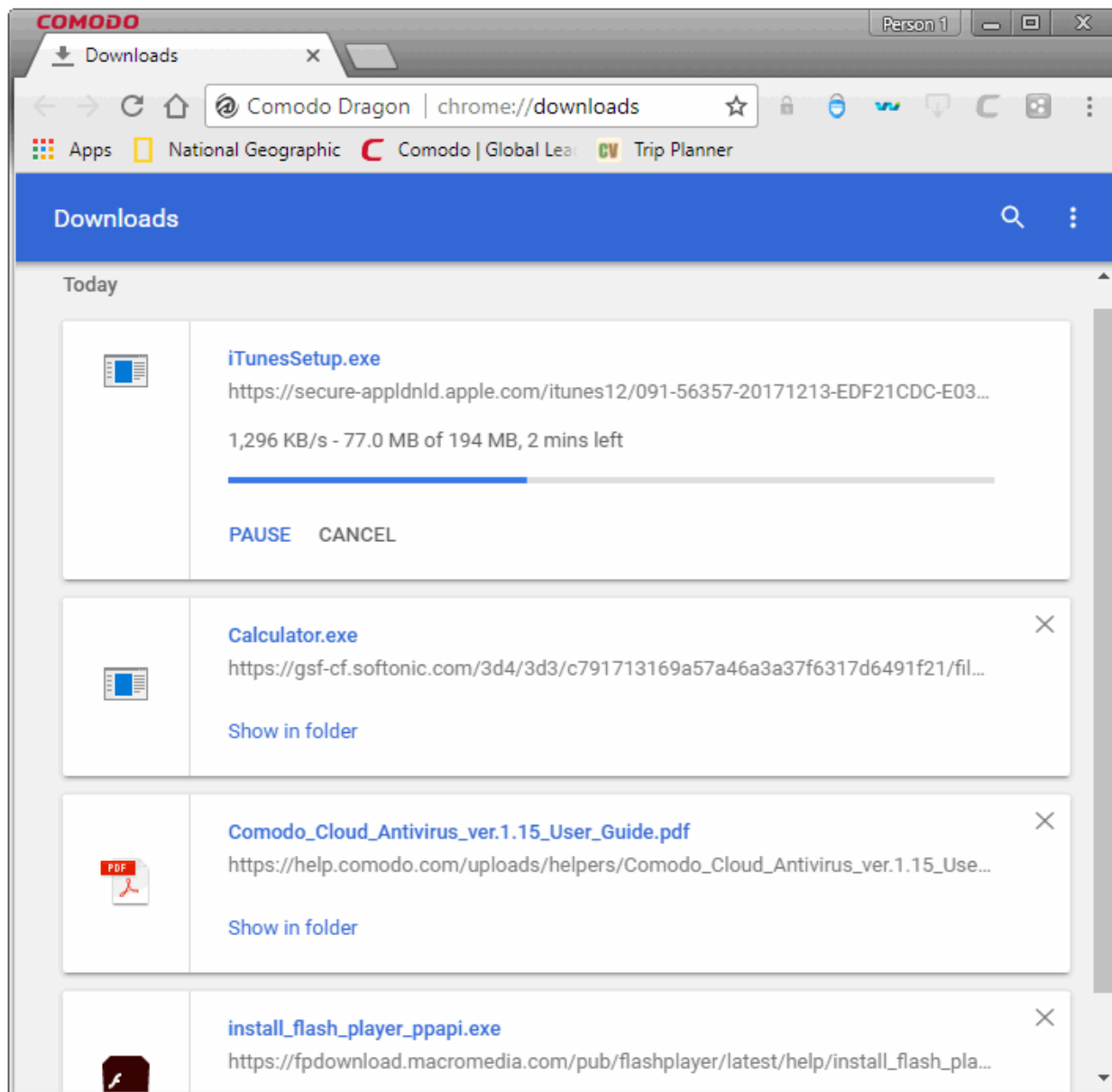

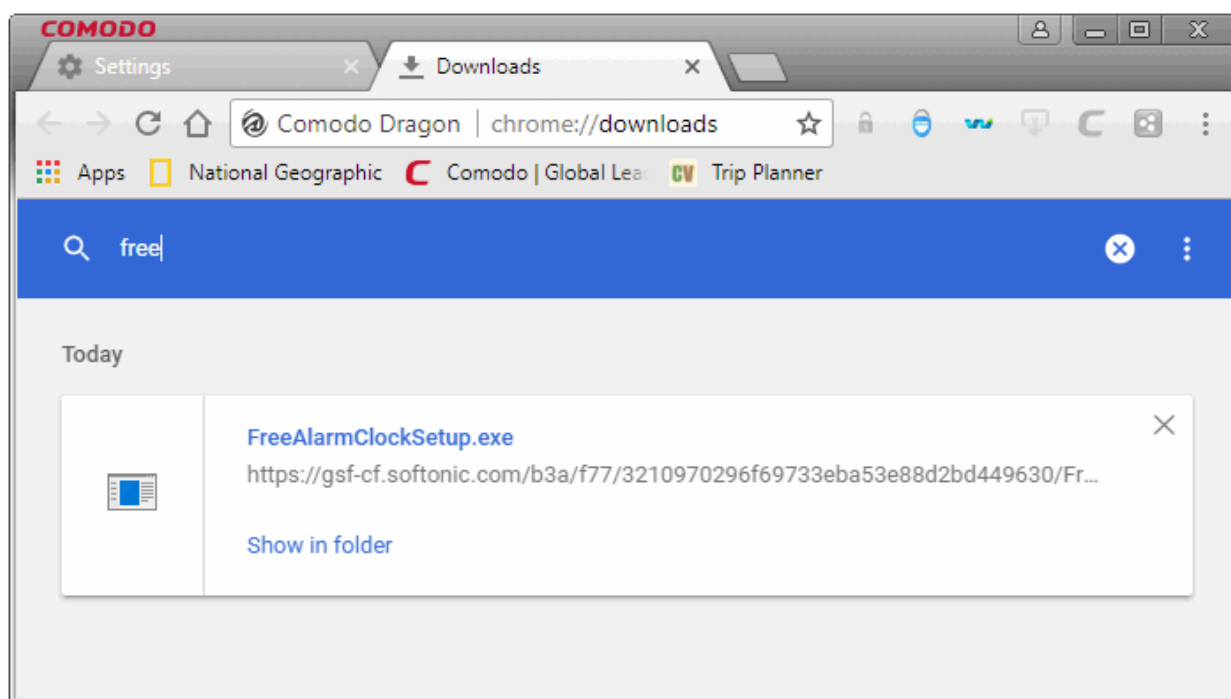
You can view and manage the list of downloaded files in the 'Downloads' page. The files are listed in chronological order.

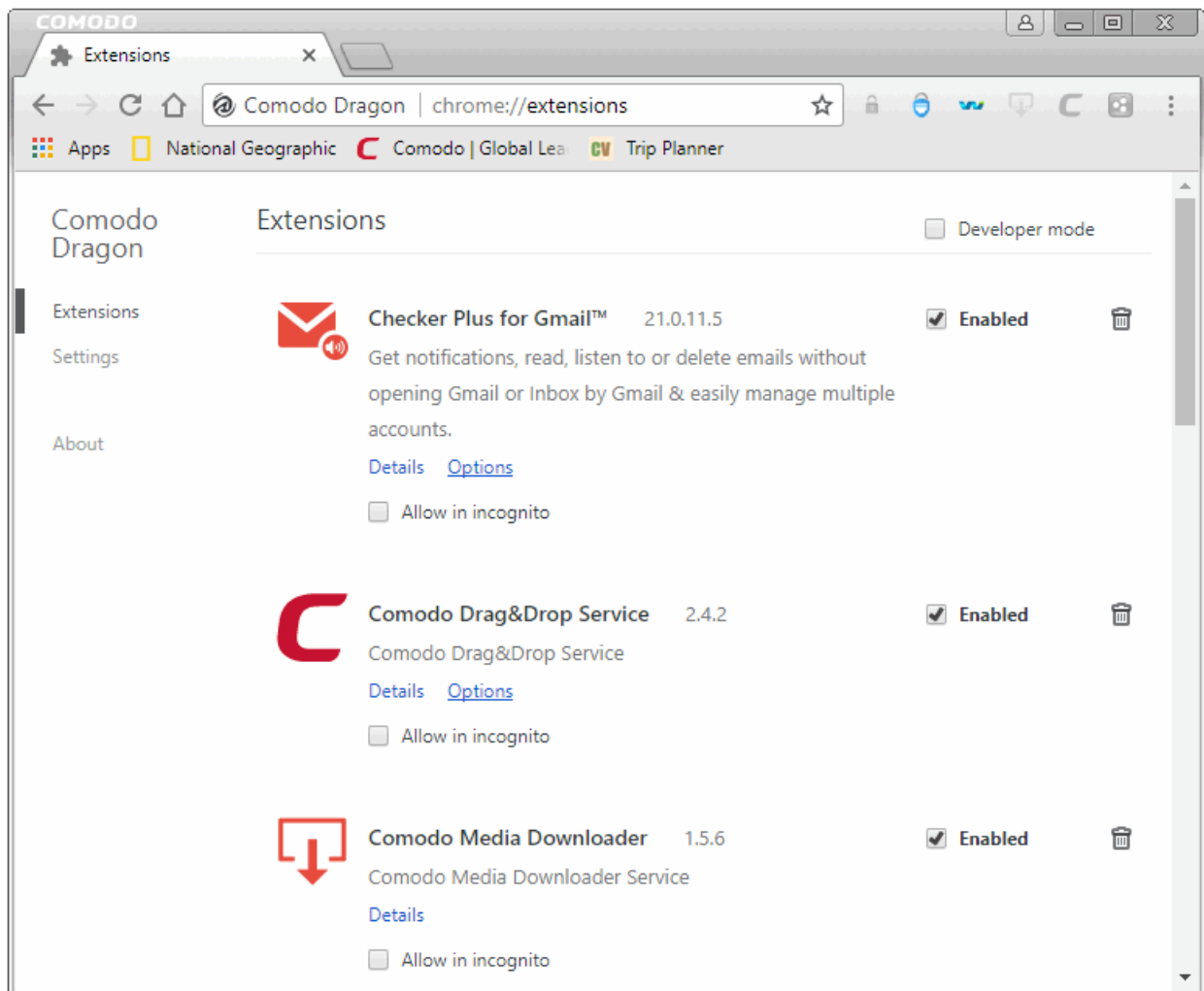

9.1. Manage Extensions

Comodo Dragon extensions allow you to add a wide variety of new features and capabilities to the browser. For example, you may want to add an extension that brings extra security to your browsing experience, or an extension that lets you quickly share items on social media.

To access the Extensions manager


- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.
 - Select 'More tools' > 'Extensions'
- OR
- Type: `chrome://extensions/` in the address bar

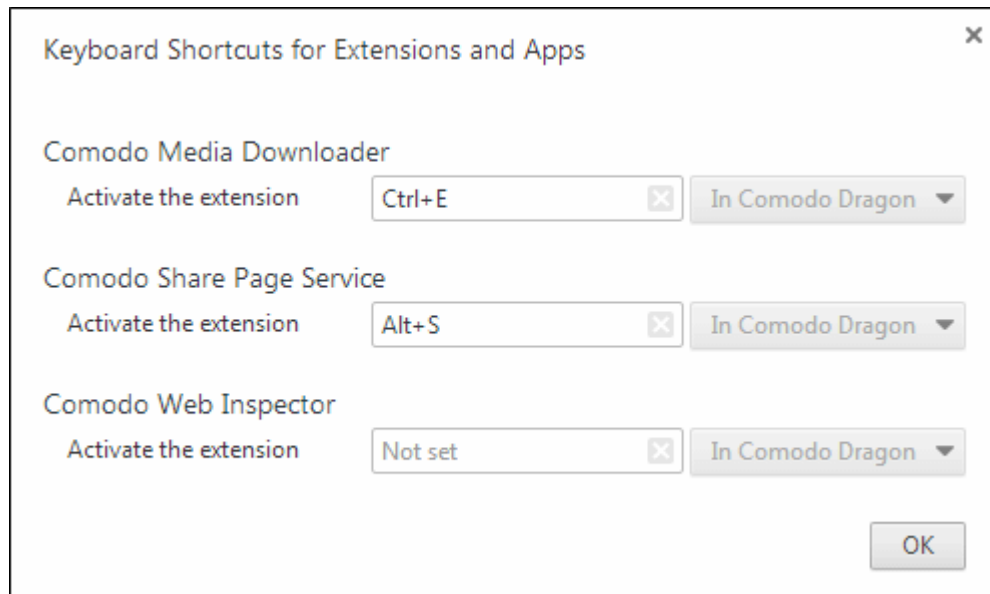


- To temporarily disable an extension, deselect the 'Enabled' checkbox besides it.
- Click the 'Details' link to see an overview of the extension.
 - Click the 'View in store' link to view extension's web store page
 - Click 'Remove' to delete the extension.
- Click the 'Options' links to configure the extension.
- Click the 'Trash can' beside an extension to permanently remove it.
- Enable 'Allow in incognito' use the extension while in incognito browsing mode.
- Enable 'Collect errors' send crash-data to the extension developers for analysis.
- Enable 'Allow access to file URLs' to permit extensions to read, modify and write files on your PC. Please make sure that the extension is trustworthy.
- Click 'Get more extensions' at the bottom to choose from a huge variety and install on your computer.
- Sign-in to Comodo Dragon to use extensions on other devices.
- Enable 'Developer mode' to access advanced tools. Among other things, developer mode lets you start writing your own extensions.

To configure keyboard shortcuts for Comodo extensions

Comodo Dragon allows to set keyboard shortcuts to quickly open specific extensions.

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner
- Select 'More tools' > 'Extensions'
- Scroll to the bottom of the page and click the 'Keyboard shortcuts' link at the bottom-right corner
- Enter your keyboard shortcut in the 'Activate the extension' field. For example, you may want to start Comodo Media Grabber with 'CTRL+M'.




- Click 'OK' after entering the keyboard shortcuts.

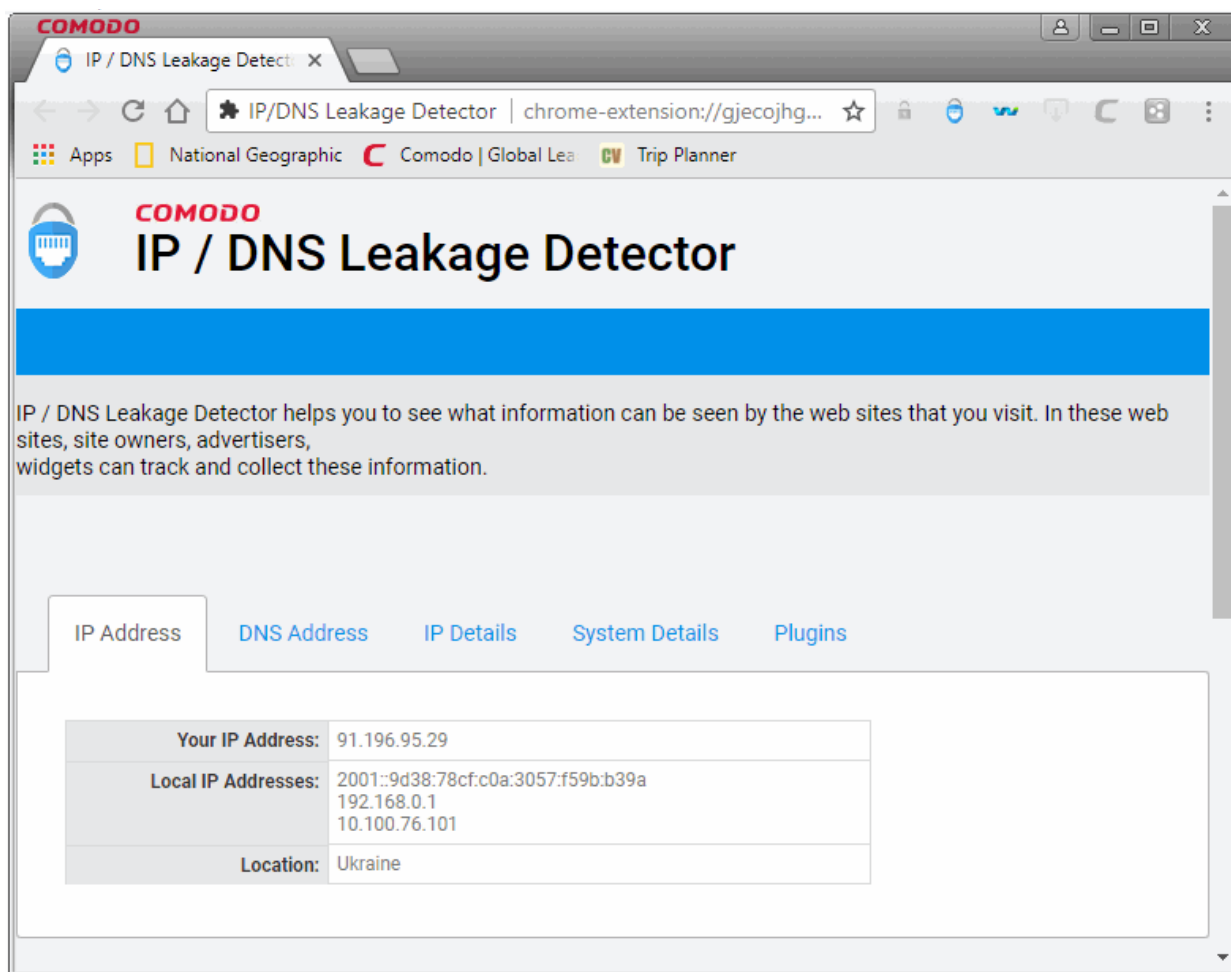
Comodo IP/DNS Leakage Detector

The Comodo IP / DNS Leakage detector is an add-on extension in Dragon that aids in identifying what information would be available to websites that you visit. By default, your IP information is available to websites and you can disable the plugins and Web RTC options in settings to prevent IP Leakage.

To view IP/DNS Leakage detector Extension

- Click  icon from Dragon browser extensions available at the top-right corner.

The 'Comodo IP/DNS Leakage Detector' will appear:



In general, the browser provides some information about your system:

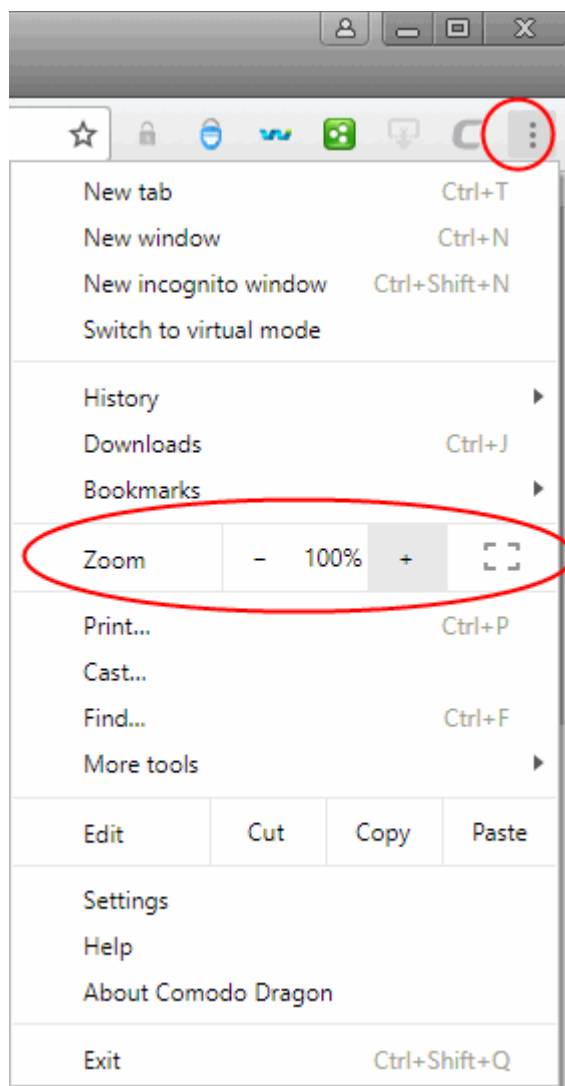
- **IP Address** : Displays the internal and external IP address of your system.
- **DNS Address** : Displays your DNS server details.
- **IP Details** : The details delivered by your service provider.
- **System Details** : The system details like language used, system platform, browser version and statuses of cookie and Java if enabled/disabled.
- **Plugins** : Displays plugins installed on your system.

Note : Your systems information will generally be available to websites you visit unless you do not want it to be available.

9.2. Zooming the Web-page

You can zoom a web page as per your comfort level.


- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner

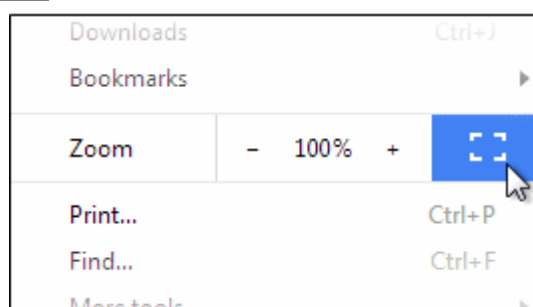


To change the zoom level

- Use the '-' and '+' buttons to change zoom levels. The default is 100%. You can zoom between 25% and 500%
- You can also change zoom levels by holding down the CTRL button then scrolling your mouse wheel
- Your zoom preferences for each site are automatically saved.

To display a page in full screen


- Press F11 button to toggle between full screen and normal view
- OR
- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.

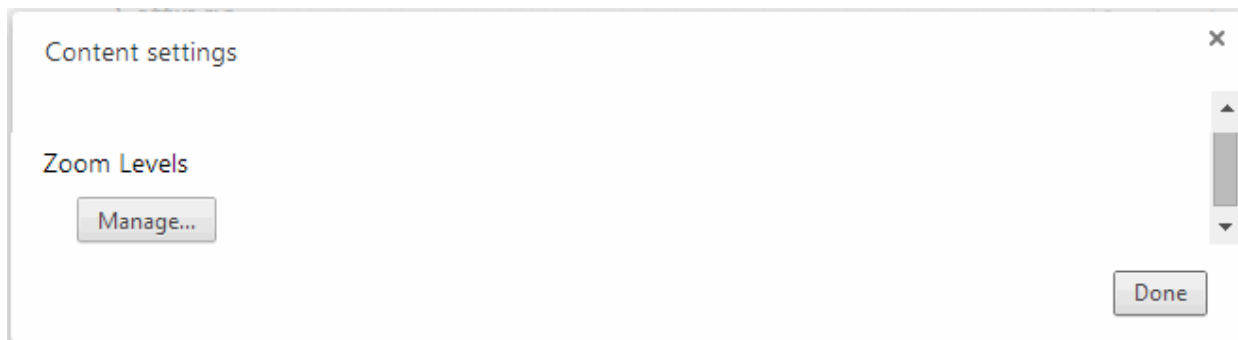


- Press F11 to return to normal view

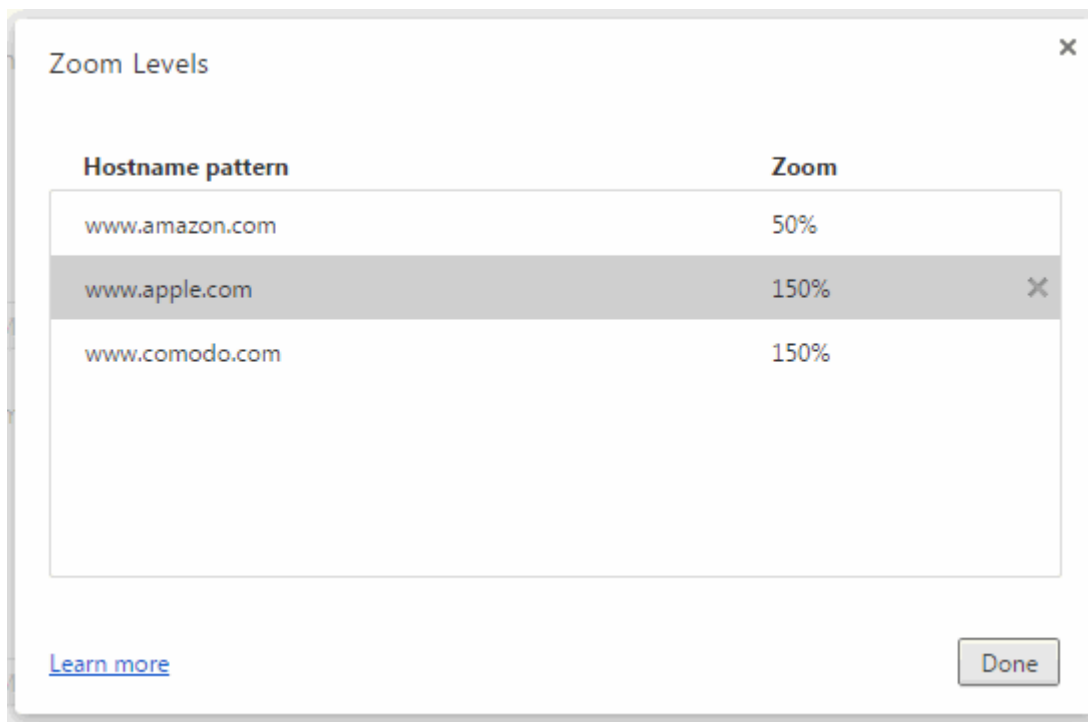
Manage zoom level

Comodo Dragon automatically remembers any custom zoom levels you set for websites that you have visited.

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down to the 'Show advanced settings' link
- Click 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' section
- Scroll down to the 'Zoom Levels' > 'Manage' button



- The 'Zoom levels' dialog lists those domains for which you have set a custom zoom level:




- Click 'X' to remove a custom zoom setting for a particular domain. The site will be zoomed at the default 100% the next time you visit.

9.3. Form Autofill

Comodo Dragon's Autofill feature lets you complete web forms with a single click, saving you the time and drudgery of entering the same details repeatedly.

To manage your Autofill entries


- Click the menu  at the top-right .
- Select 'Settings' > scroll down to the 'Show advanced settings' link > Passwords and forms' section.

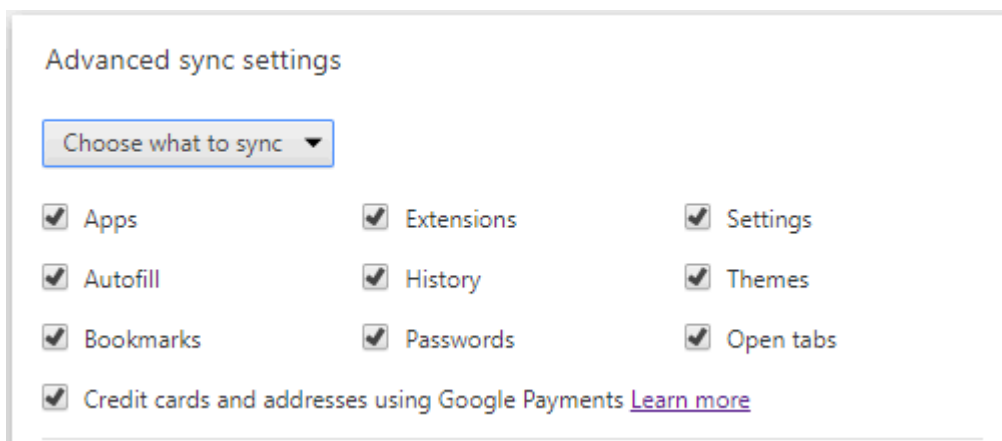
9.5. Protect your Synced Passwords

If you choose to sync your Comodo Dragon settings with your Google Account, Dragon will encrypt your synced passwords with a cryptographic key generated by your Google Account password.

Dragon allows you to customize your sync passwords if you do not wish to use your Google Account password.

To choose an encryption method

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > click 'Advanced sync settings' button in the 'Sign in' section. Note: You should have 'Set up sync' already.
- Select what should be synced in the drop-down window.



- Select what should to be encrypted in the 'Encryption options'. The default setting is 'Encrypt synced passwords'.

Encryption options

For added security, Comodo Dragon will encrypt your data.

- Encrypt synced passwords with your Google credentials
- Encrypt all synced data with your own sync passphrase [Learn more](#)

- Select 'Encrypt synced passwords with your Google credentials'
- Select 'Encrypt all synced data with your own sync passphrase' if you do not want to use Google Account password.

Encryption options

Only someone with your passphrase can read your encrypted data. The passphrase is not sent to or stored by Google. If you forget your passphrase, you will need to [reset sync](#).

- Type and confirm the passphrase and click 'OK'.

The passphrase will be stored in your computer.

Please note that if you choose to have your own passphrase, this has to be provided every time you choose to sync passwords on a new system. Also, any change in the encryption options has to be carried out in all computers to continue syncing.

To personalize Google services

- Click 'Google Activity Controls' link to access activity controls.

The activity controls lets you define which type of data are saved to your Google account. Note: You need first to sign in to your Google Account. The following activities can be saved:

- Web & App Activity
- Location History
- Device Information
- Voice & Audio Activity
- YouTube search history
- YouTube watch history

Forgot Sync Passphrase

In case you forgot your synced passphrase, you'll have to reset sync via your Google account. An entry will be created in your Google account called 'Data from Chrome Sync' when you **enable the sync** feature. You have to enable sync again and choose a new sync passphrase.

- Click 'Reset sync'.
- Sign up to Chrome browser to sync again.

All your sync data will be deleted from Google's servers. However, the data on your computer such as bookmarks, passwords and current preferences will not be deleted.

9.6. Enable / Disable Malware Domain Filtering (Comodo Secure DNS)

Comodo Secure DNS helps users stay safe while browsing online. If malware domain filtering (Comodo Secure DNS) is enabled, potentially dangerous websites may be blocked for the following reasons:


- The website may contain prohibited content
- The website may be fraudulent - attempting to collect your personal information by pretending to be a legitimate site.
- The website may offer illegal sharing of copyrighted software or media.

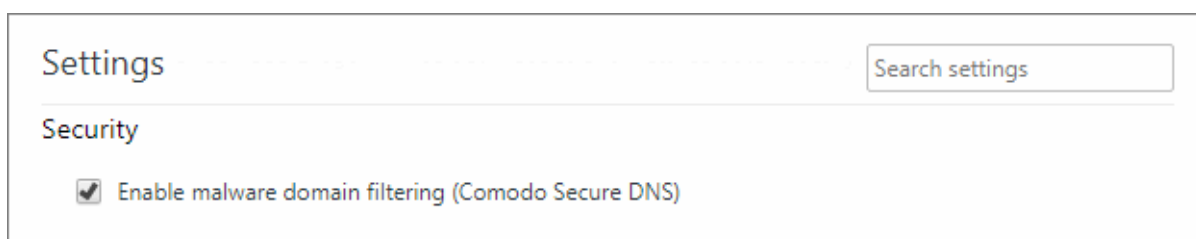
This feature is enabled by default in Comodo Dragon. If you feel that websites that you require are being blocked while this setting is enabled you can manually disable it from the settings menu.

- If enabled, Comodo Dragon will use Comodo Secure DNS servers instead of default DNS servers provided by your service providers.
- Irrespective of whether or not you have chosen the option 'I would like to use Comodo Secure DNS Servers (with all applications)' or 'I would like to use COMODO Secure DNS Servers (in Dragon only)' during installation, selecting this option will force Comodo Dragon to use Comodo Secure DNS for malware domain filtering.
- Secure DNS references a real-time block list (RBL) of harmful websites. These include phishing sites, malware sites, spyware sites, and parked domains that contain excessive advertising. You will be warned whenever you attempt to access a site containing such potentially threatening content. Our highly secure infrastructure also reduces your exposure to DNS poisoning attacks.
- In addition, enabling Comodo Secure DNS makes the web pages you visit to load faster as Comodo operates a huge network of fully redundant DNS servers located at optimal locations around the world. Your requests for web-pages are always resolved by the high performance DNS cluster closest to you. Hence the websites load faster than when you continue to use the DNS server provided by your ISP (which you share with other customers of the ISP).

To disable malware domain filtering (Comodo Secure DNS)

- Click the menu  button located in the top-right
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click the 'Show advanced settings'
- Scroll down to 'Security' section




- Deselect 'Enable malware domain filtering (Comodo Secure DNS)' option

- Restart the tabs on which you want the settings to take effect.

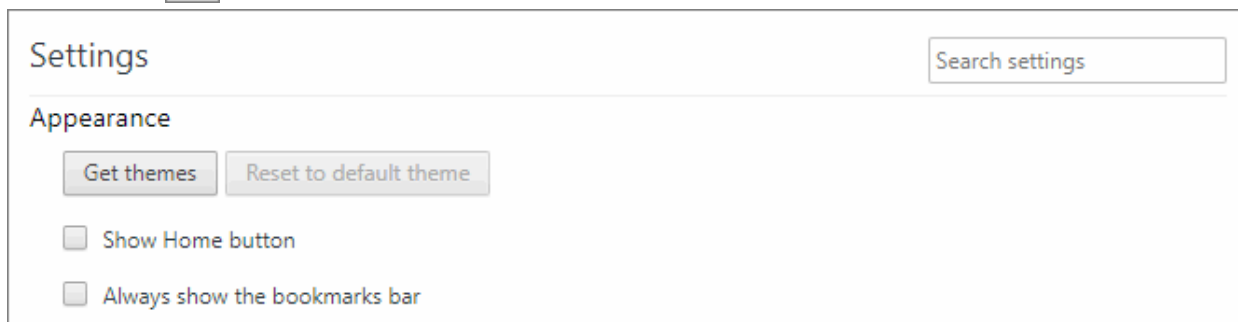
9.7. Applying Themes

You can add themes to Dragon from the Chrome web store.

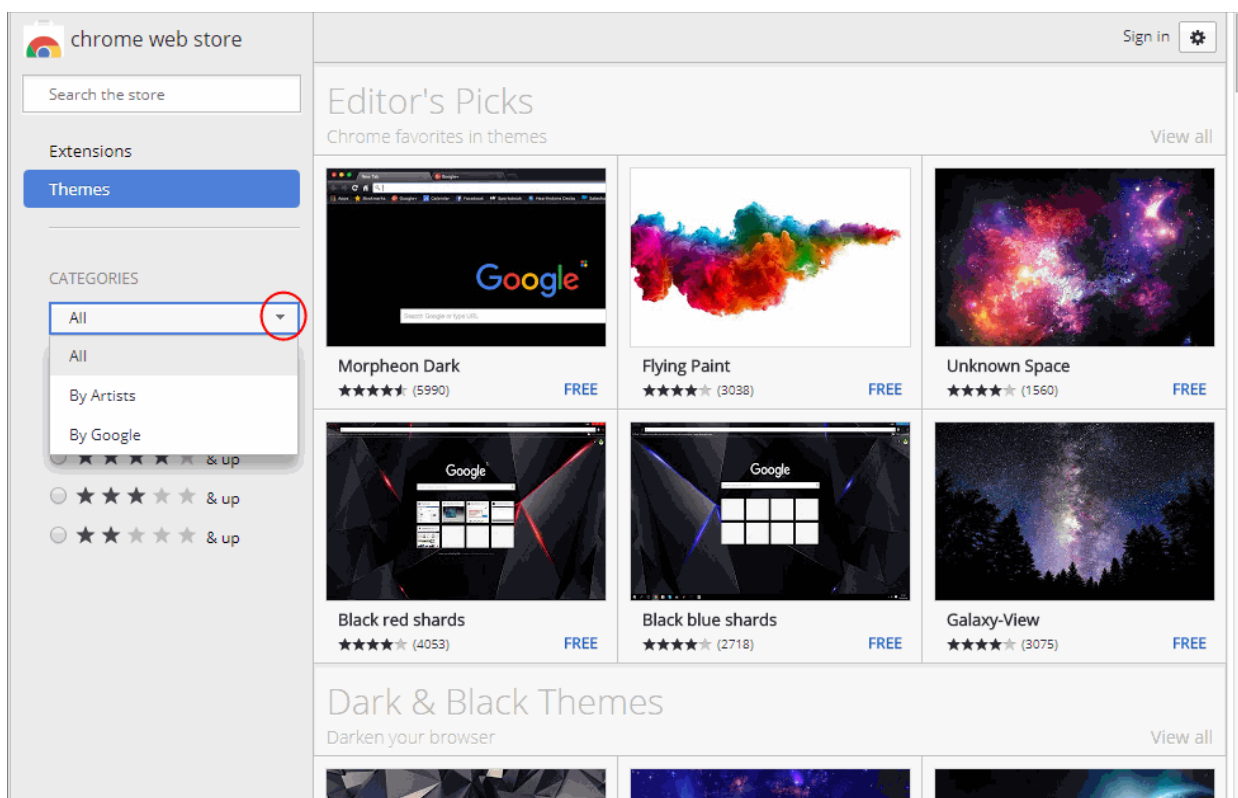

- Click 'Reset to default theme' to revert to the original Dragon theme.

9.8. View Task Manager from Comodo Dragon

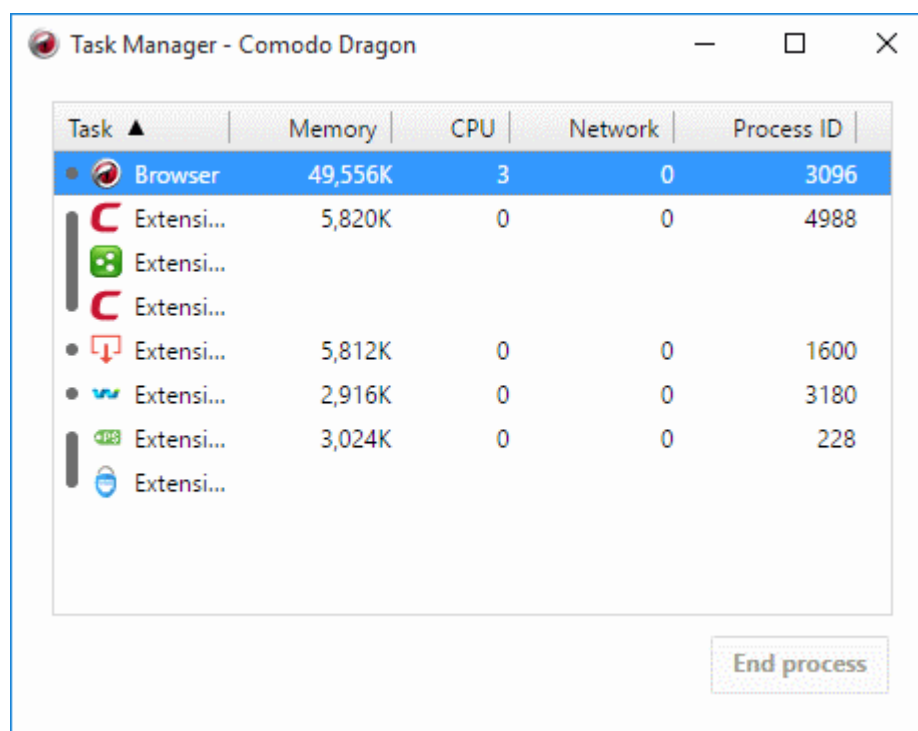
The 'Task Manager' lets you view and control all processes that Dragon is currently running.

- Click the menu  button located at the top-right corner
- Select 'More tools' > 'Task manager' from the menu

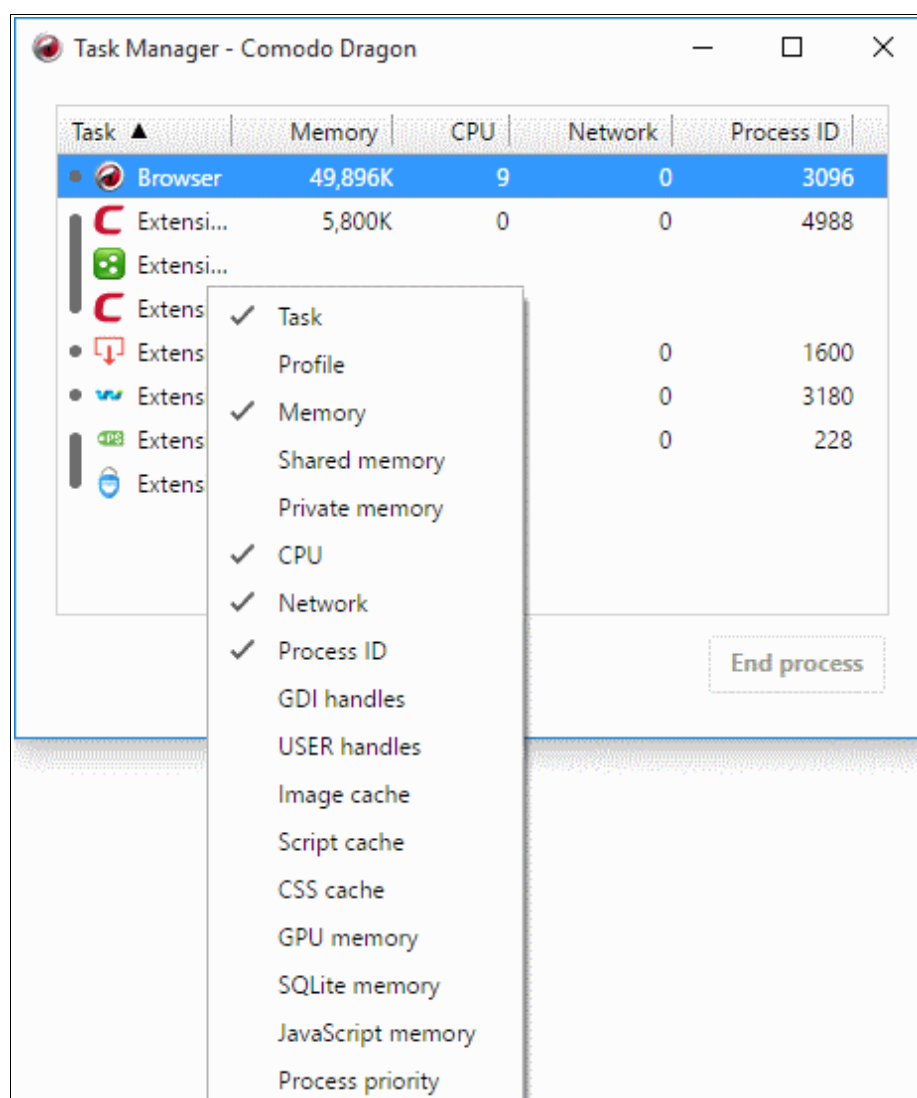
- Press Shift + Esc (while Dragon is your active application)

The interface will show you the amount of Memory, CPU and Network traffic that are consumed by these processes.

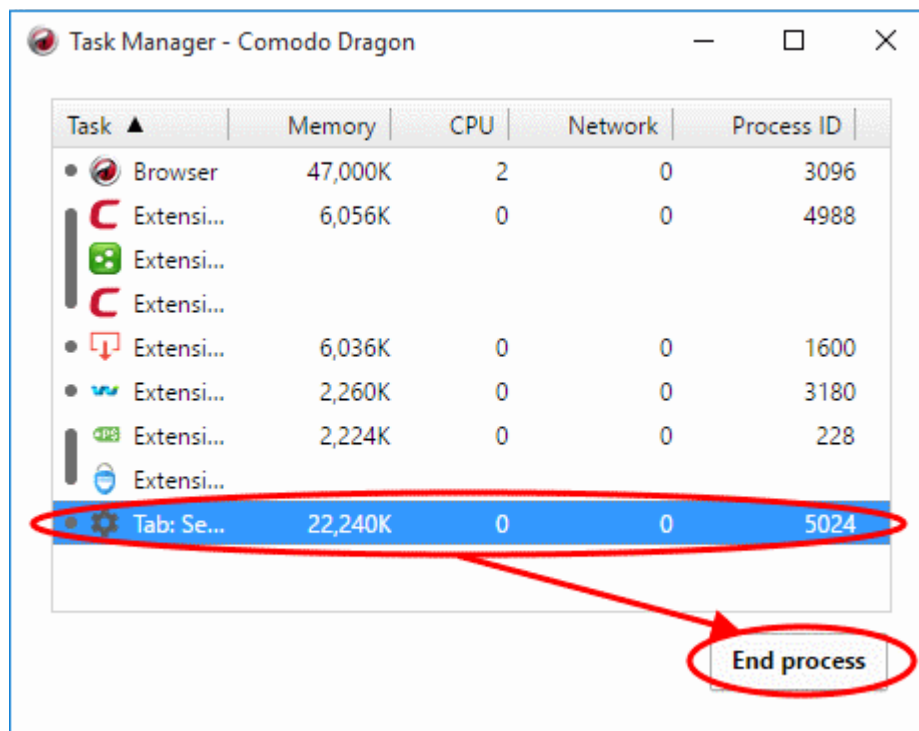


- **Task** - Name of the Comodo Dragon process
- **Memory** - RAM consumed by the process
- **CPU** - How much CPU processing power is used by the Dragon process
- **Network** - How much network traffic is being used by that process
- **Process ID** - The identification number of the Dragon process

Advanced users can add or remove columns by right-clicking anywhere in the task manager interface:




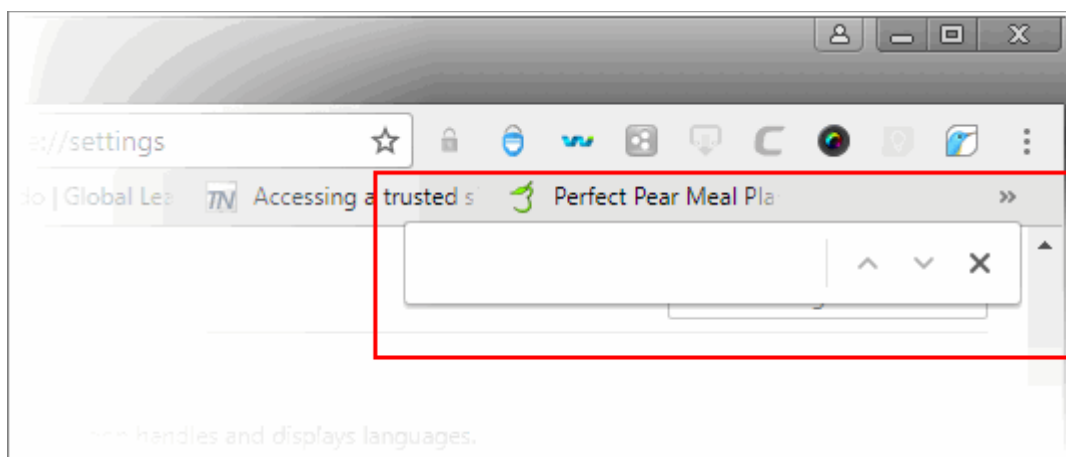
- To close any open process, simply highlight the process in question and click 'End Process'.



9.9. Searching Within Page Content

You can search for content within the page by using the 'Find' feature.

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
 - Click the 'Find' button
- OR
- Use the keyboard shortcut CTRL + F keys.




- Type your search term in the text-box that appears at the top-right corner of the page.

Comodo Dragon automatically searches the page as you type, highlighting potential matches in yellow.

- To quickly see where all the matches are located on a webpage, using the yellow markers on the scrollbar.


The number of items that matches the search parameter will be displayed at the far right of the search field box.

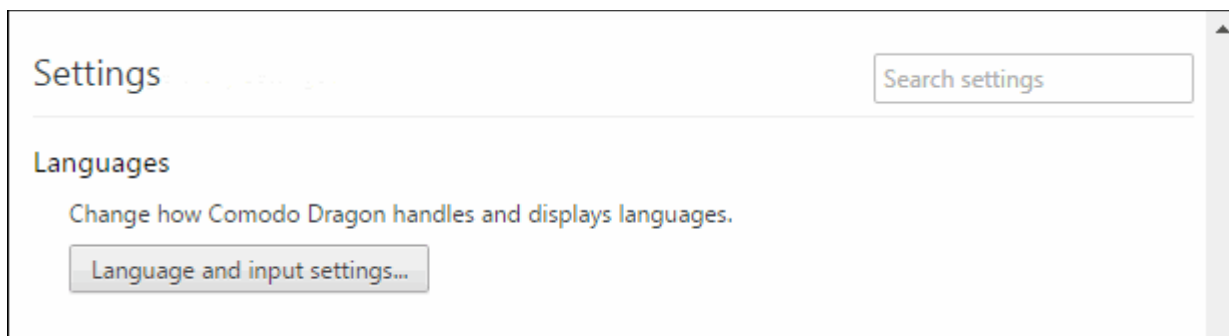
- You can search up or down the web page by clicking the  or  buttons.

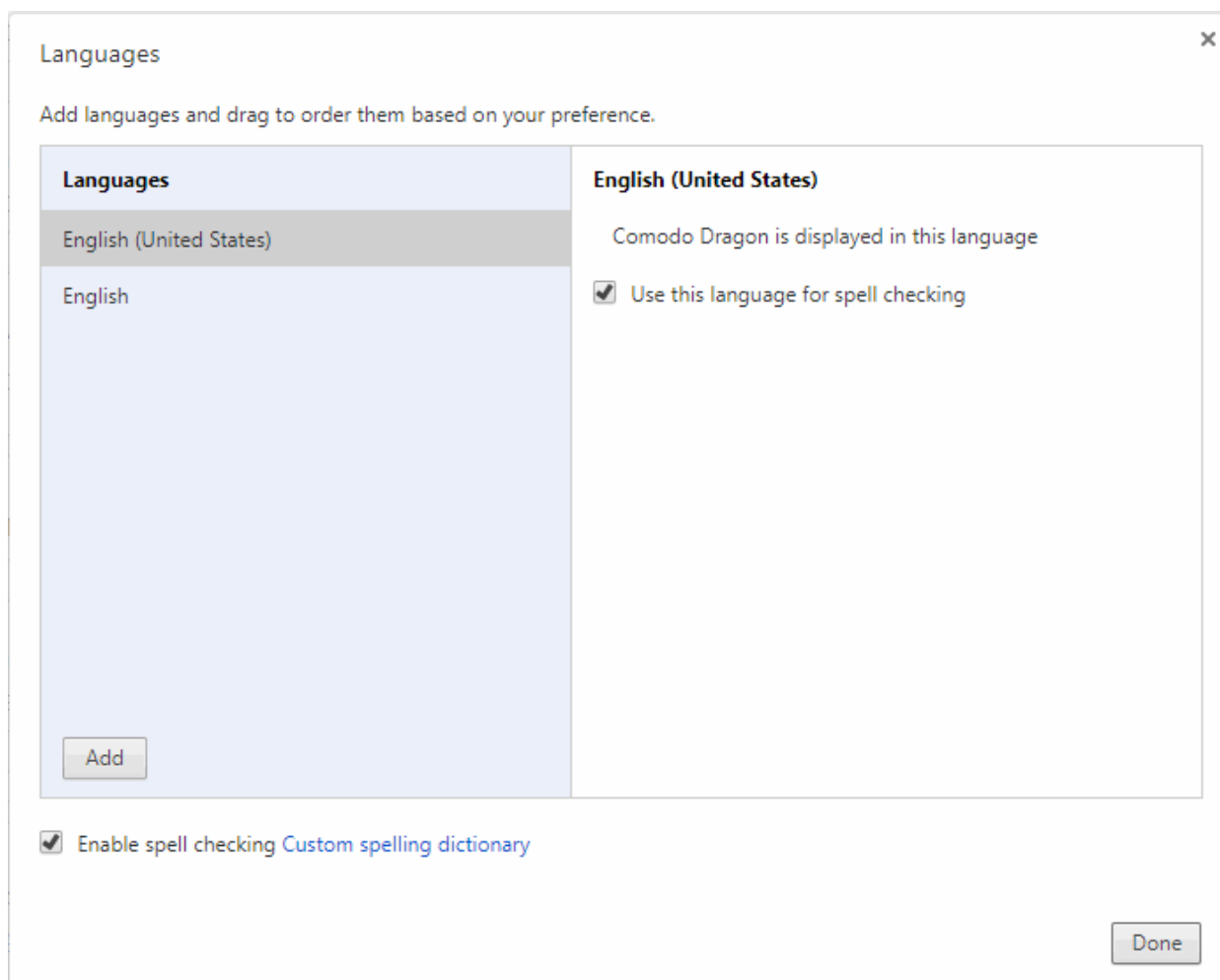
9.10. Customize your Spell Checker

Comodo Dragon's built-in spell checker automatically checks for spelling when you type something in web forms and text fields. If a word is not listed in the Dragon dictionary, then it will show as a spelling mistake each time you type that word. You can add words to the Dragon dictionary to avoid showing them as a mistake and also set the spell-check language.

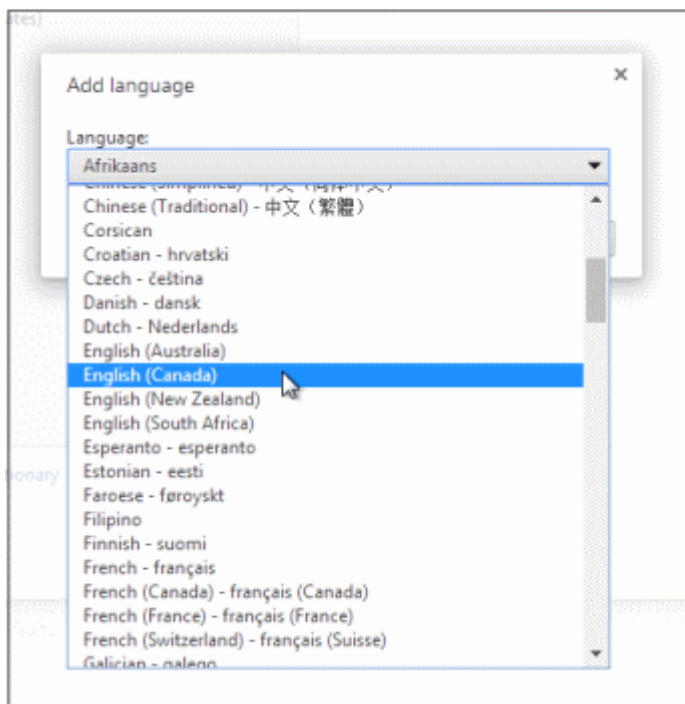

- Click 'Settings' > scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Scroll to the 'Languages' section.



- Click 'Language and input settings'.



- In the opened 'Languages' dialog, select the language that should be used for spell check

- In the 'Add to desktop' dialog, create a name for the page (if required).
- Enable 'Open as window' if you want the page to open in a single window (optional).




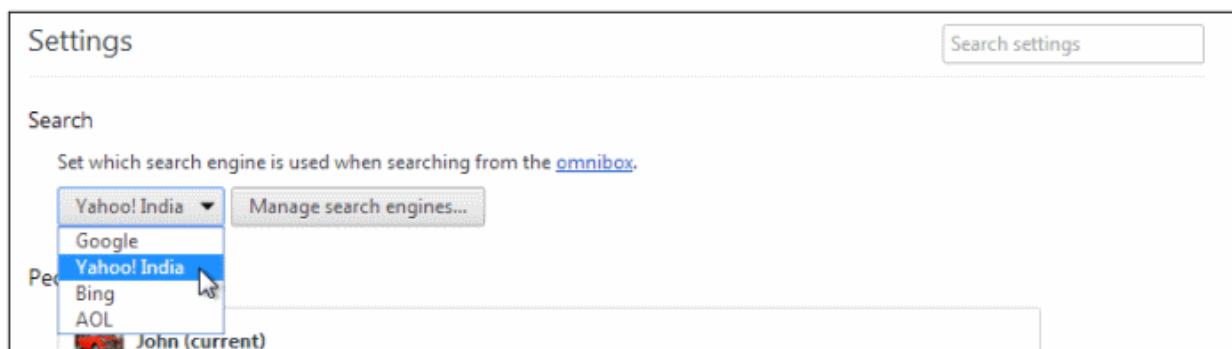
- Click 'Add'.
- A desktop shortcut will be created for the webpage.

9.12. Manage Your Search Engines

When you use a search engine, Comodo Dragon automatically recognizes it and adds to its list of usable search engines. You can also manually add search engines or edit/remove search engines. You can also specify which should be your default search engine.

The address bar (omnibox) can be used as a search box. Dragon automatically uses Yahoo/Yandex by default, but you can configure another default search engine.

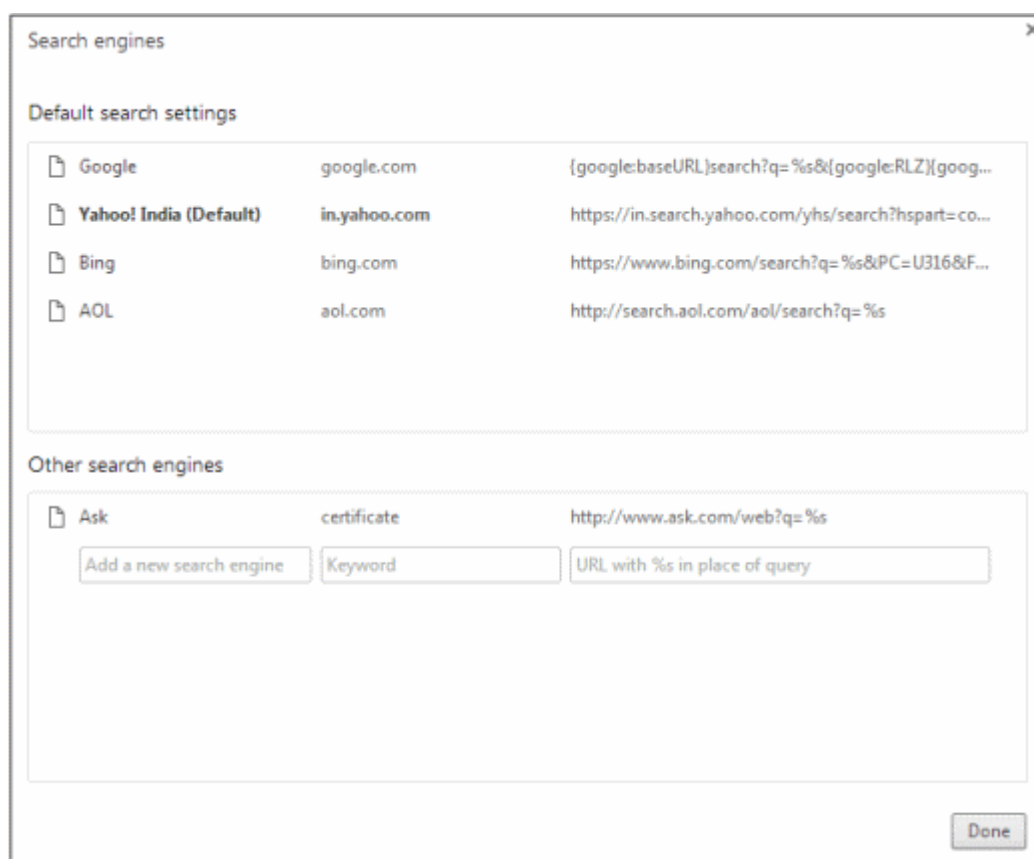
- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > scroll to the 'Search' section.
- Click the drop-down menu to view a list of available search engines.



- Select the search engine that you want to set as default from the drop-down.

The selected search engine will be used by Dragon as default in future.

- Click the 'Manage search engines' button to open the search engine configuration screen:



- To set a default search engine as default, place your mouse over it and click 'Make Default'.

The 'Other search engines' area displays search engines that are used by Dragon and added automatically. You can also add search engines manually in this section.


- To add a search engine, fill out the fields and click 'Enter'
- To edit a search engine, select it and edit the fields as required
- To delete a search engine, select it and click 'X' that appears at the far end of the row
- To set a default search engine as default under 'Other search engines', hover over it and click 'Make Default'
- Click 'Done'.

9.13. View and Stop Background Pages and Applications

Comodo Dragon lets you see which background pages are running and how much resources they are using. This is useful when you manage and optimize resource usage by closing pages that you no longer require.

Tip:

- **Background Pages** - Web pages that are opened in the background (and may not be visible to you).
- **Background applications** - Applications that can keep running even after you close the browser.

- Click the menu button  located in the top-right corner.
- Select 'More tools' > 'Task manager'.
- The first column lists items that are active such as extension, plugins and tabs. Look for items that are labeled as 'Background page'.

- Select a task and click the 'End process' button to stop a task.
- Select 'Exit' from to close Comodo Dragon when background applications are running.

9.14. View, Save and Print a PDF


Comodo Dragon lets you quickly view, save, print and search within PDFs.

To open a PDF in Dragon

- Open Comodo Dragon.
- Press **Ctrl+O**, navigate to the location where the PDF file is saved and click 'Open'.


To save a PDF

Use any of the following methods:

- Right-click the PDF and select 'Save as'.
- Use the keyboard shortcut **Ctrl+S**.
- Click the menu button  at the top-right and select 'Save page as'.

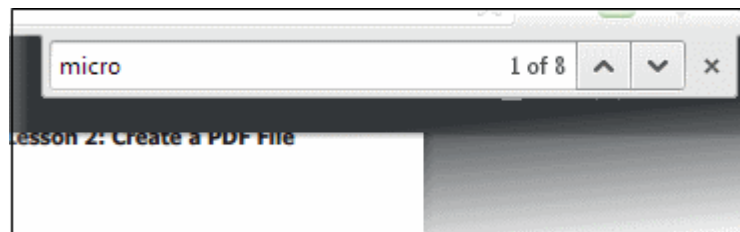
To print a PDF




Use any of the following methods:

- Right-click the PDF and select Print.
- Use the keyboard shortcut **Ctrl+P**.
- Click the menu button  at the top-right and select 'Print'.

To search in a PDF

- Press the keyboard shortcut **Ctrl+F** to search the text in your PDF.
- The search window at the right hand side will appear.



- Enter the text in the search box.
- The number of matching items will be displayed on the right.
- You can search up or down the PDF file by clicking the  or  buttons.
- To close the search box, click the  button.



9.16. Website Security Indicators

- Dragon security indicators are shown in the website address bar and tell about the security of the connection between you and the website you are visiting.

Transport Layer Security (TLS) or Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) protocol provides an encrypted tunnel between your computer and the site you are viewing. All data transmitted between you and the website pass through Internet in an encrypted manner, so that it cannot be deciphered by third parties that try to intercept the transmission. This prevents your sensitive data like your credit card numbers, passwords etc. being stolen by hackers. Secure websites enforce this protection by deploying SSL certificates on their web servers. Comodo Dragon displays indications and

details for you to check whether the website you visit is protected by TLS/SSL and the connection security status.





The icon at the left of the URL in the address bar indicates whether the website uses TLS/SSL and its current connection security status.

The following sections explain more on:

Clicking the very first icon displays the site setting menu. Meaning - that the icon in this pane indicates whether or not a sites uses TLS/SSL protocols. You can identify a website as genuine and trusted if it uses a valid TLS/SSL certificate. Invalid certificates could mean that someone is trying to tamper with your connection to the site.

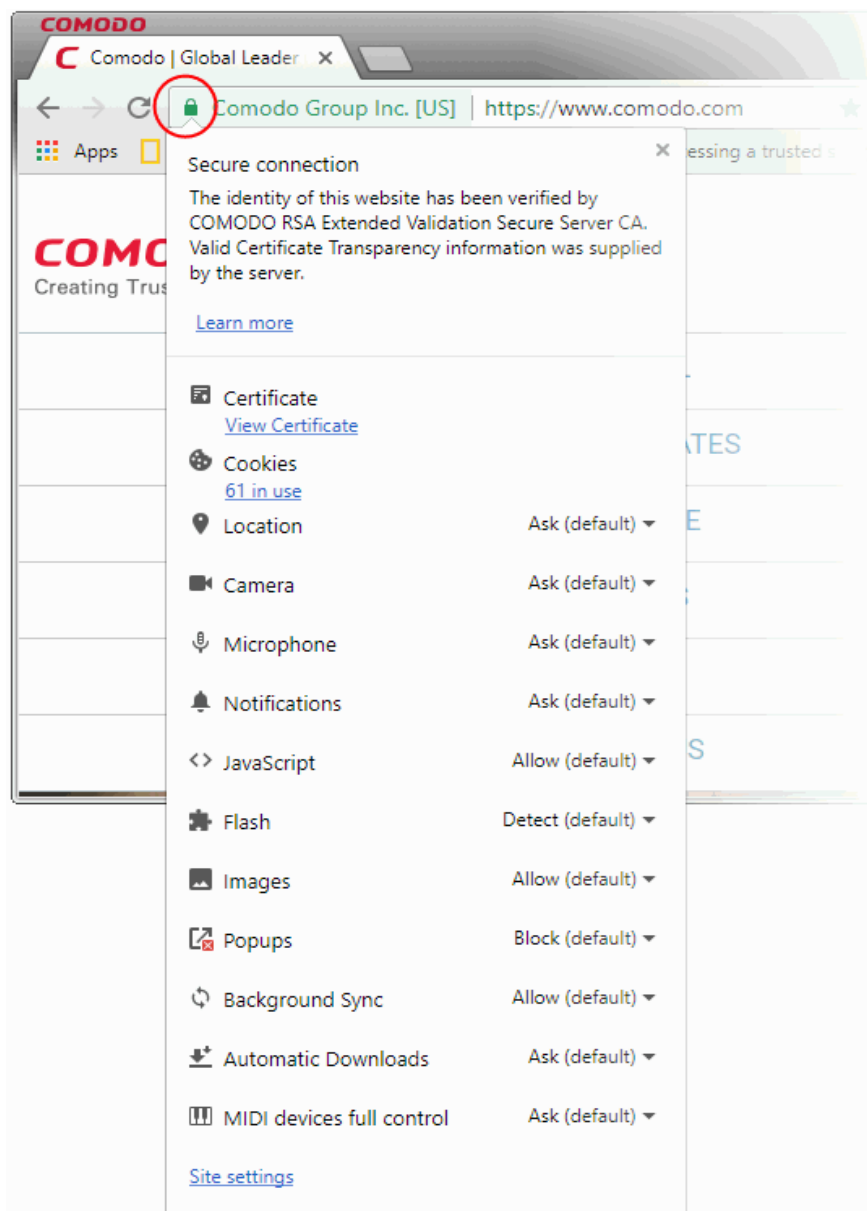
Comodo Dragon informs you whether your connection is fully encrypted. If your connection is insecure, third parties might be able to view or tamper with the information you provide on the site.

The following table contains descriptions of different types of icons:

Icon	Description
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The exclamation mark inside the black circle icon appears when you visit sites that are not using SSL. The identity of this website has not been verified. This is normal for regular HTTP sites.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The green lock icon appears when Comodo Dragon successfully establishes a secure connection with the site you are viewing. The websites that use SSL to transmit information the website address will start with 'https://'. Your connection to the site is encrypted. This website has been verified by a trusted third-party authority. If the site uses an Extended Validation SSL (EV SSL) certificate, the organization's name will appear next to the icon with green text.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The exclamation mark inside the yellow circle icon appears when Comodo Dragon detects that the site has included some insecure content (such as images hosted on http server) on the page. Indicates the lowest cost of secure connection website but do not provide authentication or validation of the business behind the website. Mixed scripting is when a page transmitted over HTTPS loads the content over HTTP. It can create loopholes for someone to take over the page. This could be because of third-party scripts or videos embedded on the page.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The exclamation mark inside the red triangle icon appears when Comodo Dragon detects high-risk insecure content on the page or when the site presents an invalid certificate. Proceed with caution, because someone on your network (like someone sharing your wi-fi connection) might be messing with the website. If you disclose any information on the website, the person on the network might be able to read it.

To view the security Site Setting menu and Global Default information

- Click on the icon at the left of the URL in the address bar to view the identity information from the drop-down




The upper pane displays the identity information and the lower pane displays and let you change settings for the site that you are currently visit.

- You can also manage items available from the 'Content settings' under the 'Privacy' section
- OR
- Go to `chrome://settings/content`

9.17. The Share Page Button

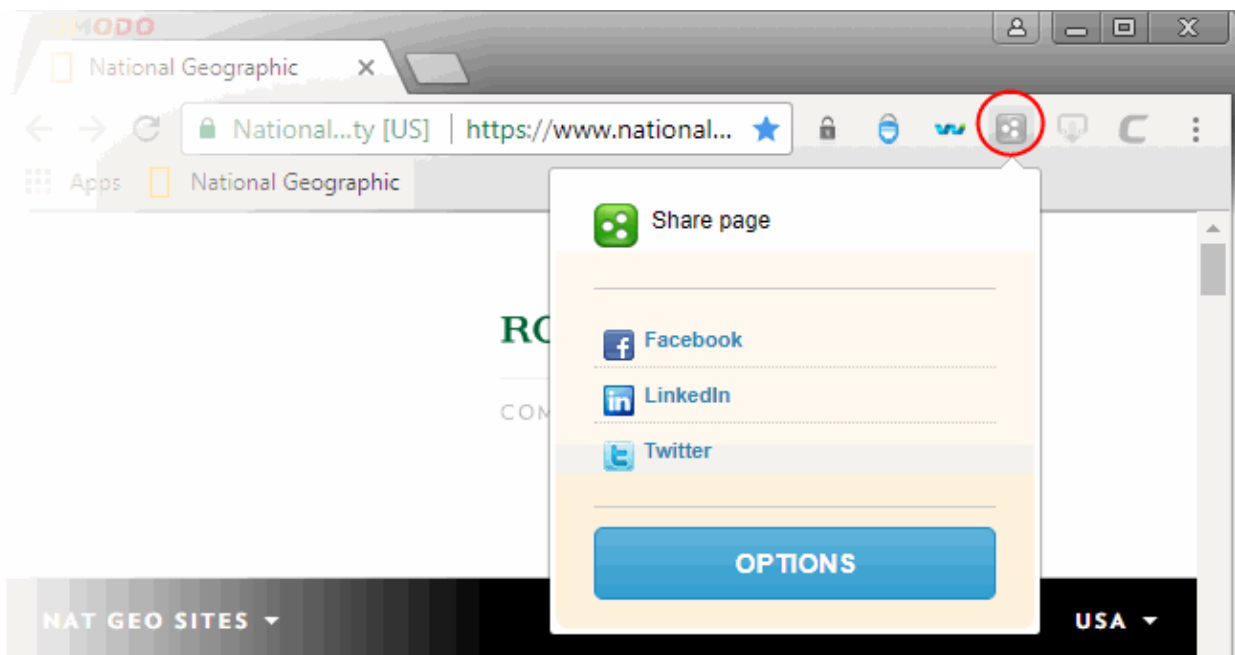
Social networking websites play an important role in our lives, allowing you to easily share information, news and the latest updates with our network of friends. Comodo Dragon allows you to share the web page you are viewing with your friends and family by just clicking the social media button  at the top right of the toolbar.

Apart from the added convenience, this button is also a far more secure way of accessing your account.

Recently, the security of 'Share' buttons embedded on web pages has been called into question. In a 'clickjacking' attack, the 'Share' button on a malicious website will open a fake login page where you will be asked to enter your user-name and password. The hackers will then have access to your account. In another type of attack, the 'Share' button will share a completely different website to the one you are looking at. This means you could unwittingly recommend phishing websites, malware downloads or XXX sites to your network of friends.

The Dragon social media button will always open the genuine Facebook/Twitter/LinkedIn website and allow you to safely login and share the page. It is good practice to use this button instead of the 'Share' buttons on the websites themselves.

- To share a web-page, click the 'Share Page' button 



A 'Share Page' dialog contains shortcut links to share the web page through your Facebook, LinkedIn and Twitter accounts by default. You can add or remove social network sites to this dialog by clicking 'Options'.

- To share the webpage through your desired social networking site, click the respective shortcut.

You will be taken to the respective login page, enabling you to login to your account and share the page.

Note: If you are already logged-in to your account through another tab or another Comodo Dragon window, click the shortcut to directly share the page.

- To add or remove social networking sites, click the 'Options' button from the 'Share page' dialog.

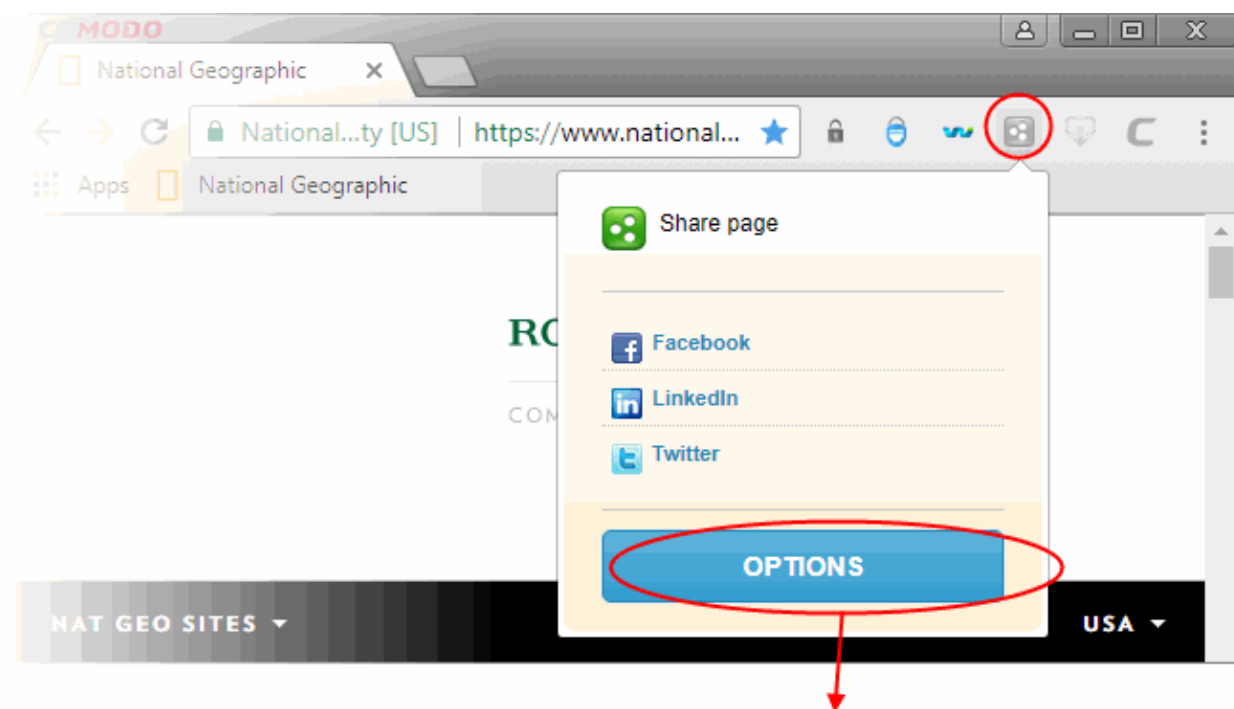

9.18. Configure Access Pages Through A Web Proxy

Comodo Dragon allows you to connect to the internet via a Proxy server.

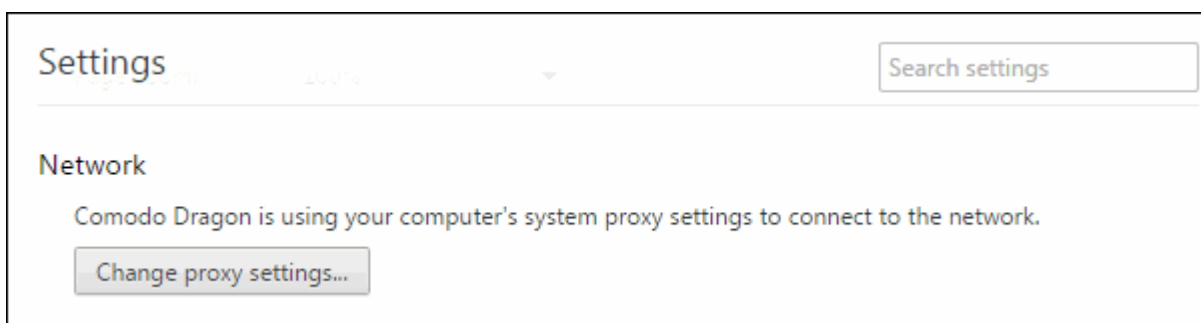
You may consider using a proxy for the following reasons:

- To anonymize your connection to the internet.
- To speed up access to resources.
- To implement access policy to a network (for example, to block undesirable websites).
- To audit usage (for example, to log internet usage).
- To scan traffic for malware prior to it entering or leaving the internal network.

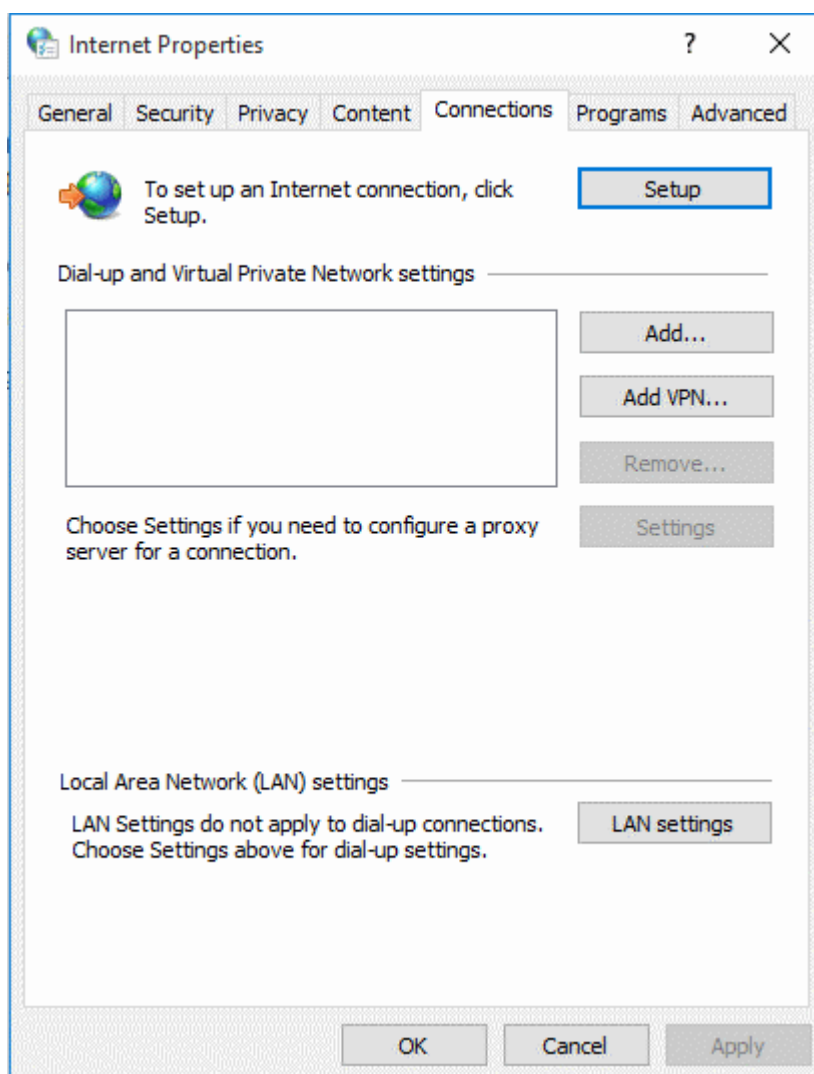

9.19. Adobe Flash Player Storage Settings


Adobe Flash Player storage settings allows a user to modify Flash cookie settings his computer.

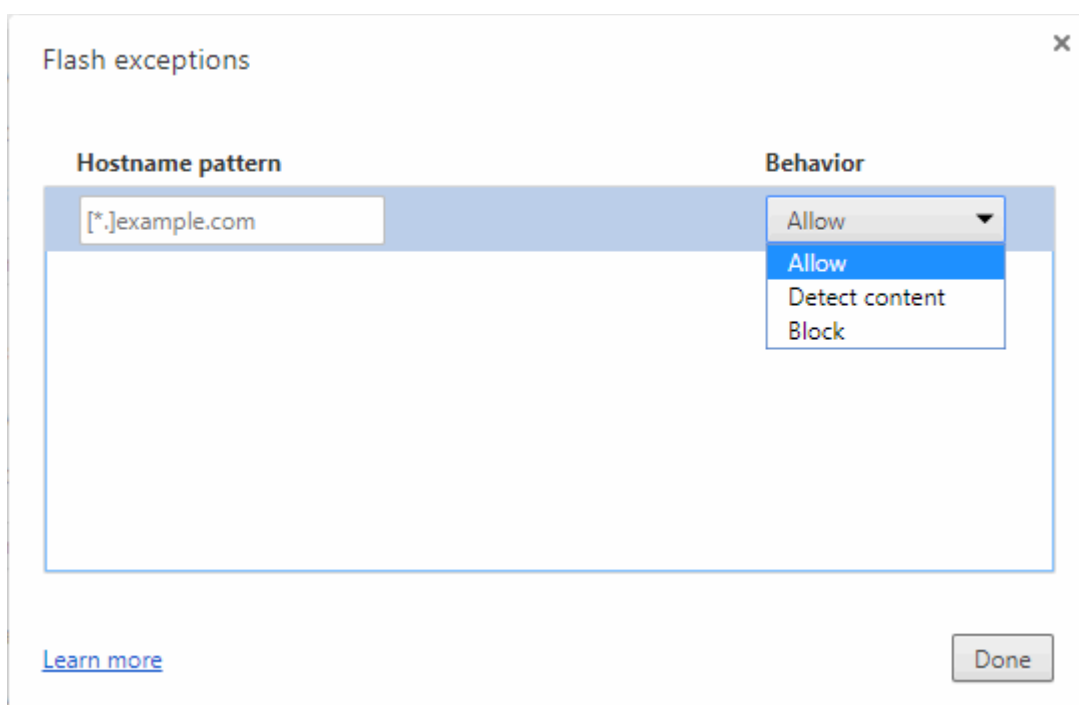

- Click 'Settings' > Scroll down to 'Privacy' section
- Click the 'Content settings' and scroll down to 'Flash'



- Configure the global settings:
 - Allow sites to run flash – If checked, will run Flash without your permission. Important note: Grant this permission only to trustworthy webpages.
 - Detect and run important Flash content (recommended) – Will recognize that flash is available then ask first before allowing sites to run it.
 - Block sites from running Flash – Completely blocks Flash when you're trying to see audio and video content on your computer/ device and runs only when a user submits.

Set-up Flash for specific sites

- Click the menu  button located at the top-left corner
- Click 'Settings' > Scroll down 'Privacy' section
- Click the 'Content settings' and scroll down to 'Flash'
- Click 'Manage exceptions' in the 'Flash' to specify websites as exceptions to the default 'Flash' behavior.




- To add a restriction for a website, enter the domain name in the "Hostname pattern" field. You can also enter an IP address, an IPv6 address, or a non-http URL.

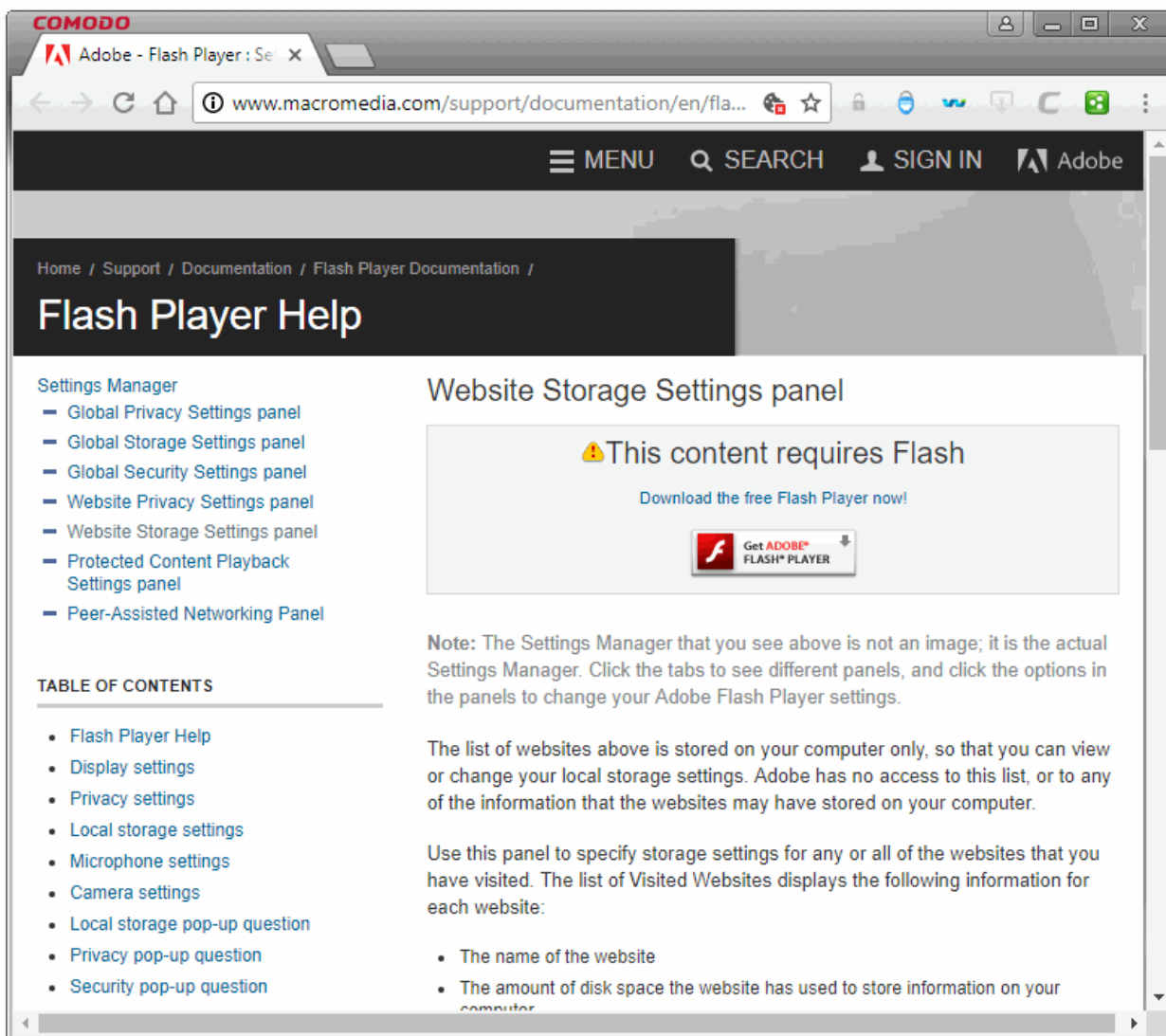
Tip: To create exceptions for all sub-domains of a website, add '*' before the domain name. For example, entering *.comodo.com, will create restrictions for all sub-domains like help.comodo.com, enterprise.comodo.com and so on.

- Use the drop-down menu under 'Behavior' to choose whether or not to allow site you would like to block from accessing Flash. The options available are 'Allow', 'Detect content' and 'Block'.
- Repeat the process to add more websites.
- To remove a website from the list, click 'X' that appears on the right end of the domain name on selecting it.
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

To modify your Flash storage settings

- Click the menu  button located at the top-left corner
- Click 'Settings' > Scroll down to 'Privacy' section
- Click the 'Content settings' > 'Manage extensions' in the 'Cookies' > 'Adobe Flash Player settings' link

9.20. Scan Websites for Malware Using Web Inspector


Comodo Dragon has a vital security feature that scans webpages and checks whether they perform malicious activities or host malware.

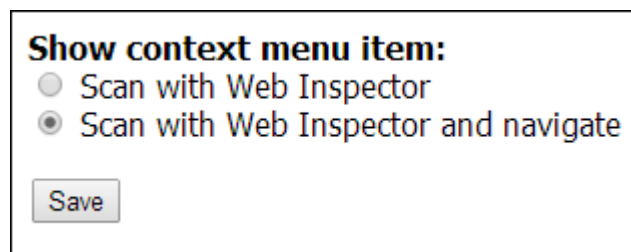

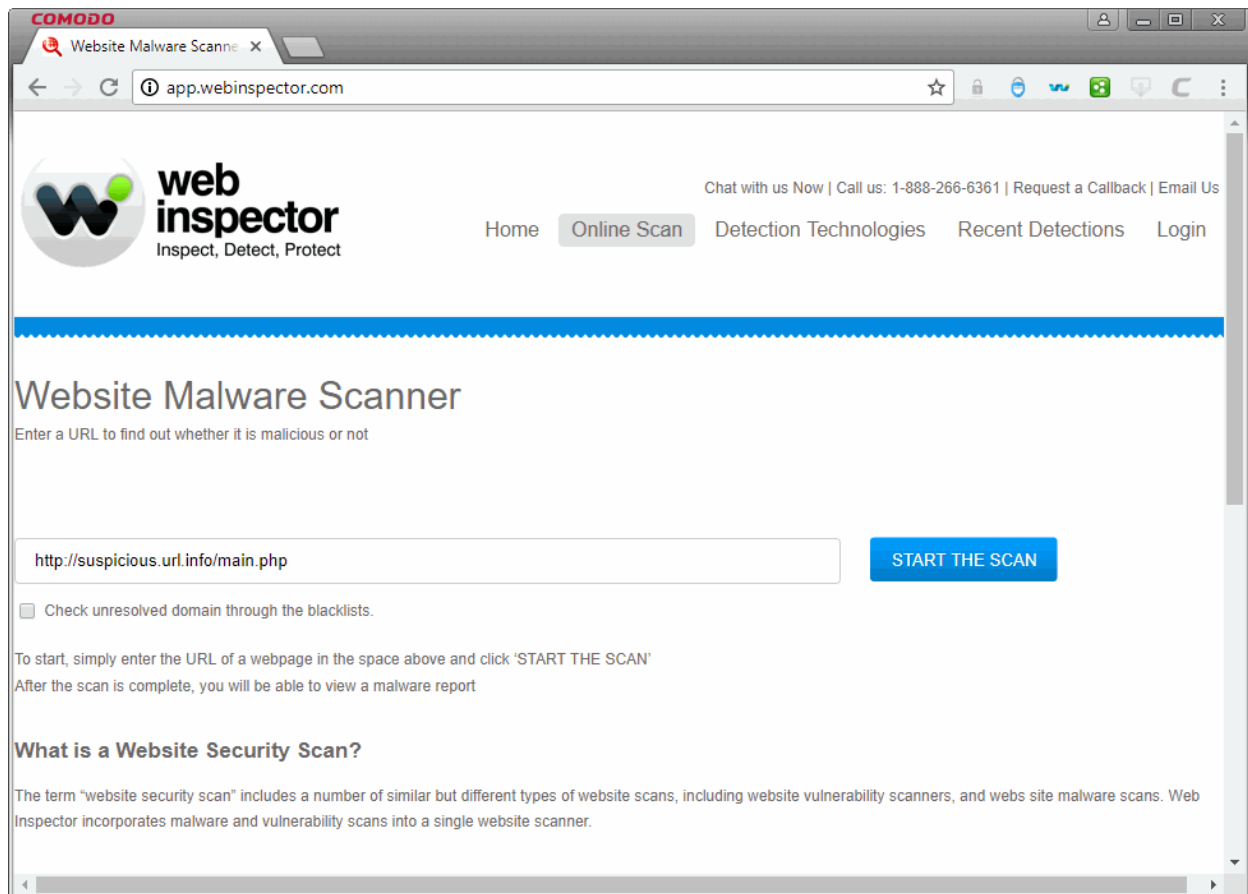

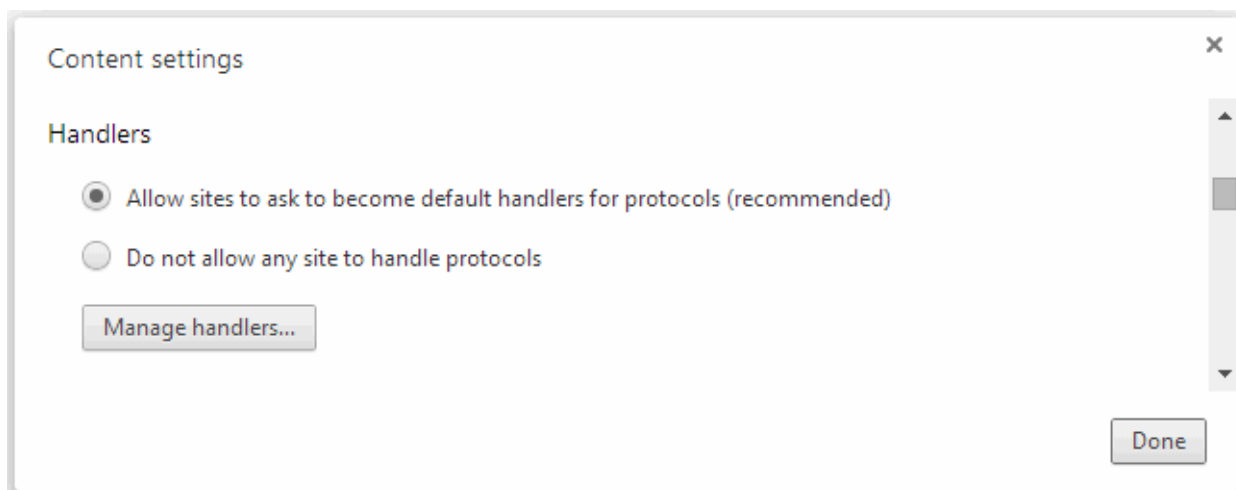

9.21. Manage Protocol Handlers

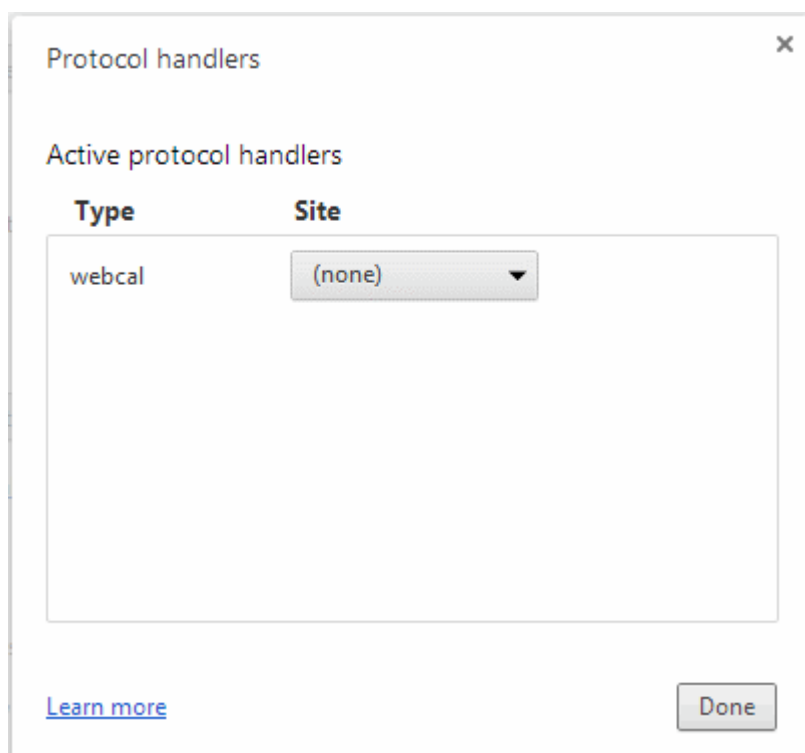
Some websites use different protocol handlers and web applications to open different types of links in a web page. For example, email links are prefixed with 'mailto:'. When a user clicks the link, the webpage, if it uses a web based application to handle emails, will ask permission to use the application to execute the link.

Comodo Dragon allows you to configure the handlers.

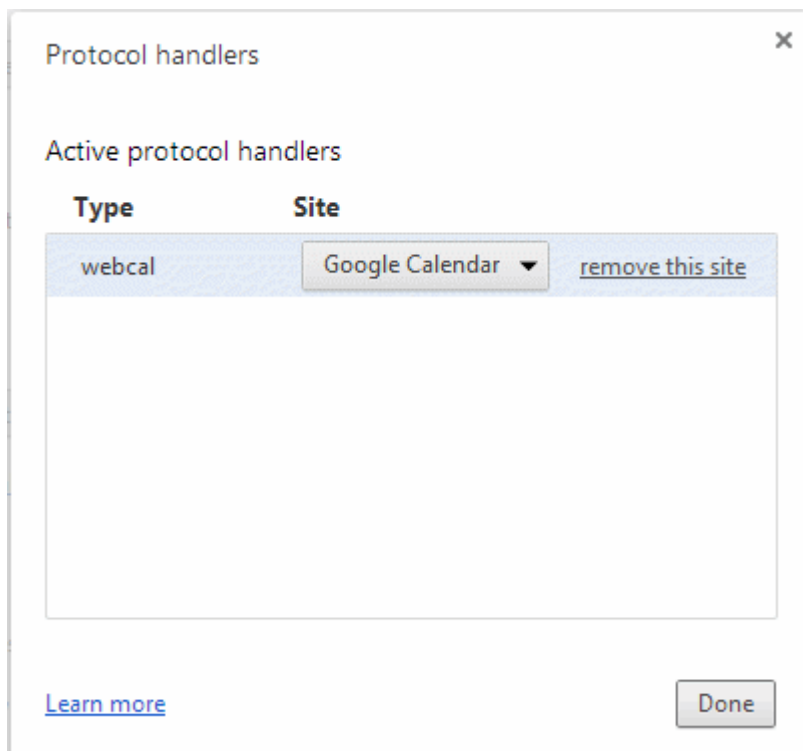
- Click the menu button  located at the top-right
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings' link
- Click the 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' section > scroll down to 'Handlers'



- Select 'Allow sites to ask to become default handlers for protocols' if you want Dragon to allow the web services to display prompts for protocol handler requests.
- Select the 'Do not allow any site to handle protocols' to disable prompts for protocol handlers requests.
- Click the 'Manage handlers...' button, if you have multiple handlers for the same protocol.



- To remove a site, select the handler you would like to remove, then hang over the cursor and click the '[remove this site](#)' link.



9.22. Using the Address Bar (Omnibox)

The address bar (omnibox) in Comodo Dragon also serves as a search bar and allows you to enter web addresses as well as use it as a search field. On entering a search term, Dragon uses the default search engine and displays the search results. Refer to the section '[Managing Your Search Engines](#)' for more details.




Search for web pages and visit web sites

- Type your search term in the address bar.
- Press 'Enter' to see the results from your default search engine
- To visit a site, type its address into the omnibox then press 'Enter'.

Search for applications, bookmarks, browsing history and related items

Comodo Dragon automatically shows you predictions of your search term to choose from, when you start typing the term, using matches from your apps, bookmarks, performing mathematical calculations and browsing history, relieving you from fully typing the search term/web address. If enabled, Comodo Dragon can also use prediction service from web to show you related search terms and websites.

The omnibox contains the following items:

-  Allows you to bookmark the currently displayed page. If this icon is yellow it means the page is already bookmarked. See [Manage Bookmarks](#) to learn more about managing bookmarks.
-  The search icon appears next to searches, including related searches if you have the prediction service turned on.
-  The site information icon on the left of the address bar indicates the SSL certificate status of the website. See '[Website Security Indicators](#)' for more details.

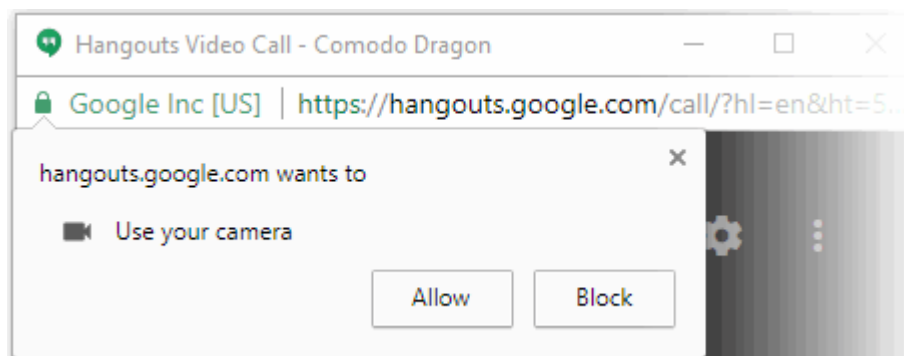

9.23. Configuring Media Settings


- Comodo Dragon allows you to configure settings for microphones and cameras so you have better control over which websites and applications are allowed to use them.
- Sites such as Google Hangouts and Skype require the use of these devices if you are placing a video call.
- Dragon will alert you whenever a website asks to use your microphone and camera.

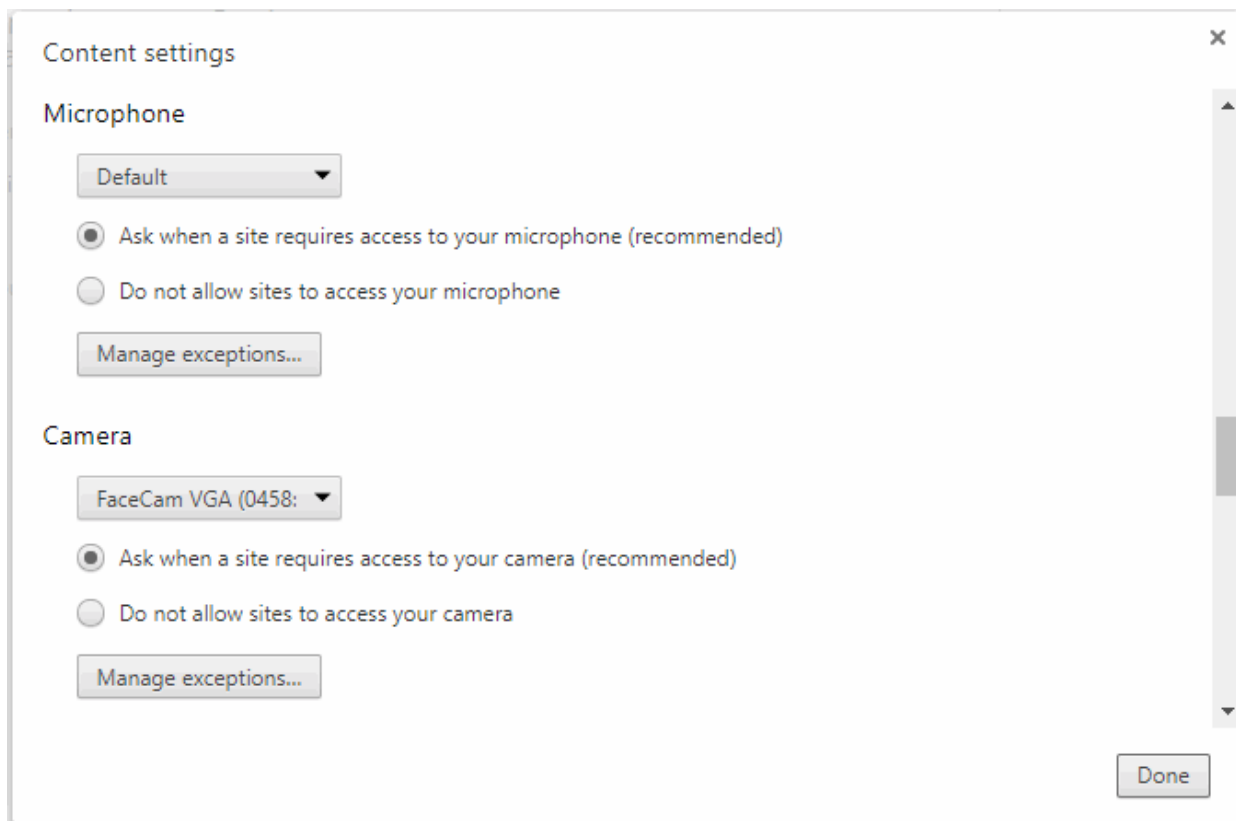


- **Allow** - Provides permission to the site to use your camera or microphone
- **Block** - Prevents the website from using your camera or microphone

Your preference for the site will be stored and you can manage the permissions from the 'Manage exceptions' in the Content settings.

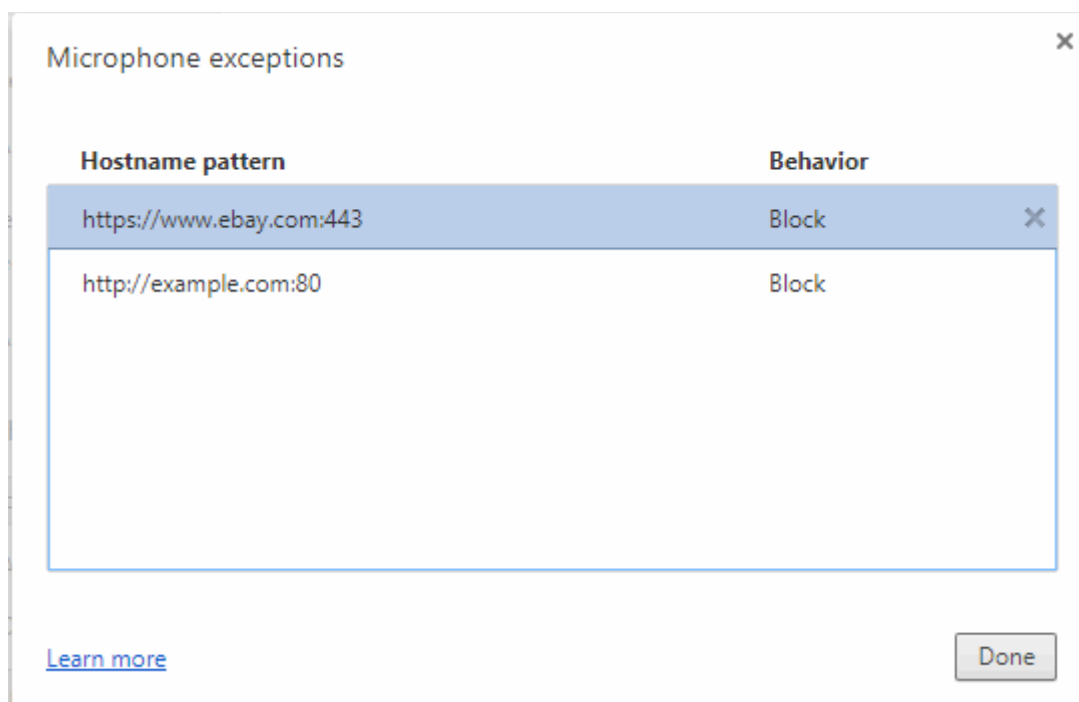

 - **Do not allow sites to access your microphone / camera** - Automatically denies any site (websites you have already visited and those you haven't yet visited) requests to access your camera / microphone.

To add list of websites as exceptions to the global settings and configure access to them individually:

- Open the webpage you want to set global permissions
- Click the security information icon on the address bar
- Click the behavior next to 'Microphone' / 'Camera'
- Select whether or not to allow microphone/camera mode from the drop-down
- Repeat the process to add more websites.




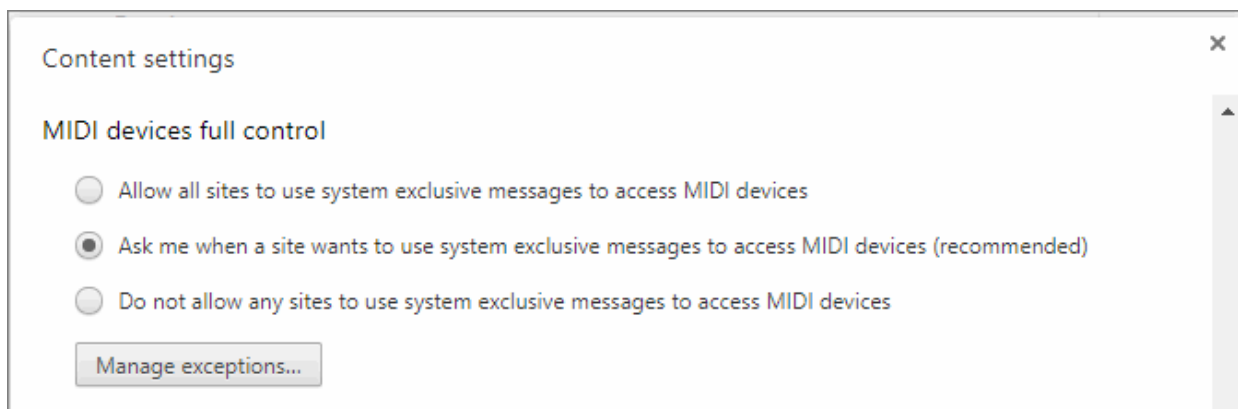
- To remove permissions for sites that you have already given via alerts to have access to camera / microphone, click 'Manage exceptions' button
- Click 'X' that appears on the right end of the domain name on selecting it
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

9.24. Configure Access to MIDI Devices

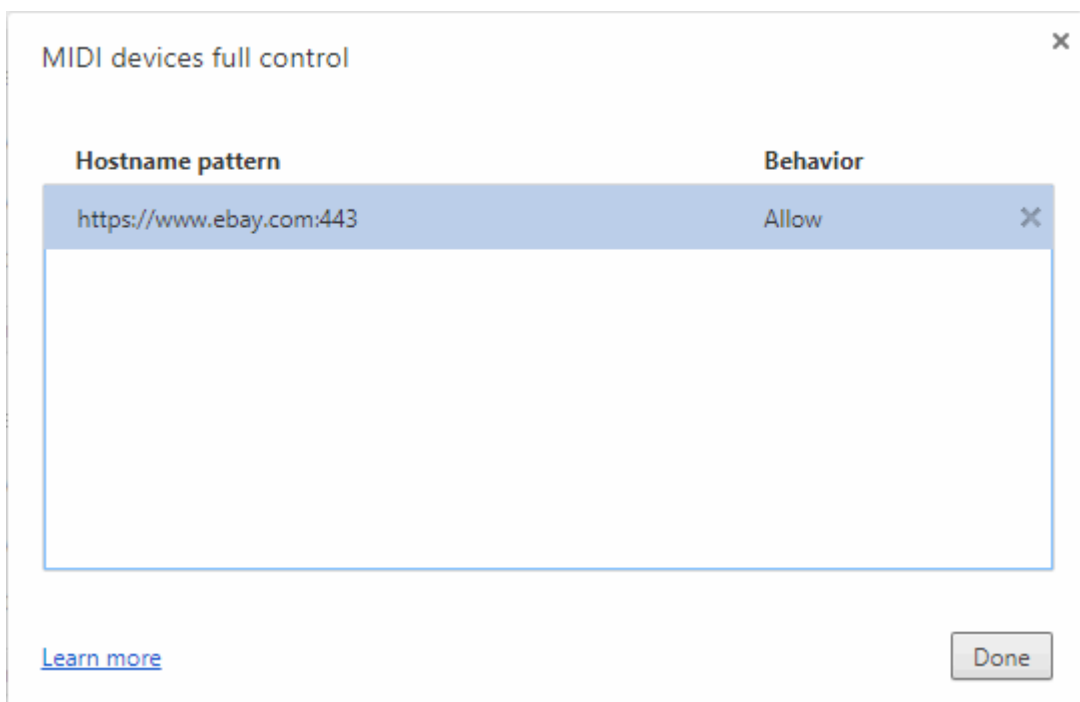
- Websites for music creation and editing, access your MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) devices for transfer of data by exchanging System Exclusive (SysEx) messages.
- Comodo Dragon is 'MIDI enabled' by default and allows you to use your MIDI devices with MIDI specific websites.
- You can configure Dragon to globally accept or deny requests from websites to access MIDI devices.
- You can also create exceptions which will allow or deny access on a per-website basis.

To configure access to MIDI Devices

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right and select 'Settings'
- Scroll down and click the 'Show advanced settings' link
- Click the 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' section
- Scroll down to 'MIDI devices full control'



- Choose the global access restriction setting for MIDI devices:
 - **Allow all sites to use system exclusive messages to access MIDI devices** - Allows Dragon to pass 'SysEx' between the website and the MIDI devices
 - **Ask me when a site wants to use system exclusive messages to access MIDI devices** - Displays a pop-up, enabling you to allow or block the MIDI device access request from the website
 - **Do not allow any sites to use system exclusive messages to access MIDI devices** - Blocks the websites from accessing the MIDI devices




To add list of websites as exceptions to the global settings and configure access to them individually:

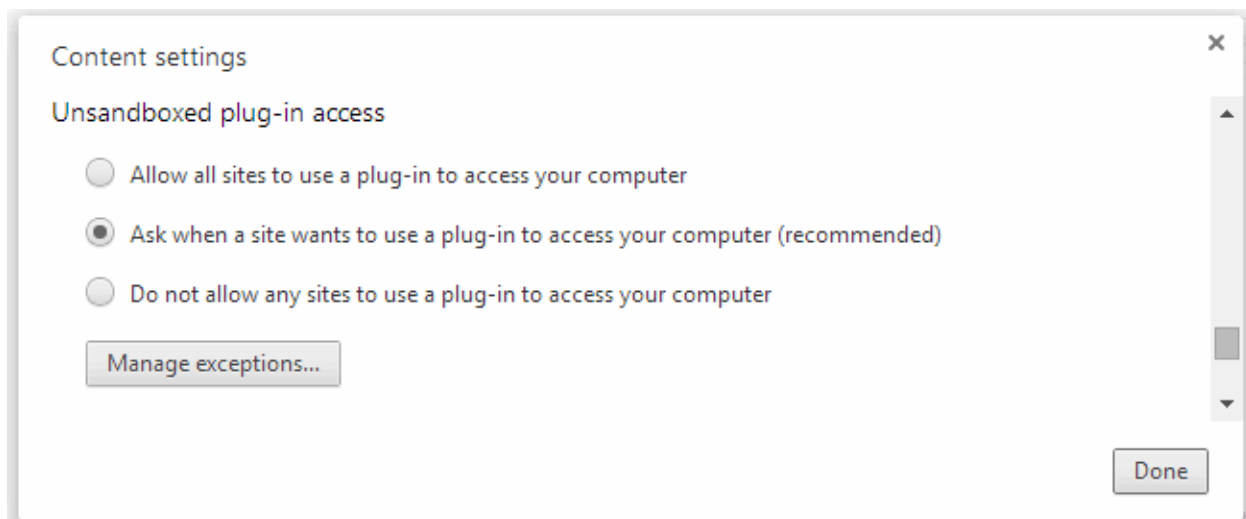
- Open the webpage you want to set global permissions
- Click the security information icon on the address bar
- Click the behavior next to 'Midi devices full control'
- Select whether or not to allow access to MIDI devices from the drop-down
- Repeat the process to add more websites.

To remove a website from the list

- Click the 'Manage exceptions' button
- Select a domain name and click 'X' that appears on the right-end of the domain
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

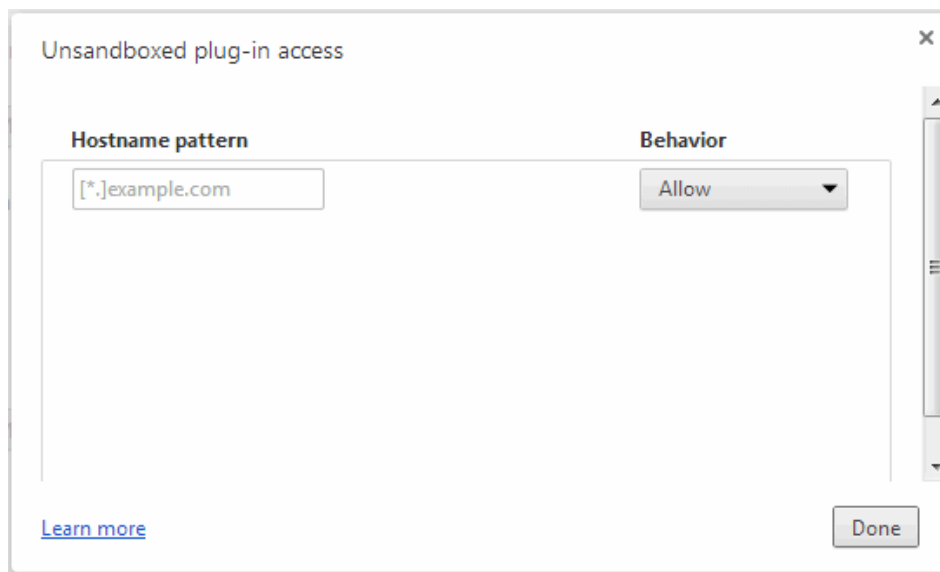
9.25. Configure Unsandboxed Plug-in Access Settings

- Some websites require plug-ins to have direct, unsandboxed, access, to your computers resources.
- For example, they may need to install additional software on your computer. Such files might contain harmful and malicious software that could be harmful to your computer.
- Comodo Dragon can be configured to protect your computer by blocking unsandboxed plug-ins from automatically accessing files on your computer.
- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link.
- Click 'Content settings' in the Privacy section.
- Scroll down to 'Unsandboxed plug-in access'.



- **Allow all sites to use a plug-in to access my computer** (not recommended) - Allows all unsandboxed plug-ins automatically access your computer.
- **Ask me when a site wants to use a plug-in to access my computer (recommended)** - Asks you for permission whenever an unsandboxed plug-in requests access to your computer.
- **Do not allow any sites to use a plug-in to access my computer** - Automatically prevents any unsandboxed plug-in requests to access your computer.

To allow or deny specific sites to use plug-in access, click 'Manage exceptions' button.




- You can edit permissions for previously granted or denied permission for specific sites.
- You can also add or remove websites from the list.

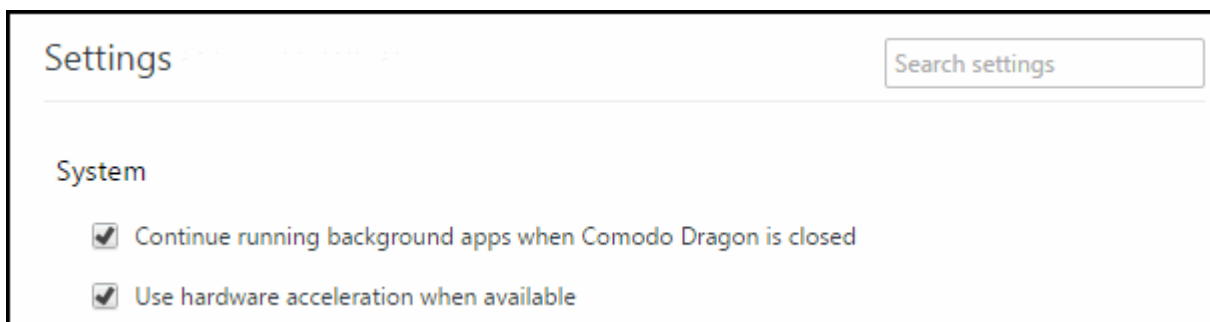
9.26. Run Dragon Browser in the Background and Accelerate Performance

- Some extensions and apps continue to run after you have closed Comodo Dragon so they can continue to deliver their services to you.
- For example, an app that checks your mail might continue to run so that it can inform you of new messages.
- A list of still-running apps will appear on your desktop system tray if this is the case.

Comodo Dragon is also capable of using hardware acceleration to improve video playback on, for example, YouTube and 3D Earth view in Google maps.

To modify background apps and/or hardware acceleration

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > click 'Show advanced settings' link.
- Scroll down to the 'System' section.



- Select 'Continue running background apps when Comodo Dragon is closed' to keep browser processes running in the background.
- Select 'Use hardware acceleration when available (requires Dragon restart)' to deliver hardware-accelerated 3D graphics without installing additional software.

1. What is Media Downloader?

Media Downloader is a free and unique extension built into Comodo Dragon that allows you to quickly download streaming video or audio files from websites like YouTube.

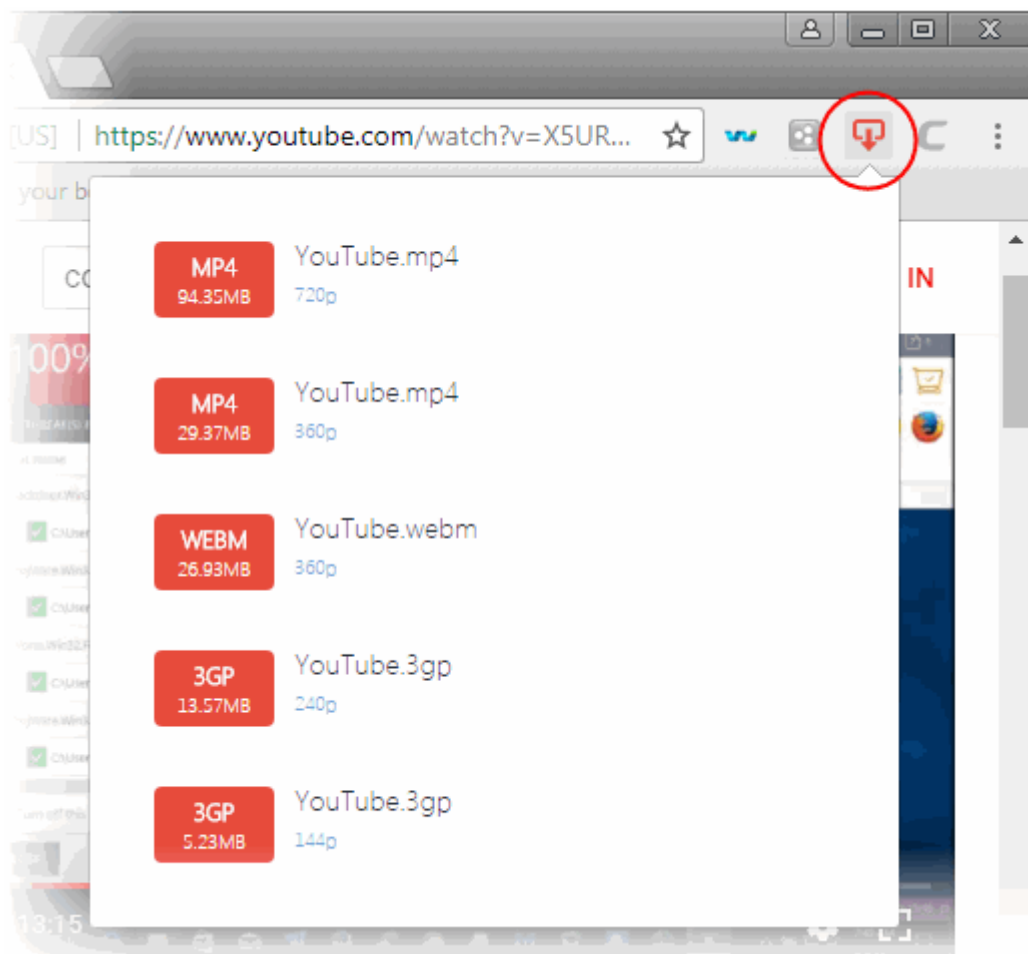
2. How do I get Media Downloader?

Media Downloader is available as part of Comodo Dragon internet browser, which is available from <http://browser.comodo.com/>

3. How do I use Media Downloader?

- Visit a website which features streaming videos. For example, www.youtube.com
- Start playing any video on the page and the Media Downloader button at the top-right should become active:

- Click the 'Media Downloader' button and a menu will appear which lists the videos detected on the current page. Select the video you want to begin the download.




4. What is the default download directory?

Media Downloader will download files to your default Dragon download directory. By default this is:

C:\Users\\Downloads

To view or change the download directory in Dragon:

- Click the menu  at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings'.
- Scroll down to the 'Downloads' section to view and modify your default download folder.

If you have not set a download directory in Dragon, then Media Downloader will ask you to choose a save location at the point of download.

5. Which websites can I download video from?

While it is not possible to create an exhaustive list, Media Downloader will allow you to download from most sites that include streaming video or audio. If you are unsure, the best way is just to test it out. Visit a website, play the video/audio and see if the Media Downloader icon becomes active.

6. Which audio and video formats can I download?

Media Downloader can download files in the following formats:

flv, mpeg, mp3, ogg, mp4, webm, m4v

The exact formats that will be presented for a particular video or audio file will vary from site to site.

7. What resolutions can I download video in?

Media Downloader will allow you to download in every resolution and file format that the original video was made available. The number of choices you see will vary from video to video.

8. Can Media Downloader convert streaming files to .avi?

Not right now. Media Downloader is a download only tool at this point.

9. Can I download embedded YouTube videos?

A: Not directly, but you can usually download by obtaining the original YouTube URL.

To do this:

- Visit a site containing embedded YouTube videos. For example, www.comodo.tv
- Right-click on the video, select 'Copy Video URL'
- Paste the URL into your browser address bar.
- The Media Downloader icon should become active, allowing you to download




10. Can I download only the audio from a video?

Not at the moment. We are looking into adding this functionality.

11. How do I disable or remove Media Downloader?

Media Downloader can be disabled or removed in the Dragon 'Extensions' page.

To do this, first open the 'Extensions' page:

- Click the menu  at the top-right browser interface:
- Select 'Settings' then 'Extensions'.

OR

- Enter 'chrome://extensions' in the address-bar.

THEN

- To disable an extension, uncheck the 'Enabled' checkbox besides it.

OR

- To remove an extension, click the trashcan on the right side.

12. Windows Media Player won't play the videos I downloaded. Do you know of any good, free media players?

13. If a page has multiple videos, can I download them all at once?


Not yet, though we are thinking of adding this feature. Right now, Media Downloader can grab the individual video that is currently playing (or is paused).

9.28. Reset Browser Settings

- Dragon allows you to reset all browser settings back to the 'factory' default settings.
- This can be useful when the browser become unstable or experience other issues because it clears out all

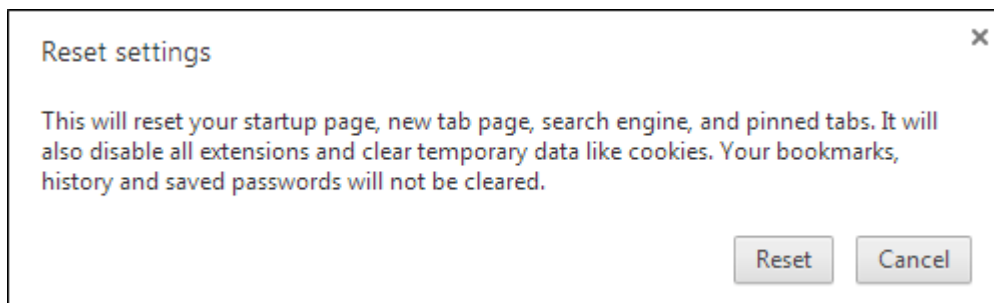
extensions, temporary data and other modified settings.

To reset your browser settings

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link.
- Scroll down to the 'Reset settings' section.



- Click the 'Reset settings' button.
- A pop-up dialog will describe which features will be reset and allow you to proceed or cancel the action:



- Click 'Reset' to apply the change.

Tip: Your saved bookmarks, password and history will not be cleared.

The following settings will be reset:

- Home page will be hidden
- Startup tabs will be cleared
- New Tab page will be empty
- Pinned tabs will be unpinned
- Default and saved search engine will be cleared
- Extensions and themes will be disabled
- Cookies and site data will be cleared
- Content settings will be cleared

9.29. Cloud Print Settings

The cloud print feature allows you to print documents from anywhere. You can make your printers available to you from multiple devices such as your phone, tablet, PC.


Cloud Print lets you:

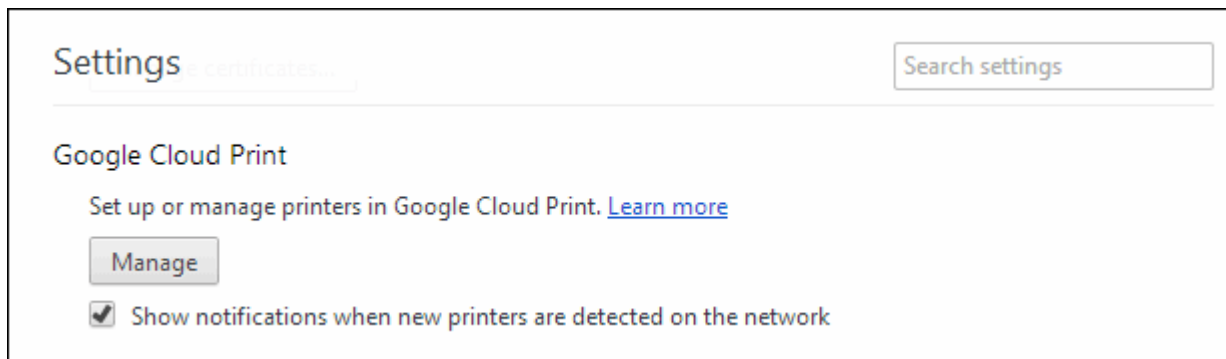
- Print from anywhere
- Manage your printer

- Share print access with your friends

Note: Make sure you connect your printer to the service before starting cloud printing.

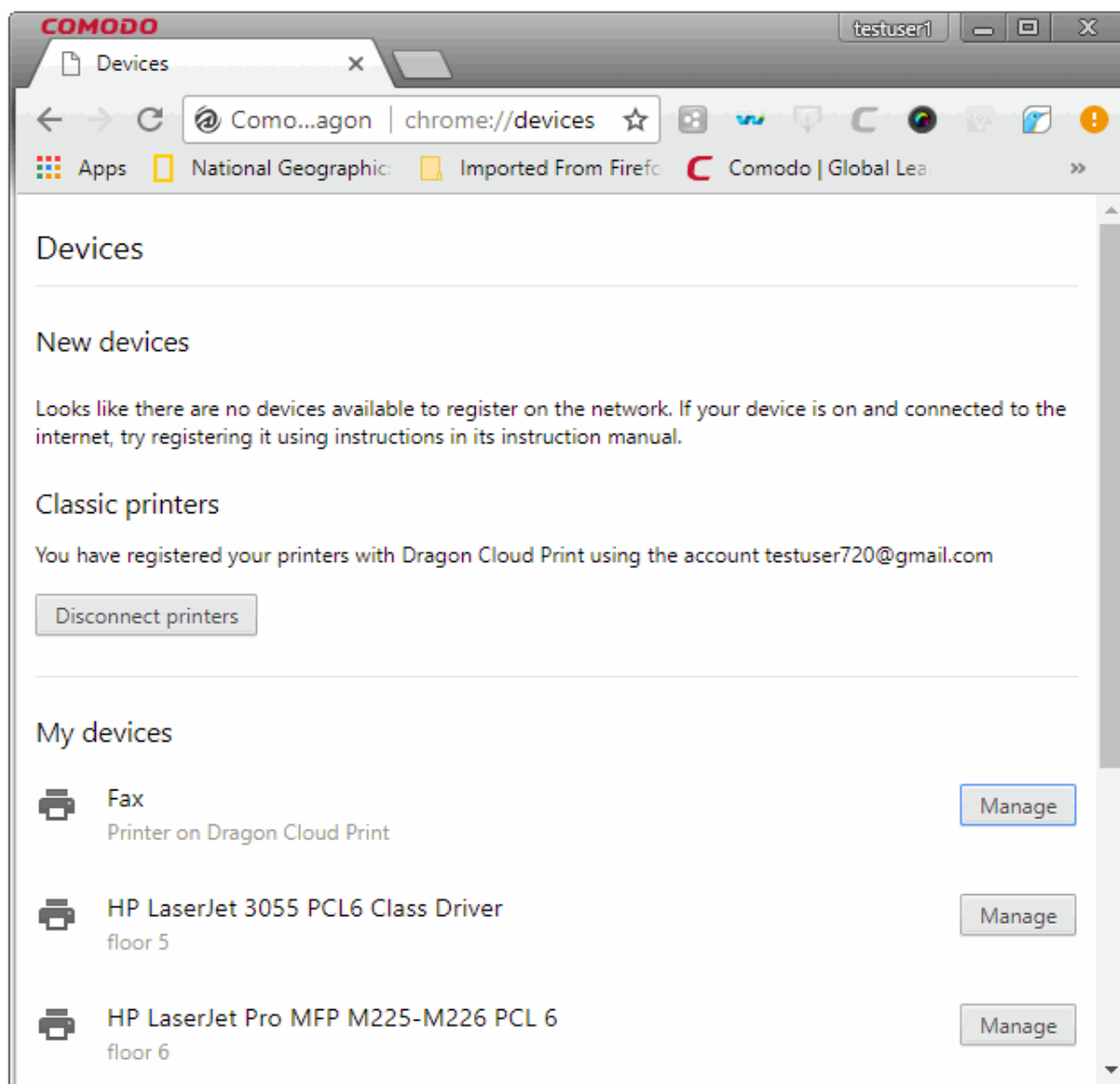
To configure Google Cloud Print settings

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings'.
- Scroll down to the 'Google Cloud Print' section.



- **Show notifications when new printers are detected on the network** - If enabled, an alert will be displayed when a new printer is detected that can be added to Google Cloud Print.
- Click the 'Manage' to customize devices and printers you want to associate with your network
- If you have not signed in to Comodo Dragon with your Google Account, click the 'sign in' link under 'My devices'.
- The list of available devices that are already registered with Google Cloud Print will be displayed including any new devices that are available on the network.
- Choose the printers that you want to connect and then click 'Add printers'.

The selected printer is now connected to Google Cloud Print via your Google Account. You can print to this cloud printer from anywhere when signed in.




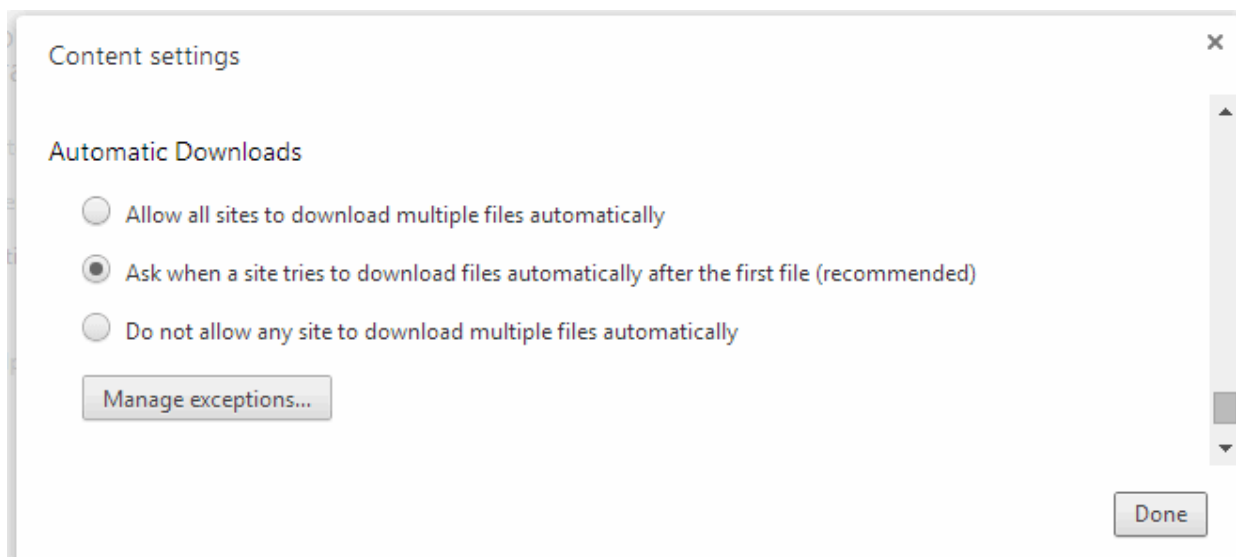
You can share your printer with your friends who also can print after signing in to their Google Accounts. Select a printer you want to share from the list of printers and click 'Share'. Your friends will receive a notification.

9.30. Set Automatic Downloads on Dragon

Automatic download settings tell Comodo Dragon whether and how it should handle data downloaded from websites that you visit.

To configure automatic downloads

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down and click 'Show advanced settings'
- Click 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' > scroll down to the 'Automatic Downloads'.

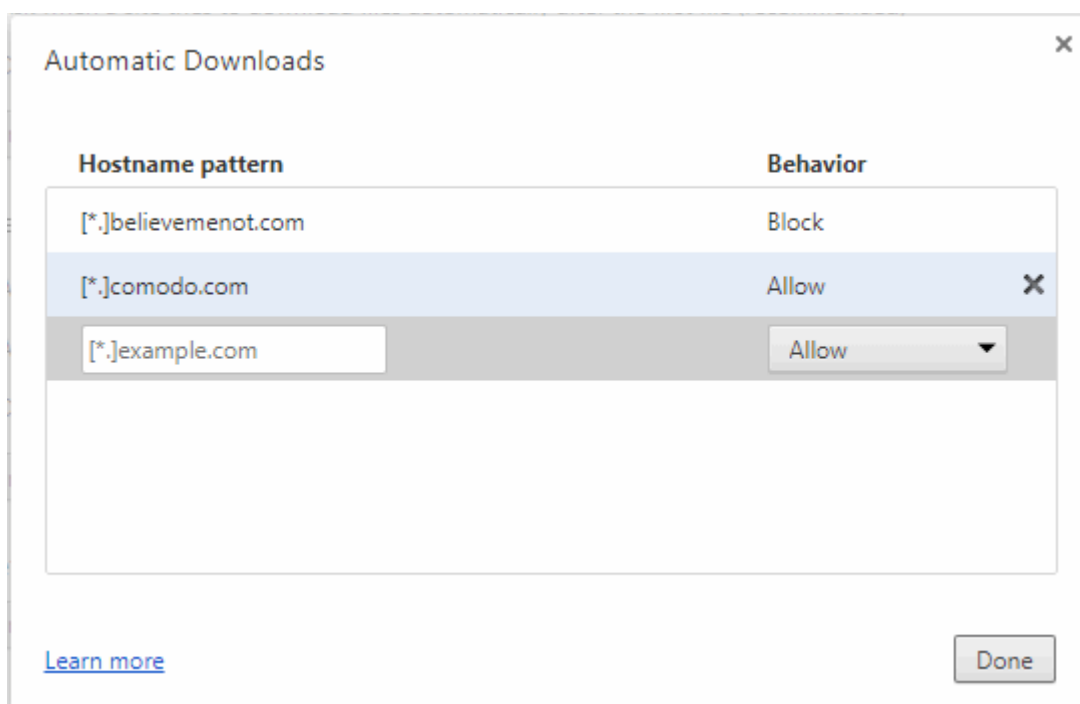


- Configure the global settings:
 - **Allow all sites to download multiple files automatically** - No restriction. Dragon allows automatic download of multiples files from all websites.
 - **Ask when a site tries to download files automatically after the first file (recommended)** - An alert will be shown when a website tries to automatically download multiple files. The first file will be allowed to be downloaded without any alert.
 - **Do not allow any site to download multiple files automatically** - Dragon will not allow websites automatic download of multiple files.

To add Exceptions

Comodo Dragon allows you to control automatic downloads for some specified domains or websites.

- Click 'Manage exceptions' button.




- Enter the domain name in the text box below 'Hostname Pattern' column to create an exception.
- Insert [*] before the domain name to create exception for the entire domain. For example, [*] comodo.com.

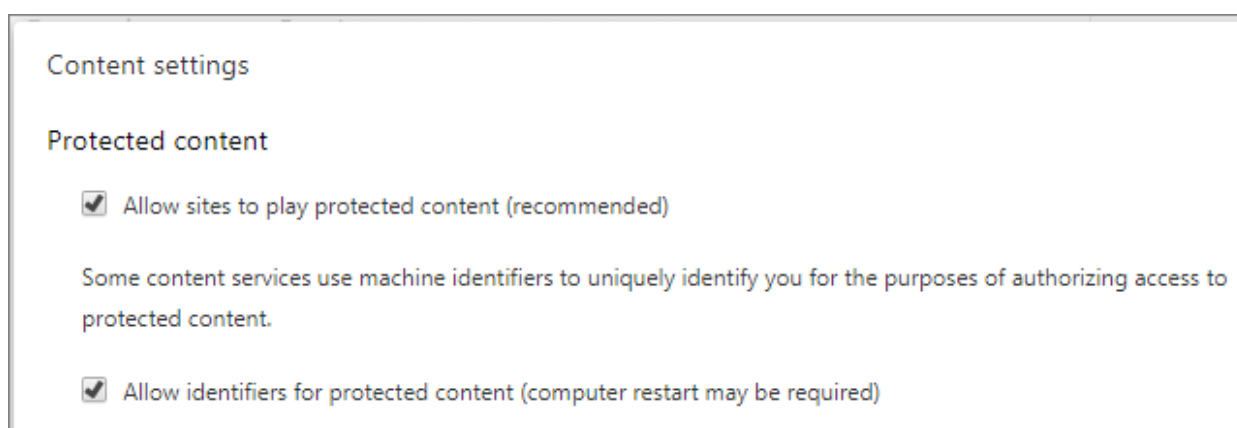
Non-http url, IP address and IPv6 address can also be entered.

- In the 'Behavior' drop-down box, select either 'Allow' or 'Block'.
- Click 'Done' for your settings to take effect.

9.31. Protected Content

Some downloaded or streaming videos require authorization in order to preserve copyright restrictions (for example, Netflix). The 'Protected Content' area allows you to configure settings which allow these services to identify you.

- Click the menu button  located at the top-right corner
- Select 'Settings' > Scroll down to 'Show advanced settings' link
- Click 'Content settings' in the 'Privacy' section > scroll down to 'Protected Content'




- Deselect 'Allow sites to play protected content' to block webpages from playing protected content.
- Uncheck 'Allow identifiers for protected content (computer restart may be required)' to disable access. Please note, this may prevent you from watching some protected content.

9.32. How to Add Accessibility Features to Dragon

You can add extensions to improve your Dragon experience, such as customizable color filter, caret browsing and more.

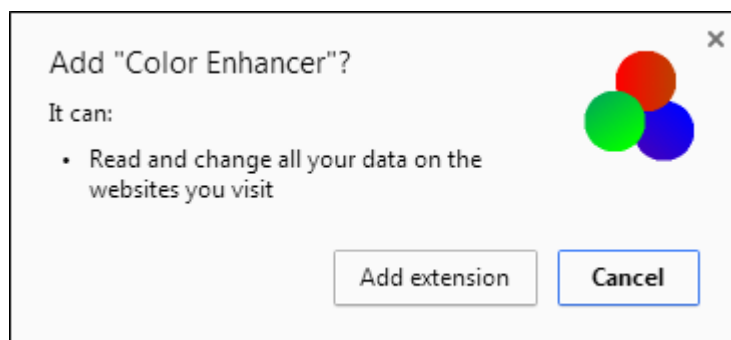

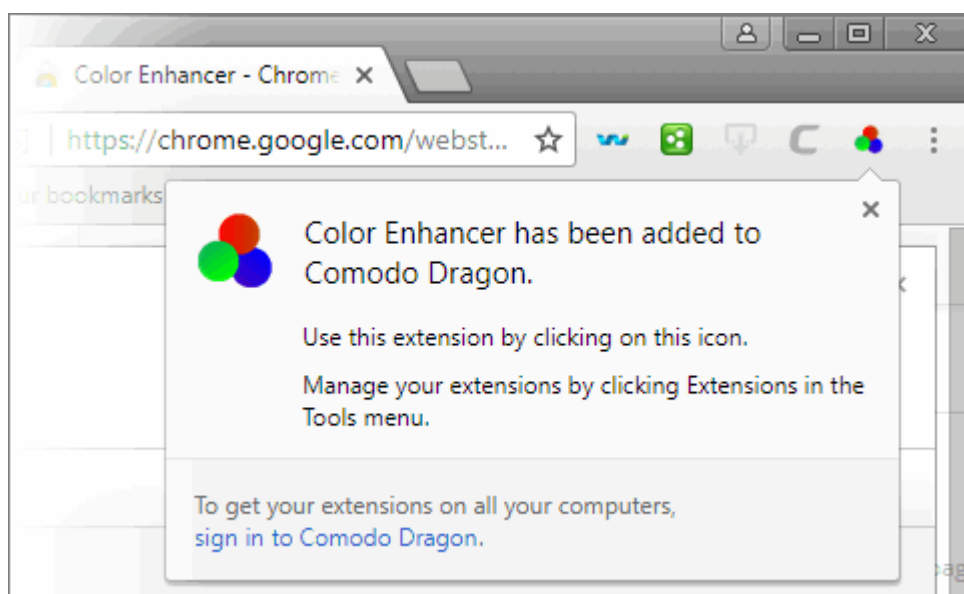

10.1. Errors and Crashes in Comodo Dragon

You may find your computer screen throwing up error messages while using Comodo Dragon. Click the following links to find out more about specific errors:

Unable to find a previously installed extension or app

This error is displayed when the browser is unable to locate an app or extension that was previously installed. The following may be one of the reasons the browser is unable to locate:

- The extension or app may have been uninstalled. Reinstall the extension or app.
- The web store that you downloaded the extension or app may have removed it for some reasons including not following their legal agreements etc.
- Dragon user profile may be corrupted. Create a new user profile.

To create a new user profile in Comodo Dragon

- Exit Comodo Dragon if it is open.
- In the 'Start' menu click 'Run'.
- In the 'Run' dialog, enter the directory applicable to your system given the following table:.

Operating System	Enter in the 'Run' text field
Windows XP	%USERPROFILE%\Local Settings\Application Data\Comodo\Dragon\User Data
Windows 7 or Windows Vista	%USERPROFILE%\AppData\Local\Comodo\Dragon\User Data

- Click 'OK'.
- In the explorer window that opens, rename the 'Default' folder as 'Backup default'.
- Open Comodo Dragon.
- The browser automatically creates a new 'Default' folder.
- Copy and paste the backup details into the new default folder.

Please note that some of the old profile might be corrupted and may result in corrupting the new default folder also. If you want the old bookmarks, copy the file 'Bookmarks.bak' from the backup folder and paste it into the new 'Default' folder.

'He's dead, Jim!' message

This message will be displayed when a web-page crashes suddenly. Just reload the page by pressing the reload button besides the address bar. If the message is displayed for all the pages, check the following to resolve the issue:

Firewall and antivirus applications

The firewall or antivirus application in your system may not allow Comodo Dragon to function properly. To confirm, disable firewall and antivirus application and open Dragon again. If it works, create an exception in the firewall or antivirus settings for Comodo Dragon and re-enable the firewall and antivirus applications in your system.

Extensions

Disable your extensions one by one and open Dragon. If any one of the extension is causing the problem, uninstall it.

To disable or uninstall an extension

- Click the menu  at the top-right corner.
- Select 'More tools' > 'Extensions'.

The 'Extensions' page will open:

- Click the 'Disable' link to disable the extension.
- Click the 'Uninstall' link to remove the extension completely from your browser.

Malware

Use the latest version of Comodo Internet Security to scan your system for any malware and to remove it. Download Comodo Internet Security from <http://personalfirewall.comodo.com/>.

User Profile

One of the reasons could be that your user profile may be corrupted. [Click here](#) to know the steps to create a new user profile.

Comodo Dragon no longer works or closes after several seconds

If Comodo Dragon closes as soon as you open it and displays no error messages, one of the likely reason may be your user profile is corrupted. Create a new user profile and see if this solves the problem.

Update plug-ins

Plug-in - a piece of software which enhances another software application, processes type of web content like Windows Media Files, Flash etc. Unfortunately, the plug-ins are not updated automatically and over a period of time get outdated as newer versions are released. The new versions of plug-ins may have better security features than the older versions - an important reason to keep your plug-ins updated to avoid potential security vulnerability.

Comodo Dragon automatically detects plug-in that is not up-to-date with security vulnerability and alerts you with a message below the address bar that the plug-in has been blocked.

- Click 'Update plug-in' in the message to install the latest version of the plug-in.
- Click 'Run this time' in the message to run the current plug-in without upgrading though this not desirable.
- **Click here** to know more about managing plug-ins.

The following plug-in has crashed

If a plug-in used by a web-page that you are on currently closes suddenly or becomes unresponsive, the message 'The following plug-in has crashed...' will be displayed. Wait for the plug-in to restart or close the process manually in the 'Task manager' window. Reload the page by pressing the reload button besides the address bar.

Web-Pages load slowly or fail to load

There could be many reasons why the web-pages are not loading quickly in Comodo Dragon. First ascertain that the problem persists only for Comodo Dragon only. Open the pages that are loading slowly in Comodo Dragon or don't load at all in other browsers.


If the web-pages are loading slowly only in Dragon, try the following:

Open the web-pages in an incognito window

If the web-pages are loading normally in an incognito window, then the problem may be with your browsing data or with extensions. These are disabled when you are using an incognito window. To resolve the problem:

- Disable all your extensions and enable them one by one until the web-pages load normally in Dragon standard window. **Click here** to know how to disable extensions.
- Delete your cookies, cache and browsing history.
- Restart Comodo Dragon after closing all the browser windows.
- Check whether the settings in antivirus and firewall applications in your system are configured to allow Comodo Dragon.

Disable Predict network actions feature

- Click the menu  at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link.
- In the 'Privacy' section, deselect the 'Use a prediction service to load pages more quickly' checkbox.

Select the feature again if the problem is not resolved. Check for the following error messages.

'Oops! This link appears broken'


Comodo Dragon displays this message if it is not able to find the web-page. One of the reasons could be that the web-page could be down temporarily. Check in other browsers if the web-page is opening. If it does, then Dragon may not be connecting to the Internet properly.

- Use the latest version of Comodo Internet Security to scan your system for any malware and to remove it. Download Comodo Internet Security from <http://personalfirewall.comodo.com/>.
- Delete your cookies, cache and browsing history.

'Resolving proxy'

If this message appears on the lower left side of Dragon browser, it may be set to open pages via a web proxy resulting in slower loading of websites or searches. Change your proxy settings.

To configure proxy settings

- Click the menu  at the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' > 'Show advanced settings' link.
- In the 'Network' section, click the 'Change proxy settings' button.
- In the 'Internet Properties' dialog, click the 'LAN settings' button.

- In the 'Local Area Network Settings' dialog, deselect the 'Automatically detect settings' checkbox.

Please note that changing the proxy settings will disable web proxy. If you are not sure about this settings, consult your system administrator.

'This web-page is not available'

Comodo Dragon displays this error message if it fails to find and open the requested web-page. Check again if you have entered the correct URL in the address bar. Try opening the web-page in other browsers such as Opera, Chrome, Firefox or IE. If the web-page is not opening in any of the browsers, check the internet connection or the website may be down temporarily.

If the web-page is opening in other browsers but not in Dragon, click the 'More information on this error' link on the page.

- Error 2 (net::ERR_FAILED): Unknown error
- Error 102 (net::ERR_CONNECTION_REFUSED): Unknown error
- Error 105 (net::ERR_NAME_NOT_RESOLVED)
- Error 104 (net::ERR_CONNECTION_FAILED)

If the page displays any of the above errors, try the solutions given below.


Malware

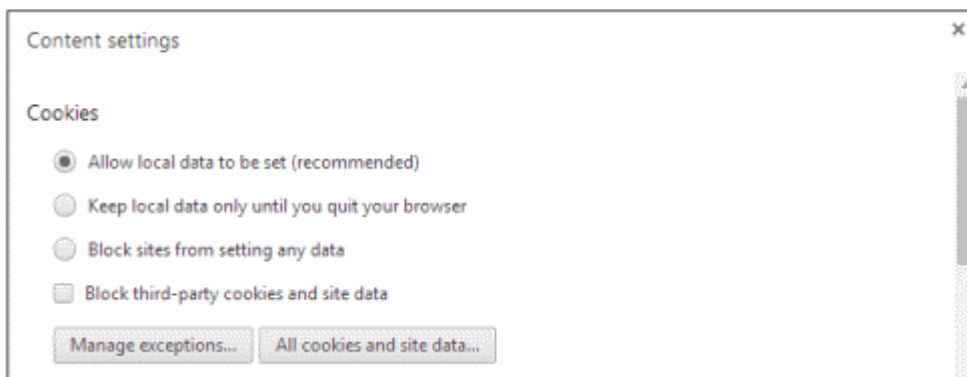
Malware may be the reason for the Comodo Dragon not being able to connect to a web server. Use the latest version of Comodo Internet Security to scan your system for any malware and to remove it. Download Comodo Internet Security from <http://personalfirewall.comodo.com/>.

Cookies

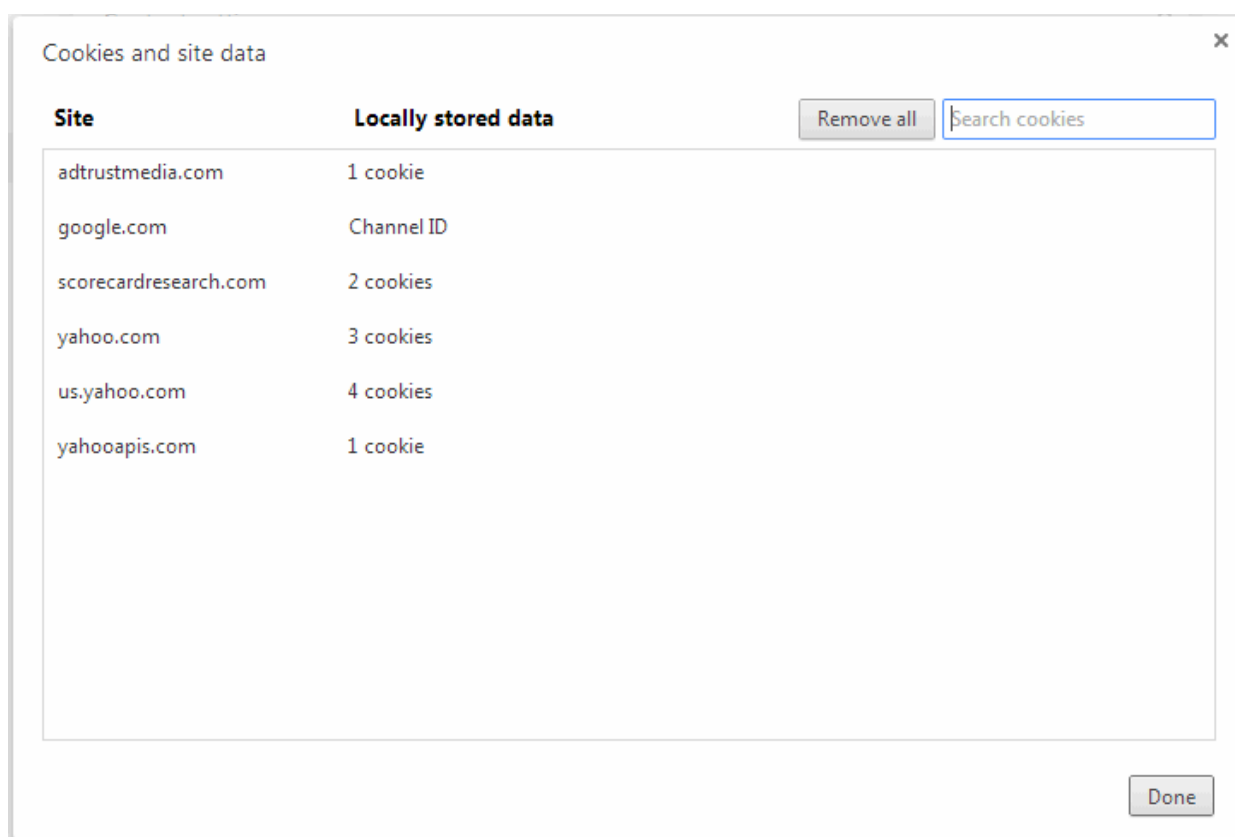
Cookies are small pieces of information sent by websites that you've visited which are stored by your web browser. Cookies are used by these websites to store your preferences about that website (for example, if you ask a website to 'Keep me logged in' or similar, it is the cookie that keeps a record of this preference). If a cookie is corrupted, the browser may display any of the above error messages. Clear all the cookies.

To delete the cookies

- Click the menu  located in the top-right corner.
- Select 'Settings' from the menu then click 'Show advanced settings' link.
- In the 'Privacy' section, click the 'Content settings' button and scroll down to 'Cookies' from the list of features.



- Click the 'All cookies and site data' button. The 'Cookies and site data' dialog will be displayed.



- Click 'the Remove all' to delete all cookies.

Antivirus and Firewall Settings

- Check whether the settings in antivirus and firewall applications in your system are configured to allow Comodo Dragon.

Proxy Settings

Adjust your proxy settings. [Click here](#) to know how to configure proxy settings.

Video is no longer available

If you try to play YouTube in Comodo Dragon and it displays 'Video is no longer available' error, the most likely reason could be the antivirus application in your system is not allowing the browser to play videos.

Disable the antivirus application in your system temporarily and try to play videos. If it works, check whether any upgrades are available for the antivirus application and install them.

Kaspersky and Shield Defense antivirus applications are the most cited softwares, as per reports received by us, that prevents the browser from playing videos. Adjust the settings in these applications to resolve the issue.

Error 124 (net_ERR_WINSOCK_UNEXPECTED_WRITTEN_BYTES)

When there is a problem with a **Layered Service Provider** in your computer, Dragon will be unable to open requested web-page and displays the above error message. To resolve the issue, check for any malware in your computer. Use the latest version of Comodo Internet Security to scan your system for any malware and to remove it. Download Comodo Internet Security from <http://personalfirewall.comodo.com/>.

If the issue still persists even after removal of of malware from your system, disable LSPs in your computer using third-party tools.

Error 128 (net_ERR_SSL_UNSAFE_NEGOTIATION)

Some of the antivirus and home security applications are not compatible with Comodo Dragon and the browser may display Error 128 when browsing Google and Gmail websites. Kaspersky, NetNanny and ESET Smart Security applications are the most mentioned applications, as per reports received by us, that cause this error. Adjust the settings in these applications to resolve the issue.

Error 129 (net_ERR_SSL_WEAK_SERVER_EPHEMERAL_DH_KEY)

Comodo Dragon may display this error when you are visiting a secure website (HTTPS) and the server that is hosting the site may not be configured correctly and the secure connection cannot be made. To protect you privacy and prevent intruders, Comodo Dragon always uses secure connections. Though the website may work in other browsers, the fact is that the server is vulnerable and the security hole has to be fixed.

Note to website administrators: This error is displayed when the SSL/TLS handshake tries to use a public key that is smaller than 512 bits for ephemeral Diffie-Hellman key agreement. To resolve this issue, disable all DHE SSL cipher suites or use 1024 bits or larger Diffie-Hellman key for the DHE_RSA SSL cipher suites.

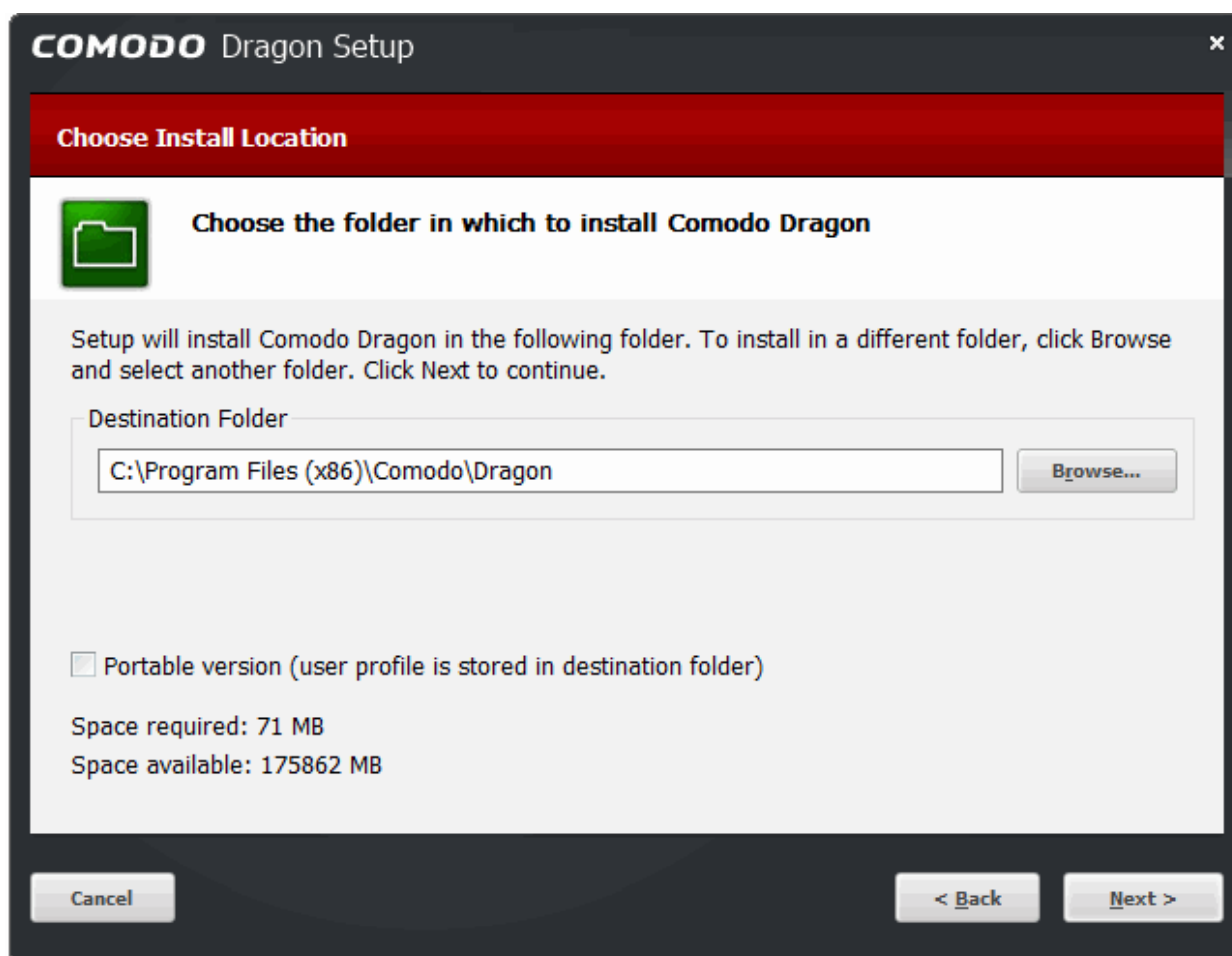

11. Portable Version

Comodo Dragon can also be installed in portable mode. As the name suggests, portable mode allows users to quickly launch and use their pre-configured Comodo Dragon on any computer without the need to install, import bookmarks or modify settings.

In portable mode, the user profile (configuration data) is written to the Dragon installation folder instead of the Windows 'user' folder on the local machine. Therefore, by simply copying the installation folder to another drive (such as a USB fob or a drive on another computer), you will be able to launch and use your personalized Comodo Dragon.



Portable mode must be selected during the installation process:

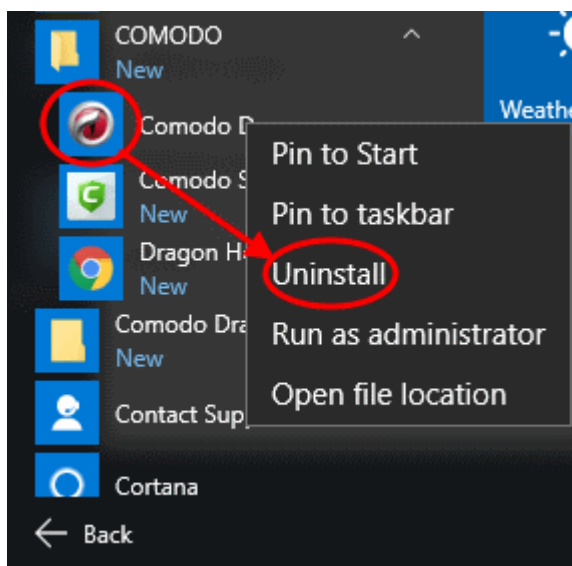
There are a few differences to setup if portable mode is selected:

- The 'Import Settings' and 'Secure DNS' dialog boxes will not be shown during the installation process
- The Installer does not write anything to the Windows registry
- Uninstaller is not created
- User profile is stored in the "User Data" folder inside the main Comodo Dragon installation folder.

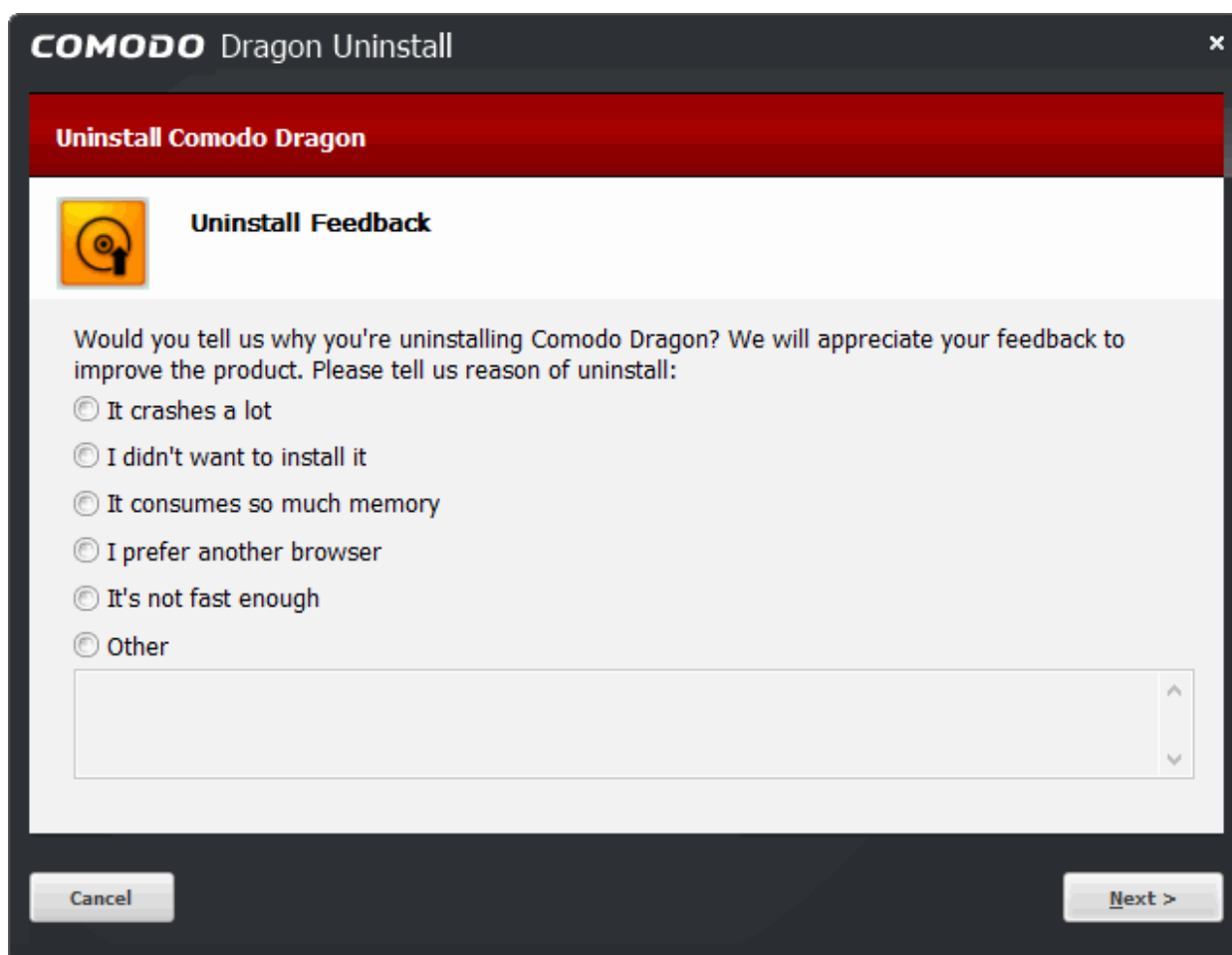

To uninstall Comodo Dragon

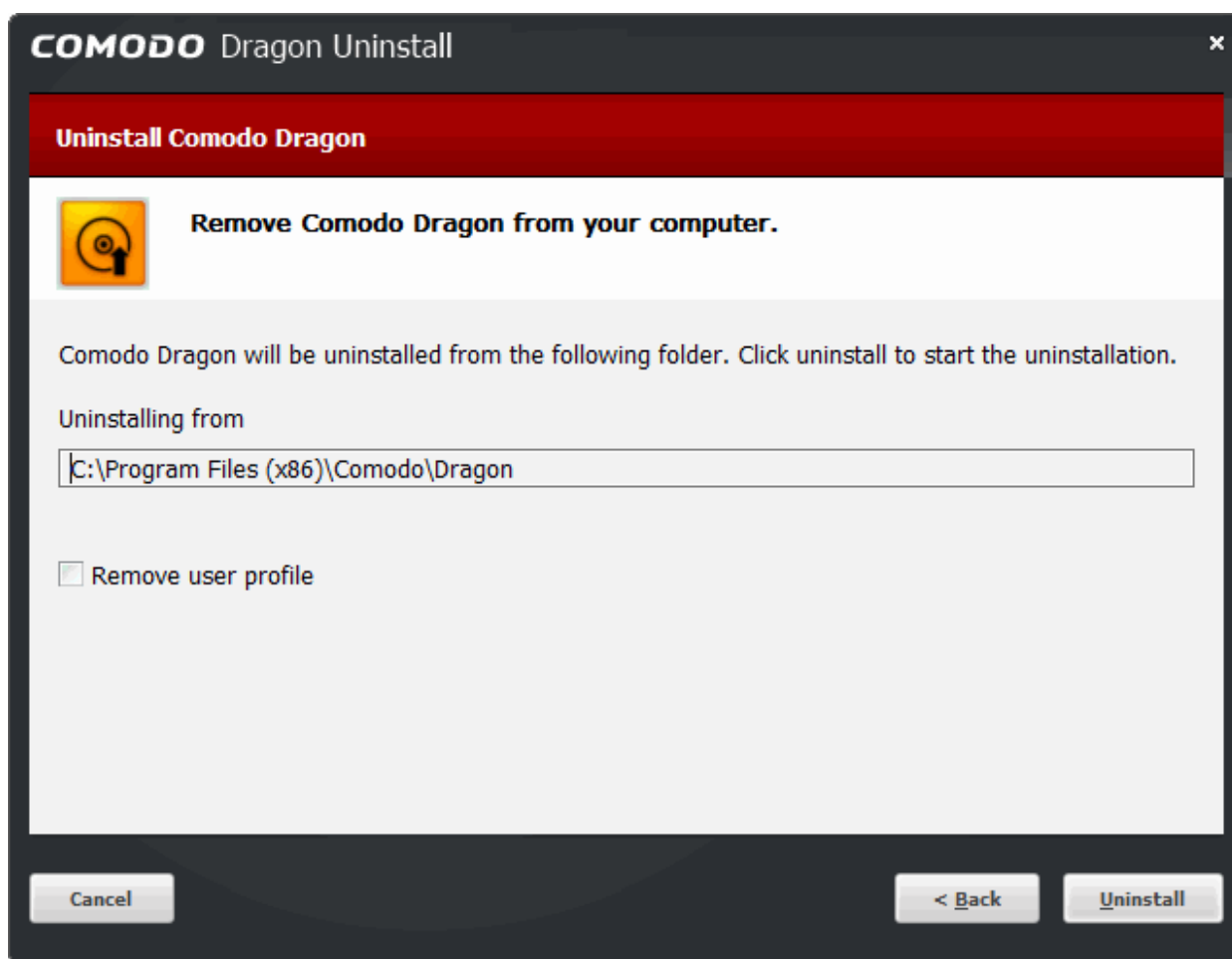
- Click 'Start' > 'Settings' > 'Control Panel'

 - In the list of currently installed programs, click 'Comodo Dragon'
 - Click the 'Change/Remove' button.
- OR
- Click *Start > All Programs > COMODO > Dragon > Uninstall Comodo Dragon.*

- Click 'Next'.



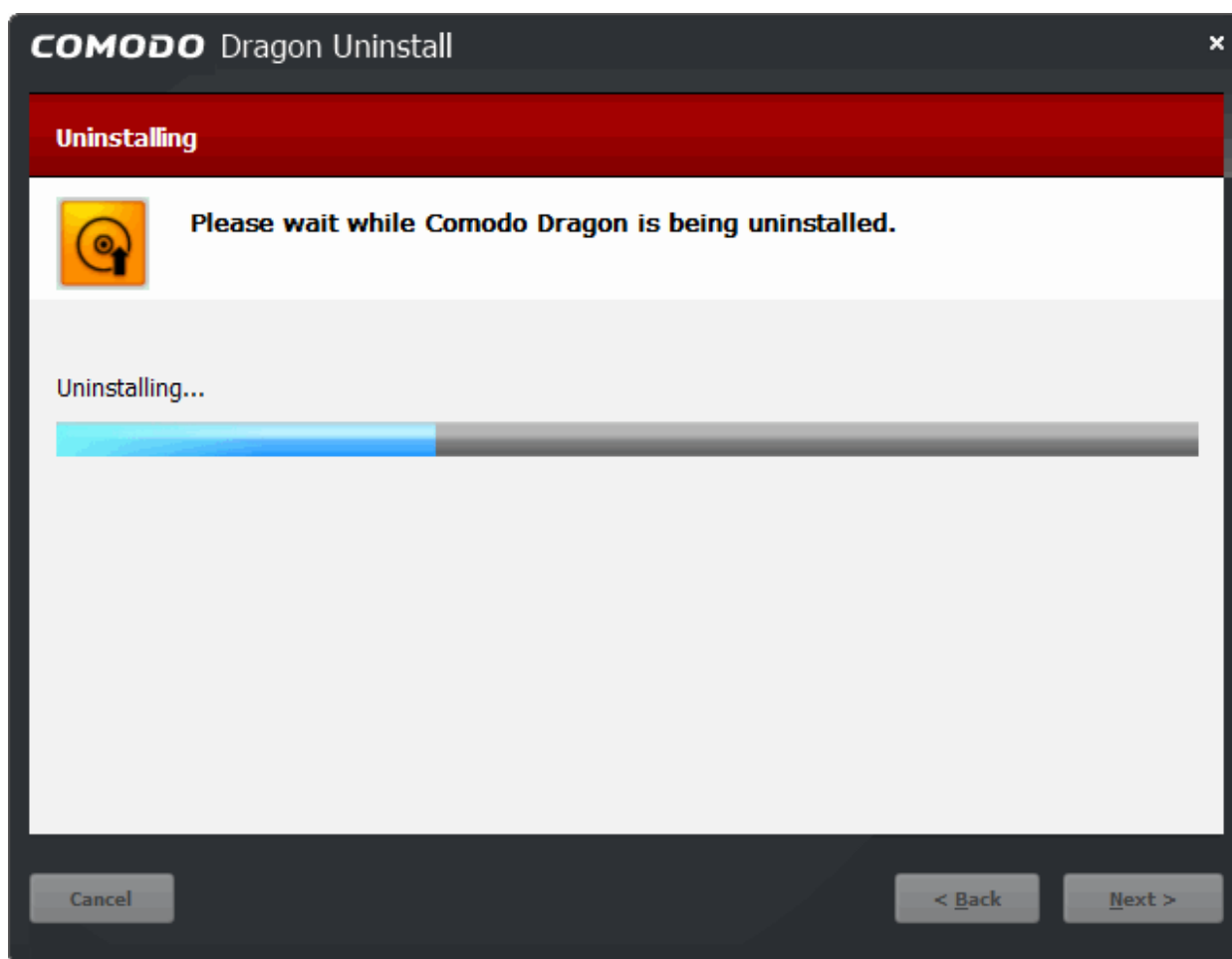

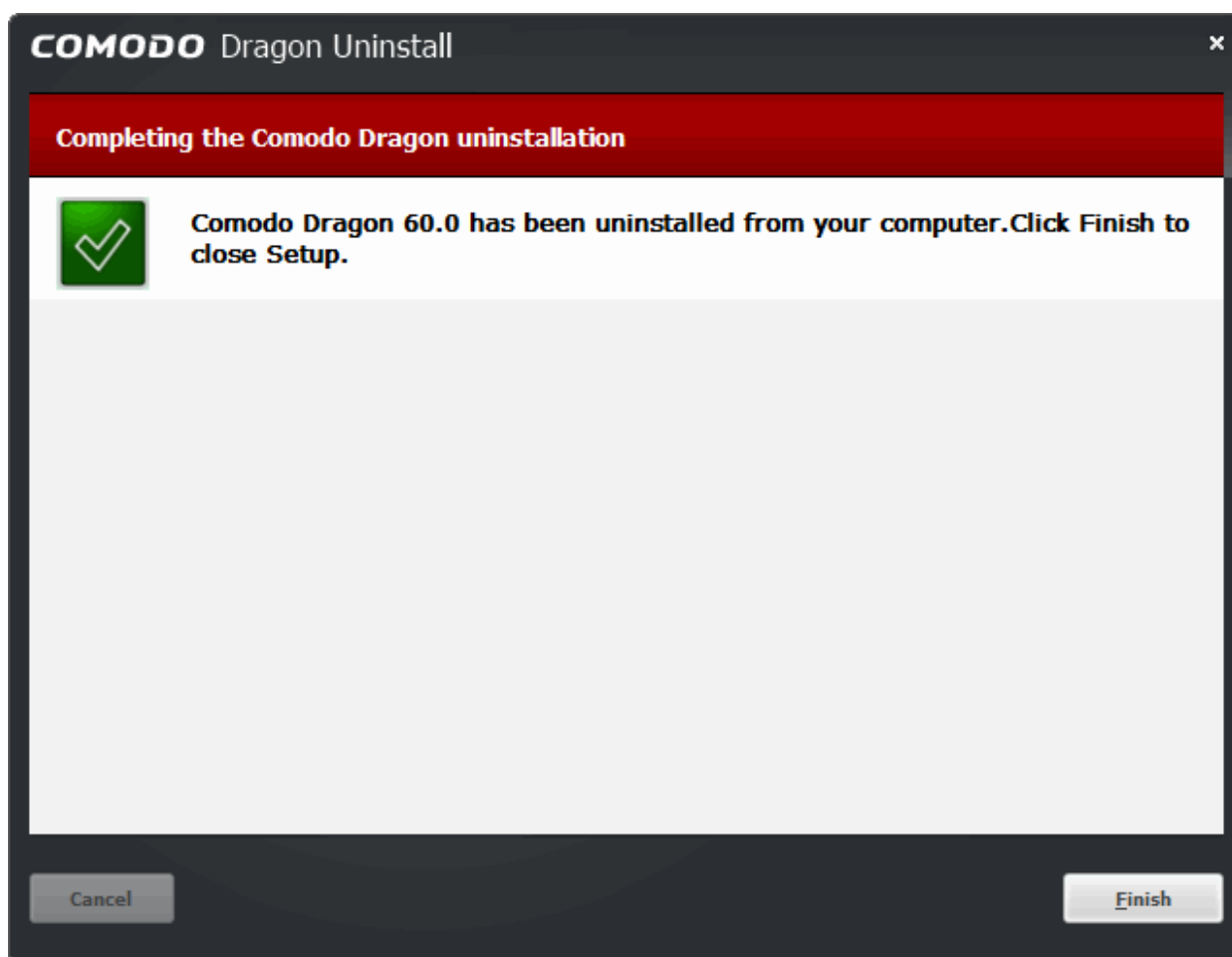
If you have chosen to install System-Wide Comodo SecureDNS by selecting the option 'I would like to use Comodo SecureDNS Servers (with all applications)' in **step 4** during installation, the modified DNS settings in your computer will not be reverted on selecting this option, enabling you to continue using Comodo SecureDNS services. If you want to revert the DNS server IP address to your previous settings you need to manually change it in the 'Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) Properties' dialog accessible by clicking Start > Control Panel > Network Connections > selected network > Properties > Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) > Properties.

- Click 'Uninstall' to commence the uninstallation.

- Click 'Finish' to complete the uninstallation process.

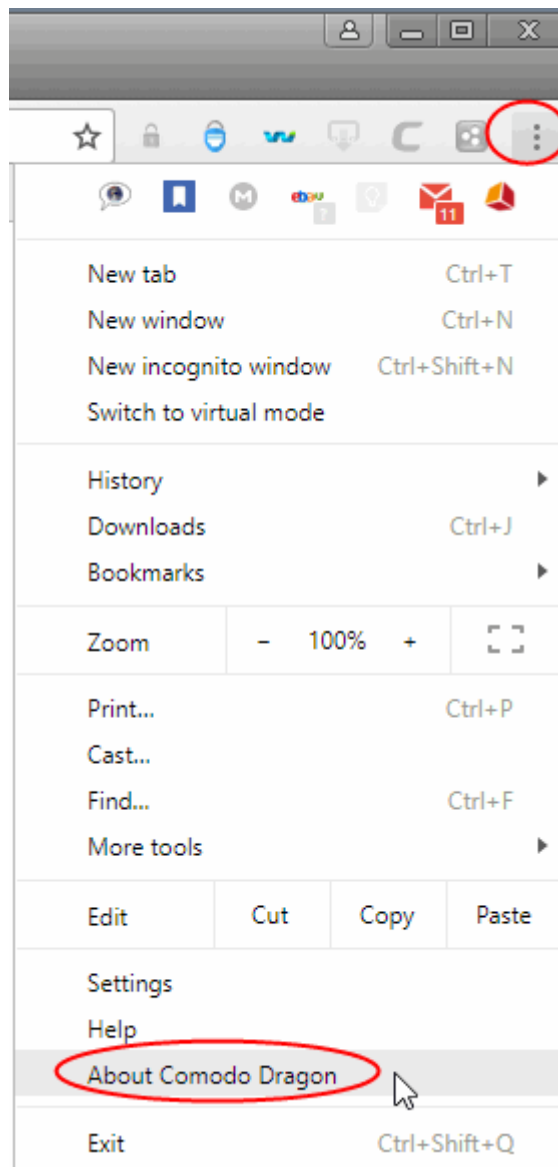

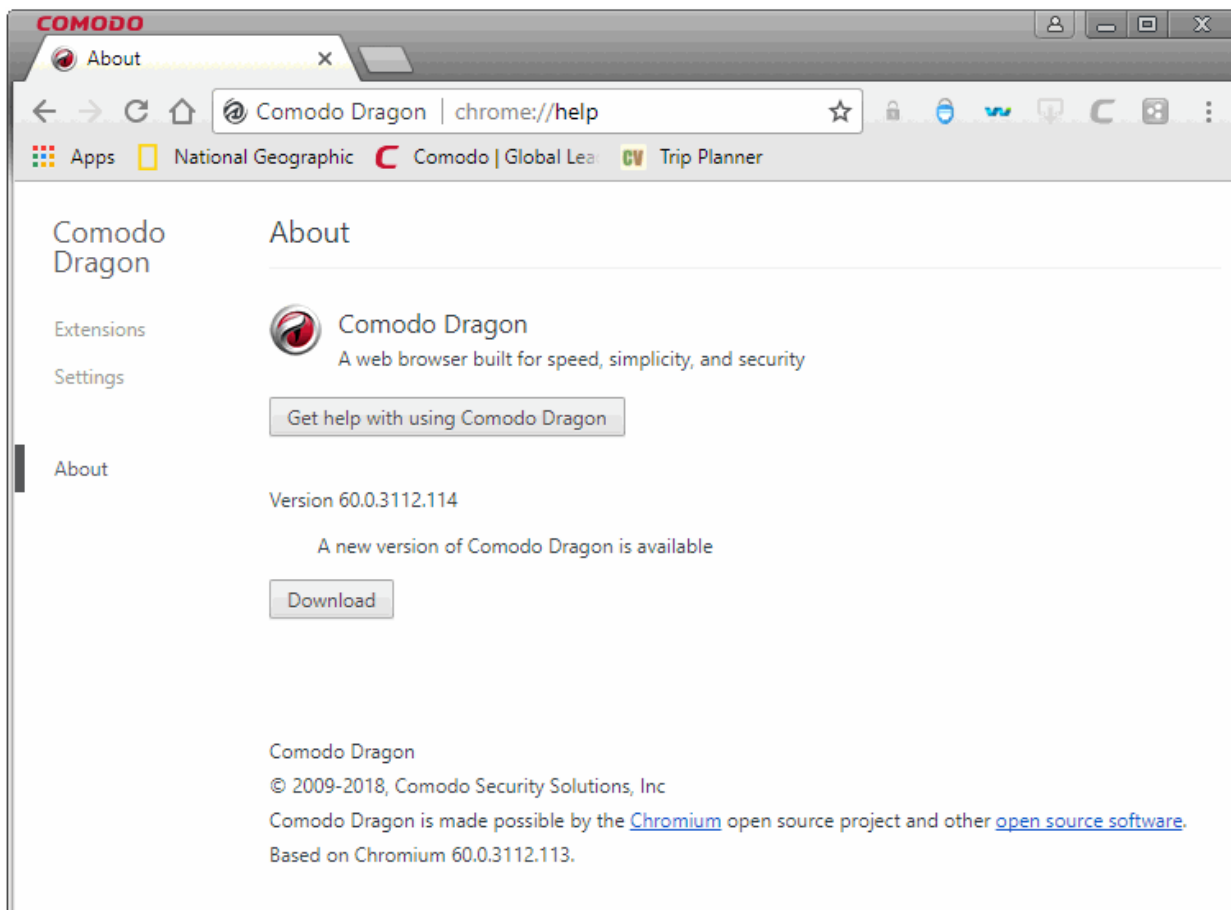
